Ubert enters Class of 2025 at the U.S. Naval Academy



ANNAPOLIS, Md. – Jack A. Ubert a graduate of Fosston High School Class of 2020 was inducted into the Naval Academy Class of 2025 Wednesday, June 30, and will begin six challenging weeks of basic midshipman training as part of Plebe Summer. Approximately 1,200 candidates are selected each year for the Academy's "plebe" or freshman class, and each student is required to participate in Plebe Summer. Last year the Naval Academy received over 16,000 applications for the Class of 2025.

During this time, plebes have no access to television, movies, the internet or music, and restricted access to cell phones. They are only permitted to make two calls during the six weeks of Plebe Summer.

The pressure and rigor of Plebe Summer is carefully designed to help plebes prepare for their first academic year at the Naval Academy and the four years of challenge, which awaits them.

As the summer progresses, the new midshipmen rapidly assimilate basic skills in seaman-

ship, navigation, damage control, sailing, and handling yard patrol craft. Plebes also learn infantry drill and how to shoot 9 mm pistols and M-16 rifles.

Other daily training sessions involve moral, mental, physical, or professional development and team-building skills. Activities include swimming, martial arts, basic rock climbing, obstacle, endurance, and confidence courses designed to develop physical, mental and team-building skills. Forty hours are devoted to the instruction of infantry drill and five formal parades.

Founded in 1845, the U.S. Naval Academy today is a prestigious four-year service academy that prepares midshipmen morally, mentally, and physically to be professional officers in the naval service. U.S. News and World Reports has recognized the Naval Academy as a top five undergraduate engineering school, comprised of approximately 4,400 men and women representing every state in the U.S. and several foreign countries make up the student body, known as the Brigade of Midshipmen.

Upon graduation, midshipmen earn a Bachelor of Science degree in a choice of 25 different subject majors and go on to serve at least five years of exciting and rewarding service as commissioned officers in the U.S. Navy or U.S. Marine Corps.

Jack was assigned to the Naval Academy Preparatory School for the 2020-21 Academic year. He graduated on May 14th, 2020 and was on the Superintendent's List by having a 3.7 or higher GPA while also passing the rigorous Physical Readiness Training (PRT).

Jack Ubert is the son of Andy and Nicky Ubert of Fosston.

Driving Soy: Polk County farmers treading new ground with tire donation to sheriff's department Eagle Enforcer tires use soybean oil in tread compound

Fosston, MN – Polk County farmers and their soybean checkoff dollars are giving back to local first responders this summer – and promoting the diverse uses of soybeans at the same time.

The Polk County Soybean – Corn Board joined the Minnesota Soybean Research & Promotion Council (MSR&PC) and its 44 organized counties by utilizing Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company's line of soy-oil tires to spotlight value-added products while also supporting law enforcement agencies in their communities.

Each organized county (Minnesota is the only state to support county-level soybean programs) has the opportunity to donate a full set of Goodyear's soy-based Eagle Enforcer All Weather tires – designed specifically for first responder vehicles traversing rugged climates like Minnesota's – to their county sheriff's office.

"The Polk County Sheriff's Office is happy to except the donation of 4 Goodyear soy-based Eagle Enforcer All Weather tires. We are pleased to partner with the MN Soybean Research and Promotion Council exploring new options to keep our deputies safe while protecting the citizens of Polk County," said James Tadman, Polk County Sheriff.

The donation period to local sheriff's departments runs June 1- July 13.

With COVID-19 gathering restrictions relaxing, the timing is ideal for the Council to drive its grassroots county program forward after a year marked by cancelled and postponed events. Promoting soybean oil via checkoff investments in renewable technology is the perfect ve-

hicle to showcase the Council's ongoing mission to improve farmer profitability by promoting value-added products, said MSR&PC Director Cole Trebesch.

"There's a high level of enthusiasm with our county boards for this campaign," Trebesch said. "We all know summertime is fleeting in Minnesota, and after the hardships of the past year, our county boards are champing at the bit to promote our commodities and checkoff investments."

Since 2017, Goodyear, supported by United Soybean Board checkoff investments, has released four lines of tires with soybean oil compounds: Assurance WeatherReady, Eagle Enforcer All Weather, Eagle Exhilarate and Assurance Comfort Drive. The Akron, Ohio-based company has increased its use of soybeans by 73% since 2018 and pledged to fully replace all of its petroleum-driven oils with soybean oil by 2040. The Enforcer tires will appeal to more than just law enforcement but also state fleets and municipalities, increasing demand for soybean grown in Minnesota.

