Itasca State Park sustained heavy damage from storms

Heavy storms in northern Minnesota hit several state parks knocking out power and temporarily closing some overnight facilities.

Itasca State Park received the most damage.

Heavy storms and damaging winds in northern Minnesota downed trees and knocked out power in several state parks and recreation areas including Itasca State Park early Thursday.

No injuries have been reported. DNR staff are still assessing state parks, trails, water accesses, roads and facilities in the northern half of the state for potential damage.

Visitors are reminded to check online at www.mndnr.gov/closures for updates on current conditions and closures before traveling. With power and telephone lines down, updates will be made as soon as possible.

Visitors should beware of dangers posed by the aftermath of the storm, such as downed or uprooted trees, other debris on trails and at accesses, and localized flooding.

The DNR is alerting guests with camping and lodging reservations impacted by closures.

Itasca State Park Update

The park remains open for day use. The north and south entrances are open, but the east entrance is temporarily closed. Visitors are encouraged to use caution because parks and trails crews are busy clean-

ing up downed trees and other damage.

Most of the park's public buildings, including cabins, the lodge and the visitor center are temporarily closed. Power and

phone lines are out at this time. Camping and lodging availability will be assessed daily. It is best to go online www.mndnr.gov/itasca for the latest updates and current conditions.

MnDOT awards \$96,000 in grants to support safer bicycling

Bicycle fleet awards are part of Safe Routes to School program

ST. PAUL, Minn. — More than 16,000 Minnesota youth will benefit from the Minnesota Department of Transportation's Safe Routes to School grants that support pedestrian and bicycle safety education in schools.

Bicycle fleets, trailers and supplies were awarded to the Northwest Regional Development Commission in Warren, St. Cloud Area Public School District and Willmar Community Education and Recreation. Awardees estimate the three fleets will be used in 42 schools, scout groups, 4-H clubs, parks and recreation and after school programs.

As a part of MnDOT's Safe Routes to School program, these \$96,000 in grants award communities a trailer, bicycles and supplies that enable teachers, after school programs, and other community groups to share the bicycles while teaching critical safety skills to youth in Minnesota.

Schools in Northwest Minnesota who will benefit from this grant are those in the eight counties of Pennington, Kittson, Mahanomen, Marshall, Norman, Polk, Red Lake, and Roseau.

"These grants will increase opportunities for kids across Minnesota to bike to school by providing free access to biking equipment and safety training," said Lt. Governor Tina Smith. "In addition to improving safety, these grants will help keep Minnesota communities healthy by facilitating the development of lifelong habits."

"Since the 1960s, the rate of youth bicycling and walking to school has decreased from 48 percent to a mere 13 percent," said MnDOT Commissioner Charlie Zelle. "The Safe Routes to School program aims to reverse this trend. The bicycle fleet grants and pedestrian and bicycle safety education are key components of ensuring youth in Minnesota are given the lifelong skills to walk and bicycle safely."

Part of the bicycle safety education includes the Walk! Bike! Fun! curriculum for children ages 5 to 13.



Since 2005, MnDOT has awarded approximately \$20 million yearly in federal funds to communities to support Safe Routes to School. The majority of funding is for infrastructure projects.

In 2013, Gov. Dayton and the legislature authorized \$500,000 in general

funds for Safe Routes to School non-infrastructure activities for the biennium. In 2014, this was increased to \$1 million for non-infrastructure activities. An additional \$1 million from the general fund was invested for infrastructure projects.

Making Sure Our Veterans Can Get the Care they Deserve

When we ask our service-members to put their lives on the line in defense of our nation, we make a commitment to give them the support they need when they come home. But too often, we fall short of that commitment, especially when it comes to healthcare.

I spend a lot of time with veterans around our state. I hear over and over again that our veterans are waiting too long for appointments at Veterans Affairs (VA) Medical Facilities. When our service-members signed up to serve there wasn't a waiting line, and there shouldn't be a waiting line at their medical facilities when they come home.

That's why I joined with Republican Senator Joni Ernst of Iowa and introduced legislation that would establish a patient self-scheduling appointment system at VA Medical Facilities. The Faster Care for Veterans Act would introduce a pilot program which would allow veterans to use their mobile devices and the internet to self-schedule, modify, and confirm outpatient and specialty care appointments.

When veterans cannot schedule the appointments they need in a timely manner, their lives may be at risk. A veteran who wants to schedule an appointment to check on their heart, but can't because of long wait times, could be at a heightened risk for a heart attack. A veteran who needs to schedule an appointment to adjust the dosage of medication they are taking might not be able to wait more than a month in order to see a specialist.

