18 Annual East Polk County Relay for Life

The American Cancer Society East Polk County Relay for Life event was held on Friday, June 24th at New Journey Church in Fosston. This annual fundraising event supports the American Cancer Society's mission to save and improve lives touched by cancer, through funding cancer research, education, and providing important services to cancer patients in our communities.

The 18th Annual event began with each of the seven teams setting up their campsites and visitors were able to stop at each team's site for a bite to eat, or to purchase something or just to visit.

Paul Peltier began the Opening Ceremony of the Relay at 6:30pm, singing the National Anthem. Followed by the Honorary Survivor speaker, Barb Wickham. Next cancer survivors in attendance were recognized and each given a purple balloon to take outside and release.

Local community members then performed in the Relay's Got Talent show for a great crowd of family, friends and community members.

The luminaria lighting ceremony followed and those in attendance could walk a small path and reflect on those that have lost their battle to cancer and others who have survived. The small track inside the church was lined with luminaria. Each was lit in honor or memory of those who have faced cancer, those who lost their battle, those who won, and those who continue to fight. Each Luminaria on the track represents someone special, and serves as a tribute to our community's fight against cancer.

The event was co-chaired by Jodi Thompson and Hazel Trostad. Team Captains were Brook Burggraf, Barb Wickham, Crystal Munter, Mary Dyrda, Andrew Hanson, Jodi Thompson, Linda Godtland, Ernie Agnes and Robin Anderson. Each team consisted of family members, friends, and coworkers.

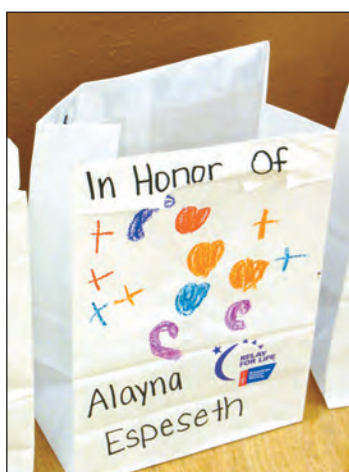

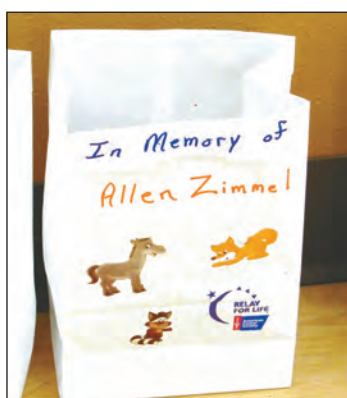

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Sound Off, combat veterans support group at Sanford Bemidji

BEMIDJI, Minn. – Sanford Bemidji offers a support group, Sound Off, for combat veterans. It is held from 5 to 7 p.m. the first and third Tuesday each month at Sanford Bemidji Medical Center's Conference Room A, located immediately to the right through the hospital's main east entrance. The group will meet next on July 5 and July 19.

The group is free and open to men and women from all branches of service, regardless of conflict or disaster. It is facilitated by Billy Benso, United States Marine Corps (USMC) combat veteran, and Mike Sletta, behavioral health triage therapist at Sanford Bemidji.

The group provides members with a safe and confidential place to openly discuss personal issues and how their combat experience impacts their daily life.

"Post-traumatic stress disorder, or PTSD, is a condition many veterans struggle with after traumatic experiences such as combat or disaster," said Sletta. "What we want our vets to know is that it's real, you are not alone, and help is out there with groups like ours."

The support group can help veterans learn that:

- Combat did change them

• No matter what they do, they can't change what they've experienced

• Drugs, alcohol, isolation and denial don't work as coping behaviors

• With support of other combat vets, they can learn to live with PTSD

Any veteran interested in attending can simply show up at the scheduled meeting time.

