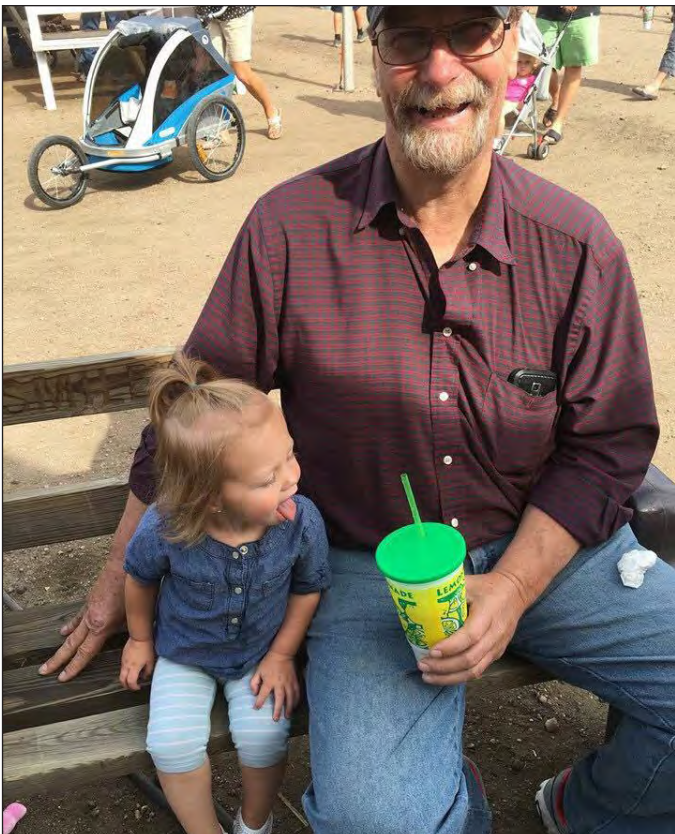

## Red Lake Chairman/Treasurer Attend Franken Listening Session

Red Lake Chairman Darrell G. Seki, Sr., Treasurer Annette Johnson, and Executive Administrator Charles Dolson, attended a rural infrastructure listening session on Wednesday, July 13, 2016, from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. at the Northwest Minnesota Foundation office in downtown Bemidji.

The session was hosted by staff from the office of US Senator Al Franken who included Jake Schwitzer, State Policy Advisor from Franken's St. Paul office, and Carson Ouellette, Franken's NW Field Rep-

resentative out of the Moorhead office.

In addition to Red Lake officers, attendees included a delegation from White Earth, several counties, cities, economic development agencies, utilities and business.

Schwitzer suggested an open discussion with the staff's main goal of listening in order to better understand northern Minnesota's needs and challenges around infrastructure. Rural Minnesota communities face unique challenges that the Metro area doesn't.

The Red Lake delegation brought up the disparity Red

Lake suffers because the formula used for tribal roads is based on population rather than land based. "Tribal roads are public roads," Seki reminded Franken's staff. Other issues brought up by tribal representatives included IHS funding, and the proliferation of drugs being brought on the reservation by non-tribal members. Seki argued that the tribe should be able to prosecute non-member offenders.

Treasurer Johnson brought up the high cost of Beltrami Electric's shut off policy. Dolson mentioned that Red Lake was moving forward with an

extensive solar energy initiative. Seki mentioned the need for housing pointing out that Red Lake has 400 members on a housing waiting list.

Other attendees shared Red Lake's concern for transportation, housing, water infrastructure and broadband access and affordability. All agreed that more funding was needed for rural infrastructure, asserting that this is connected...and vital to keeping rural Minnesota healthy. Nearly all were of the same mind that working with the feds led to unnecessary and expensive "red tape" citing several examples.

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## Clearbrook-Gonvick summer recreation hosts Kloster Park League, Cadet League World Series

Kloster Memorial Park in Clearbrook will host area Summer Recreation programs as they wrap up their softball and baseball activities.

The popular Kloster Park League World Series returns for its 28th year on Sunday, July 24. Thirteen teams in three leagues will be battling for the coveted World Series crown. The Northern League (girls ages 9-14) has four softball teams. The Junior League (9-11 year old boys) has five baseball teams and the Senior League (12-14 year old boys) has four teams this year. Pitching machines are used for all games.

