Strategic Farming: Field Notes discussed early-season weed control and scouting tips

The cold, wet spring has impacted not only crop planting decisions, but also early-season weed and pest management. Recently planted corn is emerging and many fields look clean, but don't be lulled into thinking that will last. While delayed preplant tillage controlled the earliest emerging weeds, ample soil moisture has allowed some of those weeds to re-establish. Emergence for other species has been delayed this season, but warmer temperatures now set the stage for rapid growth. Preemergence (PRE) herbicides provide a strong foundation ahead of the postemergence applications. "Because planting was delayed, the postemergence applications may seem 'early' this year," explains Dr. Debalin Sarangi, UMN Extension weed scientist. "Even so, postemergence herbicides should be applied about 14 days after the PREs or mid-June if fields were planted in late May." Delaying the postemergence application is risky since weeds can quickly grow beyond the stage where they can be controlled. There is also the possibility that some herbicides could cause carryover injury if they're applied very late. Check herbicide labels for rotation intervals. This will be particularly important if sugarbeets are in the crop rotation, Sarangi states. Waterhemp is a particularly challenging weed to control in soybean because its emergence pattern extends into August. One strategy to combat this weed is to "layer" preemergence herbicides. By following a PRE application with an additional application 30 days later, weed seedling control can be extended

to canopy closure. There have been significant changes this year for dicamba product labels for dicamba-tolerant soybean. The cutoff dates for application are now June 12 for areas south of Interstate 94 and June 30 for areas north of I-94. In addition to cutoff dates, there is a new temperature cutoff. No applications are allowed if the forecasted high or field air temperature exceeds 85 degrees F. Always check the label as it is the final authority. To reduce dicamba drift, Sarangi urges applicators to select the right nozzles that deliver coarse droplets. Wind and temperature are factors that need to be considered for not just dicamba, but all plant growth regulator herbicides. Plant growth regulators (i.e. dicamba, 2,4-D) work best when combined with a glyphosate product, because two sites of action are provided instead of just one. Including a preemergence herbicide in the tank mix will add control of late-emerging weeds. "Target weeds when they are no more than four inches tall," stresses Sarangi. Once they reach six inches, they have developed multiple growing points and will be very difficult to control. Weed, disease, and insect pests are rarely evenly distributed throughout a field. Dr. Anthony Hanson, Extension IPM educator, urges growers to use recommended scouting practices to get a good field average. If issues are isolated, then spot-treating instead of a whole field application is an option. "In addition to numbers of pests, pay attention to life stages," Hanson states, "because that will impact treatment rec-

ommendations." Black cutworm (BCW) is an insect pest that the IPM team has been keeping an eye on. While this has been a relatively low year for BCW moth flights into Minnesota, there were a few significant captures at the end of April and into early May. For those locations, the larvae could be cutting corn through June 20. Alfalfa weevil larvae have also been detected. While the first alfalfa harvest will kill most of the larvae, alfalfa regrowth should still be monitored for recurring issues. Fertile Sand Hills BioBlitz through month of June

You can be a citizen scientist and help the Agassiz ELC identify plants, animals, insects, and birds as part of the AELC 30th Anniversary BioBlitz! A bioblitz is a communal citizen-science effort to record as many species within a designated location and time period as possible. In this case, the designated location is the 640 acres that the City of Fertile owns and manages in the Fertile Sand Hills. The time period for this BioBlitz is during the month of June. "June is a fantastic month to see the diversity of prairie plants blooming in the Fertile Sand Hills," notes Agassiz ELC Executive Director Wayne Goeken. "Along with that you also see a lot of pollinators and other insects special to the Fertile Sand Hills." To get observations into the BioBlitz, participants need to take photos and upload them

through the iNaturalist app which is a free download. A lot of good information on how to use the app is at the inaturalist.org web site. The app provides suggested identification of plants and animals which will automatically be registered to the AELC bioblitz project if taken with a smartphone with GPS coordinates. iNaturalist makes it easy for anyone to genuinely participate in this bioblitz by recording observations. These iNaturalist observations are independently identified and verified as research-quality data, so no matter how small, your observations will contribute directly to science. iNaturalist automatically tallies a species count that you can look up to see how we're doing. Goeken noted, "As of June 10th, five observers have uploaded a total of 103 observations which represent 62 different species thus far—and

the best part of June is yet to come!" The City of Fertile's Sandhills property has a wealth of potential biodiversity with its unique diversity of ecosystems including dry sand prairie, oak savanna, aspen woods, riverine habitats, and sand dunes. Look up "AELC 30th Anniversary BioBlitz" at "Projects" under the "Community" tab on the iNaturalist website to see how the tally is going—you can also see where the observations are being recorded on a map located at this site. So, get out and wander throughout the Fertile Sand Hills during June and take photos of the bountiful blooms and critters—upload to iNaturalist and be a part of this fun citizen science effort. Beetles, Bugs, and Flies Oh My!

