## DNR appoints new Parks and Trails area manager at Lake Bronson

The Department of Natural Resources recently appointed Jenny Eastvold as the Parks and Trails area manager based out of Lake Bronson State Park in northwestern Minnesota.

Eastvold began her new job on June 20. She oversees operations and recreational programs at Lake Bronson, Old Mill and Hayes Lake state parks, as well as area Trails and Waterway program operations.

Eastvold started her DNR career with the Parks and Trails Division in 1990 as the assistant park manager at Lake Bronson State Park after working four seasons at Voyageurs National Park. She went on to work at McCarthy Beach, Temperance River, Scenic and Jay Cooke state parks. 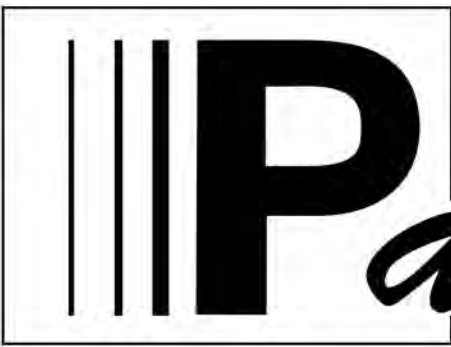

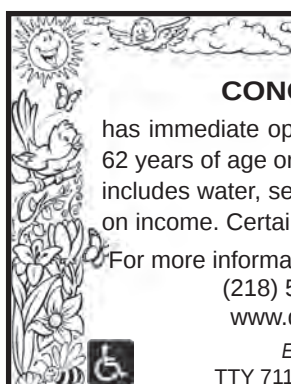

Ruffed grouse counts up, sharp-tailed grouse down from last year

Minnesota's ruffed grouse spring drumming counts were up 18 percent statewide this year compared to last year, according to a survey conducted by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

"Ruffed grouse populations tend to rise and fall on a 10-year cycle and counts this year are typical of what we expect during the rising phase of the cycle, which we are seeing now," said Charlotte Roy, DNR grouse project leader.

Drumming is a low sound produced by males as they beat their wings rapidly and in increasing frequency to signal the location of their territory. Drumming displays also attract females that are ready to begin nesting. Ruffed grouse populations are surveyed by counting the number of male ruffed grouse heard drumming on established routes throughout the state's forested regions.

Drumming counts are an indicator of the ruffed grouse breeding population. The number of birds present during the fall hunting season also depends upon nesting success and chick survival during the spring and summer. For the past 67 years, DNR biologists have monitored ruffed grouse populations. This year, DNR staff and cooperators from 14 organizations surveyed 126 routes across the state.

The 2016 survey results for ruffed grouse were 1.3 drums per stop statewide. The averages during 2013 and 2014 and 2015 were 0.9 and 1.1 and 1.1, respectively. Counts vary from about 0.6 drums per stop during years of low grouse abundance to about 2.0 during years of high abundance. Results this year

follow a year of no change from 2014 to 2015. While it can be difficult to explain year-to-year variation, the lack of change in last year's results followed a cold, wet spring of 2014, which may have hurt grouse production.

In the northeast survey region, which is the core of Minnesota's grouse range, counts were 1.5 drums per stop; in the northwest there were 1.1 drums per stop; in the central hardwoods, 0.8 drums per stop; and in the southeast, 0.8 drums per stop.

**Sharp-tailed grouse counts down slightly**

To count sharp-tailed grouse, observers look for males displaying on traditional mating areas, which are called leks or dancing grounds.

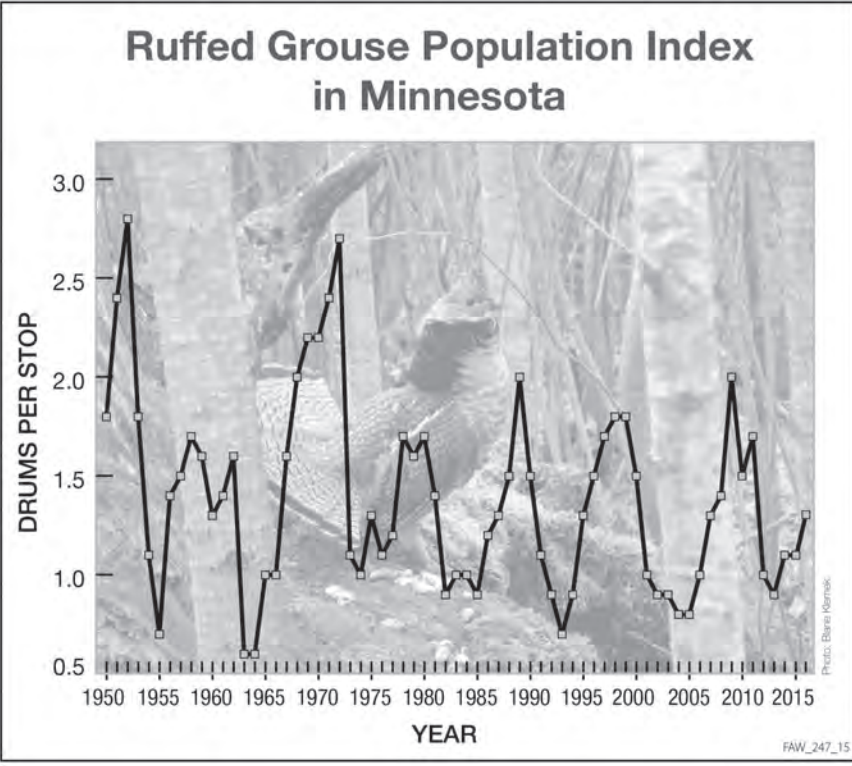
"The data on sharp-tailed grouse take some interpretation, because survey results can be influenced by how many leks are counted or changes in how many birds are at each lek year to year," Roy said. "The average number of sharp-tailed grouse was similar this year compared to

