D & R Grocery sold to Groceries Plus

If you go back to the beginnings of Oklee History, there were two grocery/mercantile business', Melby Bros. and Bergeron's.

Melby Bros. Store was built in 1910 by Ole and his brother, Tom. Tom Melby died shortly after they started the business and Tom's widow, Inga Melby, was a partner for many years. Then Orlo purchased Inga Melby's interest in the 1940's. Ole and Orlo were a father and son partnership until 1970 when Orlo purchased his father's interest. The name was changed to Melby's in the 1940's.

The store was a General Merchandise business and carpet and linoleum were also sold. All types of farm produce were purchased over the years to provide a market for the farmers in the area. Poultry, turkeys, eggs, potatoes, hay, and wool were shipped out in carload lots. A produce truck made weekly trips to the markets of the Iron Range and Duluth, delivering eggs and poultry. In the Dust Bowl days of 1934, 1300 cars of hay were shipped out of Oklee and two-thirds of them were shipped by Melby's.

Ole Melby's philosophy was that if a market was provided for farmers, then the local business would prosper in turn and this proved to be true.

The business was in the family for 69 years and was sold to Richard and Judy Murack in November, 1979. Other owners

were Maynerd & Shirley Peters and Errol & Geri Rustan.

In 1913, Peter Bergeron rented a soft drink parlor from Alphonse Paquin and in 1914 bought the J.O. Tessier General Store. In 1916 he bought the Louis Falardeau building, constructing an addition to it two years later. With considerable remodeling, this building served as Bergeron's store, a Red Owl Agency and general store until 1971 when it changed from Red Owl to L.B. Hartz.

Vern Bergeron had been in business with his parents several year along with his wife Eva Mae, operated the store until 1973, when the business was sold and the building rented by Allen Basinger. The Basingers operated the store as Oklee Hartz Market until July 1977, when the business was bought by Milo and Edith Heden, who continued to lease the building from Eva Mae Bergeron. Considerable inside remodeling and equipment changes were made at this time.

In September 1979, the building was purchased by Milo and Edith Heden. A new store front was added at this time and the name changed to Heden's Hartz.

Since 1979 several remodeling changes have been made to the store and the apartment above the store. Not sure of how many times it changed hands before Dale & Elmer Kolseth ran a grocery store in the building.

In the summer of 1986 Rick

and Debra Sherman purchased Dale's Grocery from Dale and Elmer Kolseth. They changed the name to D & R Grocery and leased the building from Edith Heden.

One of the first improvements was to convert one of the storage rooms into a study and playroom for their four children, Conway, Nicosia, Ryan and Jesse. D & R Grocery's first two part-time workers were Deb's mom Lorraine Cote and Clara Radniecki. Before you knew it, Conway and Nicosia were helping with stocking shelves and running the till. A few years passed and the building was purchased from Mrs. Heden which included the upstairs apartment and storage shed out back.

In 1997 Errol and Geri Rustan agreed to sell Rustan's Grocery to Rick and Deb. This was the original site of the Melby Bros. store built in 1910. After 30 days of remodeling that included roof repair, upgraded air conditioning, refurbished produce cooler, compressors and new video room, etc., D & R Grocery was ready to re-open at it's new location. The original building D & R Grocery started in was sold to Loretta Flatgard and became part of Oklee Quilting Supply, Inc.

A couple of generations has passed now since first turning the key as most customers can testify. With grandchildren popping in and out of the store

at various times, D & R Grocery has truly become an "old-fashioned" mom and pop store. So many friends, family and employees have helped make D & R Grocery a success over the years.

Now Rick & Debbie Sherman are looking forward to retirement. They are excited that Jason Beckett and his family have purchased their store. Jason is the owner of Groceries Plus located in Erskine and plans on expanding his business with this purchase.

Rick and Debbie have been very dedicated businesspeople to the City of Oklee and we will miss their smiling faces when you walked into D & R Grocery to pick up your fixings for supper or your baking needs. They have been open 7 days a week for 35 years.

Rick and Debbie would like to thank all their family, employees and friends that have helped make them successful over the years. And thank you to all who supported their store the past 35 years.

What will Rick and Debbie do now with all this free time? Rick will get to hunt more often, and they will both be able to enjoy spending more time with friends and family. They haven't had a vacation together in 18 years and plan on some doing some traveling too.

MnDOT conducting prescribed burns in northwest Minnesota

BEMIDJI, Minn. — Local residents, motorists and others in Kittson, Marshall and Beltrami Polk counties may see smoke from roadside controlled burns. The prescribed fires are controlled by trained crews and conducted within MnDOT rights of way during optimal weather conditions to ensure safety and effectiveness.