The numbers are troubling. More than 120,000 veterans waited at least 90 days for appointments for healthcare, and some never even received appointments. In 2015, the number of veterans waiting 30 days or more for medical care increased by 50 percent.

Often, appointments are available at VA facilities but go unfilled, further contributing to long wait times. A 2008 internal audit by the Inspector General of the Department of Veterans Affairs estimated 18 percent of outpatient appointment slots

went unfilled due to patient "no-shows" or because facility personnel did not refill the cancelled appointments.

This is unacceptable, and our veterans deserve better. No one should have to wait weeks or months to receive the medical care they need, especially our veterans.

With our bipartisan bill, veterans would be able to self-schedule appointments 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and could immediately schedule appointments canceled by other veterans. This would significantly reduce wait times for veterans trying to get appointments because it would ensure that all available appointments are utilized.

This new legislation builds on our work to ensure that our veterans receive the care and respect they have earned when they return home. Whether it is expanding the federal hiring preference for our National Guard and reservists, helping Iraq and Afghanistan veterans who were exposed to toxic burn pits, or making it easier for veterans to get jobs they're trained for, I know we can do better.

Our Faster Care for Veterans Act capitalizes on state-of-the-art technology that makes it easier to schedule medical appointments. This technology already exists, and is being used by private sector hospitals and health systems to eliminate wait times and ensure that every available appointment is filled. It is commonsense that we enable our veterans to use this same technology to schedule their medical appointments without unnecessary red tape and delays. The VA is currently trying to develop its own scheduling application. While this is a great step forward, veterans have already been waiting too long for technology that already exists.

Long wait times put veterans' lives at risk. After they have sacrificed so much, it is our duty to treat them with the dignity and respect that they have earned. This bipartisan bill would take an important step forward in ensuring that our brave men and women who have sacrificed so much have timely access to the medical care they need and deserve.

Arts Legacy and Arts Project Grants deadline is August 1

The application deadline for Arts Legacy and Arts Projects Grants from the Northwest Minnesota Arts Council is August 1, 2016. \$130,000.00 is available for various arts organizations, communities, and school districts. Applications are being accepted in our seven county service area including Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake and Roseau counties.

The Arts Legacy Grants is a main category for funding artistic activity within the seven county service region. Funding for the grants comes from the Minnesota State Legislature through the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund of the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment. A maximum of

\$10,000.00 can be requested. Applicants are required to provide for at least 10% cash match and in cases of repeat sponsorship, a 25% cash match.

Arts Projects Grants are supported by general allocation funds from the Minnesota State legislature, for locally produced projects and events as well as

sponsorship of performances of touring companies and artists. These grants are a maximum of \$3,000.00 with an either 10% cash match or a 25% match for repeat sponsorship.

Also available on a first come-first served basis are Artist Residency Grants for our School Districts. The maximum

is \$2100.00 to sponsor a traditional weeklong residency. An extra \$400.00 may be requested for visual art residencies for supplies. Schools are strongly urged to use a COMPAS artist.

Arts Projects funded through these very important grant opportunities include festivals, community theatre projects, folk music entertainment, sponsorship of visual demonstrations, creative writing workshops and many other activities that improve the quality of life of people in our communities.

Carbon Monoxide poisoning suspected

On July 22nd at approximately 9:15 a.m., a call was made to the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office of a possible carbon monoxide poisoning at a residence northeast of Clearbrook. A Sheriff's deputy along with the Clearbrook Fire Department and Bagley Sanford Ambulances responded to the scene. Four people, including two adults and two children, were all showing symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning. The two adults were found unresponsive. All four were taken by ambulances to the hospital and are receiving treatment for carbon monoxide poisoning. The adult male has been flown to the Twin Cities for treatment. The preliminary findings are that the family was using a generator next to their house due to the power outage that occurred on July 21st and their basement filled with carbon monoxide from the exhaust from the generator. When the power was restored to their house and their central air conditioning started again, the contaminated air in the basement was spread throughout the house. These findings, however, have not been confirmed.

As of this printing we have not received any updates.

New Rules for Telemarketers

By one estimate, Americans lost \$7.4 billion in 2015 to telemarketing scams. For years, scam artists—often operating from other countries—have asked people to pay them by wire transfer, reloadable money packs, or remotely-created checks or payment orders. Scammers prefer these methods because they are like cash—they are difficult to trace, and once sent, the money is usually gone for good.

The Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") recently changed federal regulations to ban telemarketers from accepting payment from people by wire transfer, reloadable packs, and remotely-created checks and payment orders.

Most legitimate telemarketers will follow the FTC's new rules, but scammers and criminals will not. If a telemarketer asks you to pay them by one of the four methods now prohibited, do not send the money. It is illegal, and the caller is breaking the law and likely trying to scam you.

In response to the rule changes, scam artists have already begun to exploit other

payment methods, including gift cards. It works like this: "Joe" received a call from someone who purported to represent Publishers Clearing House and claimed he won \$500,000 in a sweepstakes. The caller told Joe that he must pay a \$1,000 insurance fee with iTunes gift cards to receive his winnings. Joe knew this was a scam, so he hung up.

To protect yourself against fraud, never pay a telemarketer with a wire transfer, reloadable pack, or a remotely-created check or payment order. Avoid giving your debit card or bank information to any caller that you have not done business with before, and always beware of offers that require you to pay an advance fee to an unknown party.

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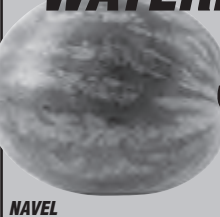

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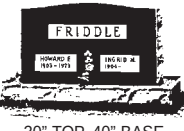

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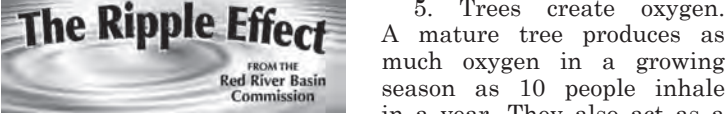
Why honeybees need protection

Honeybees flitting from flower to flower is one of the first signs that warm weather has arrived. Honeybees are a welcome presence in the garden, pollinating plants and contributing to local honey supplies.

Despite their importance in the ecosystem, honeybees are in grave danger. In 2014, U.S. President Barack Obama created a task force comprised of various agencies to address the growing issue of rapidly diminishing honeybees and other pollinating insects. This initiative was a response to reports from American beekeepers indicating hive deaths have been on the rise, gravely affecting the honeybee population. Honeybees pollinate many fruit trees, nut plants and vegetables, playing a crucial role for many nations’ food industries.

In addition to government involvement and honeybee conservation methods designed by environmental agencies, there are many things that regular citizens and homeowners can do to protect honeybees this summer. The Environmental Protection Agency and the Pesticide Action Network offer these tips.

- Use caution when applying any pesticides to home gardens. Be especially cautious when applying pesticides when bees are likely to be flying. If you must apply pesticides, do so only after dusk.
- Stagger your planting throughout the growing season. Rather than planting everything at once, stagger planting for flowers and other plants that have blooms. This gives bees plenty of pollen sources



Surviving the Heat Wave: Where’s the nearest tree?

As the biggest plants on the planet, trees give us oxygen, store carbon, stabilize the soil and give life to the world’s wildlife. They also provide us with the materials for tools and shelter. As humans we know trees are critical to many of the needs we require. But did you know that rivers, lakes and streams also rely on trees and forests to stay healthy?

Trees provide a number of benefits to rivers, lakes and streams. Those benefits are then passed along to humans, animals, and aquatic species.

The North Santiam Watershed Council identified 6 main benefits to planting trees near a river or stream and how we all are able to share in these benefits together:

The Benefits of Trees

It’s great habitat for wildlife and when large branches and leaves fall into the stream, it ends up being just what the doctor ordered for salmon and steelhead. Trees help you by reducing the risk of flooding and stabilizing the bank. In fact, there are six really very good reasons to plant trees stream side:

1. They shade and cool the air and the stream water. It’s what they’re know for.
2. Trees actually can clean the soil and the water percolating through it by absorbing chemicals and other pollutants. Scientists have studied how trees filter sewage and farm chemicals, reduce the harmful effects of concentrated animal wastes, and clean water runoff that enters streams.
3. Trees slow storm water runoff and reduce the threat of flooding.
4. Trees break the force of wind to help keep topsoil in place. Their roots bind the soil contributing to bank stabilization.

5. Trees create oxygen. A mature tree produces as much oxygen in a growing season as 10 people inhale in a year. They also act as a giant filters cleaning the air we breath. Trees clean the air by intercepting airborne particles, reducing heat and absorbing pollutants such as carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide and nitrogen dioxide.