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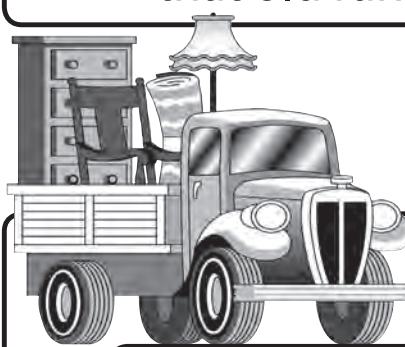
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DNR and Roseau River Watershed District partner on flood damage reduction project

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and Roseau River Watershed District are partnering on a flood damage reduction project that will also enhance wildlife habitat over thousands of acres of public land on the Roseau River Wildlife Management Area in Roseau County.

“For over two decades, the Roseau River WMA and surrounding area has often been buried in water,” said Randy Prachar, Roseau River WMA wildlife supervisor. “Excessive flooding has compromised wildlife habitat. The project will not solve all of the WMA’s flooding problems, but will go a long way toward better habitat management for the wide array of plants and wildlife native to the area.”

Construction started in June to address discharge of water from the pools that too often coincides with peak flows of a given flood on the western portion of the Roseau River. This discharge may result in damage to infrastructure and compromises various land uses such as agriculture near the river. It also contributes to transfer of flood waters from the Roseau River to the Two Rivers watershed in the area locally known as the Juneberry area (the “Big Swamp”), northwest of Greenbush.

The project includes installation of two new water control structures – one on Pool 2 and one on Pool 3, enhancement of an existing water conveyance channel on the west end of Pool 3, and development of a 1.9-mile-long outlet channel from the west end of Pool 3 to the Roseau River.

Unlike other areas of the state, the Roseau River WMA has relatively intact habitat that, on a landscape scale, will produce an abundance and diversity of wildlife when flooding is moderated through management, Prachar said.

The partnership

Developing the partnership was critical to the success of this project. The DNR contributed the land on the Roseau River WMA, and took the lead on environmental review and permitting for the project. WMA staff will operate the structures.

The watershed district applied for and administers the flood damage reduction grant, which pays for the infrastructure. The district provided technical expertise in wetland delineation, project mitigation for wetland impacts and engineering throughout the project’s development. The wa-

tershed district also organized formal public hearings for the project. Roseau County provided use of an unorganized township road.

Win-Win situation

Talk of the project was initiated in the early 2000s. The project team reconvened in 2009 when the Roseau River Watershed District and the DNR determined that there was enough common ground and interest to restart project discussions.

“The Roseau River WMA project is now in the construction phase after a successful second attempt to develop a flood reduction project and natural resources enhancement project,” said LeRoy Carriere, long-time watershed district board member. “Thank you to everyone involved.”

The project followed the Red River mediation agreement project team process whereby agency and local concerns are addressed through the use of a consensus-based process to reach agreements for the solutions that meet the defined goals of the project. It will operate according to an operations plan agreed to by the project work team, which consisted of agency representatives, landowners and local government members. “Using the project team process to move this project forward was important to reaching our goal of a final, constructed project,” said Roseau River Watershed District Board Chair Tony Wensloff. “Because all interested parties were at the table from the start, we were able to keep moving forward in the right direction.”

The project will reduce the peak flow on the Roseau River. Peak discharge from the pools to the river will now occur ahead of the peak flow period on the river. Water level fluctuations within the pools will be reduced and flooding will be moderated along the river in the Big Swamp. These changes will enhance the quality of existing wildlife habitat, combat invasive species competition with native vegetation, and improve wildlife production.

“The operating plan does not change the existing management strategy for wildlife habitat on Roseau River WMA,” Prachar said. “It simply allows a better chance for those strategies to succeed.”

Road preservation project begins July 11 on highways 32, 72, 92 and 102

BEMIDJI, Minn. – Motorists can expect lane closures and delays on area highways beginning Monday, July 11, as crews complete preventive maintenance seal coating projects that will extend the life of the highway surface.