Traffic should not be affected, and all roadways and trails will remain open. When weather conditions allow the prescribed burns will take place in the following locations:

- Beginning October 25, weather permitting:
- Highway 9 near Beltrami (RP 206 to 216)
- Highway 59 Thief River Falls to Lake Bronson
- Highway 75 from Stephen to Warren
- Highway 102 from Crookston to Fertile

The fires are used to improve native vegetation and weed control.

Motorists will encounter signs as they approach the burn

areas warning of the potential of smoke, and weather will be a controlling factor for when they take place. Motorists should be attentive and watch for the burn crews, who are monitoring these efforts. Prescribed burns are scheduled during optimal weather conditions to ensure safety and effectiveness.

MnDOT performs the prescribed burning of grassland vegetation along many roadsides, which provides for optimal vegetation health. Healthy roadside vegetation provides safer clear zones, stabilizes soil, conveys runoff, and treats stormwater runoff. Healthy roadside vegetation also provides additional benefits such as preserving populations of rare species and making roadsides more attractive. Fire also promotes tall native grasses and forbs that trap blowing snow and prevent it from drifting across the road. Native prairie vegetation is planted along highway right of way to reduce the amount of mowing needed, which saves taxpayer money.

Minnesota State Patrol Cadets to Graduate from 63rd Training Academy

The Minnesota State Patrol's core values — respect, integrity, courage, excellence and honor — will be the focus of a ceremony on Friday welcoming 34 women and men as state troopers.

A graduation ceremony was held Friday, October 22 for the cadets following their successful completion of the Minnesota State Patrol's 63rd Training Academy.

The graduates are part of the State Patrol's Law Enforcement Training Opportunity (LETO) program, which is designed to recruit people with no law enforcement experience. The class includes: Five women, Twelve military veterans.

Early detection of breast cancer, expert care lead to positive outcome

Early detection of breast cancer, expert care lead to positive outcome

Hannah Stonehouse Hudson found a lump on her breast during a self-exam last winter.

She met with her doctor at Essentia Health in Fargo, which was followed by a mammogram, ultrasound and biopsy before she was diagnosed with breast cancer.

Hannah, 43, said she was unsure what to expect when she went in for a double mastectomy in February. But she felt well taken care of by everyone at Essentia, from her doctor, surgeon, oncologist and nurse navigator to all the nurses who helped her when she was hospitalized.

"My nurses were amazing," she said. "They took such good care of me. They were the people that were there for me. I knew that I was going to be well taken care of. They made sure that I knew that. They made me feel

like I was the only one there. They didn't make me feel like I was bothering them or that I was just another room to check on."

Hannah says she feels fortunate. She opted for a double mastectomy based on her family history, but she was able to avoid radiation and chemotherapy. Her tumor was sent for testing and was determined to be stage 2 cancer. She says there is a low chance that her cancer will return.

"I try to focus on the positives," she said. "Yes, I had breast cancer. Yes, I had a double mastectomy. But I had a doctor who jumped right on it. I had wonderful care. I can't control that it happened. I can't control any of it. I'm sad and I grieve it. I lost a part of my body. I mourned that. But I am also trying to switch my way of thinking. Part of my self-care is being grateful for the great care

I received."

Hannah says she put off getting a mammogram. She said she plans to help raise awareness of breast cancer and encourage women to get mammograms to promote early detection.

Minnesota Starwatch for November 2021

Watching November's evening planets from night to night is akin to watching a slow-motion chase. Venus comes out in the setting sun's afterglow and barely seems to budge all month long. But not so Saturn and brilliant Jupiter. After nightfall you can watch them close in on Venus as they head toward the horizon.

Will the two giant planets catch up to the brighter but much smaller Venus? Alas, no. Before year's end, Venus begins a rapid drop from the evening sky, leaving Saturn and Jupiter behind.

While you're watching Saturn and Jupiter, notice the lone bright star low and to the left of the planets. This is Fomalhaut, the only bright star in Piscis Austrinus, the southern fish. Above and to the right of Saturn and Jupiter, the Summer Triangle of bright stars still shines, though lately it has tipped on its side a bit. A waxing moon visits

Saturn on the 10th and Jupiter on the 11th. On the 12th, the moon shines above Fomalhaut.

In the morning sky, Mercury briefly appears very low in the east-southeast during the first few days of the month. On the 3rd, if you catch Mercury just as dawn starts to break, you may spot a very thin old moon above the planet.