6. When they grow old and die, logs that have fallen into a stream will make great habitat for fish.

The US Department of Agriculture provides excellent resources on where you should plant certain types of shade trees and what types of trees are best suited for your area of the country. The Red River Basin mostly occupies zones 2-5. Please reference the list below for trees that meet those zones recommendations.

Best Types of Shade Trees

- Paper birch (zones 2-7)
- Norway Spruce (zones 2-7)
- Eastern white pine (zones 3-8)
- Red oak (zones 3-8)
- Sugar maple (zones 3-8)
- Blackhaw viburnum (zones 3-9)
- Red maple (zones 3-9)
- Weeping willow (zones 3-9)
- White oak (zones 3-9)

The next time you find yourself taking shade beneath a tree, remember all the benefits that one tree provides. Then kick back and soak it all in.

- Provide clean sources of water. A small garden feature or a rainwater collection is enough to provide bees with a drink when needed.
- Honeybees and other bees require some sort of shelter. Dead trees and plants provide adequate shelter, so don’t be so tempted to pull out all of the undergrowth in the name of aesthetics.
- Plant a garden that will attract bees. Resources for planting a bee-friendly garden can be found by visiting http://www.panna.org/sites/default/files/Bee-FriendlyGardening_PAN.pdf.
- If you come across a hive, leave it alone. It’s best not to disturb a hive and honeybee colony. If bees are located where they can become a nuisance, contact a local bee expert to see if the hive can be moved.
- Think about becoming a beekeeper yourself. There are many different resources available to help you get started.

Bees are being threatened at an alarming rate. Educating yourself about what to do to protect honeybees can help to restore the valuable honeybee population.

Ask a Trooper

Question: Can you talk about railroad crossing safety and the laws that cover it?

Answer: In my career, I had responded and investigated train/vehicle crashes where the majority of them resulted with a fatality or a serious injury to the vehicle occupants. Collisions with trains are mostly preventable. In Minnesota, failure to yield the right of way, disregard of a traffic control device, improper turn and inattention and impatience are cited as the most common factors contributing to motor vehicle/train crashes.

The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) has worked to share the following rail safety tips:

1. Yield the right-of-way to trains at highway-rail crossings. It’s the law.
2. Never drive around lowering gates, it’s illegal and deadly.
3. Never race a train to the crossing; even if it is a tie, you lose.
4. Expect a train on the track at any time, trains do not follow set schedules.
5. Look out for the second train when crossing multiple tracks.
6. Immediately get out of your vehicle if it stalls on the crossing, get clear of the tracks and call 911.
7. Always stop your vehicle, behind the white line when crossing gates are down or lights are flashing. Wait for the crossing gates to rise and lights to stop flashing and look both ways, listen and proceed with caution.



Bicyclists and pedestrians should always look both ways before crossing railroad tracks, cross only in designated areas and avoid crossing when gates are down. They should be aware that trains may operate any time throughout the day and night in either direction, and please know that walking on the railroad tracks is illegal.

At 50 mph, it takes a fully-loaded freight train 1.5 miles to come to a full-stop. By the time the train engineer sees a vehicle or pedestrian on the tracks, it is often too late.

The chance of death or serious injury from a motor vehicle/train crash is 11 times greater than for other highway collisions.

Because of their size, approaching trains appear to be traveling at a slower speed.

Railroad tracks and property close to the tracks (railroad “right-of-way”) belong to the railroad. People who don’t have permission to be on railroad property are trespassing. Even if there isn’t a “No Trespassing” sign, it’s still illegal and dangerous to be on the property.

A Couple of My Favorite Allis Chalmers Tractors

Let’s take a look at the WC tractor. It was introduced in 1933 as the country was trying to crawl out of the grips of the stock market crash and depression. Year after year sales increased peaking in 1937 and staying strong through the end of it’s production in 1948.

The WC was known as a “square tractor” because it had a four in bore and four inch stroke. It was rated by the Nebraska test having 21 drawbar hp. The base price was \$675 dollars on steel although being a leader in the rubber tire industry most WC’s were delivered on rubber. Total production was 178,000 making it one of Allis Chalmers most successful tractors.

My favorite Allis Chalmers tractor is probably the RC. The RC had a short production run. It was built from 1939-1941, and actually was sort of unsuccessful for the Allis company. It was built for smaller farmers. It used a WC frame, but the engine from a B Allis Chalmers. Having the same frame as the WC all mounted implements that worked on the WC also worked on the RC. This clever marketing scheme, for whatever reason, just didn’t catch on. The RC was discontinued and the model C took its place and was more successful for Allis Chalmers.

