Capital Credit Checks Coming from Garden Valley Technologies

[Erskine, MN May 2022] In May, Garden Valley Technologies issued more than 17,500 checks to members totaling approximately \$1.5 million in allocated capital credits. This capital credit payout repre-

sents a percentage of the capital credits allocated for 2002 and 2021. Capital credits are one of the many benefits of being a GVT member. Because co-ops operate at cost, any excess rev-

enues (called margins) are allocated and retired to members in the form of capital credits. "As a member-owned cooperative, it's rewarding to see these dollars go back to people in our local communities," explains

Timothy Brinkman, CEO/General Manager of GVT. "Unlike a private company or corporation, our members earn money back for every dollar they spend with us." Garden Valley Technologies

has paid out over \$18-million of capital credits over the last 15 years to our member owners. In addition to providing residential and business members with advanced integrated

Groundbreaking held for Ombimindwaa Gidanawemaaganinaadog

On Tuesday May 10, 2022... oh, around noon, a groundbreaking ceremony and celebration was due to commence for Ombimindwaa Gidanawemaaganinaadog, Red Lake's New Intergenerational Service Building. Several visitors from architects to county social service workers came from Bemijigamaag and elsewhere to join the Red Lake Tribal Council, tribal staff, community members, and honored guests.

Ombimindwaa Gidanawemaaganinaadog translates to English as Uplifting our Relatives. It was formerly known as Children and Family Services.

Visitors coming to Ogaakaaning (Place of walleye) aka Red Lake Village, were directed to turn north between the old... and new... Red Lake Trading Posts. Turn toward the lake known locally as Miskwaagamiiwizaaga'iganing. (Lake of Red Liquid) If travelers looked about they saw lots of new and exciting things. They saw new construction. They saw a widened Highway #2 with turn lanes, curbs and street lights. Red Lake Nation did not sit idle during the pandemic.

Mino-Giizhigad! (It is a good day) It was the warmest day of the year so far at 72 degrees, a clear sky met the lake horizon. There, overlooking the south shore of the Sacred Lake, work had already begun. Perhaps 20

laborers worked on the footings and foundation of the building. Cars parked bumper to bumper on each side of the road hinted a good crowd.

Entering the area, hills of dirt were piled high to the east. To the west four cabana like tents covered heavy hors d'oeuvres, salads, fruits, fruit drinks and water to be served after the ceremony. To the north in front of the construction was a podium surrounded by flowers and a balloon arch.

While waiting for members of the tribal council to break from their monthly meeting, Little Bear Drum sang several songs.

Meanwhile, the land and water were acknowledged in a traditional way through ceremony, smudge, pipe, and drum. Fred Desjarlait Jr., Spiritual Advisor spoke about the importance of the day. "We want our ancestors to know what we were doing and why we are doing it. I asked the Creator and our ancestors to bless what we are doing for future generations."

Upon the arrival of members of the Tribal Council, Ombimindwaa Executive Director

Cheri Goodwin lip pointed saying "Ambe omaa," (come here) pointing to the chairs out front.

Goodwin, clearly excited, proceeded to thank all who made the day possible, tribal council, state and federal governments, site workers, and staff.

Tribal Chairman Darrell G. Seki, Sr., emphasized the importance of all working together. "Chi Miigwech to Cheri Goodwin and her staff...all the ones behind the scenes... for doing what you have to do to get this building going, and all of you, and the whole tribal council. Working together we create many opportunities for you, our tribal members, of the great Red Lake Nation."

Tribal Secretary Samuel R. Strong also spoke highlighting the importance of utilizing the strength of community, the strength of the elders, and the strength of the lake for healing. "This is a place for our families to heal. We always talk about intergenerational healing and this is where it's going to happen."

Polk County septic system fix-up grant program

Polk County Environmental Services is pleased to announce the availability of a cost-share grant program that is available to property owners in Polk County that have an existing noncompliant septic system. Funds are intended to fix septic systems that are currently failing codes or functionality. These dollars are made possible through a grant received from the Minnesota Clean Water Legacy Act.

There is a limited amount of funding available and preference for funding will be determined based on household

income status, condition of existing system, and proximity to priority surface waters. Income restrictions do apply. A major goal within the fix-up program aims to fix "imminent public health threats". Polk County uses HUD low-income guidelines to group funding grant contributions.

