Garden Valley Technologies also offers a residential unlimited long-distance plan for calling outside of our new expanded local calling area. This service is available for \$22.95/month/line.

Driving Soy: Pennington – Red Lake County farmers treading new ground with tire donation to sheriff's department

Eagle Enforcer tires use soybean oil in tread compound

Red Lake Falls, MN – Pennington – Red Lake County farmers and their soybean checkoff dollars are giving back to local first responders this summer – and promoting the diverse uses of soybeans at the same time.

The Pennington – Red Lake County Corn and Soybean Board joined the Minnesota Soybean Research & Promotion Council (MSR&PC) and its 44 organized counties by utilizing Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company's line of soy-oil tires to spotlight value-added products while also supporting law enforcement agencies in their communities.

Each organized county (Minnesota is the only state to support county-level soybean programs) has the opportunity to donate a full set of Goodyear's soy-based Eagle Enforcer All Weather tires – designed specifically for first responder vehicles traversing rugged climates like Minnesota's – to their county sheriff's department.

"The Red Lake County Sheriff's Office really appreciates this generous donation by the Minnesota Soybean Research

& Promotion Council and the local soybean board," said Sheriff Mitch Bernstein.

"We typically need a new set of tires for a patrol vehicle each year and these high-quality Goodyear Tires will help us to do our job safely and effectively. An opportunity like this does not come along very often, so we are so grateful to have received something that is so useful, all while benefiting our farmers at the same time."

The donation period to local sheriff's departments runs June 1- July 13.

With COVID-19 gathering restrictions relaxing, the timing is ideal for the Council to drive its grassroots county program forward after a year marked by cancelled and postponed events. Promoting soybean oil via checkoff investments in renewable technology is the perfect vehicle to showcase the Council's ongoing mission to improve farmer profitability by promoting value-added products, said MSR&PC Chair Cole Trebesch.

"There's a high level of enthusiasm with our county boards for this campaign,"

Trebesch said. "We all know summertime is fleeting in Minnesota, and after the hardships of the past year, our county boards are champing at the bit to promote our commodities and checkoff investments."

Since 2017, Goodyear, supported by United Soybean Board checkoff investments, has released four lines of tires with soybean oil compounds: Assurance WeatherReady, Eagle Enforcer All Weather, Eagle Exhilarate and Assurance Comfort Drive. The Akron, Ohio-based company has increased its use of soybeans by 73% since 2018 and pledged to fully replace all of its petroleum-driven oils with soybean oil by 2040. The Enforcer tires will appeal to more than just law enforcement but also state fleets and municipalities, increasing demand for soybean grown in Minnesota.

In addition to the county promotion, the Council will give away two sets of Goodyear's popular Assurance Weather-Ready tires – also made with 100% soybean oil – at this year's Farmfest (Aug. 3-5) and Big Iron (Sept 13-15). A third set of the WeatherReady tires, which

are tailor-made for everyday vehicles, will be available through an online promotion that will allow farmers to nominate their favorite nonprofits.

"On behalf of the Red Lake and Pennington County Soybean and Corn Growers Association, we are pleased to provide each of our county Sheriff's departments with a set of soy-based tires," said Pennington – Red Lake County Soybean/Corn Grower President David Miller. "This is a great way to showcase the many uses of soybean oil, all while driving demand for our product."

The Pennington – Red Lake County Soybean and Corn Growers Association is affiliated with the Minnesota Soybean Research & Promotion Council, which oversees the investment of soybean checkoff dollars on behalf of the nearly 28,000 soybean farmers in Minnesota. The Council is governed by the rules of a federally mandated checkoff program that requires all soybean producers pay a fee on the soybeans they sell. This money is used to promote, educate and develop market opportunities for soybeans.

