She kept the crowd of over 100 attendees enjoying Scandinavian humor, no partiality here as she is 50% Norwegian and 50% Swedish. It was a great way to lighten up and enjoy the day. After a two-year break from this event, due to COVID, it was good to be able to laugh and enjoy being community with guests from Bemidji on the East to Fosston on the West and of course those good Scandinavian ones from “Nort” of Gonvick.

Bonnie Underdahl, President of FLC WELCA, welcomed the guests, many first timers, that were able to navigate the excess rain that had fallen during the night. The fellowship hall was welcoming with blue and yellow tablecloths, showing our support for Ukraine, with a white lace overlay. Table toppers with a gnome theme showcased a terra cotta flowerpot of greens and small gnomes, staying with our Scandinavian theme. The little gnomes made by Marilyn Melby were a table favor attendees were able to take home and enjoy.

Pastor Mark Olson led the group in a devotion using the story of the hemorrhaging women that touched Jesus’ cloak and the power that it created. There were table favors of a pocket prayer shawl that people were invited to hold as he led everyone in prayer and for them to take home to use in their prayer life.

Muff Magelssen and Signe Bergesen led us in the Norwegian table grace followed by an English translation that all prayed.

The delicious brunch featured a wild rice seafood salad, fruit cup, tender cloverleaf rolls and a brownie for dessert. The servers, “Men of Faith”, dressed in their sparkling white shirts and black bow ties looked dapper as they attended to the diners needs.

Many varied door prizes were given out as the finale of the brunch and visitors were encouraged to look at the mission and quilt displays.

It was not only the fellowship fall that looked great, the pews in the sanctuary were draped with 108 colorful pieced quilts that have been completed in the last few years. On our mission day we have people from Faith joined

with members from Bethel, Landstad and Zion to complete our various mission projects. Thank you to Adeline Wooliscroft with her passion for making the majority of quilts over many years. This will be her last year as she is forced to retire from this mission due to failing eye sight. Her masterpieces and willingness will be missed. In addition to the quilts the sanctuary altar rail was adorned with nearly 20 crocheted or knitted prayers shawls. Our principal creator of shawls is Sandy Bromaghin, a member of Landstad church in Shevlin. It really is a community doing God’s work with our hands. Those in attendance were given the opportunity to stroll through the display of quilts and shawls and some even found some to buy. The proceeds from the quilt sales help purchase the needed supplies to keep this mission alive. The prayer shawls are used locally to support people with TLC and wrap them in God’s love. A few quilts are distributed locally as in the case of fire but the majority are sent through LWR (Lutheran World Relief) to foreign countries. We have been notified by LWR that are various mission kits and quilts have been sent to Thailand, Angola, Peru, Pakistan, Ukraine, Guatemala, Syria and Burkina Faso in West Africa. They recently acknowledged our giving by saying, “accept our thanks, you blanket the world with love. You pack up compassion and

send it into a world full of need. You give help and comfort to our neighbors with the very least when they need it most.”

Our net proceeds from this years “Ode to Spring” are being earmarked for Ukraine mission relief. The following is a report from Lutheran Disaster Response. “On February 24, Russian forces invaded Ukraine, launching land, sea and air attacks. Airports are now shut, and few railway lines are operational. Civilians fleeing the violence are heading toward Ukraine’s western districts and such neighboring countries as Poland, Moldova, Slovakia, Romania and Hungary. About 5 million people are seeking refuge in neighboring countries. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many of these Ukrainians fleeing their home need shelter, basic necessities and pastoral care. Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits.”

## IDEA competition names winners

April 26, 2022 (Bemidji, MN) – The 14th season of the IDEA Competition has named its winners.

The IDEA Competition, which is run and coordinated by the Northwest Small Business Development Center, was designed for one purpose — to grow the economy of Northwest Minnesota by outfitting the next generation of home-grown innovators for success in the global marketplace. The program identifies the most promising ideas and entrepreneurs through a competitive process, awards cash and in-kind awards to winners, and provides intensive follow-up assistance.

Megan Pederson, of Fertile, is the overall winner of this season’s competition. She won \$10,000 in cash for her idea, Community Voice, a mobile app intended to serve communities by increasing community engagement, increasing transparency among community leaders, and connecting people to services.

