CHS to build state-of-the-art grain facility in Erskine

ERSKINE, MINN. (June 14, 2022) – CHS will begin construction this summer on a new state-of-the-art grain facility with 1.25 million bushels of additional storage capacity in Erskine, Minn. The facility is slated to be operational in the fall of 2023 and will help CHS expand operational capabilities and increase efficiency across its footprint. The new shuttle elevator will bring total capacity at the location to 4.55 million bushels of storage and will complement existing CHS grain, agronomy and energy assets and offerings for area producers.

“CHS is committed to growing our cooperative with customer-focused solutions that make it easier for producers to do business with us,” says

Rick Dusek, executive vice president of CHS ag retail operations. “Our people, assets, capabilities and operational footprint are the strengths of our retail platform, and this important project advances our strategy to expand our customer-focused retail solutions platform, creating value and driving growth for farmers – as customers and owners. This facility is a key location in the flow of grain from the Upper Midwest to export terminals in the Pacific Northwest.”

The new terminal is the latest in a series of investments throughout Minnesota and North Dakota by CHS. In keeping with its core value of safety, the company has placed priority on safety features and advancements to improve oper-

ating conditions.

“Along with expanding our grain handling capabilities and value to area farmers, the new facility will create advantages for our employees, farmers and community,” says James Hardy, who manages CHS Northern Grain, a CHS business unit with 11 grain facilities in northwest Minnesota. “Improved traffic flows, better operating conditions, advanced equipment and the latest safety advances are just some of the innovations to help us provide a better customer experience. We want to get producers in, out and back to the field as quickly and safely as possible.”

Vigen Construction out of East Grand Forks, Minn., is overseeing this construction project.

A Toyota 4-runner was traveling Eastbound on highway 92 when the vehicle lost control, entering the south ditch of highway 92, rolling multiple times before final rest.

The driver, Morgan Taylor Avenson, age 22, of Bemidji, died at the scene. She was not wearing a seatbelt. It is unknown at this time if alcohol was involved with the driver.

The passenger Kendra Kristine Platow, age 29, of Shevlin was life flighted to Fargo with life threatening injuries. She was wearing a seatbelt. No alcohol was involved with the passenger.

Road conditions were dry at the time of the crash.

Kohlrabi; overlooked but tasty

The most overlooked vegetable that I know of is Kohlrabi. I seldom see it on the seed racks of our local stores so you will probably have to look for it in seed catalogs. Lucky for us, seed catalogs are all on-line.

Kohlrabi looks like a green turnip with leaves growing out of the ball of the plant. They are usually green but can be purple or white. Most are intended to be eaten at 2, 3 or perhaps 4 inches in diameter but some varieties like 'Kosack' will grow larger and are good eating even at eight inches in diameter. Any variety in a catalog will probably be good for some gardeners but I really like 'Terek' from the Johnny's catalog.

Kohlrabi is a cole crop in the cruciferae family of plants and so is related to cabbage, radishes, turnips, and kale. As such, they will be affected by the same pests as other members of the family.

I started growing kohlrabi when my turnips and rutabagas were infected by cabbage root maggots which I am still struggling with. The maggots of this fly tunnel through the roots making them inedible. The only time I have seen the adult flies is when I used a

floating row cover on my cabbage. Hundreds of small, gray, house-fly like insects were desperately trying to get away from the cabbage. Kohlrabi is affected by these flies but the damage is done below the part that you want to eat.

Kohlrabi can be planted with your first planting in the spring with radishes and onions. I usually start some under lights inside for transplanting while planting other seeds directly into the garden. A four-inch spacing is good for the regular sized varieties and ten inches for the large varieties. I like to plant five to a square-foot with the middle plant being a large variety. Eat the smaller outside ones first which leaves more space for the large middle one to grow to full size. Higher densities of the small varieties may be possible. Kohlrabi prefers cool climates and may not thrive during hot weather. I have not experienced this in Beltrami County.

Kohlrabi is good sliced and eaten raw or you can cook them any way that you cook turnips or rutabagas. They are very



good in salads or can be shredded for a cole-slaw or a carrot salad type dish. The leaves can be cooked or also used in salad.

Like most vegetables, kohlrabi is very nutritious. One cup of kohlrabi provides 93% of your daily vitamin C needs. It's also a good source of potassium, fiber, and vitamin B6.

The large varieties of kohlrabi will keep well in the refrigerator until Thanksgiving. Think about the opportunities that that will give us for the Holiday meals.

It isn't too late to plant Kohlrabi this year. Last year I planted some by seed on June 22 and got good production. I think you could plant them in mid-July or even later for a Fall garden crop.

about the dangers of putting your feet up on the dash while driving and air bags. With the way vehicles are changing, can you talk about the other air bags, like side curtains and such? Thank you.

Answer: Thank you for the email and I am happy to talk about this. First of all, let me say air bags are designed to work with seat belts to keep vehicle occupants in a safe position during a crash — air bags are not effective when the motorist is not belted.

You are right with all the changes in vehicle technology. Motor Vehicles are federally required to be equipped with "Supplemental Restraint Systems" (SRS.) Not all of the safety features described in this article are standard equipment, some may be optional depending on the vehicle.

Air Bag System Components

- Driver and Front Passenger Air Bags
- o Supplemental Side Air Bags
- o Supplemental Seat-Mounted Side Air Bags (SABs)
- Supplemental Side Air Bag Inflatable Curtains (SABICs)
- Supplemental Knee Air Bags

• Knee Impact Bolsters

All of these features and advancements in technology are incredible. But again, if people are not belted and seated properly these components could injure occupants. Children are at an even greater risk or injury from a deploying air bag. To keep yourself and others safe make sure you:

- Keep items away from any area where these systems can deploy.

- Always buckle up — and insist passengers are belted, too.

- Wear lap belts low and snug across the hips; shoulder straps should never be tucked under an arm or behind the back — not only is this unsafe, it is illegal.

- Children under age 13 should always ride in the back seat.

- In Minnesota, all children must be in a child restraint until they are 4 feet 9 inches tall, or at least age 8, whichever comes first.