Households must not exceed these income guidelines, must be the landowners homestead not a second dwelling or rental, and applicants will be required to pay any match requirement upfront if approved. No holding tank septic systems can

be installed and SSTs for new construction of a dwelling does not qualify for the program. The County will provide a cost share grant contributing 60% and up to 80% of installation cost up to a maximum of \$12,000 grant dollars.

This year, 619 names will be engraved onto the walls of the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington, DC. There were 427 officers killed in the line of duty in 2021 and an additional 147 officers who lost their lives in previous years. These will be added to the nearly 24,000 killed in the line of duty already memorialized there. Please join us as we come together to pay tribute to our fallen in a livestreamed Candlelight Vigil. You can watch from anywhere in the world as the names of those brave men and women are read aloud in respect, honor, and remembrance.

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of Saturday, May 21 between nine and noon; just in time for local gardeners to plant on Memorial Day. Options exist in these sales that allow the home gardener to reach out and try some new varieties.

The Beltrami County Master Gardeners and the Bemidji Garden Club will be having their 30th annual plant sale at the 4H building on the Beltrami County Fairgrounds. This sale is known locally for having excellent herbaceous (not woody) perennial flowers that have been grown locally by the best gardeners in Beltrami County. They are plants that performed so well in our own soil and climate that they have to be divided and sent out to other gardens. There will also be bedding plants including heirloom varieties grown from the seed that are difficult to find. I will bring some Tithonia, (Mexican Sunflowers) and Lavatera (Rose Mallow) which you may not find anywhere else. Expect also to find plants that attract bees and butterflies.

The Bemidji Foot Shelf will have their 7th annual plant sale this year in the Bemidji Industrial Park at 1260 Exchange Ave. SE. They will have herbs, flowering plants, hanging baskets and vegetables like peppers, squash and many types of tomatoes grown by Chris and Kelly at the winter greenhouse and other locations. There is also an open house of the food shelf facility and their garden and greenhouse going on at the same time.

The Senior Center at 216



3rd Street NW in Bemidji will have their 4th annual plant sale. At ten o'clock there will be a gardening class on Tomatoes, composting, and growing cucumbers and other vines. You will find a great variety of annuals and perennials here along with probably the best selection of houseplants to be found on this day. The plants have been grown by senior citizens along with the many crafts that they also sell at the Center.

And now we just received word that there is a fourth sale on this day. The Shevlin Garden Club is having their spring plant sale at the Horticulture Building at the Clearwater County Fairgrounds in Bagley on Saturday. It is also from 9 to noon. The word is that club members bring what they want to bring so you can expect anything to be there.

Happy Spring! It is finally here.

Choosing Plants for your Yard and Garden

I have heard there is good soil for gardening and farming in Beltrami County, but since moving to the area in September 2000, I haven't lived on “good” soil. I have resided in four different houses, all built on sand. If I'm going to get more specific, the University of Minnesota Extension categorizes the soil in my yard as “loamy sand”, so it's not pure sand. However, it requires a lot of organic material – compost, mulch and the like, for it to hold moisture and nourish the vegetables and flowers I want to grow.

Another challenge to gardening in our area (and particularly noticeable this year) is that the last frost date for Bemidji is so late, making our gardening season a mere 90 days or so. The last frost date is around May 31- June 2. It is recommended that gardeners wait until after this date to transplant plants that cannot survive a frost. Every year I see this date, but

again last May, the mild winter, warm spring, and forecast once again tricked me into planting tomatoes in the third week of May. This is almost always a mistake, and last year, despite the extended forecast, we had two nights of late May freeze (25 degrees!) in my area southwest of Bemidji that killed every last one of my tomato plants, despite them being covered. Even Master Gardeners can let their hopes and excitement lead them to make unscientific and disastrous decisions! I think I have finally learned my lesson – but we will see. Warm spring breezes can really affect my judgment.

If you are like me, you also need to determine what you actually have room to plant. When looking over seed catalogs in the winter or visiting nurseries in the spring, it is easy to get excited and purchase more seeds or plants than one has room for. Before ordering seeds or purchasing plants, take time to map out your space and determine how much space each plant would need to grow and thrive before making your purchase. Some common vegetable seeds that tend to do well for many gardeners in our area are green beans, zucchini, squash and cucumbers. Tomatoes are more challenging, depending on the summer.