We live with beetles, ants, flies, moths, bees, caterpillars, maggots, grubs, spiders, and on and on! There are good pests, bad pests and some down-right ugly pests. Every garden has them. The good ones—pollinators, like bees—are a welcomed member of our gardens. They aid in plant growth and fruit and vegetable production; without them, nothing would grow. Some of these good guys even help us get rid of the bad ones, for example, ladybugs which prey on aphids. A number of the ugly ones are bad for gardens and need to be removed. Maggots, grubs, and ants are just a few.

For this article, we will focus on harmful pests. One way to group garden pests is by native, non-native, or invasive. Natives are insects that have always been here. Non-natives are species that originated somewhere other than their current location and have been introduced to the area where they now live. Invasives are the bad guys. They are non-native organisms that cause harm to the environment, the economy, or to our health.

Here are a few invasive insects that we need to watch for: Asian long horned beetle—A very handsome fellow, easily identified by its long black and white antenna and its black and white body. It can destroy trees like maple, ash, and birch.

Brown marmorated stink bug—Aptly named as it gives off an unpleasant odor when disturbed or crushed. It is shield shaped, mottled brown with a dark and light banded antenna. It feeds on over 200 kinds of fruits and vegetables.

Emerald ash borer—We have all heard of this one. It is very destructive to ash trees, and can kill entire areas in a short period of time. Approximately 1/2 inch long, it is bright metallic green in color. It is most often transported in firewood.

Spongy moth—Previously known as the gypsy moth, its caterpillar stage is the most harmful. Quite similar to our native forest tent caterpillar, it has a "hairy" appearance and

is initially a mottled grey but soon takes on pairs of blue and red bumps down its backside. Spongy moth populations rise and fall in cycles, varying over the years from very few to large numbers, which cause very noticeable leaf damage and tree defoliation. The moth stage is one to two inches in length with cream-colored wings. The only function of the adult stage of spongy moth is to reproduce; it cannot feed.

Spotted wing drosophila—A small fruit fly with yellowish-brown wings and prominent red eyes. It attacks raspberries, blueberries, strawberries, and grapes.

Each time you are in your garden, check your plants. Look on the flowers, stems, both sides of the leaves, and in the soil. Should you find an invasive insect, contact the Department of Agriculture as they track them.

Remember you don't need a bunch of toxic chemicals to control garden pests. Picking them off and putting them in a bucket of soapy water is often enough. Some can simply be washed off with a hose or sprayer. Home-made solutions work well. If, as a last resort, you need a chemical pesticide, first be sure you have correctly identified the pest, then read the labels on the pesticide so you know what you are getting. Consider any risks to humans animals, and the environment and before applying so you understand the directions. Don't allow chemical pesticides to lie around when you are done. Properly dispose of any remaining chemical, clean the applicator and recycle if you are able.

Obituary for Stephen Taffin

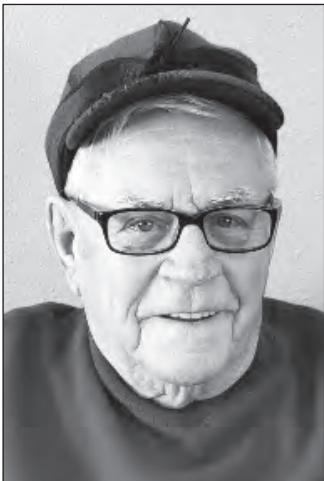
Stephen Wayne Taffin of Bagley, MN passed away unexpectedly on Tuesday May 24, 2022 at the age of 66.

Ask a Trooper

Question: It seems there are far too many wrong way drivers.

On 4-lane and 2 lane roadways, what should drivers do if they encounter a wrong-way driver?

Answer: Great question as this is a very dangerous situation. I was speaking with a Trooper who was part of a crash investigation involving a wrong way driver on I-90 in Olmsted County in 2019. The Trooper said it was one of the worst crashes he had seen in his 24-year career. A vehicle traveling east in the westbound lane struck a vehicle traveling east in the eastbound lane at highway speeds. This direct head-on crash involved two passenger cars with three occupants in each vehicle. All six people were killed in the crash. The wrong way driver was impaired on a controlled substance. In 2021 State Patrol received 1,451 reports of wrong way drivers, so far this year we have had 676.

If a wrong way driver is approaching you on a two-lane roadway reduce speed and move as far to the right as possible,

even if there is no shoulder. Traveling on a multiple lane roadway travel in the center lane so you can move to the right or left to avoid a wrong way driver heading in your direction. If you are traveling on roadway with two lanes in the same direction then travel in the right lane. Avoid slamming on your brakes if there is traffic behind you. Honk your horn and flash your lights to get the driver's attention.

Pull over on the shoulder as soon as possible after avoiding a wrong way driver and call 911 to report it. Give the dispatcher your location and a description of the vehicle.

You can avoid a ticket — and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention and always drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota toward Zero Deaths.
