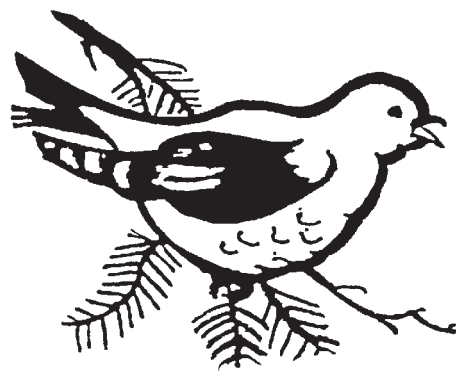

Over \$8,000.00 Awarded to Area Artists NWMAC's Annual Spring Art Exhibit!

The Northwest Minnesota Arts Council awarded \$2450.00 dollars in prize money to adult and student artists' at their annual Spring Art Exhibition reception held on May 04, 2015 at the Ralph Engelstad Arena in Thief River Falls, Minnesota. Over 100 artists from the 7 county service area participated in this year's event. Artists, students and the "Of The Year" recipients were all honored at the reception.

Approximately 180 people attended this year's reception. A young talented musician, Alex Conwell of Red Lake Falls, entertained guests. Alex played two violin/fiddle songs and wowed the audience with his talent. Guests also heard a special presentation on our Northwest Minnesota arts economic impact study results, titled Creative MN, from Sheila Smith, Executive Director of Minnesota Citizens for the

Arts. Executive Director of NWMAC, Mara Hanel, and Board Chair, Bruce Reeves of Red Lake Falls presented certificates to the winners. Those winners include Nick Reitzel of Karlstad, who took 1st place in the Adult category for his mixed media painting, "Our Sins are Forgiven." He was awarded \$500.00. Second place of \$300.00 went to Deb Aune of Gatzke. Third place of \$200.00

plus Adult People's Choice Award of \$100.00 went to Rock Bakken of Hallock.

In the Student category, Macy Larson of Crookston came in 1st place for her sculpture "I Came in Like, 'Oh Yeah!'" She was awarded \$300.00. The Student People's Choice Award went to Peyton Svegdahl of Strathcona. She received \$50.00.

Even if an artist or student didn't win an award, they can still showcase their talent thanks to the Travelling Art Show. The Travelling Art Show will be touring the 7 county service areas with over a dozen pieces chosen by Therese Masters Jacobson, NWMAC's showcase specialist. The pieces will travel from May until November to local libraries with the first stop at the Ada Public Library from May 08 - June 12, 2015. Thief River Falls RSVP Bone Builder Exercise Class trainers and participants recently gathered, representing more than 600 RSVP volunteers in the region, to commemorate and recognize National Senior Corp Week, May 18 - 22, 2015.

One hundred thirteen committed RSVP volunteers, throughout the 7 county region, diligently lead participants through the osteoporosis prevention classes twice per week. Bone Builders is RSVP's largest offering, with 32 separate classes enriching the lives of nearly 500 participants throughout the area. Thief River Falls is home to 3 such classes which are offered to participants completely free of charge.

Bone Builders incorporates strength, balance and flexibility exercises to combat bone loss and prevent falls due to balance issues. "The longevity and in-

tegrity of RSVP's Bone Builder Program is due to the steadfast efforts of our volunteer trainers," RSVP Program Director Tammy Frohlich states.

National Senior Corp week is an opportunity to thank Senior Corps volunteers for their service and recognize the positive impact and value to our communities and nation. Volunteer service keeps older Americans active, healthy, and engaged, helps our communities by solving local problems, and helps our nation by saving taxpayer dollars, reducing healthcare costs and strengthening our democracy.

RSVP volunteers are involved in many different areas of service, directly impacting individual lives and communities as a whole. "RSVP volunteers are the ones who make their communities great places to live and to return to," adds Frohlich.

RSVP volunteers help build capacity and improve sustainability in organizations where they serve. In Northwest Minnesota, during 2014, 606 RSVP volunteers served 53,208 hours, in 117 different jobs...jobs that promote positive change and meet the most pressing needs of communities, such as food shelves and Home Delivered Meals, senior transportation, leading Bone Builder exercise classes, grocery shopping or home maintenance for seniors, helping students with literacy, and so much more.

RSVP of the Red River Valley collaborates with partnering volunteer agencies and volunteers, by providing mileage and meal reimbursement, supplemental insurance, recognition events and gifts, and occasional expense-paid training opportunities. RSVP supports volunteers in Northwest Minnesota through financial

assistance from State and Federal government, United Way of Crookston, and the Counties of Polk, Norman, Red Lake, Kittson, and Roseau.

RSVP has been sponsored by the University of Minnesota Crookston for 40 years. Inter-County Energy Assistance Program celebrates 50 years

Inter-County Community Council is celebrating 50 years of serving Clearwater, Pennington Red Lake and East Polk counties. This week's highlight is the Energy Assistance and Weatherization programs.

