The flight deck on the USS Minneapolis-Saint Paul LCS 21 is more than 1.5 times larger than most U.S. Navy surface combatants. Three reconfigurable spaces allow for flexible armament including guns and missiles.



Inside view of the Pilot house. The automated ship reduces crew size, increases situational awareness and combat effectiveness. The ship was built in Marinette, Wisconsin. They also build U.S. Navy's Constellation Class Frigates, the Freedom Class Littoral Combat Ships, the Navy Lighterage System, mine countermeasure vessels, and ocean tugs, as well as U.S. Coast Guard icebreakers, buoy tenders, and response vessels.

Sharon and Russ Lembke attend commissioning of the new Navy Ship

Local Vietnam Navy veteran Russ Lembke and his wife Sharon were invited to attend the commissioning of the new Navy Ship USS Minneapolis-Saint Paul LCS 21 on May 21, 2022 in Duluth, Minnesota. This was the first ship ever commissioned in Minnesota. The ship was built in Marinette, Wisconsin. LCS stands for (Littoral Combat Ship). The length is 387 feet, Beam 57.7 feet and

draft 14.1 feet. LCS is a fast, agile, mission-focused platform designed for operation in near-shore environments yet capable of open-ocean operations. It is designed to defeat asymmetric "anti-access" threats such as mines, quiet diesel submarines and fast surface craft. LCS's are outfitted with mission packages that deploy manned and unmanned vehicles and sensors in support of mine countermeasures anti-

submarine warfare or surface warfare missions. The full load displacement is 3,450 metric tons. It has a combined diesel and gas turbine with steerable water jet propulsion. It is capable of speeds greater than 40 knots. Senator Amy Klobuchar stated, the ship was built from iron ore mined in Minnesota. The event was by invitation only. There were about 2,700 people there. Lembke's

son Dean is the Director of Building and Facilities at the Duluth Seaway Port Authority. He made the arrangements with the commissioning committee for docking the ship and security. Dean mentioned that his dad was a Vietnam Navy veteran. The committee said they would like to invite him to be there. The Lembke's of Clearwater Lake, Clearbrook and Leonard enjoyed the day.

Demonstrations and Displays at Gully Days Skol!

The Gully Community Center will be in a "flurry" Saturday morning, June 18th. Starting at 9:00 am, David Lee Catering will be serving coffee and Norwegian sweets. His almond bars are a favorite! Also beginning at 9, artisans will be there demonstrating and displaying various hand-crafted items, many with Scandinavian roots. **Artisans include:** Lyn Sunrud and Marge Trembath from the Norda Gonvick Rosemalers will demonstrate some of their Rosemaling techniques and display finished projects. Rosemaling is a decorative folk painting of Norway. It could be found on walls, ceilings, and on furniture beginning in the 1700's. Lyn has been a Rosemaler for many years, but Marge more recently took up Rosemaling as a retirement hobby. **Roz Watnemo** will display and demonstrate Hardanger embroidery. She is an expert in this art, having designed, stitched, and published hundreds of designs and has sold them world-wide. Hardanger embroidery is a form of embroidery traditionally worked with white thread on white even-weave cloth. It originated near the Hardanger Fjord area of Norway. **Alethea Kenney** and other members of the Sustainable

Sheep and Fiber Community of northern Minnesota have a goal of seeing sustainably raised local sheep wool and products available to a wide range of consumers. They will be at Gully Days Skol! demonstrating a variety of fiber art techniques used in previous generations, including spinning and processing wool using hand cards, combs and tatting. **David Lee**, in addition to serving coffee and sweets, will demonstrate lefse making beginning at 10:00 am. He says the recipe he uses was found by his wife in the Thief River Falls Times about 40 years ago. **Displays in the Community Center include:** **Susan and Wes Roland** will bring a Sons of Norway display. They are members of the Granlund Lodge # 240 that meets in Fosston. The mission of Sons of Norway is to promote and to preserve the heritage and culture of Norway. Wes, being able to speak the Norwegian language is a fine representative for this group. **Gretchen Beito** of Thief River Falls, offered to loan four of her original pieces of art for display. They were done by artists with connections to this area. They include artists: **Russell Norberg** was born in 1933 in Johnson Township. He taught for many years before becoming a full time art-