When I first moved to Bemidji back in September 2000, Beltrami County was categorized as being in Growing Zone 2b. In the past 10 years or so, I have seen it categorized as Zone 3. This number is important for determining what plants and trees can live in our area from season to season – what perennials will actually be pe-

renial. When you are choosing trees and perennial flowers at a nursery (or online), check to make sure that you are choosing something that is hardy to at least zone 3! One great perennial flower that grows well in our area from year to year are Annabell hydrangeas. When you go to a local nursery, you will almost always find them. They are beautiful and bloom and spread reliably every year. Alongside them, you will also find many other varieties of hydrangeas that come in more colors (Annabelle Hydrangeas are white). Generally these variants are only guaranteed to Zone 4 and so you are taking a gamble in buying them. Local nurseries are more likely to carry plants that work in our area. Be extra careful when buying plants in chain stores like Menards, Walmart, and Home Depot as I have seen plants and trees there that are only perennial in the deep south. So, read the tag on any plant you hope will survive more than one summer in our area!

It's an exciting time of year, and I'm sure one of these days it will finally stop snowing, the ice will come off the lake and it will be time to start planting spinach, lettuce, peas and other early spring crops. If you have questions, the University of Minnesota Extension website is a great resource. 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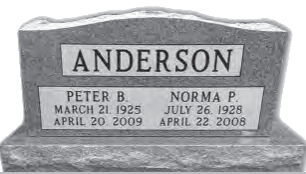

Wild fox in Minnesota tests positive for highly pathogenic avian influenza

A wild fox from Anoka County has tested positive for highly pathogenic avian influenza. This is the first confirmed case of HPAI in a wild mammal in Minnesota.

The University of Minnesota Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory alerted the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, which is responsible for monitoring the health of the state’s wildlife. The National Veterinary Services Laboratory later confirmed the positive test earlier this week.

Last week, two red fox kits in Ontario, Canada tested posi-

tive for HPAI. Those kits were the first reported cases of the current HPAI outbreak in a wild mammal in North America. The Minnesota fox also was a kit.

The DNR routinely responds to reports of sick wildlife and conducts testing for many wildlife diseases, including canine distemper and rabies in foxes. In light of these most recent findings of HPAI in fox kits, the DNR will add avian influenza to the routine screening process when foxes exhibiting neurological symptoms are submitted to the Min-

How to corral spring allergies

Spring is synonymous with rebirth. Each spring, flowers begin to bloom again, grass starts to grow and people from all walks of life rekindle their love affair with the great outdoors. Spring also marks the return of a familiar foe: allergies.

Seasonal allergies can put a damper on even the most welcoming spring day. After all, a day soaking up the sun isn’t so relaxing when it’s also spent sneezing and confronting allergy symptoms like congestion, runny nose and watery eyes. Thankfully, it’s possible for seasonal allergy sufferers to have their spring and enjoy it, too.

• Pay attention to seasonal allergy trackers. Seasonal allergies are now easier to track than ever. For example, Pollen.com is an easily accessible and free site that allows visitors to type in their ZIP codes and access daily allergy reports for their towns and cities. Visitors also can see five-day forecasts that can help them plan trips and other outdoor excursions. Weather.com also offers free allergy reports and forecasts. Individuals with seasonal allergies can make use of these sites and plan their activities based on the information they provide.

• Stay indoors when allergen levels are especially high. The Mayo Clinic notes that there are several things individuals can do to reduce their exposure to seasonal allergy triggers.

That includes staying indoors on dry, windy days. This doesn’t mean individuals need to lock themselves indoors all spring. But it’s important that seasonal allergy sufferers recognize that some days might be too much to handle. Rain helps clear pollen from the air, so individuals who are avoiding the outdoors on days when pollen counts are high should be able to get outside after a good rain without triggering an attack.

• Maintain clean air indoors. The great outdoors is not the only place where allergens percolate. The Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America notes that improving air quality in a home can reduce allergy triggers. Air conditioners can prevent outdoor allergens from entering a home, so utilize units on warm spring days when you might otherwise open the windows. Open windows and screen doors provide easy entry points for allergens like pollen, so turning on the AC when outdoor allergen counts are high can make seasonal allergies more manageable.

• Consider treatments. Over-the-counter treatments like antihistamines, nasal sprays and decongestants provide most individuals with sufficient relief from their seasonal allergies. If OTC remedies are ineffective, treatments such as allergen immunotherapy and a consultation with an allergen may be necessary.