Inter-County Community Council has been the delivery agency for Energy Assistance Program in Pennington, East Polk and Red Lake Counties since it first started in 1980. In 1981 Inter-County assisted 2,700 households pay heating and electric bills. Currently we assist about 1,400 households at an average of \$750.00 per household. Every year we receive appreciative calls and letters from households that would have a very difficult time deciding whether to buy food, medicine or heat and when it's 30+ below in Minnesota you need heat. Of the households served 39% are households with seniors, 27.19% have someone with a disability, and 20.93% have children under 6 years old. As a 501(c)3 non-profit organization Inter-County Community Council can receive donations from persons or organizations that are designated to specific activities within the agency. One of those programs is the Reach Out for Warmth Program which is used to help households that have an en-

ergy emergency not met by the traditional energy assistance program, 100% of the donations go out to assist families. Those interested in donating to this fund may call Inter-County for more information.

Inter-County Community Council has been delivering the Department of Energy's Low-Income Weatherization Program since 1975. In the first few years of the program we blew insulation into attics, caulked obvious cracks and holes that let in cold air and put plastic on windows. In the early 80's we assisted with the development of the blower door technology to assist in the diagnosing of air infiltration and the ability to pinpoint the leaks and seal them. Health and Safety is now a major part of the weatherization audit, analysis of the heat distribution system for peak operation efficiency and heat delivery to the proper locations in the house. The weatherization program at Inter-County services the areas of Pennington, Red Lake, East Polk and Clearwater. It has helped approximately 2,500 families save money on their energy bills by improving home energy efficiency. In Minnesota, the average savings per household annually is estimated to be \$304 on heating and cooling bills, additionally, every dollar spent on weatherization measures generates an additional \$1.09 of economic activity in the State.

One of the households we served was not able to get their house heated higher than 55 degrees. All family members wore parkas and snowsuits when in the house. The family was huddled in the kitchen around the oven and that is where they slept at night also. Our contractor started dense packing the walls while one of his workers weather-stripped the attic hatch and sealed bypasses into the attic. Insulation was to be blown into the attic also. By the time the contractor finished three walls the little jackets started to get unzipped as the heating system was now able to start getting the temperature up to 68 to 70 degrees. That following summer the auditor was in the city park having a picnic with his own family when a little boy came running up to him and said 'hi, I remember you, you made our house warm, thanks mister'. This is just one of the many stories we have in how much of a difference the weatherization program makes.

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Lake Bemidji State Park opens first-of-its-kind group camp for tents and RVs

Up to 50 people can soon stay at the new Lavinia Group Camp at Lake Bemidji State Park. With five 50-amp electric hookups for RVs and a large tenting area, the facility is the first of its kind in Minnesota state parks, according to the Department of Natural Resources.

The location is very private and has its own water supply. There are two vault toilets on site, with showers and flush toilets a short walk away at the park campground building. A screened picnic shelter offers four picnic tables, counter space and electric outlets. Two pedestal grills and a custom-made "council" fire ring are just outside. The site includes parking for vehicles, trailers and boats. One of the RV sites is ADA-accessible.

This project was made possible with funding from the Parks and Trails Fund, created after voters approved the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment in November 2008. The Parks and Trails Fund receives 14.25 percent of the three-eighths percent sales tax revenue that may only be spent to support parks and trails of regional or statewide significance.

"The Lavinia Group Camp is a premier example of a Legacy-funded development project that will better meet the needs of today's park visitors," said Erika Rivers, director of Minnesota state parks and trails. "It gives people another great reason to visit Lake Bemidji State Park, which is already a popular vacation destination with a swimming beach, a bog walk, great fishing and year-round naturalist programs."

The new group camp is located off of the Pine Lane loop of the main campground and just west of the old Lavinia Road. A drawing of the site can be found on the park's website.

"The Lavinia Group Camp is perfect for family reunions and other outdoor get-togethers," said Pete Harrison, Lake Bemidji State Park manager. "Many campers have told us this is exactly what they are looking for. Currently, larger groups must rent multiple campsites for friends and family, which tends to scatter them throughout the campground."

The Lavinia Group Camp will be available for \$200/night and will rent as a complete unit only, meaning it will not be possible to rent a single RV site or building at a lesser rate.

Reservations can be made starting at 8 a.m. Friday, April 10, for groups arriving May 21 or later. Reservations can be made online at www.mndnr.gov/reservations or by calling 866-857-2757.

Customers who already have a reservation elsewhere at Lake Bemidji State Park may upgrade to the Lavinia Group

Camp for a fee (\$5 if modified online and \$7 if done by phone, plus the difference in nightly site fees).

DNR: Boaters and businesses must follow aquatic invasive species laws

With the annual start of the boating season Memorial Day weekend, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is reminding everyone to follow the law and protect their waters from aquatic invasive species.

Already this year, DNR inspectors have stopped a number of boaters and businesses moving watercraft in and out of lakes with zebra mussels attached to boats or equipment.

