Mentor Farmers' Market and Alex Conwell, Violinist

The Mentor Farmers Market customers have enjoyed Alex Conwell and his beautiful violin melodies over the past 8 years. Alex Conwell is a contemporary violinist and folk fiddle

player hailing from Minnesota. Performing with a looping pedal, Alex's solos turn into many-layered compositions that evoke feelings of adventure and wonder, while their

folk repertoire is well suited to dances and heritage events. Inspired by artists such as Lindsey Stirling, Aaron Meyer, and Simply Three, as well as having a passion for storytelling and improvisation, Alex's sound is a blend of Irish folk, bluegrass, classical, and new age mixed together into something that one might find in a film score. Alex can also be found on their improvisational storytelling podcast "Diceweave".

Alex has created an album called "Fractal Skies," and plans to perform at the Mentor Farmer's Market periodically through the rest of the summer. Fractal Skies is a collection of original songs performed on violin and looping pedal that take the listener on a round trip journey from Earth through space.

Future is Bright for Racing in Bemidji

Over the years Bemidji race fans have had many drivers who have become legends on the speedway track. Names like Lancaster, Matzdorf, Caspers, Matthews, Spaulding, Strand, Jessness, Stranger, Kolkin, Sautbine, Bahr, Mills, Nelson, Lindell, McClellan, Jacobson, Heller, Reed, Olafson, Jackson, Beaulieu, etc. Drivers who have earned the respect of fans who have watched them race over the years. Today many of those drivers are still active in racing but most through a son or daughter.

A resurgence in the interest in racing has taken place at Bemidji Speedway. Just 10

years ago the track was at a low in car counts with 35-40 cars in the pits. In the last three years those numbers have grown each year to an average of between 80-90 cars each week today. One of the reasons is a renewed interest in racing by the younger generation.

Bemidji Speedway has witnessed the growth of the sport like no other with 30+ teen drivers competing in the various classes available at the track. With seven young women between the age of 14-16 included in that group. The interest has never been higher with many more expected to join the ranks in the coming year. With each new driver comes pit crews and lots and lots of new fans for the

sport. Everyone wants to see the "new" driver compete on the track and cheer them on. Racing is back in a big way at Bemidji Speedway.

From a North Woods Family Farm to the Classroom, Holm has Deep Roots at BSU

Bemidji, Minn. – Alumna Sara Holm '19, always knew she would attend Bemidji State University to become a teacher. After earning her elementary education degree and a minor in sports management, Holm is now settled into a successful career as a third-grade teacher at Red Lake Elementary in Minnesota's north woods.

Originally from Shevlin, Minnesota, Holm grew up on a family farm where she and her two older brothers are fifth generation caretakers. After graduating from Bagley High School in 2015, it was a no-brainer that Holm would go to Bemidji State. Not only did she love BSU's professional education program and its lakeshore campus, she also had deep connections campus with a mom who's a longtime employee and an alumnus-dad.

"Going to BSU was in my life plan from a very young age. I was very familiar with the campus and that made the transition to college from our close-knit small town a lot more comfortable as a freshman," she said. "I have always loved the view of the lake and all the trees on campus. Other colleges don't even come close to matching BSU's beauty. Plus, getting outdoors between classes was a must for me."

Taking advantage of Bagley High's postsecondary enrollment options, Holm completed her associate's degree and even enrolled in a number of Indigenous studies courses at Bemidji State before becoming a full-time student. This experience allowed her to adapt to life on campus, she said. Then, when she started her journey BSU's Department of Professional Education, Holm felt better prepared to visit classrooms, shadow teachers, teach lessons and acquire tips from veteran teachers across the region.

"I was very fortunate to



have been placed in classrooms throughout the Bemidji and Bagley School Districts," Holm said. "But during the longest field experience, which happens just before student teaching, I went to Red Lake Elementary School and that's where I knew I wanted to start my career."

Holm applied for a full-time position at Red Lake Elementary after she completed her degree and was offered a position. Now, Holm has the privilege of watching the students she worked with during her college experience grow and progress through school.

"I was so impressed with how welcoming the teacher, staff and students were to me," she said. "It was such an impactful experience that I knew I wanted to apply there after graduating. Even now as I see that class of first graders going on to be in fourth grade I am able to continue those relationships and see their growth over the years."

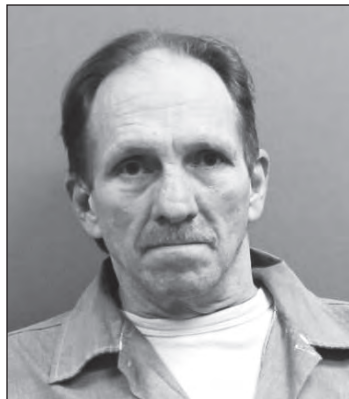
During the summers, when school is not in session, Holm spends time with her fiancé and goldendoodle in the north woods of Bagley and Itasca State Park.

notification is not intended to increase fear but rather raise awareness. Law enforcement believes that an informed public is a safer public.

The Clearwater County Sheriff's Office may not direct where this individual does or does not reside, nor can this agency direct where they work or go to school.

Convicted sexual and predatory individuals have always been released to live in our communities. It was not until the passage of the Registration Act that law enforcement had an ability to track movement of these individuals after their initial release. With the passage of the Community Notification Act law enforcement may now share information about many of these individuals with the public. Abuse of this information to threaten, harass or intimidate a registered person is unacceptable and such acts could be charged as a crime. Such abuses could potentially end the ability of law enforcement to provide these notifications.

Suspect apprehended in Pennington County Homicide

Eric Reinbold located after appearing on a law enforcement trail camera

Eric Reinbold, the man sought in the July 9 murder of his wife Lissette Reinbold of Oklee, Minn., was apprehended early this morning in Red Lake County.

Shortly after 9:30 p.m. Tuesday, agents were alerted to movement in front of a trail camera that had been set up in a wooded area off of County Road 1 not far from Reinbold's parent's property. This area had been searched by law enforcement in the days following his disappearance.

Deputies with the U.S. Marshals Service, the Pennington and Red Lake County sheriff's offices and agents with the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension converged on the area. Mr. Reinbold was found hiding in the woods near an abandon homestead and was taken into custody without incident shortly after 12:30 a.m. Wednesday.

Mr. Reinbold is currently in the Pennington County Jail. A bail hearing has been set in Pennington County District Court for this Friday. Mr. Reinbold was charged via complaint with Lissette Reinbold's murder on July 30. He was also being sought by the U.S. Marshals Service for violating the terms of his release from federal prison.

This is an active and ongoing investigation.

Ask a Trooper

Question: In reference to the Interstate, is it true that one out of five miles is straight so airplanes can land on there if needed?

Answer: No, this is a myth that is so widespread that it is difficult to dispel. The myth typically states the requirement came from President Dwight D. Eisenhower or the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1956. However, no legislation, regulation, or policy has ever imposed such a

requirement. Airplanes do land on Interstates in an emergency, but the highways are not designed for that purpose.

According to the United States Department of Transportation – Federal Highway Administration, the Interstate System was first described in a Bureau of Public Roads report to Congress, Toll Roads and Free Roads, in 1939. It was authorized for designation by the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1944, with the initial designations in 1947 and completed in 1955 under the 40,000 mile limitation imposed by the 1944

Act. President Eisenhower didn't conceive the Interstate System, but his support led to enactment of the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1956, which established the program for funding and building it.