Also as part of her prize package, Pederson was named the 2022 Minnesota Cup semifinalist for Northwest Minnesota and will have the option of competing in that state-wide competition as well. Minnesota Cup is a public-private partnership that supports Minnesota entrepreneurs through an annual competition that connects participants with education, mentorship, and support to launch and accelerate their new ventures.

“Supporting and rewarding local innovators is what the IDEA Competition is all about,” said Mic McCrory, a program specialist with the Northwest Minnesota Foundation who serves as program coordinator. “We are thrilled with the variety of ideas that we considered this year, and these three winners represent the best of Northern Minnesota innovation.”

The runners-up in the IDEA Competition won a variety of awards of well.

Kenna, Chloe, and Rocky Cook, of Bemidji, won \$4,000 in cash and an in-kind award from Evolve Creative that provides up to \$2,500 in marketing services. The trio’s idea expands on their development

and sale of dryer balls from alpaca fibers and organic soil enhancers from alpaca manure. The whole family operates Cook Family Farm, but this specific venture is driven by Kenna, 18, Chloe, 16, and Rocky, 15.

Merlin Olson, of Lengby, won \$1,000 in cash, as well as in-kind awards. His idea for the Motor-grader Debris Blower involves a debris blower that can be attached to a road grader, allowing debris to be quickly and easily cleared from roadways.

His in-kind awards include:  
• \$5,000 worth of engineering and technical writing services from LVI Supply  
• \$5,000 worth of patent and trademark legal services

through HSML Law in Minneapolis

• \$5,000 worth of services through IDEA Works for general consulting, including advanced business planning, facility acquisition, and vendor selection

Sixteen participants competed in this year’s IDEA Competition. Upon entry, each entrepreneur is registered with the Northwest Minnesota Small Business Development Center and is partnered with an SBDC consultant, who provides guidance and expert assistance throughout the development their idea.

Since its inception, the IDEA Competition has awarded more than \$465,000 in cash prizes and \$50,000 in in-kind awards.

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## Wagon Wheel Ridge In Dispute With State Environmental Agencies

Karlstad, MN – April 28, 2022 – Wagon Wheel Ridge (WWR) and its owner, Mr. Glen Brazier, are currently involved in disputes with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MN DNR), the Kittson Soil and Water Conservation District (Kittson SWCD) and the Minnesota Board of Soil and Water Resources. The disputes are primarily over a ditch and cul-

vert that was dredged on WWR property for the purpose of relieving the nearby community of Karlstad, MN, of excess water that historically backed up into the city and surrounding area. They also served as a fire break to protect the community against potential wildfires. Karlstad was impacted by a devastating wildfire in 2012 in which Mr. Brazier lost several structures himself.

The state is now ordering Mr. Brazier to dam the culvert and fill in the ditch. This is all in reference to their claim that the ditch is in violation of wetlands regulations. Wagon Wheel Ridge is currently in the administrative appeal process with the Kittson SWCD. In addition, WWR also filed a Minnesota district court case alleging an unlawful search of Mr. Brazier's property. Specifically, WWR alleges that the MN DNR and the Kittson SWCD conducted an unlawful search using intrusive drilling operations at WWR, despite Mr. Brazier's specific instructions that no drilling take place on his private land.

If forced to dam up the ditch at this point, the current floodwater surrounding the community of Karlstad, MN, (as displayed in the photographs provided) would prove itself to be continuously present. In the event that flooding conditions take place, this water would increase in scale beyond that of its current state, putting Karlstad and the surrounding area at significant risk. It would also put the community at extreme risk of potential wildfires once again.

This unfortunate situation is no longer feasible due to the negative impact it will have on the community of Karlstad. In addition to the impact on Karlstad, Mr. Brazier maintains that his rights have been violated as a private landowner.

University of Minnesota Extension will be offering Youth Tractor and Farm Safety Certification at six locations across the state in 2022. The youth tractor and farm safety certification program provides youth 14 years and older the opportunity to learn about safe equipment operation and general farm safety. Students who complete this program will receive a U.S. Department of Labor certificate of training. This certificate is required for 14- and 15-year-olds who wish to work with equipment with over 20 horsepower off of their family farm or homestead. Frost zones and restricted routes are on the MnDOT load limits map.