ist. The watercolor displayed is "Tamarack Trees Near Gully." 1975. **Rev. Carroll Ellertson** was born and raised near Gully. He was a missionary in South Africa for many years of his life. The charcoal/ink "Zebra Patterns" was done in 1973. **Anne J Beito** was a Crewel Embroidery artist. She was born in Wanke in 1902. She married George A. Beito of Gonvick in 1931. Two of her Crewel Embroidery works are on display, a floral piece and a hat for a Valdres, Norway Bunad. In addition to the pieces on loan from Beito, one of the local art pieces on display at Gully will be "Prairie Smoke" of the unique handprints series by Gully Artist **Cindy Kolling**. The **Prairie Smoke** is a native wildflower that develops a wispy "smoke-like" appearance when it is in the seed stage. It can be spotted on the sandy hillsides in the Gully and Trail area in June. The demonstrations and displays will be from 9-11:00 in the Community Center. The coffee and Norwegian sweets will be available from 9 -1:00, with a lunch of Sloppy Joes, potato salad and beans offered from 11:00-1:00.

Construction on Highway 1 east of Red Lake planned for June

A Minnesota Department of Transportation construction project on Highway 1 east of Red Lake will take place in June. It includes culvert replacements and turn lane improvements between Red Lake and Reservation Highway 18. Motorists can expect staged detours, bypass lanes and lane closures. Red Lake Builders is the contractor for the project. This project will also include resurfacing in 2023. Once complete, the benefits include a safer road, improved drainage, and safer intersections. Flooding update: Highway 92 reopened from Brooks to Highway 32

The Minnesota Department of Transportation has reopened Highway 92 from Highway 59 in Brooks to Highway 32 after repairs have been completed. The highway was previously closed due to damage caused by flooding. Highways that remain closed: •Highway 75 from Highway 171 to Canadian border •Highway 175 from Kittson County Road 34 to North Dakota Border •Highway 220 between

Highway 1 and Highway 11 •Highway 317 between Highway 220 and North Dakota border When a road is closed it is illegal to travel in that area. Motorists can be fined up to \$1,000 and/or 90 days in jail. In addition, if travelers need to be rescued from a closed road, other expenses and penalties will apply. 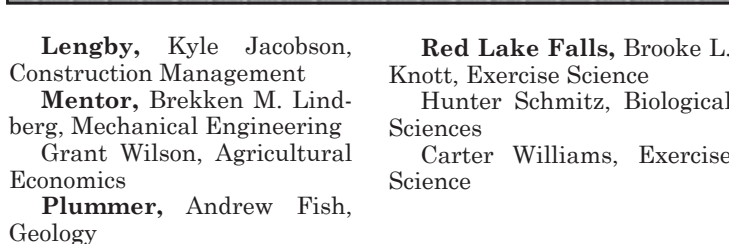

Q u e s - tion: I have noticed that some of the local express shut-

tle buses do not stop at railroad crossings. I thought all buses were supposed to stop before crossing railroad tracks. Can you talk about this?

Answer: If it is a school bus or Head Start (early childhood programs, etc.) bus then they are required to stop whether

loaded or not. For other buses, the law requires loaded buses to stop for railroad crossings. If there are no passengers then they do not need to stop.

Master Gardeners- Who are we?

The University of Minnesota Extension Volunteer Master Program's mission is "to use research based horticultural knowledge and practices to deliver educational outreach and project-based efforts that inspire change and promote healthy people, healthy communities and a healthy planet."

Started in 1977, the first class had twenty-five people enrolled. Today there are more than 2,700 Master Gardeners in almost every county across the state who share horticultural expertise, learned from these annual classes and continuing education events. Master gardeners come from many walks of life; teachers, former teachers, retirees, business professionals, writers, paraprofessionals, contract specialists, nurses, managers, salespeople, and various other occupations, all with a shared love of growing plants.

