Commissioners from Red Lake, Polk and Hubbard Counties and other interested persons were given a guided tour of the Enbridge pump station at Clearbrook. They were able to see how Enbridge pipeline system serves as a vital link to stable and reliable North American crude oil supplies for Minnesota and the surrounding region.



Bill Palmer, Enbridge Terminal Supervisor at Clearbrook explained the control system. They check levels, tanks, volume and where the oil is going. Various products are kept in separate tanks and they can all be monitored with this system. Monitoring is constantly being done by sensors that transmit data to Enbridge's central control facility in Edmonton, Alberta.

Tour given at Enbridge Energy's Clearbrook Terminal

Enbridge Energy's Clearbrook Terminal was opened recently for a tour of the large facility. Included in the tour were county commissioners from, Red Lake, Polk and Hubbard counties, Senator Rod Skoe and other interested persons. They were able to see the inner workings of the property located just south of Clearbrook.

Bill Palmer, the terminal supervisor stated that about 15 people are at the facility, as it is mostly run by automation. Monitoring is constantly being done by sensors that transmit data to Enbridge's central control facility in Edmonton, Alberta.

The Clearbrook terminal receives the oil in Enbridge pipe-

lines coming from the tar sand fields of Canada and the Bakken field in North Dakota and is transferred to refineries in the Twin Cities. The tanks that are located on the property is temporary storage and can go with the Koch Pipeline located just south of the Enbridge facility at Clearbrook or to Superior, Wisconsin. The Kochs are one of many shippers that Enbridge transports oil for through their same lines.

The pump station is vital to move the oil along. Pressure is used to maintain flow in the pipeline. It is a very slow process as liquid petroleum moves at about a walking pace.

Enbridge is also planning for renewal energy. They have more than 2,800 megawatts of green power generation capacity from wind, solar and geothermal projects. To date, they have invested in: 16 wind farms (more than 2,500 MW gross capacity, either in operation,

planned or under construction); Four solar energy operations (150 MW gross capacity); Five waste heat recovery facilities (34 MW gross capacity); A geothermal project (23 MW capacity); A hydroelectric facility (2 MW capacity).

Palmer wanted to remind people to "Call Before You Dig". 811 is a free service and one should never assume the depth of pipelines. You should call if you are planting trees, installing fence posts, constructing sidewalks, steps, roads, parking lots, driveways, ditches, utilities or buildings.

Enbridge Pipeline facts

Safety:

- We constantly monitor thousands of points along our system, and we keep track of every barrel to confirm that the amount of crude oil entering our pipelines precisely matches the amount we deliver.

Projects:

As part of the Mainline Enhancement Program, Enbridge increased the average annual capacity of Line 67 in two phases, from 450,000 barrels per day (bpd) to its full design capacity of 800,000 bpd. The Line 67 Upgrade Project did not require new pipeline construction. Enbridge added pump station horsepower at the existing facilities.

The performances will be in the big tent Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 27 and 28, at 1 and 3:15 p.m. The band will also provide music for a dance at TJN's in Red Lake Falls Saturday night.

Ca Claque performed at the Chautauqua in 2014 and were invited back because of their joyful, high-energy music, song and dance.

Headquartered in St. Boniface, Manitoba, Ca Claque (pronounced sa-Clock) showcases Franco-Manitoban artists who share a love of traditional and contemporary French-Canadian folklore.

Members of Ca Claque have backgrounds in voice, piano, guitar, bass and percussion, classical ballet, jazz, tap, modern, musical theatre and, naturally, traditional French-Canadian gigue (step dances). Between them, the members have decades of stage experience and professional accomplishments.

Ca Claque has performed in Costa Rica, Peru and Chile and participated in countless festivals. The group appeared at the Calgary Stampede and

is a regular at Folklorama in Winnipeg.

A newcomer to the Festival will be Thomas Barret, an Ojibwe musician from the Red Lake Nation. He uses a hip-hop style to teach about and celebrate culture and overcome challenges.

Throughout the weekend, there will be programs, arts and crafts displays, caricatures, children's activities. Demonstrations will be given on wool spinning and carding, broom and butter making. Food, including French Festival specialties such as Tourtiere (meat pie) and bread made in the earth oven, will be available. Silent auctions will be held Saturday and Sunday.