The Leonid meteor shower is predicted to peak the morning of the 17th or 18th, but a nearly full moon will interfere for most of the night. November's full moon rises in the afternoon on the 18th, with fullness arriving at 3 a.m. on the 19th. The full moon also undergoes a near-total eclipse, entering Earth's umbra at 1:18 a.m. and exiting at 4:47 a.m. The maximum eclipse occurs at 3:03 a.m. That night the moon travels the sky followed closely by the Pleiades star cluster, with the panoply of bright winter stars bringing up the rear.

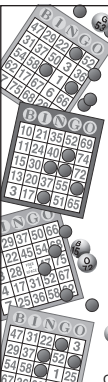

Question: Why is it legal for trucks hauling turkeys to spread feathers everywhere?

Answer: According to state law, drivers carrying turkeys do not need to provide a fencing around the vehicle to keep the feathers from escaping.

Minnesota law also allows exemptions to motor vehicles operated by a farmer or the

farmer's agent when transporting produce such as small grains, shelled corn, soybeans, or other farm produce of a size and density not likely to cause injury to persons or damage to property on escaping in small amounts from a vehicle.

Turkey feathers are not the size and density likely to cause injury to anyone or damage any property as they escape in small amounts. If you see items not fitting that (i.e. sugar beets,

potatoes, etc.) please report the hazard so it can be addressed and corrected.

Massey Harris-Ferguson

For a while I subscribed to The Massey Harris Ferguson Legacy Quarterly. Being one of my favorite tractors is a 55 Massey Harris, I thought it would be a fun read. I was right. Another feature of the Massey Harris line is their advertising. I love looking at old Massey advertising.

Massey-Harris Co. was formed in Toronto with the merger of Massey Mfg. and A. Harris, Son & Co. in 1891. In 1892 Massey-Harris Co. bought 40 percent of the Sawyer Co. and renamed the company Sawyer-Massey.

Massey-Harris later purchased J.I. Case Plow Works, Racine, Wisconsin, in 1927, selling the J.I Case name to J.I. Case Threshing Machine Co. In 1928, Massey-Harris entered the tractor market with its Wal-lis tractor.

Massey Harris-Ferguson was created through the merger of the Massey Harris and Ferguson Companies in 1952. Both Massey Harris and Ferguson kept separate lines of tractors until 1958 when the tractor lines were united under the new name of simply Massey Ferguson.

After World War II Massey Harris passed many of the other companies in equipment sales, but only sold half of the tractors that John Deere did and John Deere was second after International Harvester. But, by the mid-1960's Massey Ferguson would be the biggest seller of farm equipment in the world!! In 1997, Massey Ferguson was

being sold in 140 countries around the world and was the leading tractor manufacturer for the 35th consecutive year. Now a subsidiary of AGSCO, Massey Ferguson continues to be a major seller around the world. Now I don't know much about world wide sales, but I am happy I have a couple 55 Mas-seys sitting in my yard!!

Did you know?

Indebtedness is often discussed in terms related to debtors' short- and long-term financial health, but debt also can have an adverse effect on individuals' mental health. A 2014 study published in the journal BMC Public Health examined the effects of debt in the aftermath of the global financial crisis that began in 2007 and extended into 2008. The authors of the study found that individuals with unmet loan payments had suicidal ideation and suffered from depression more often than those without such financial problems. The 33 peer-reviewed studies examined by the authors of the 2014 study covered various types of debts, including medical debts, mortgages and credit card debt. Each type of debt produced negative health consequences, though individuals who failed to pay their mortgage or had their homes repossessed reported an especially high prevalence of mental and physical health impairments.

Pet-friendly fabrics to try at home

Maintaining a pet-friendly household requires contending with a certain measure of dirt, dander and fur. It's often a sacrifice made for the immeasurable benefits that come from having companion animals. Even when their owners are especially careful, pets can do some damage around the house. Homeowners can mitigate potential problems by choosing largely pet-proof furniture fabrics.

• **Woven fabrics:** Fabrics that have visual texture or subtle patterns can help disguise stains and make pet hair less noticeable. Opt for a color similar to a pet's fur color to further camouflage shed hair. Pet owners should know that cats may get their claws stuck in certain woven fabrics.

• **Leather and faux leather:** Many pet owners like that leather and faux leather products are nonabsorbent and resistant to stains, odors and punctures. In addition, fur won't cling to leather and similar fabrics easily, making them a better choice for those with dander and fur allergies.

