"Let's Talk Crops" with free webinar series

Itasca's Evening Lantern Lit Snowshoe Walk

Saturday, January 8, 2022 from 5 – 7:30 p.m., come –and–go at your leisure

Start at the Mary Gibbs Mississippi Headwaters Center. Lighted trails include Schoolcraft Trail and trail to Mississippi Headwaters

Gerald Dyrdaahl Pine Lake Memorial postponement speculations

The Gerald Dyrdaahl Pine Lake Memorial race had been postponed until January 8-9, 2022. We appreciate all the support from everyone involved as we worked through this situation.

Many speculations behind the delay have been posted on various social media platforms so I have decided that we need to explain in detail how this decision ultimately came to be:

With all of our event permit applications we have to also have a Covid Protocol in place if there is a positive case or exposure and how we would handle the situation; in addition to including this with our event permits to state and local agencies we also have to include this for a few of our sponsors.

We were notified one crew member had a family member test positive for Covid and our protocol requires the affected crew member quarantine, recently CDC changed those requirements from 10 days to 5, so this member was advised to

not attend the Jan 1-2 event.

Wednesday evening a person living in my home tested positive, we immediately called 5 Star Promotions to notify them of this and placed calls with ISR. After these conversations we had a second test to confirm this was not a false positive, which it was not. We then again spoke to ISR and discussed what our options are as this affected 5 more crew members and 4 were required to quarantine. Due to liability with insurance and risk of future permits if we violate our own Covid protocols, we called 5 Star Promotions again to inform them of the guidance we were given, unfortunately it was not just something we could fix by bringing in outside personnel to run the event due to potential liabilities if something was to happen.

We are now working with ISR on policies for this same scenario for future as many roles that needed to be back-filled for this weekends event

had to have ISR training. As a group we have backups in place, but how this situation unfolded with the holidays many of us were together.

This is a scenario that was worst case scenario for Covid and revealed an issue that we are now addressing for future events and having back ups to the back ups.

As we all work through this new world of restrictions, I know first hand gut reactions are always upsetting but ultimately we had to make a decision that protected not only future events, venues, sponsors, racers, and fans but also the series and being able to pull permits from government agencies.

I hope everyone has a safe New Years and will still be coming to future events, we all need to work together for the future of cross country racing.

Klobuchar and Phillips announce Expo Bid

WASHINGTON – U.S. Senator Amy Klobuchar (D-MN) and Representative Dean Phillips (D-MN) announced that President Biden has signed legislation into law authorizing funding for the U.S.'s participation in international fairs and expositions abroad, which could include building a U.S. pavilion at the 2025 World Expo in Osaka, Japan.

This follows the Biden administration's approval to grant federal recognition to Minnesota's proposal to host a Specialized World Expo in 2027. Titled "Expo 2027 Minnesota – Healthy People, Healthy Planet: Wellness and Well-Being for All," this event would bring the world together to showcase

the best of innovation and accomplishment in health and wellness, including highlighting the Upper Midwest's important contributions in this field.

Construction of a U.S. pavilion at the Osaka World Expo is a prerequisite to securing Minnesota's bid to host a Specialized World Expo in 2027.

"There's no better place to showcase the exchange of ideas and American ingenuity than Minnesota," said Klobuchar. "The enactment of this legislation helps us get one step closer to highlighting our state's strong offerings in health and wellness to the world. I'm proud of Minnesota's leadership in this sector, and I will continue working to ensure we have the

opportunity to show off the very best Minnesota and the country have to offer the world."

"World Expos are opportunities to strengthen our international relationships and showcase American innovation on the world stage," said Phillips. "This is exactly how Congress should work - Republicans and Democrats on main street and in Congress coming together to bring commerce and ideas right to our doorstep."

Essentia Health's top baby names of 2021

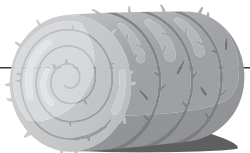

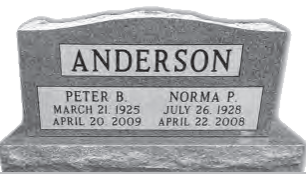

At an auction I had years ago there was an M Farmall with a loader, but it had a beefed up wide front for handling bales. I did an article a couple of years ago about my neighbor, Einar Kvasager, and his brother Bjarne who hooked a WD9 McCormick with a 44 Massey to make a 4 wheel drive tractor. Einar also has a reversed Allis Chalmers with a John Deere snowblower attached. It is quite a nice machine! We all probably have done or know someone who has tried some type of modification to make a better tractor.

