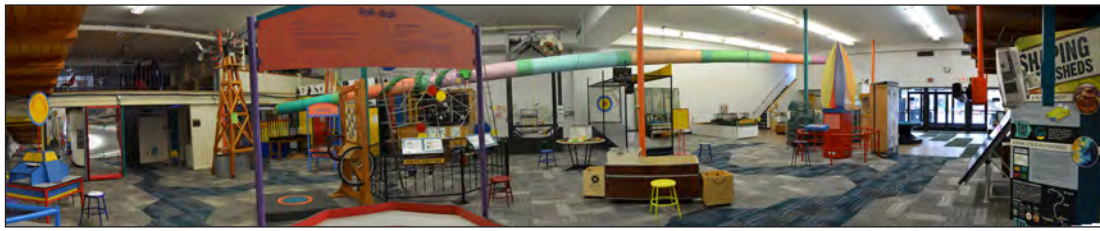

Headwaters Science Center Named Best Museum in Minnesota

Kitura Main, docent at the Headwaters Science Center (HSC) in Bemidji, MN, when she heard that HSC had been voted Best Museum in Minnesota, told Lee Furuseth, executive director of the center, "I couldn't be prouder." Kitura frequently says, "Guests and visitors come for the science and stay for the staff."

HSC was selected the "Best" through a balloting process where the public votes to determine the "Best" in Minnesota. Winners, in more than, 380 categories can be found on the Minnesota's Best website or in the printed edition of the Minnesota's Best Magazine.

The Headwaters Science Center has been opening its doors since 1993. Laddie Elwell, a former Bemidji State professor, was the first and founding director. She founded HSC with her husband, Jim, who filled the role of Chief Financial Officer (CFO), along with the combined efforts of



many friends acting as the first board of directors and committed volunteers. Twenty-seven years later, the Headwaters Science Center is still going strong.

"It is easy for me to understanding why so many people feel so strongly about the center. People love the way the Science Center engages them in science." The HSC mission is "Science You Can Touch". Laddie established the mission and guests and visitors have been "touching" science ever since.

High Tech Robotic Dairy Field Day on September 22

McIntosh, Minn. (09/07/2021)— University of Minnesota Extension will be hosting a summer field day at Golden Sunrise Dairy, 31328 290 St SW, McIntosh, MN on September 22.

Golden Sunrise Dairy is owned and managed by Tim Rolf and his son, Derek. In 2020, they moved into a new high technology, automated cross ventilated barn featuring the latest in dairy technology. Calves are fed on automatic calf feeders. Cows are milked with Lely A5 milking robots.

Cows and heifers are fed with an automatic feeding system that weighs, mixes and delivers the correct diet to the correct group of animals. In addition, all manure is removed from the pens with a robotic manure removal system.

The Rolfs also grow corn and hay for their livestock. Tim's family also has a farrow to finish swine operation.

Registration begins at 9:30 am with the program from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm, concluding with a lunch. There is no charge for

the field day.

Criminal Conduct Leads to Arrests

On Tuesday, September 7th at approximately 6:05 am, the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office received a call that there appeared to be protesters on

470th Street blocking the road. The initial call reported that they were setting up a tee pee and barrels in the roadway and vehicles could not pass through.

An early estimate of protesters present along the road was between 75-100 people.

Once law enforcement arrived on scene, it was discovered that several items had been placed in the roadway spread out for approximately one mile. The items included a tripod, three 55-gallon barrels filled with concrete, an overturned car, a boat and a group of six people in chairs connected with sleeping dragon devices.

Additional resources were requested through mutual aid including additional officers and extrication teams.

After dispersal orders were given at each location along 470th Street, a total of 23 people were arrested after refusing to leave the area. Six people were attached to the 55-gallon barrels, four people attached to the tri-pod, seven attached or near

the boat and six that were in chairs connected with sleeping dragons. Five individuals that had been at or attached to the overturned car left the scene on their own before extrication teams arrived.

The process to remove the individuals from the objects and sleeping dragons took approximately seven hours to complete. A large mess of debris was left to clean up after the extrications and oil had run onto the ground at the overturned car.

The 23 people arrested were from the following states: Massachusetts, Oregon, Maine, Illinois, South Dakota, Washington DC, New York and Texas.

All the people arrested and booked into local county jails are being held on Probable Cause holds for Public Nuisance and Obstructing Legal Process.

Minnesota Farmers Union applauds USDA action to cover feed transportation costs for farmers, ranchers impacted by drought

ST. PAUL – Minnesota Farmers Union (MFU) applauds USDA for its plans to help farmers and ranchers impacted by drought cover the cost of transporting feed for livestock that rely on grazing, hay or forage.

USDA announced Sept. 8 that it is updating the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees and Farm-raised Fish Program (ELAP) to cover feed transportation costs. Livestock producers will be able to apply for assistance at their local USDA Service Center later this month.

ELAP already covers the cost of hauling water during drought and this change will expand the program beginning in 2021 to cover feed transportation costs where grazing and hay resources have been depleted. This includes places where:

- Drought intensity is D2 for eight consecutive weeks as indicated by the U.S. Drought Monitor;
- Drought intensity is D3 or more; or
- USDA has determined a shortage of local or regional feed availability.

"This is welcome news for farmers and ranchers in Minnesota who have watched their pastures wither this summer," said MFU President

Gary Wertish. "With nearly 37 percent of Minnesota having drought intensity of D3 or more as of Sept. 9, this assistance from USDA is much-needed. As farmers and ranchers continue to access their financial situation as a result of the drought, we will continue to advocate for those who were adversely impacted."