• **Microfiber:** Microfiber is tightly woven, making it a good option for durable, high-end elegance. Dirt and dust cannot penetrate the fabric, and cats are less likely to get their claws into this fabric. Some microfibers are odor- and stain-resistant as well, though spills will need to be mopped up quickly. One concern with microfiber is the material tends to hold onto pet fur. As a result, owners may spend ample time vacuuming shed hair.

• **Synthetic materials:** Polyester, acrylic or nylon materials can stand up to wear and tear longer than others, so they may be appealing if pets will be allowed on the furniture. Durable fabrics also can be wiped clean with a cloth.

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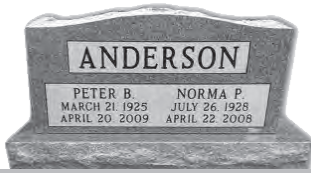

Obituary for Richard Widseth

Richard Alton "Dick" Widseth, 89, of Crookston, MN, passed away early Friday morning, October 15, 2021, with family at his side.

Dick was born in Gonvick, MN, on August 10, 1932, the son of Albert and Emily (Peterson) Widseth. He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith, and grew up in Gonvick and McIntosh, MN, before following in the footsteps of his father and five uncles by attending high school at the Northwest School of Agriculture, the fore-runner of today's University of Minnesota Crookston campus. The UMC football field is named after his favorite uncle, Ed Widseth, an All-American for the U of M Gophers who played professionally for the New York Giants, where he was an All-Pro and 1938 MVP of the league. Dick played football and basketball for the Aggies, graduating from the Northwest School with the Class of 1949. It was there that he met the love of his life and future bride, Clarice Mae Thureen, a beautiful young lady from East Grand Forks, MN.

Dick enrolled at the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks where he entered the School of Engineering, played Sioux football, and was captain of the team during his senior year. He became an excellent amateur pilot through training he received in the University's ROTC program and was named Top Cadet in his class. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from UND in 1954. Dick was united in marriage to his sweetheart, Clarice, on August 23, 1953, in the Bethesda Lutheran Church in East Grand Forks. Through the coming years their union would be blessed by the births of Cynthia, Tamra, Jennifer, Jeffrey, and Gregory. Dick's career as a construction and consulting engineer took him, Clarice, and their growing family around northwest Minnesota, and then to Mason City, IA, as City Engineer. In 1965, he returned to Crookston as City Engineer before becoming manager of the Crookston branch of Webster, Foster, and Weston, a Grand Forks consulting engineering firm. In 1975, he started his own engineering firm with Howard Smith and Donald Nolting. As founding partner and president of Widseth Smith Nolting & Associates, Inc., he led a design and consulting firm that grew to include 200 employees and 9 offices across Minnesota and North Dakota. He took particular pride in the design of a new water system for the City of Crookston, which used simple gravity to bring water from the aquifer 20 miles east of town—a system that serves the city to this day. In 1986, he helped develop and became general manager of American Aerostar Corp., a Danish wind energy company, eventually leading the reorganization of that entity into Phoenix Industries. Following his retirement and Clarice's passing on November 4, 1996, Dick moved to Bemidji to work part-time for Kraus-Anderson

Construction, before returning to Crookston in 2012.

Dick and Clarice cherished their relationship with the Northwest School where they met, and every June found them attending annual alumni gatherings and hosting old friends in their home. For 3 years, Dick served as president of the NWSA Alumni Association, where he helped start the Heritage Fund and was involved in the renovation of the White House Alumni Center. In 2014, he was named NWSA's Top Aggie, the highest honor bestowed by the association to recognize alumni who have displayed exemplary commitment and service to community, church, education, family, or in their occupational field. He was a longtime member of Trinity Lutheran Church, was active in the American Society of Professional Engineers, Rotary Club, and Chamber of Commerce, and served as President of Crookston Jobs. He and Clarice were active volunteers in the community, involved in numerous volunteer organizations and charitable and public service events. Recognizing their history of service, in 1985 the City of Crookston named them Volunteers of the Year.

Whatever the season—deer, duck, pheasant, grouse, walleye and northern, or sunfishing with the Aggies, graduating from the Northwest School with the Class of 1949. 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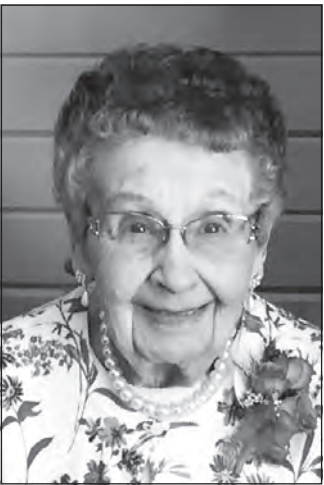
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Obituary for Janis Wikstrand