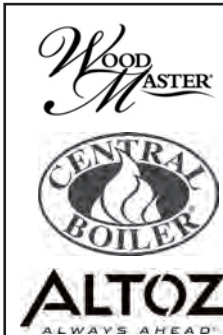

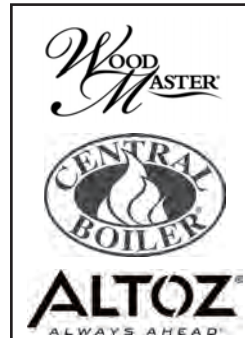

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Ask a Trooper

Question: My son just got back from Legionville where he was selected to attend and train and will serve as a school patrol captain when school starts up next fall. Can you talk about that? He had a great experience and I didn't realize how much history there is with it.

Answer: I'd be glad to chat about it as I just wrapped up helping instruct session two. The idea of the School Patrol originated with Sister Carmela of the Cathedral School in St. Paul on Feb. 21, 1921 when the first patrolmen were stationed at the intersection of Kellogg Boulevard and Summit Avenue in Saint Paul. Adopted citywide by the City of St. Paul in 1922 as a part of the program of the School System and the St. Paul Police Department, it was also adopted as a statewide program by the Minnesota Highway Patrol.

Earle Brown, the first chief of the Minnesota Highway Patrol, felt that a uniform program of training and support should be created in the State and came to the Minnesota American Legion in 1935 requesting such assistance. In 1936, under a co-operative program, The American Legion started a statewide training program held at the Crow Wing County Fairgrounds in Brainerd, with two years at Camp Ripley, using these facilities until 1956. The Training Center was staffed by members of the Minnesota Highway Patrol, qualified Legionnaires and support staff.

In 1948, the Minnesota American Legion set up a com-

mittee to raise funds to construct a permanent training center for the School Patrol. The Parker family, in 1954, donated the original 560-acre site on North Long Lake. The caretaker house used to be the old farmhouse, and the old barn was once the old milk house and was converted into an educational building. The area called Parkerville consists of many family cottages along the lake right next to Legionville. The generous Parker family, many of whom were Legionnaires in Brainerd, also donated the Boy Scouts camp on the other side of North Long Lake.

A later addition of land raised the total to 610 acres with 1,500 feet of shoreline beach. The property contained some buildings, including a large barn which was converted to an all-purpose unit of classrooms, office, canteen, first aid room, a large theater and a recreational area on the second floor. A modern dining hall, seven dormitories, caretaker's house and two cabins for staff have been built creating the modern Legionville School Safety Patrol Training Center,



Inc. The original barn has come down and since been replaced with a new one.

From the first program in 1936 of two weeks and 157 patrolmen, the enrollment has progressed to more than 1,000 each season with the training center having a session capacity of 168. All sessions are now co-ed.

Each youngster, between the ages of 8-13, attends and is sponsored by an organization in his or her hometown. The typical patroller is a student entering fourth, fifth, or sixth grade. The patrollers are selected to represent their schools at Legionville by the School Patrol advisor of their school and local personnel. Teams of patrollers are encouraged to attend together to enhance their training and knowledge.

Last week was a fun week for a tractor guy like me. My neighbor had a couple Minneapolis Molines that I have been eyeing for years and I guess they came up for sale. I went to visit him and made a deal....so the 2 model Us came to the Mickelson Farm. One is on steel that came from a Twin City tractor and the other is on rubber with a set of steel to go with it! They are the first steel wheel tractors I have ever had. Can't wait to see what becomes of the Us!

The Minneapolis Moline company has a long history. In 1887 the Minneapolis Threshing Machine Company (MTM Co.) was formed. They started with threshing machines and eventually manufactured steam powered tractors. In 1902 the Minneapolis Steel and Machinery Company (MS&M Co.) was also founded. Their engineers developed a lightweight tractor line using the name Twin City. Due to a depressed farm economy the MTM Co, MS&M Co., and the Moline Implement Co. of Moline, Illinois, merged on March 30, 1929. They formed the Minneapolis Moline Power Company. They manufactured tractors under the Twin City name until 1938. After that the name of the tractors was changed to Minneapolis Moline. The also then took on the pretty yellow and red paint scheme. The first of these "Visionlined" models was the model "Z". The models "U", "G", and "R" followed in the company's letter series of tractors.