Did you know one of the state's first automobile routes passed right through Itasca State Park? Over 100 years since the highway was conceived, there has been a renewed interest in the Jefferson Highway, an early automobile route that linked small towns from New Orleans, Louisiana, to Winnipeg, Manitoba. As the nation's first transcontinental highway, the Jefferson Highway created intense competition between states, cities and towns. Everyone wanted to be included on its route, as the age of the automobile emerged. Minnesota, and especially Itasca State Park, became a top destination for tourists.

After much initial celebration and publicity, the Jefferson Highway quietly disappeared from maps in the 1920s. Only traces of the nearly forgotten highway remain today, but the route laid the groundwork for some of today's major highways, and it had a significant impact on early tourism in Minnesota.

Today, local communities are becoming excited about searching for evidence of the original route, which often can be found in trails threading around lakes, swamps and hills. Join Ren Holland and Frank Mitchell, who were raised near Itasca Park and lived on the Jefferson for years, as they share their new findings on the history of this short-lived but popular road route.

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**Make your summer party a green get-together**

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency has some provided some tips to help make your family get-together less stressful on our natural resources. Summer is the prime time to sit back, relax, and enjoy family and the neighbors. It's the season of parties and barbecues. No matter what kind of get-together you're planning, there are a few simple ways to make it more sustainable! In most cases--from composting to mosquito control--hosting a sustainable event can actually be cheaper and easier than the wasteful alternative.

**Organics recycling stations.** Think of all those paper plates, napkins, and party invitations dumped into the trash bin. Each ton of paper recycled saves 17 trees, 380 gallons of oil, 3 cubic yards of landfill space, 4,000 kilowatts of energy, and 7,000 gallons of water. That's why it's so important to set up recycling bins and composting bins around your space. Reducing your overall waste is easiest when you plan ahead of time and focus on reusing items. You can place clearly labeled waste stations with garbage, recycling, and organics collection containers. Free downloadable signs are available at Rethink Recycling. With more and more drop-off sites and curb-pickups, it's easier than ever to dispose of your organics.

What are organics? Organics include all food scraps (fruits, veggies, bread, eggshells, coffee grounds), food-soiled paper, (tissues), non-plastic lined bowls, pizza boxes, napkins) and certified compostable plastics. Unlike small-scale or backyard composting, commercial organics recycling facilities are designed to handle large volumes of material, so they process meat, dairy, bones and non-recycleable paper. For more general information, click on this list of what is/is not suitable for organics recycling.

Where do I bring my organics recycling? Some cities will soon have citywide organics recycling, and a number of other cities are adding drop sites. Please check with your local municipality or service provider to confirm if, how, where, and what organics materials you may be able to recycle. Some programs may be free, while others will have a cost for service. And, you can always start your own backyard compost!

**BYOP (bring your own plate).** Provide reusable or compostable plates, cups, silverware and linens. Using reusable and washable items is always the best choice whenever feasible.

**Ditch the balloons.** Consider buying an alternative decoration (like native flowers)! Try to decorate only with items that could be reused, recycled or composted, instead of thrown in the trash at the end of the night.

**Drink up.** If you provide separate recycling containers for empty cans and bottles, you can go one step further by buying bulk-size containers and asking guests to bring reusable cups or mugs.

**Eat local.** Eating local food is easy to do with summer farmers' markets, co-ops and blooming neighborhood gardens. Eating locally reduces the amount of fuel needed to grow, package, and transport the food, especially when we think of how the average meal travels 1,500 miles to make it to our dinner tables. Try turning your special event into a potluck, or ask your guests to each contribute an item from their gardens.

**Pass the ketchup.** Always buy condiments in bulk to avoid those pesky individual wrappers. Buying food in bulk is an easy way to create less packaging as well!