The impact of certified Master Gardeners in 2021 alone is incredible. Master gardeners contributed 135,822 volunteer hours and reached 85,933 people with educational information about our work.

Our work includes giving presentations on horticulture skills, pollinators, climate change, plant biodiversity, local food, clean water, and nearby nature. These seven items listed are the priorities that inform our work.

I will touch on two of those priorities in this article, horticultural skills, and local food. Future articles will expound on other priorities.

With the resurgence of gardening interest over the last few years, master gardeners have reached out to schools, Boys and Girls Clubs, food shelf farms, community education classes, libraries, and community organizations, presenting horticultural skills classes to new and experienced gardeners. Sharing research-based knowledge as well as firsthand experiences builds confidence for new gardeners to help them grow a garden successfully.

Master gardeners also hone their horticultural skills by participating in seed trials for the University of Minnesota. Each year, we are invited to sign up for the trials, depending on the time and effort you can expend. Each trial has 6 varieties of the seeds to be trialed, usually flowers and

vegetables. Once the seeds are planted, we track how long it takes to germinate, how many seeds germinated, how many are living after 3 weeks, first fruit or flower, how many flowers or items they produce, how much the average item weighs and length of the items. For flowers, the size of the blossoms, spacing, and color are tracked. For vegetables, we also taste for sweetness, if they were tough or stringy texture and then rank them from 1 through 6 as to favorite to least favorite. We log if insect problems or diseases were present. Lastly, we say whether we would grow that item again. One year, I trialed yellow bush beans and one plant produced 113 bean pods. I would plant that variety again. After all the data is collected, the results are published and the specific varietal names of each seed we trial, so we can plant them the following year if desired.

The priority of local food promotes the use of sustainable techniques for growing local food on multiple scales and at various locations. Around our area several soil types provide challenges to the home gardener. Master gardeners recommend taking soil samples and sending them to the University of Minnesota soil lab for testing to ensure any soil amendments to the garden will help produce a bountiful crop. Wissota Hornet Feature:

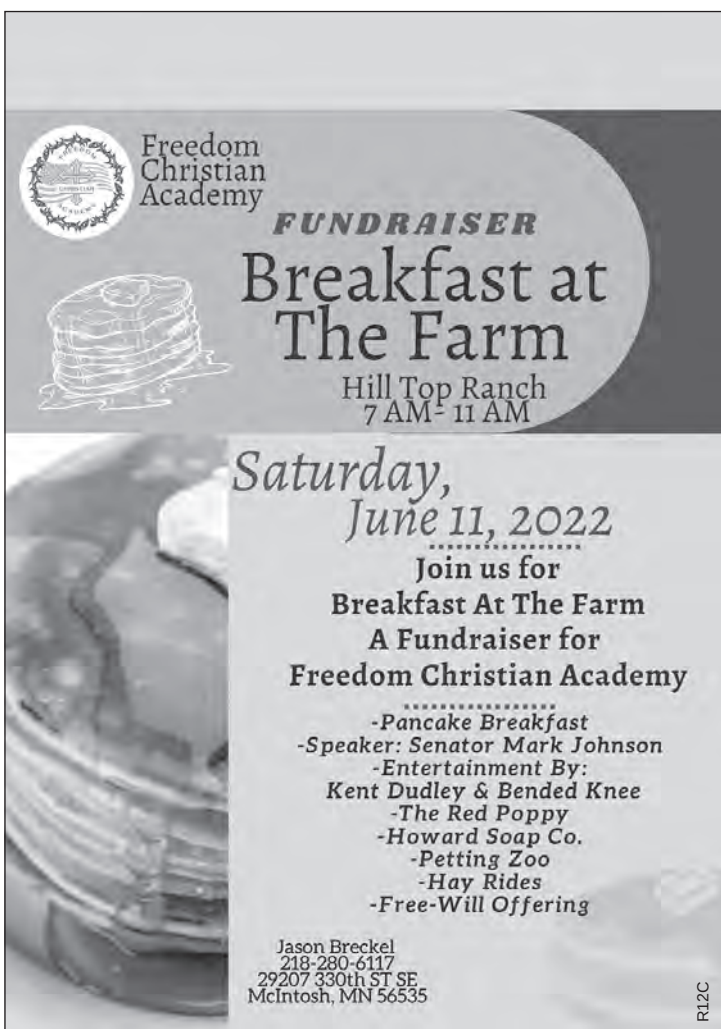

Wissota Super Stocks Feature:

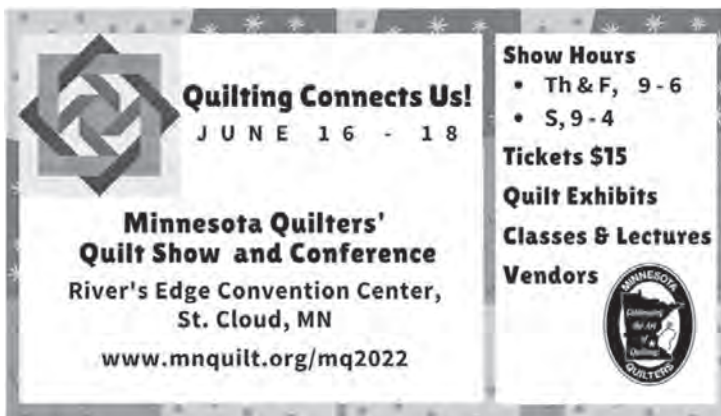

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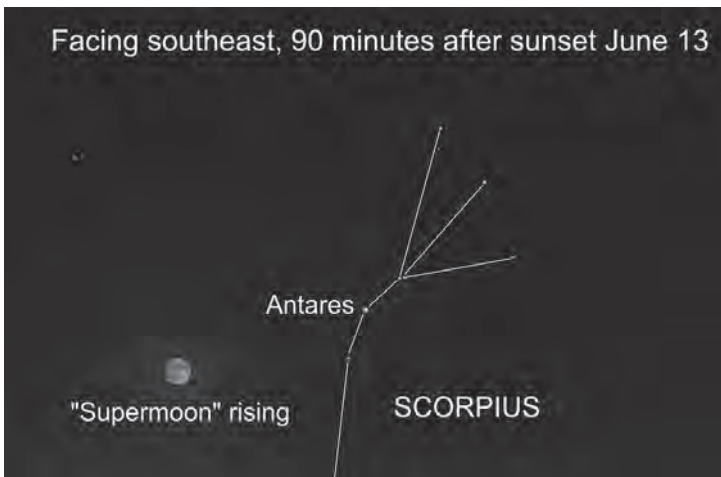
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Facing southeast, 90 minutes after sunset June 13
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Minnesota Starwatch for June 2022

June begins with Jupiter sailing away from Mars, moving ever higher and westward above the predawn eastern horizon.

About 75 minutes before sunrise, Venus will be quite low in the east. To the upper right of the brilliant planet will be Mars, and to its upper right will be bright Jupiter. West of Jupiter, you'll see Saturn well up in the southeast.

With a clear sky, an unobstructed view of the eastern horizon, and binoculars, you may spot Mercury in the sun's foreglow, to Venus' lower left, between about the 17th and the 25th. Once Mercury is up, all five planets visible to the naked eye will be strung out in

an arc from left to right in the order Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn—the same order as their distances from the sun.

However, the sun will probably begin to wash out Saturn and Mars before Mercury appears. So be sure to look for Saturn and Mars by 75 minutes before sunrise, then try to spot Mercury about a half hour later.

The night of the 13th-14th, June delivers a large and gorgeously bright "supermoon." It gets its beauty by reaching fullness at 6:51 a.m. on the 14th—less than 12 hours before perigee, its closest approach to Earth in a lunar cycle. Unfortunately, on that morning the moon sets before reaching fullness. To catch it, check your local time of moonset and look to the southwest 20 minutes beforehand. Or, just watch the moon rise against a sunlit sky the evening of the 13th.

Summer arrives officially with the solstice at 4:13 a.m. on the 21st, when the sun reaches a point over the Tropic of Cancer. At that moment Earth will be lighted from the Antarctic Circle up to the North Pole and beyond to the Arctic Circle on the dark side of the planet.



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