My dad and grandpa had U standard and a UB Diesel. Hearing those stories always sparked my interest in Minneapolis Moline Tractors! The first tractor I ever bought was a Minneapolis Moline, a Model ZB. I have too many tractor projects, but I am glad I have two Minneapolis Molines to put on the list. I love tractors!! A little extra note don't forget to come to the 4th of July Parade and Tractor show in Plummer, MN, on the 4th!! Hope to see you there!!

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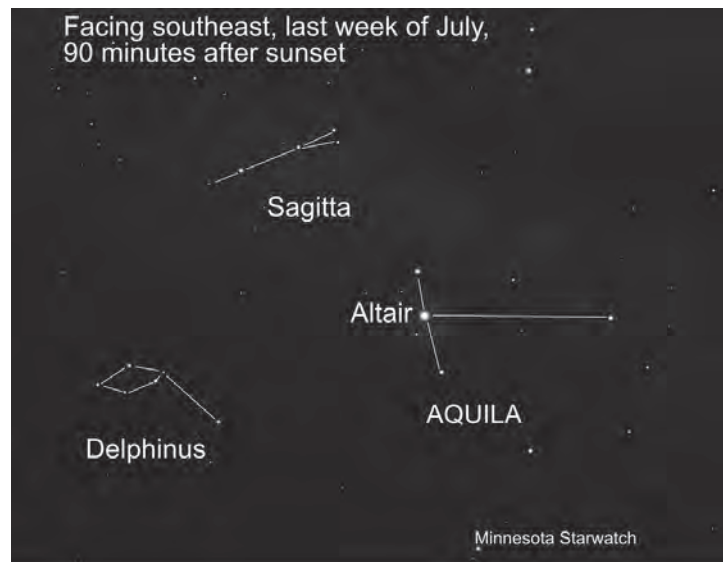
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Minnesota Starwatch for July 2021

Venus glimmers in the sun's afterglow, where it will stay for months to come. Look for the planet low in the west-northwest about 40 minutes after sunset. The best days may be the 11th and 12th, when a young moon hovers nearby.

In the southern sky, the summer stars have taken center stage. Grab a star chart—or find one online—go out at nightfall, and start by locating the Big Dipper in the northwest. Follow the curve of its handle to brilliant Arcturus, a star whose path cuts down through the plane of the Milky Way. Arcturus anchors the kite-shaped constellation Bootes, the herdsman.

Moving eastward, we first encounter Corona Borealis, the Northern Crown, accentuated by its bright star Alphecca (or Gemma). Next comes an hourglass of stars outlining upside-down Hercules.

Then we meet the large Summer Triangle of stars. Brightest is Vega, in Lyra, the lyre. To Vega's lower left is Deneb, the tail of Cygnus, the swan. Deneb is also the brightest star in the Northern Cross, whose long section extends below Vega. Farther below Vega shines Altair, in Aquila, the eagle. East of Altair, little Delphinus, the dolphin, seems to leap toward a dark sea. Above it floats skinny Sagitta, the arrow.

Low in the south, gigantic red Antares marks the heart of Scorpius. Just east of Scorpius sits the Teapot of Sagittarius, with its spout pointing toward the scorpion's tail.

By month's end, Saturn and Jupiter, in that order, will be rising in the southeast before midnight. Look for them below Altair. Or catch them in the southwestern predawn sky; note that they form a triangle with Fomalhaut, the lone bright star in Piscis Austrinus, the southern fish. Earth is catching up to both planets in the orbital race and laps them in August.

July's full moon rises within an hour of perfect fullness the evening of the 23rd. Though not designated a supermoon, it will still be close, and thus bright as well as quite round.



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