"Far too many people are still not following the law," said Greg Salo, DNR Enforcement Division operations manager. "Some of these laws have been on the books for more than 15 years and yet we're still seeing a violation rate around 17 percent. That's unacceptable. Violators should know better by now."

More than 500 Minnesota rivers, lakes, and wetlands are designated as infested with aquatic invasive species. That leaves more than 10,000 bodies of water to protect.

"Everyone using Minnesota waters must remember that Clean, Drain, Dispose is not only the best way to protect their lakes and rivers, it's also the law," said Ann Pierce, section manager, Ecological and Water Resources Division. Fines for violations range from \$100 to \$500.

Before leaving a water access, boaters are required to:

- Clean off all aquatic plants and animals.
- Drain all water from bilge, livewell and baitwell by removing drain plugs and leaving the drain plug out when transporting.
- Dispose of unwanted bait in the trash.

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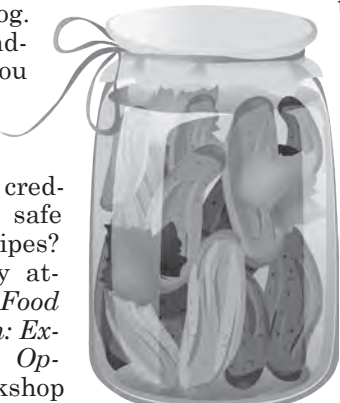

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highway rights of way**
BEMIDJI, Minn. – Placement of rummage sale signs and other unauthorized objects in state highway rights of way is prohibited under MN State Statute 160.27, according to the Minnesota Department of Transportation. In addition, rummage sale signs may not be placed on private property outside of the right of way limits without landowner consent.

Highway rights of way include the driving lanes, inside and outside shoulders, ditches, and sight corners at intersections. MnDOT crews will remove any unlawfully placed signs and impound them at one of its local maintenance truck stations. Violation of the law is a misdemeanor. Civil penalties also may apply if the placement of such material contributes to a motor vehicle crash and injures a person or damages a motor vehicle that runs off the road. In addition, the Minnesota Outdoor Advertising Control Act (MN State Statute 173.15) prohibits erecting advertising devices on public utility poles, trees and shrubs, and painting or drawing on rocks or natural features. MnDOT administers these laws in a fair and impartial manner. All signs, including: rummage, garage, yard, estate, realty, flea market, craft, produce, greenhouse and nursery sale are treated in the same way. Signs wrongly placed on state highway property by businesses, churches, private citizens or charitable groups will be removed.

Ask a Trooper

Question: How many cars can someone try to sell at the end of the driveway without having a "dealer" license?

Answer: The law pertaining to a "dealer license" talks about the limit of vehicles a person can sell without needing that license. Minnesota State Statute 168.27 sub. 8 says; "A person is limited to the sale, purchase, or lease of not more than five motor vehicles in a 12-month period.

As far as where a person is selling them, much of this will depend on the local zoning ordinances. I advise you to check with your local city,



county or township about how many vehicles you can sell on your property. Vehicles are not allowed to be sold from rest areas, park and rides, and within the highway right of way.

After half of the nights in 2014 were lost to rain, the Greenbush Race Park opened the 2015 WISSOTA Polydome race season with no chance of rain in the forecast, and a good car count in the pits. 70 plus cars including WISSOTA Modifieds, Streets, and Midwest Modifieds along with Pure Stocks, Lightning Sprints, and 4 cylinders had registered to race on a beautiful Saturday night.

The Central Boiler Modified feature lined up 14 cars for the green flag, and polesitter Aaron Holtan of Newfolden, Mn jumped to the early lead followed by Stoney Mtn, Mb driver Rick Delaine. The cautions would fly early and often, the first just three laps in when Modified rookie Gunner Gust of Strathcona, Mn. would spin in corner four. Just a couple of laps later Gust' night would end when he brought out the yellow for the second time. Delaine would chase Holtan but couldn't get up beside him to make a pass. Even through four more caution flags and a green, white, checkered finish, Holtan would hold off Delaine to pick up the opening night win. Mike Tiani of Middle River, Mn would finish third. Holtan and Delaine picked up the wins in their respective heats.

WISSOTA Street driver Ryan Johnson of Karlstad, Mn. won features on the opening night and last night of racing in 2014, picked up where he left off and it took him 15 laps to do it. Johnson would start 5th in the 11 car field, but it would be outside polesitter Shawn Teunis of West St. Paul, Mb to take the early lead. Teunis would be followed closely by Terry Blacklance of Thief River Falls,

Mn. and Badger, Mn. driver Nick Linert. Johnson would get by Blacklance and Linert on a restart and actually would pass Teunis for the lead on two separate occasions only to have it nullified by caution flags. After the 6th caution flag, it was a green, white, checkered finish and heading into the final corner Johnson would get beside Teunis as the two drag raced to the checkered flag with Johnson getting the win by a fender.