In addition to the county promotion, the Council will give away two sets of Goodyear's popular Assurance WeatherReady tires – also made with 100% soybean oil – at this year's Farmfest (Aug. 3-5) and Big Iron (Sept 13-15). A third set of the WeatherReady tires, which are tailor-made for everyday vehicles, are available through an online promotion that allows farmers to nominate their favorite non-profits.

"I feel we are helping out our law enforcement with these tires and also promot-

ing soybeans in another use, in our everyday lives," said Kevin Krueger, President of the Polk County Soybean – Corn Growers.

The Polk County Soybean – Corn Growers Association is affiliated with the Minnesota Soybean Research & Promotion Council, which oversees the investment of soybean checkoff dollars on behalf of the nearly 28,000 soybean farmers in Minnesota. The Council is governed by the rules of a federally mandated checkoff program that requires all soybean producers pay a fee on the soybeans they sell. This money is used to promote, educate and develop market opportunities for soybeans.

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Ask a Trooper

Question: Hi, I am wondering if there is any laws that

prohibit a person from having a blue flashing light in front or back of a bicycle.

Answer: A blue light, whether flashing or not are not allowed on bicycles. Bicyclists must use a headlight and rear reflectors when it's dark. To increase visibility, adding a rear flashing light is allowed.

Rules of the Road

- Bicyclists may ride on all Minnesota roads, except where restricted.

- Bicyclists should ride on the road, and must ride in the same direction as traffic.

- Motorists must at all times maintain a three-foot clearance when passing a bicyclist.

- Bicyclists must obey all traffic control signs and signals, just as motorists.

- Bicyclists must signal their turns and should ride in a predictable manner.

- Bicyclists must use a headlight and rear reflectors when

it's dark. To increase visibility, add a rear flashing light.

- Drivers must drive at safe speeds and be attentive — look for bicyclists, check blind spots.

- Drivers should use caution and look twice for riders when turning.

- Drivers should use caution when opening door upon parking on side of road.

About one-half of all bicycle-vehicle collisions are due to a variety of bicyclist behaviors, such as disregarding a traffic sign or signal. The other half are caused by vehicle driver

behaviors, such as inattention and distraction. It's important for everyone to do their part to share the road and drive smart.

Ragged

The midnight blue book with golden letters upon the cover reads, "Ragged, Spiritual Disciplines for the Spiritually Exhausted" by Gretchen Ronnevik.

Gretchen is from Fergus Falls, MN and a country gal. Her husband's a farmer and they have a pile of kids. That's all I needed to know about the book before I picked it up. Wanting to know how a gal who has to discipline her own kiddos yet apparently still has time for spiritual disciplines got my attention. The exhausted part of the title automatically resonated...so thought I'd give it a try. Spoiler alert, I was not disappointed.

Gretchen's voice is unique. She tells her story while knitting warmth all around by inviting us in. Like a pile of wool waiting to be spun, her words are chain-linked and when they come together, they wrap round us resonating deep within. The richness she brings to the table of grace is for such a time as this. Much needed are the words in print, and while it's an incredibly easy read, the depth is beyond measure.

She says things like, "The spiritual disciplines are the holy-therapy exercises to ground us in the reality of God's sufficient work. They are the recovery work of our human souls traumatized by the Fall (Gen. 3). They don't earn us grace. They awaken us to the reality of grace."

She says things like, "The spiritual disciplines are God putting us in physical situations where we must face our deprav-

ity and his sufficiency."

She says things like, "You won't find a list with details of how much, how long, or how often you must practice meditation, or prayer, or lament. They're just a part of life. The Holy Spirit will offer these things to you for each situation, as needed."

She says things like, "He calls us to participate in our restoration, not contribute to our restoration. We are restored when we remember what God has done, in very tangible, tactile ways. The restoration isn't theoretical. It's practical."

I enjoyed the passages she's chosen to incorporate as well as the personal stories she shares.

A young man who read it was touched by this quote. "Spiritual maturity isn't pious independence from God, but a deeper dependence on him. The Christian life is to sink into his sufficiency, not prove we can do it on our own."

A young woman who read it enjoyed this nugget. "God will disrupt our striving towards our own ideal of perfection as many times as he needs in order to teach us to take our eyes off of ourselves and look at him."