Under the revised USDA policy, eligible ranchers will be reimbursed 60% of feed transportation costs above what would have been incurred in a normal year. A national cost formula, established by USDA, will be used to determine reimbursement costs. More information will be forthcoming from USDA and will be available at fsa.usda.gov/elap.

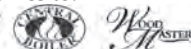

Ask a Trooper

Question: In which direction must a vehicle face to be legally parking along a street or right-of-way?

Answer: The vehicle must face the same direction in which traffic is moving along that side of the street or right-of-way. Vehicles stopped or parked must

have the right-hand wheels parallel with and within 12 inches of the right-hand curb. If there's no curb, the wheels must be to the right of the paved or improved or main-traveled part of the street or highway.

By ordinance on streets and highways under their jurisdiction, local authorities may permit parking of vehicles with the left hand wheels adjacent to and within 12 inches of the left hand

curb of a one-way roadway. Allowing that on state trunk highways requires the consent of the commissioner.

Mackinac Bridge

Saturday., September 11, 2021, an event happened on the Mackinac Bridge. It was the 14th annual tractor crossing. It is a unique and interesting tractor ride. If you are not familiar with a tractor ride, a bunch of tractor fans get together and head down the road with their old tractors. Some rides are long lasting more than a day. Others are short measured in hours or even less. No matter the distance those that love tractors enjoy their jaunt, sitting in the seat of their favorite tractor and enjoying the view of whatever the path they are taking. One episode of my favorite show, Classic Tractor Fever talks about the Mackinac Bridge tractor crossing. This year I heard over 1500 tractors crossed the bridge.

I don't know if you are familiar with the Mackinac Bridge. I was not but learned many facts about the bridge. The Mackinac Bridge connects the upper peninsula of Michigan with the lower peninsula, spanning the strait of Mackinac. It is the fifth longest suspension bridge in the world and the longest in the western hemisphere. Construction began on the bridge on May 7, 1954. It was opened

for use on November 1, 1957. The two main support towers are 552 feet tall. The height of the roadway in the middle of the bridge is 200 feet above the water. All suspension bridges are meant to move to accommodate wind, temperature, and weight. According to the Michigan Department of Transportation(MDOT), the bridge can move up to 35 feet in an east and west direction if the wind was strong enough!!

A man named Bob Baumgras of Owosso Tractor Parts organized the first crossing. In 2007 the Mackinac Bridge Authority granted Owosso Tractor Parts permission to conduct a tractor parade over the bridge. The first year(2007) 614 antique tractors made the crossing, in 2015 over 1000!! In 2017, 1326 tractors crossed the bridge. This year a cap of 1500 tractors was made and reached. It has turned into a huge event. People from many states and even England participated in the crossing. This event takes place in September, pretty hard for a school teacher to get away!! But maybe someday I can make the trip and watch the parade across the Mackinac Bridge!!! One for the bucket list!!

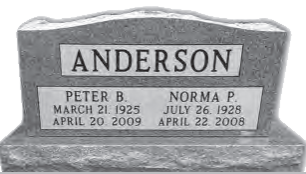

DNR certifies new catch-and-release state record northern pike and tie for muskie

Anglers over the summer caught and released a new Minnesota state record northern pike and tied the record for muskellunge.

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources certified the state catch-and-release record northern pike, a 46 1/4 inch fish caught June 19 on Basswood Lake by Brecken Kobylecky, a 15-year-old from Geneva, Illinois. The previous record was a 45 1/4 inch northern pike caught on the Rainy River in 2018.

The record pike was the biggest fish Kobylecky had ever caught. He was fishing with an Ely-based fishing guide and with about 10 minutes left of their final day fishing, they were trolling for pike.

"We hooked onto a huge pike that was barely hooked, and could hardly land it due

to the sheer size and weight of the fish," Kobylecky said.

Once the fish was in the boat they carefully took a few photos and measured the pike before releasing the fish back to the open water.

"The whole experience went by in a flash but it was an experience of a lifetime I'll never forget," Kobylecky said.

The DNR also certified a 57 1/4 inch muskie caught July 23 on Lake Vermilion by Todd Kirby of Hudson, Wisconsin that tied a 2019 muskie also caught on Lake Vermilion.

With two Vermilion Lake muskies now tied for the state record, this well-known water body continues to prove itself as a top muskie fishing destination. Kirby had fished the lake a handful of times and was familiar with small pockets that muskie seem to in-

habit.

"That Friday night we were up against the weather. There was a huge storm front moving through creating extremely unstable conditions. The humidity was high, and storm clouds were building. It was one of those nights that the fish seemed to be super active, our boat had multiple chases, one resulting in a 48 inch fish in the net — at that time my personal best," Kirby said.

They continued fishing into the night and around 10:30 p.m. he had a large "thud" hit his line hard when his bait was no more than 15 yards from the boat.

"I compared it to reeling in a large moving 'log' and after a few dark splashes, she was in the net. Everything just happened so fast!" Kirby said.

Kirby and fishing partners John and Will Gavic thought the fish looked 50 inches and were amazed seeing they caught a fish even longer, and one that would earn state record status.

"My bait just so happened to be the one that she ate, but that whole night couldn't have been possible without the help of John Gavic and Will Gavic. Muskie fishing is a team effort, and when you have a good team on your side, landing a fish of that caliber creates a memory of a lifetime," Kirby said.