The day kicks off at 1:30 when regular season awards will be presented. Games will begin at 2:00. The Northern League starts their World Se-

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## RSVP popular bone builder exercise class transitions to evidence-based SAIL (Stay Active and Independent for Life)

Bede Ballroom, on the campus of the University of MN Crookston, was alive with movement during the June 28 training event for RSVP Bone Builder Volunteer Exercise Trainers. Eighty-eight current and/or new volunteers from the Northwest MN region participated in the day long event, enjoying a presentation on Reflexology by Crookston resident Nancy Wagner before jumping in to the audience participation portion of actual training in a similar, yet superior, exercise program named Stay Active and Independent for Life (SAIL).

For many years, one of RSVP's most popular programs throughout the seven-county region has been the osteoporosis prevention exercise class called Bone Builders, which is currently in 31 sites, keeping more than 500 older adults moving and socializing within a group exercise setting. With looming news that RSVP's federal and state grants will no longer count Bone Builders as an impact program, the step to transition to an accepted and evidence based program was taken to comply with grant guidelines. Evidence based means thorough research has been conducted and health benefits have been measured and improved.

"SAIL Away With Bone Builders" will continue as RSVP's typical exercise class as trainers are now equipped to return to their classes and begin implementation. Classes will still be provided free of charge twice per week for one hour, with a focus on strength, balance and falls prevention. SAIL, like Bone Builders, is a fitness class specifically designed for older adults which includes educational materials and self-assessments. It is safe, fun and it works, helping older adults stay active and independent.

There are many similarities between BB and SAIL meaning trainers and participants should be able to easily transition. This change will align RSVP with grant guidelines and bring new energy to RSVP exercise classes!

The event was the culmination of nearly two years preparation and planning. In the summer of 2015, three RSVP Bone Builder volunteer trainers took an online class in the SAIL program. Cheryl Hegg and Elaine Bertils, Fertile, and Pauline Olson, Hallock, stepped forward with enthusiasm and



determination to complete the 'More than expected' curriculum goals. "Completing the course was a great commitment of time and energy on their part," stated RSVP Director, Tammy Frohlich. "The large group training event would not have been possible without them!"

Without the transition, RSVP's longevity and all their services would be at risk of termination. The proactive approach to comply will not only ensure RSVP's competitiveness, but will provide area seniors top-notch health promotion and prevention experiences.

It is now the newly trained RSVP volunteers, equipped with manuals, a demonstration dvd, and their actual training participation, who will impact rural seniors wishing to remain healthy and independent within their communities. "Our enthusiastic and supportive volunteers are the reason we are able to provide the services we do!" commented Ms. Frohlich.

## Minnesota State Patrol

### DPS News: 41 protesters arrested on 35W

More than 40 protesters made their way to Interstate 35W in Minneapolis Wednesday morning blocking the freeway and endangering the motoring public. The Minnesota State Patrol, Hennepin County Sheriff's deputies and University of Minnesota police responded to the area and closed the freeway for the safety of the protesters, motorists and first responders.

Troopers arrested 41 on the freeway after about an hour and impounded four vehicles the protesters used to block traffic. They will be charged appropriately for their actions which endangered the motoring public. The freeway reopened shortly after 9:15.

"The State Patrol supports the right to exercise one's First Amendment rights, but the freeway is not the place to do so," said Col. Matt Langer, Minnesota State Patrol Chief. "The closure of an interstate freeway for the purposes of a demonstration is unacceptable. They are used by everyone and are an artery for emergency vehicles. It is illegal to walk on the freeway and blocking traffic is dangerous for both pedestrians and motorists."

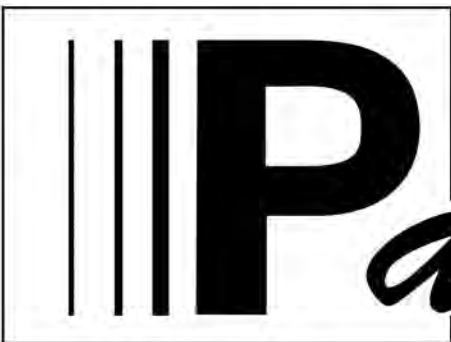

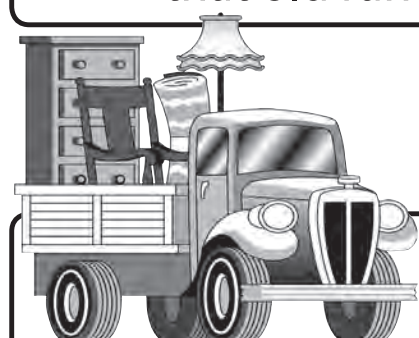

## Ask a Trooper

by Sgt. Jesse Grabow Minnesota State Patrol

**Question:** I have two questions for you. Do I need a hood on my car to operate it legally? What is the law regarding vehicle fenders and tires sticking out beyond the sides of a vehicle?