A few years ago at the WM-STR in Rollag, MN, they feature on farm inventions, especially many different tractor hook ups. Some were tractors that were basically built on the farm while others were different ways to hook more than one tractor together. Of course if you follow any of that kinds of engineering you have probably seen or at least heard of Don Dufner's inventions. The triple D John Deere hookup or the 830 Special(3 830 John Deeres hooked together with the middle unit featuring a sound guard cab). Oh and many more.

As I was scrolling through Facebook on one of the many tractor pages I have joined, an incredibly interesting(to me) tractor picture came up. It was an A John Deere with a loader. Cool, I have a few A John Deeres, but this one was different. The front end was heavy duty! Late A rear end, block, head and tin work. The orbit steering unit is from a 105 JD combine and runs off the 60 live hydraulic pump through a flow divider to allow the remote to function as normal. Basketball: From small town to big time

When the weather cools, the action heats up on basketball courts across the country. Basketball is a popular winter sport that has been ingrained in North American culture since its inception in the late 19th century.

Basketball is believed to have originated at Springfield College (once known as the International YMCA Training School) in Massachusetts. Male students were restless once football season ended and needed a sport that could provide exercise and help them work off steam. A physical activity instructor named James Naismith was tasked with coming up with a game that students could play indoors under artificial light without the roughness of foot-

ball, soccer or rugby.

Naismith came up with a game that employed peach baskets nailed to the lower rail of the gymnasium balcony - one at each end. He then came up with the initial 13 rules of moving a ball across the court and getting the ball in the baskets and what constituted fouls, according to Springfield College.

The first game consisted of nine players on each team because Naismith's class included just 18 students. The final score of the inaugural basketball was just 1-0, but over time players began to excel at basketball, and the game gradually became more popular.

Basketball is now popular across the globe. The National Basketball Association has

opened 12 international offices and has started broadcasting games to more than 200 countries and territories. NBA Commissioner Adam Silver said in 2018 that he believes that basketball can be the No. 1 sport in the world (soccer currently holds that ranking). Young people are increasingly playing the sport, and rapid growth in China and India also has fueled basketball's popularity.

Total NBA revenue hit \$8 billion last season, according to Forbes, and it shows no signs of slowing down. Little did James Naismith know when he put up peach baskets and tossed a soccer ball that his sport would one day become a global phenomenon.

Ask a Trooper

Question: My wife slid off the state highway

this morning. She came to a stop in the median ditch, unhurt but rattled - only needing to be pulled out. When she called me I told her to call the State Patrol and stay in the car until you arrived. What is the right procedure to follow when a driver ends up stuck in the ditch? Do you contact the towing company or is that the responsibility of the stuck driver?

Answer: First of all, I am glad she is all right. Secondly, thank you for the email as this is a great topic. Minnesota State Troopers have responded to approximately 6,916 vehicles that have slid off the highway in 2021 and needed assistance. This does not include crashes, motorist assists and other calls for service.

If you slide off the highway, the first thing a person should do is assess the situation.

- Is anyone injured? If so, call "911" immediately.
- Are you in a safe or dangerous location? Generally, it is best to stay in your vehicle as it will offer you some protection.
- Is your vehicle partially on

the highway in the traffic lane? Are you on the bad side of a hill or curve? If so, you and your occupants might be safer leaving the vehicle. However, do not stand on the highway. Find a location that is safe and far off the highway.

After it is safe and reasonable, please report the incident as soon as possible. Be prepared to give your location and a brief description of what happened.

If you are stuck in snow, mud or for whatever reason, you can call a tow truck or ask the dispatcher to have them send one. If you do call a tow, tell the appropriate law enforcement agency (State Patrol/Sheriff/Police) to help prevent doubling

up and keeping responding resources available for others.

State Troopers and other law enforcement agencies will help with traffic control and provide scene safety as the tow truck operators go to work. Even for a vehicle breakdown or flat tire, call in and we will do our best to respond and help keep everyone safe.