The highway segments scheduled for the preventative maintenance include:

- Highway 32 – Fertile to Highway 200 (15 miles)
- Highway 102 – Fertile to Crookston (19 miles)
- Highway 92 – Gonvick to Trail (8 miles)
- Highway 92 – Bagley to mile post 53 (2 miles)
- Highway 72 – Waskish to mile post 48 (12 miles)

During this work, a pilot car and flaggers will control traffic, and motorists should plan

for daily lane closures in the area where crews are working. Drivers are urged to slow down and be alert for loose gravel and oil spraying in these areas. The work zone speed limit is 40 mph.

Crews will be working during daylight hours and once work is complete on one segment, crews will move to the next section and not necessarily in the order outlined above. The project is expected to be complete by the beginning of August, weather permitting.

Morris Sealcoat & Trucking, Inc., is the contractor the \$1.4 million project consisting of 56 miles of pavement resurfacing.

MnDOT urges motorists to always drive with caution, and reminds them to slow down in the work zone and never enter a roadway that has been blocked with barriers or cones.

Ask a Trooper

Question: I was wondering who is required to stop at weigh stations. Next month I will be taking a trip up north pulling a 20 foot trailer, fully loaded with my ATVs on it. My truck is a 2004 F350 dually crew cab – long box. I was wondering if I'm required to pull through or not when coming upon a weigh station.

Answers: In Minnesota the signs on the roadway say “all trucks over 10,000 lbs. must enter when open.” By law, you must enter Minnesota weigh stations when they're open with the vehicles you described as I would say that would be over 10,000 lbs.

Also as mentioned in this situation that most of the Commercial Motor Vehicle requirements (log books, health cards, etc.) would likely not apply since it's for “personal use.” A good reminder that every driver is responsible for securing their

entire load/cargo. The State Patrol is the sole agency having statewide jurisdiction in vehicle size and weight enforcement. The Commercial Vehicle Section staffs highway weigh stations at Erskine, Lakeland, Moorhead, Ramsey, Saginaw, and Worthington. In addition, all commercial vehicle enforcement personnel carry low profile portable scales for roadside weighing stations.

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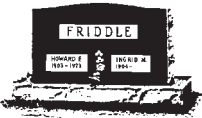

Holtan & Sobolik get first checkers of the year at Greenbush Race Park

The 4th of July weekend and a beautiful night for racing set the stage for the WISSOTA Polydome dirt track series at the Greenbush Race Park.

The Central Boiler Modifieds would send 13 cars to take the green flag. Jordan Duray of Halma, Mn. would start third and lead the first three laps before spinning in corner four and making contact with Rick Delaine of Stoney Mountain, Mb., sending both drivers to the rear. On the restart, Newfolden, Mn., driver Aaron Holtan would inherit the top spot and use it to build a commanding lead. Holtan would go unchallenged to pick up his first feature win of the year, Dustin Wahl of Greenbush, would finish second and heat winner Gavin Paull of Fort Frances, Ont., third. Jamen Foss of Greenbush, Mn., would pick up the other heat win.

Polesitter Kurt Smith of Greenbush, would lead the 20 car Midwest Modified field to the green and it would be Smith to hold the lead through a couple of caution flags until about lap six when Patrick Sobolik of Hallock, powered past John Halvorson of Warren, and Smith for the lead. The last yellow would fly on lap eight and on the restart Halvorson got by Smith for second and one lap later Halvorson surrendered the second spot to Jordan Wahl of Greenbush, but Sobolik would go on to pick up his first feature win of the year with Wahl finishing second, and Halvorson third. Austin Hunter of Winnipeg, Mb., would start 16th and finish fifth. Heat wins went to Halvorson, Wahl, Justin Olson of Thief River Falls, and Don Scholler of International Falls.

The 10 car Street feature would have Jeremy Gust of Strathcona,jump to the early lead only to have Ryan Johnson of Karlstad, Mn., get the top spot one lap later. Johnson,

who started seventh, would hold everyone off even through the lone caution flag to pick up his second win of the year. Shawn Tuenis who won the three previous features would finish second and Gust third. Johnson and Chase Boen of Karlstad, would pick up the heat wins.