**Answer:** There is nothing in Minnesota law requiring a hood on a motor vehicle while in transport.

Minnesota law states that "Every passenger automobile shall have fenders, or other devices, that are designed to prevent, as far as practicable, water, dirt, or other material being thrown up and to the rear by the wheels of the vehicle." So every vehicle MUST have fenders. In reference to wheels sticking out, if the wheels go



out beyond the outside of the vehicle, then they would NOT be in compliance with the law. If someone was to have wider wheels on their vehicle that stuck out past the fender, they would need some type of fender flare added on.

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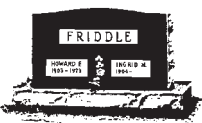

## Heavy rains flood some state campsites and trails; cause dangerous river conditions

Heavy rains in portions of north-central and east-central Minnesota have flooded campsites and other facilities at some state parks, prompted the closure of several off-highway vehicle (OHV) trails and state forest roads, and created dangerous river conditions, said the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

Water levels continue to rise on rivers and streams in the region, including the Mississippi and St. Croix, and are projected to continue rising over the next several days. Fast-moving, swollen rivers should be avoided; water recreationists are advised to check the state water trails website for river level information to locate rivers unaffected by the flooding event.

Although all state parks remain open, some campsites, trails and facilities are temporarily closed.

Conditions across the affected region are changing rapidly; anyone planning to visit a park or trail in the days ahead should check the DNR website for visitor alerts or call local park or DNR offices before leaving home. Where campsites are flooded, state park staff are notifying reservation holders and issuing refunds.

"By checking conditions online, state park visitors, and river and trail users, should be able to find alternative locations where they can still get out to recreate safely and responsibly," said parks and trails district supervisor Joe Alberio. "Closures will be lifted as soon as conditions allow and repairs are made. If unsure about the status of a campground, trail or river, the best option is to either check the DNR's website or call

the local state park office."

Closures at this time include:

- The campground at Interstate State Park.

- Rock Lake Campground, Pillsbury State Forest.

- Tamarack Horsecamp and Boulder Campground in the St. Croix State Forest.

- OHV trails and some forest roads in the Nemadji and St. Croix state forests.

- The Kettle River Bridge north of Rutledge and the Willow River Bridge on the Willard Munger State Trail.

Other state park, trail and facility closures may exist in areas of high water or storm damage. Check online at [www.mndnr.gov/closures](http://www.mndnr.gov/closures) for updates on current conditions before traveling.

While some state park and trail facilities may reopen, high water conditions can persist in rivers and lakes for an extended period of time following flooding events. Water recreationists should avoid flooded waterbodies, stay alert for potential storm debris in waterways, and be sure to wear a life jacket at all times. For current river level reports, check [www.mndnr.gov/river\\_levels](http://www.mndnr.gov/river_levels).

Additionally, some public water accesses may be inaccessible due to high water conditions and slow no-wake restrictions may be in place. To find alternate public water access locations, visit [mndnr.gov/wateraccess](http://mndnr.gov/wateraccess).

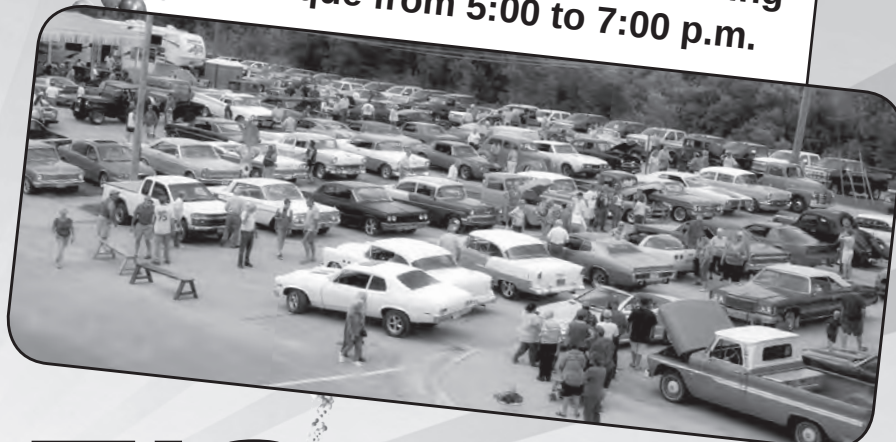