Admission is free and the public is welcome to all events in the park.

The Old Crossing and Treaty Park is on Red Lake Co. Road 3 and seven miles northeast of Gentilly on County Road 11 or 10 miles southwest of Red Lake Falls.

The festival, presented by AFRAN (Association of the French of the North), emphasizes the French heritage of the Red River Valley.

Closing your Pool for the Season: Now what do I do with all this water?

With the start of the school year and cooler temperatures right around the corner, comes all the work that goes into getting ready for fall and winter. If you have a backyard swimming pool, it will require a fair amount of attention in preparation for winter. Whether your pool is a permanent fixture or has to be taken down or set up water has to be drained either below the skimmer or completely. With the average backyard pool having between 5,000 and 14,000 gallons of water that is a substantial amount of wasted water entering our waterways.

Can you drain your pool water into the street? The short answer is yes, but you must consider a few things prior to draining. Draining your pool water can wreak havoc on the environment if not done correctly. Once the water has entered the storm drain it can enter our waterways where it can kill fish and threaten the quality of the water.

Most cities have their own ordinances and suggestions on how to safely and effectively drain your pools. The City of Los Angeles offers several stay waterway friendly practices you can do when draining your swimming pool:

- Let the pool water sit for at least five days without adding chlorine or adding de-chlorinating agents to clear it of potential pollutants.
- Before discharging pool water into a storm drain, check the drain's corner catch basin to make sure it's not clogged. Since clogged basins can lead to flooding, make sure to report basins in need of cleaning.
- Discharge pool water into storm drains only from the hours of 8 p.m. to 8 a.m.
- If rain has recently hit your area, wait at least 48 hours until after the rain has stopped to avoid overwhelming the sanitary sewer system.
- If your pool water contains copper-based algacides or dyes, you should not be discharging into the storm drain system. Each city might have different rules on this so make sure you follow up with your cities ordinances to prevent major impacts to local waterways.

If when you are draining your pool you can't help but

think about the money that was spent to fill it up.... Try recycling your pool water.

Here's what you need to know.

Your current pool water isn't good for your garden or landscape; specifically it needs to be a little less chlorinated. You can do this 1 of 2 ways.

- Turn your pump off, remove your skimmer with the chlorine tablets in it and quit adding any chemicals to your pool. Let your pool go untreated for a few days. Then test it. The pH levels needs to fall between 7 and 8, with the chlorine level at 1 part per million or less. Larger pools may take longer to reach the desired pH level. Then you can either use a siphon or a water pump to water your garden, landscape or yard.
- Remove a bucket full or more of water and let it stand in the sun for a few days. Again test the water like above. Then use the bucket to water your garden, landscape or yard. (This is a great idea if you want to hold on to those summer days just a few weeks longer and let the kids swim after school while the afternoon temps still allow it.)

All cities have their own set of ordinances that outline specifically what you can and cannot do as it relates to what can enter the storm drain system or the sanitary sewer. Make you sure you check in to find out what is preferred and allowed for draining and filling pools in your neighborhood.

Ask a Trooper

Question: Question: Read your article from 2014 concerning collector plates. I have a related question. I have a 20 year old car that would qualify for collector plates. Collector plates are usually a single plate if I'm not mistaken. I currently have regular passenger car plates on the vehicle.

Can I run a single regular plate on the car and be in compliance? For me the yearly registration fee is not an issue. Look forward to your reply.

Answer: If a vehicle has regular plates issued, it must display both the front and back plate. Displaying only a single plate on the back is legal if the vehicle:

- Is a collector's vehicle with a pioneer, classic car, collector or street rod license.
- Meets the requirements of a pioneer, classic or street rod vehicle but is used for general transportation.
- Is model year 1972 or earlier, not registered as a collector vehicle and is used for general transportation purposes.

For collector plates, you have the option of receiving one plate for \$13.50 or two plates for \$15. It would be the owner's choice, but again, only one has to be displayed on the back of the vehicle.