The featured race of the evening was the Chad Olson Memorial for the Lightning Sprints. Three time winner of this race Roland Bernard of Winnipeg, Mb., would lead the pack through the first half of the 25 lap race. But in the last half of the race Alan Truscinski of Greenbush, started to reel Bernard in, and a caution on lap 22 would put everyone on Bernard's bumper. On the restart it would be Brandon Johnson to jump to the highside to challenge Bernard. And it would be Johnson using that highside to make a last lap, last corner pass on Bernard to get the win and his second Olson memorial win. Bernard would finish second and Truscinski third. Bernard and Johnson would pick up the heat wins.

Bryce Corneliusen of Warren, would lead the 10 car Pure Stock feature to the green flag and hold the lead through some early cautions before he started leaving a trail of white smoke and pulling off the track on lap 10. Last weeks feature winner Jared Palm of Warroad, Mn., would inherit the lead only the have Ryan Hagen of Thief River Falls, get by Palm out of turn two on lap 12. Hagen would go on to win his second feature of the year with Palm finishing second and Adj. Lane of Williams, third. Jerome Berger of Badger, and Corneliusen won the heats.

Up next on July 9th at the Race Park will be just a regular night of racing with all six classes, Modifieds, Streets, Midwest Modifieds, Pure Stocks, Lightning Sprints and the 4 Cylinders. Gates open at 4:30 with the draw cutoff at 6pm and racing set to start at 7pm sharp.

Reminder: It is illegal to uproot aquatic plants using hydraulic jets

Aquatic plants help keep lakes clean and support fish populations – reasons why each year the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds lakeshore property owners about a type of product that can damage lake bottoms.

These devices resemble a fan or trolling motor contained in a short tube and create strong currents of moving water. They can be used to push floating debris away from docks and shorelines but may not be used to move sediment or excavate the lake bottom or remove aquatic plants.

“People need to know that they can’t aim products that produce jets of water in such a way that they move the lake bottom,” said Steve Enger, aquatic plant management supervisor with the DNR. “In some cases, depending on water depth, it may be impossible to use these products legally. In all cases, if these products are kicking up sediment from the lake bottom the property owners could receive a citation.”

The products are not always illegal, but consumers should use caution before purchasing these devices. A quick test: If the intent is to move sediment

or uproot aquatic plants, then the intended use is illegal.

“Unfortunately, we’ve seen these products directed at the lake bottom, where they can uproot aquatic plants and cause clouds of sediment that can drift along the shoreline,” Enger said. “This can cloud other people’s enjoyment of the lake, and may cover fish spawning areas with a layer of sediment.”

Aquatic plants help maintain water clarity, prevent erosion, stabilize the bottom and provide habitat for fish and wildlife. While lakeshore property owners can legally remove some aquatic vegetation for access, it is illegal to use a hydraulic jet to do so. There are other options for legally removing aquatic vegetation. These may require a permit, depending on the control method, type of plant and size of the control area.

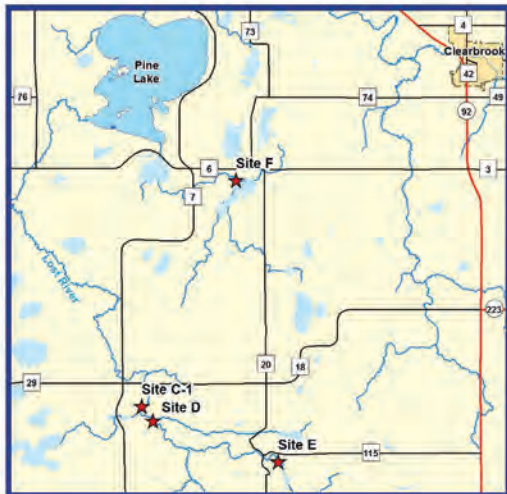