So, if you are looking for something to ponder that brings a whole lot of rootedness, you need look no further. Gretchen explains, "The good news is that spiritual disciplines have less to do with what we bring before God and more about who Christ is for us, not only as the author but also as the perfecter of our faith."

Hebrews 12:2 agrees. "Therefore, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross... and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." My recommendation would be to not take my word for it, but take a look yourself. May you be deeply enriched by what you find. Amen.

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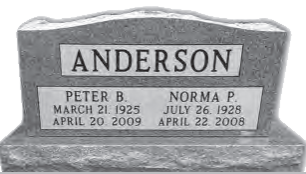

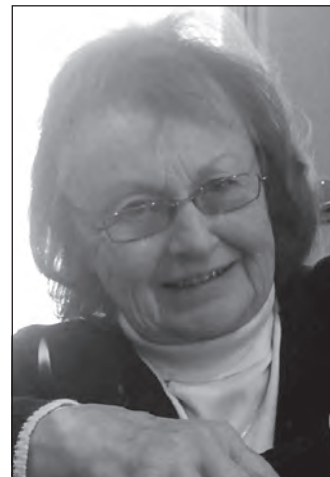

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Obituary for Martha Johnson

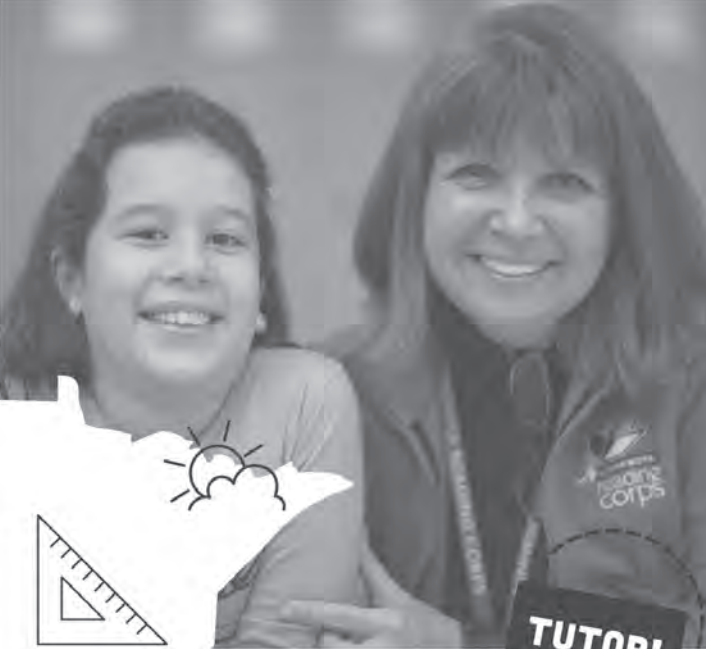

Bemidji Speedway and LVI Supply welcomed all Union Workers Sunday night with Mayor George Prince greeting the workers, fans, and racers. Sunny and hot conditions welcomed 84 cars to the track but a soft breeze out of the south made for bearable conditions.

Winners on the night were Michael Roth in the Wissota Pure Stocks, Conrad Schwinn in the Bemidji Mini Stocks, Jeff Reed in the Wissota Midwest Modifieds, Payton Edelman in the Wissota Hornets, Doug VanMill in the Wissota Super Stocks, Mike Hart in the Wissota Mod Fours and Doyle Erickson in the Wissota Modifieds.

Next Sunday the track welcomes the Advantage RV Mod Tour to town with many of the top modified drivers in the tri-state area coming to battle on the 3/8 mile oval. Starting time is 5:PM.

Wissota Pure Stock Feature:

In the opening feature of the night a caution filled race slowed the action. Billy Binkley and Michael Roth led the field to the green flag with but multiple spins and cautions did not determine a leader until several restarts later with Josh Berg claiming the advantage over Dusty Caspers and Micheal Roth. Farrington slid up high in turn four and Fouquette charged back into second with Josh Beaulieu racing into third and Tyler Kaeter moving up into fourth dropping Farrington to fifth. Kaeter and Beaulieu fought for the third spot with Beaulieu winning the position as Erickson took this #99 modified into Victory Lane for his first win of 2021. Fouquette was second with Beaulieu, Kaeter and Farrington in the top five with the final race ending at 9:PM.