To be eligible for collector plates, a vehicle must:

- Be at least 20 model years old.
- Be owned and operated solely as a collector's item and

not for general transportation purposes.

The owner also needs to prove they own one or more vehicles with regular license plates.

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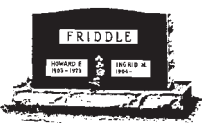

This gargantuan ship is said to have housed as many as 200,000 sailors in its years of use from 1945-1992 and was the original location of our Navy's TOPGUN jet pilot fighter training school. These days the Midway has become a thriving symbol of American Armed Forces history as well as representing our daily freedoms as a Museum which inspires over 1,000,000 visitors a year.

These young impressionable Falcons left the nest for a road trip with their Great-Auntie Ellie Gilbertson of Brooklyn Park, MN (formerly Maple Bay) and their Grandma Shelly Broden of Fertile on Tuesday August 9th. They headed straight to Las Vegas, Nevada to pick up their coach, (and dad) Andrew Broden, who flew part-way due to work to save time. Before leaving Las Vegas the boys were treated to several landmark sites and had a blast playing games at a virtual-reality arcade.

On August 11th the video games were over because it was time to get serious and look for a good night's sleep, the group stayed with family in Chula Vista, CA a 20 minute drive from San Diego. The next morning as the excitement got to the group the boys got an amazing glimpse of the Pacific Ocean during early bird weigh-ins at Broadway Pier. Before this tournament Gavin has a 2014 – 2015 record of: 97 wins and 13 losses; and a 2015-2016 record of: 68 wins and 9 losses; out of that he got 46 pins including earning 2nd place at the NYWA State Elementary Wrestling Championship on April 3rd.

Gavin started with 9 com-

petitors in his bracket. 1st Gavin got a bye – 2nd match he took a hard loss 14/4, catching his opponent in a chancery at the end, but run out of time for the pin – 3rd match was exciting as the score hit 14/0, not in Gavin's favor, then he took down his competitor in a massive headlock nailing a pin in the last seconds of the 3rd period – 4th match was a devastating loss, removing him from the tournament.

9 year old Falcon Wrestler, Gage Vedbraaten is the son of Andrea & Andrew Broden of Fertile and Dustin Vedbraaten of McIntosh. Before this tournament Gage has a 2014 – 2015 record of: 67 wins and 29 losses and 2015-2016 record of: 62 wins and 24 losses; out of that he got 24 pins.

Gage started with 14 competitors in his bracket. Gage's 1st match he worked hard outmaneuvering his opponent 15/0 – 2nd match Gage used his knowledge and skills; he grinded it out and powered through for an ankle pick takedown earning himself the win by points 4/2 in hard overtime – the last two matches on Saturday he took losses, however was able to look forward to Sunday evening when he would be moving on in the top 6 and be a part of the real 'Battle on the Midway' on the flight deck.

The boys got their first taste of the salty Pacific Ocean on Saturday at Imperial Beach into the night. They caught sight of sea creatures, made sand castles and jumped waves for the first time. Of course it was so amazing the whole group couldn't resist enjoying Coronado Beach all day Sunday before Gage moved on to battle royal in the evening.

Being the youngest of 6 kids in his bracket, Gage was very excited to be dueling on the USS Midway. However, all in all it turned out to be an anti-climatic contention as Gage wrestled 3 grueling minutes for 5th place in his bracket taking a loss by points 3/0. Both brothers do plan to return to the 'Battle on the Midway' in next year's tournament where they will strive as elders in their division.

Grandma Shelly and Auntie Ellie started the long drive home on Monday after dropping Andrew off to catch a flight. They took the long way and toured the countryside with Gage and Gavin. The boys were able to see mountains, desert and canyons through California, Nevada, Utah and Wyoming and even made a stop to see Mt. Rushmore in South Dakota before getting home to Fertile by early morning August 19th.

With school around the corner, these two will have a lot of stories to tell their teachers and buddies about what they saw and experienced on this road trip. But they are even more excited to share their new knowledge and experience in the wrestling room. As they say, "Wrestler Tip #1: If you think you're the best wrestler in the room, you should probably find a new room. There will always be someone better, waiting to teach you a lesson."