Now the real reason I am an RC fan is our neighbor, Walter Pederson, had one. He often used it to mow hay. He had a #5 John Deere mower attached to the back of the RC. When Walter had his auction sale I wanted so bad to buy his E-3 Co-op, or that little RC Allis. My pocket book felt other wise!!! I couldn’t by the E-3 or the RC, but I did by the #5 mower that was hooked the RC and I still have it today. I used the #5 to mow a little hay, although now it just sits in a weed patch. But, I won’t sell it, you see that is my memory of a dear neighbor and that cute little RC Allis Chalmers!!!

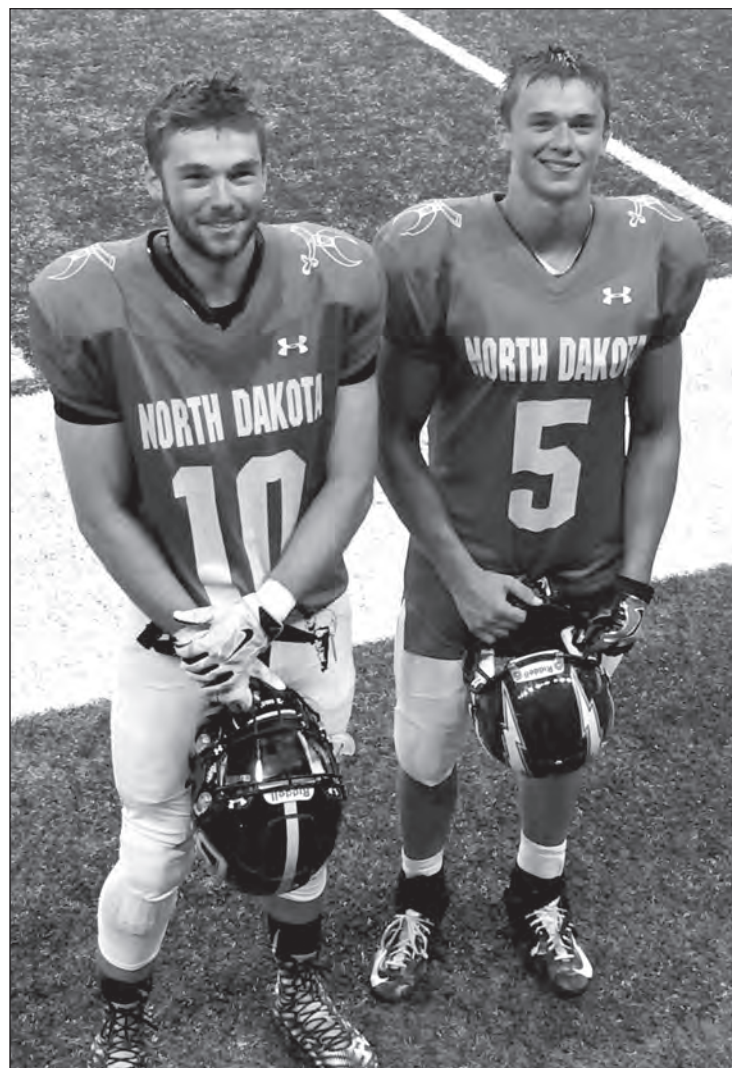

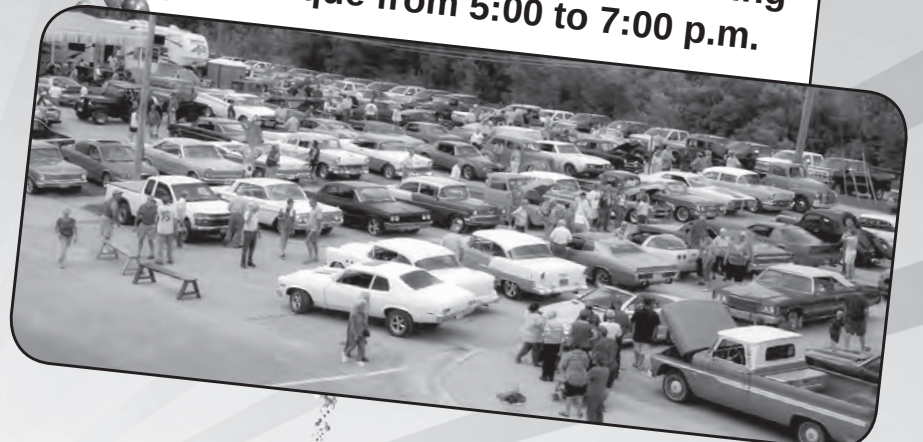