**Bzzzzzzzz.** Mosquitoes can make or break an outdoor party, but there are surprisingly effective ways of managing them without breaking out the DEET. The EPA considers DEET and picaridin "conventional repellents" and oil of lemon eucalyptus a "biopesticide repellents." Lemon eucalyptus oil has been used since the 1940s as an insect repellent. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has approved eucalyptus oil as an effective mosquito repellent. A recent study showed that a mixture of 32 percent lemon eucalyptus oil gave more than 95 percent protection against mosquitoes for three hours. All you need to do is mix one part lemon eucalyptus oil to 10 parts sunflower oil or witch hazel. (Not recommended on children under 3 years old).

## Ask a Trooper

**Question:** I frequently encounter a traffic situation while riding my bicycle. I ride with traffic and adhere to the same rules as when I'm behind the wheel of my own vehicle. When I come to a stop sign on my bike and the crossing traffic does not have the same,



many drivers will stop and attempt to wave me across. I will wave the polite crossing driver to move along. My thought is I'm riding in a lane of traffic and want to be treated the same as other traffic. If I want to be treated as a pedestrian, I will dismount my bike and cross at the crosswalk. I feel it is best to proceed through an intersection when crossing traffic is sufficiently spaced so I can make it across just as I would in an automobile. Accepting a wave by a driver doesn't necessarily assure my safe crossing as crossing traffic from the other

direction may or may not stop. Do you think drivers should only stop if a bicyclist dismounts and/or enters the crosswalk? Or am I misinterpreting their stopping as politeness when in fact they are legally required to stop?

Answer: If the bicyclist is off their bicycle at an intersection and walks across, they have all the rights at the intersection as a pedestrian would. Motorists must stop for crossing pedestrians at every intersection, even those without crosswalks or stoplights. Motorists should stop far enough back so drivers in other lanes can also see the pedestrian in time to stop.

Those riding a bicyclist must obey all traffic control signs and signals, just as motorists. Bicycle-vehicle collisions are due to a variety of behaviors by the rider, such as disregarding a traffic sign or signal, inattention and distraction.

Bicyclists and motorists are equally responsible for safety on the road. The number one contributing factor to bicycle-vehicle collisions is failure to yield the right-of-way — by bicyclists and drivers alike.

Each year in Minnesota, approximately 40 pedestrians and 10 bicyclists are killed as a result of collisions with motor vehicles.

- As a group, pedestrians and bicyclists comprise nearly 10 percent of all traffic fatalities each year —71 percent of these fatal crashes occur in urban areas.

- 30 percent of pedestrians and 8 percent of bicyclists killed had consumed alcohol.

- 15 percent of pedestrians killed were not crossing properly.

### Rules of the Road and Safety Tips

- Bicyclists may ride on all Minnesota roads, except where restricted.

- Bicyclists should ride on the road, and must ride in the same direction as traffic.

- Motorists must at all times maintain a three-foot clearance when passing a bicyclist.

- Bicyclists must signal their turns and should ride in a predictable manner.

- Bicyclists must use a head-light and rear reflectors when it's dark. To increase visibility, add a rear flashing light.

- Motorists must drive at safe speeds and be attentive — look for bicyclist sand check blind spots.

- Drivers should use caution and look twice for riders when turning.

## How to help students choose an extracurricular activity

## Winning License Plate announced

Following a week of online voting, during which more than 30,000 votes were cast, Lt. Gov. Tina Smith today announced the winner of the contest to design a Minnesota state parks and trails license plate.

The winning plate features an image of a canoe on the water, surrounded by Minnesota’s four seasons.

“Generations of Minnesotans have enjoyed our extraordinary state parks and trails system,” Smith said. “This new license plate allows Minnesotans to invest in the future of our parks and trails, and proudly demonstrate that commitment on their vehicles.”

The plate was submitted by Michelle Vesaas of Coon Rapids. Vesaas’s design received the most votes from among three finalists.

“My design was inspired by being in the outdoors in this beautiful state through all four seasons,” she said. “Even in the coldest days of winter, if you’re dressed for it, there is incredible beauty to be found.”

The new license plate will be available from the Department of Motor Vehicles this fall as part of the ongoing celebration of the 125th anniversary of Min-



nesota state parks and trails. The cost will start at \$60, plus tax. The total includes a one-time \$10 fee for the plate itself and a minimum \$50 contribution (renewable annually).

“Purchasing the new license plate will be a great way to show everyone on the road that you ‘go the extra mile’ to support Minnesota state parks and trails,” said Erika Rivers, DNR parks and trails director.

The plate provides their owners with unlimited access to all 75 Minnesota state parks and recreation areas for the year, replacing the need for an annual vehicle permit (a \$25 value).

Proceeds from license plate sales will help fund the operations and maintenance of Min-

nesota state parks and trails.

The DNR already has eight Critical Habitat license plates from which Minnesotans can choose. These specialty plates—first offered in 1995—provide an opportunity for citizens to support conservation and show their individuality by purchasing a license plate featuring a loon, a moose or another Minnesota-related image. The parks and trails plate will bring the total number of specialty license plates available from the DNR to nine.