“Wild animals can sometimes transmit diseases to humans, and while we typically think of rabies or other well-known diseases as the primary concerns, this shows that there are other risks to keep in mind as well,” said Dr. Joni Scheftel, state public health veterinarian with the Minnesota Department of Health. “The best advice we have for Minnesotans is to avoid contact with wildlife that appear sick or injured and contact your healthcare provider if you are bitten or have other close contact with wildlife.”

Minnesotans who find sick or dead waterfowl and raptors — which are the wildlife most affected by HPAI — should contact the DNR to file a report. Learn more about what kind of reports the DNR needs for monitoring purposes, its response to the avian influenza outbreak, and contact information on the DNR website (mndnr.gov/AI).

Ask a Trooper

Question:

Can someone with a motorcycle permit have their small dog riding on the motorcycle or would that be considered a passenger?

We have already purchased a helmet and leather jacket for this lucky pup! Thank you for your response.

Answer: First of all, where will this dog be seated and how? I see less issues if you are talking about a motorcycle side car or a motorcycle trailer equipped with a kennel. But if you are talking about on the actual motorcycle with you, I don’t think this would be very safe for you or your pet.

If you are going to carry a passenger, there are a few key items to keep in mind:

Equip and Adjust Your Motorcycle:

- A passenger seat and footrests are required by law.
- Adjust tire pressure and suspension settings for the additional weight. (Do not exceed weight limitations specified in the owner’s manual.)
- Readjust mirrors.

Passenger Preparation:

- Provide protective riding gear: eye protection, a DOT-approved helmet, boots, gloves, long riding pants and a high-visibility motorcycle jacket.

- Passengers under age 18 are required by law to wear a DOT-approved helmet.

- Small children are required by law to be able to reach both footrests with their feet while sitting on the passenger seat.

Getting On and Off the Motorcycle:

- Start the engine before the passenger gets on.
- Squeeze the front brake while the passenger gets on or off the bike.

- Passengers should get off the bike before the operator.

Passenger Safety Tips:

- Hold operator’s waist or hips, or motorcycle’s passenger hand-holds.

- Keep feet on footrests at all times, including while stopped.
- Keep hands and feet away from hot or moving parts.

- When turning, look over the operator’s shoulder in the direction of the turn.

- Avoid turning around or making sudden moves that might affect operation.

- If crossing an obstacle, rise off the seat keeping your feet on the foot pegs with knees slightly bent and allow legs to absorb the shock upon impact.

Operator Safety Tips:

- A passenger will affect handling due to extra weight and independent motion.

- Braking sooner with greater pressure may be necessary.
- Use extra caution in a corner.

- Allow more time and space for passing.

- Be ready to counter the effects of wind.

- Avoid extreme speeds and dramatic lean angles.

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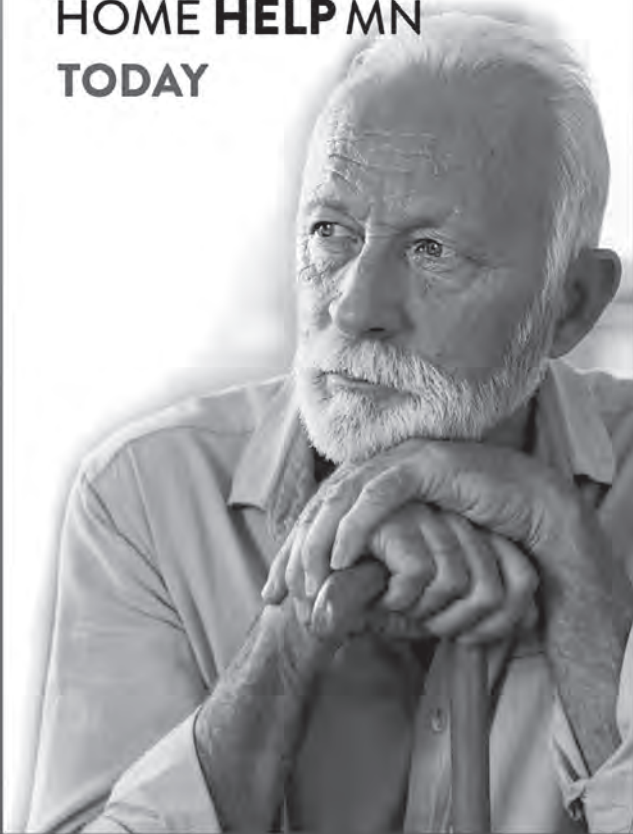
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