Ask a Trooper

Question: My daughter just got in a crash recently. Nobody got hurt but it got us talking on how important it is to know what to do after something like this. Can you write about that?

Answer: The first and most important thing to do after you've been involved in a crash is to get to a safe place. Worry less about "preserving the scene" for law enforcement and more about protecting yourself and your car from further damage, especially if you're on a highway or interstate. For the latter, this could mean driving (if possible) to the nearest off-ramp or underpass. If your car isn't drivable, stay inside it, but move to the passenger's side, so that there's more room between you and traffic.

Once you're safe, call 911. Even if the crash seems minor, you'll need a police report for your insurance company. Once first responders are on the way, you can start talking to the other driver. Be courteous - you've both been through a traumatic situation - but don't talk fault. Instead, exchange information.

- Name
- Address

- Phone number
- License plate number
- Driver's license number
- Insurance company name
- Insurance policy number

Then take pictures, both of the damage itself and of the accident scene (but again, try to do so safely). Once you've done that, first responders should be there, and then you can start filling out a crash report.

Once you have a report number, you can call your insurance company. And if you can, see a medical professional. You may feel okay right after the crash, but injuries can show up after the adrenalin wears off.

The best way to deal with a crash is to make sure it never happens in the first place. So be sure to put your away distractions when you drive, find a sober ride if you've been drinking, obey all speed limits, and wear your seatbelt.

## Northern state forest roads, trails flooded by spring rains

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources cautions state forest road and trail users to watch for flooding and damage in the northern third of the state as a result of recent spring rain and seasonal snow melt.

Before traveling on state forest roads, users are urged to check the state forest road closure page of the DNR website ([mndnr.gov/TrailConditions](http://mndnr.gov/TrailConditions)) and proceed with caution even if roads are listed as open.

"Some areas of northern Minnesota received heavy rain last weekend and more rain is forecasted for this weekend. With ground conditions still frozen, we're finding several forest roads completely under water, and others with wash-outs and culvert failures," said Matt Huseby, roads program coordinator for the DNR Forestry Division. "The vast nature of our state forest road and trail system coupled with rapidly changing flood conditions may mean users will encounter flooding and damage before we're aware of it. So, users should be alert for unsafe conditions and use caution."

To stay safe on state forest roads and trails:

- Don't travel on flooded roads. Hazards can be hidden under floodwater.
- Obey forest road and trail closures and signs. Don't drive around barricades.
- Pay attention to vehicle weight restrictions.
- Report unsafe conditions to the local area DNR Forestry office ([mndnr.gov/Contact/Localator.html](http://mndnr.gov/Contact/Localator.html)).

For information on road and trail closures, visit the state forest road closure page. New closures are added as conditions warrant. Temporary road and trail closure information is updated weekly on Thursdays by 2 p.m. Temporary closure signs also will be posted at entry points and parking lots. Roads that can handle vehicle traffic during the spring thaw will remain open but might have vehicle weight restrictions.

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## MnDOT conducts aerial photography on Highways 2 and 75 near Fosston and Crookston

Residents asked not to disturb temporary targets

Bemidji, Minn. – The Minnesota Department of Transportation is asking residents not to disturb aerial photography targets as crews begin aerial mapping in northwestern Minnesota. Landowners in the area that will have targets placed on or near their property will be contacted directly. Weather permitting, work will begin mid-May. The mapping will take place in the following locations:

- Highway 2- in the city of Fosston
- Highways 2 and 75 – from two miles southwest of Eldred to Highway 2 in the city of Crookston

The aerial survey process relies on clear observations, and must be conducted after the leaves fall and before it snows. To begin the process crews place an "X" on the ground as a reference point for the aerial photographer.

Aerial mapping is used to create a record of existing infrastructure and landscape along MnDOT right of way for transportation planning and highway design. In order to obtain accurate aerial mapping, MnDOT crews paint large white "X" targets on paved surfaces, and place plastic or fabric "X" targets on unpaved surfaces.

A survey crew then records the coordinate position and elevation of the temporary targets for the aerial photography company. The plastic and fabric targets are temporary and will be removed when the photography is completed.
