## Steve Philion Earns Hall of Fame Honor

Steve Philion was one of four individuals inducted into the Minnesota Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame during a November 5, 2016, ceremony conducted at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Minneapolis.

Philion began his basketball coaching career with a 23-year run at Clearbrook-Gonvick, where he had stints with the boys and girls teams. He led the Bears to state tournament appearances in 1992 and 1993.

Philion-led teams have won 18 Conference and Section 8A titles in 1992 and 1993. He began working with the Red Lake County basketball program in 1998. Philion starts his 43rd year of coaching this winter with 557 career wins. Coach Philion has been recognized as District Coach of the Year five times, and Section Coach of the Year twice.

He has also coached baseball at the high school and American Legion level. In addition to coaching, Philion has been a Minnesota State High School League and NCAA college football, baseball, softball and volleyball official for over 40 years.

Joining Philion in this year's MBCA Hall of Fame class is Mark Klingsporn of Tartan, Rich Odell of Virginia, and John Oxtom of Lakeville North.

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## Essentia Health Encourages People to "Start the Beat"

Essentia Health is encouraging its employees and the public to help fight sudden cardiac arrest by signing a petition to "Start the Beat." The petition is asking the White House to begin a national campaign to bring awareness to the serious public health problem of sudden cardiac arrest. Each year, 600,000 people die from a heart attack, making it the leading cause of death in the United States.

"I am asking my colleagues and the public to join me in signing the current petition requesting a national campaign to raise awareness of sudden cardiac arrest. Training in CPR, AED use, and recognizing the signs of a heart attack will save lives," explains Essentia's Chief Medical Officer Dr. Peter Henry.

The goal is to improve sudden cardiac arrest survival rates nationwide. Survival rates from sudden cardiac arrest are tragically low at only 6-percent nationwide. Research has shown that early CPR and AED use can significantly improve survival but citizens are still reluctant to act.

"Stop, drop and roll" and "Stop the bleed" are campaigns

that have increased training and saved lives. A national "Start the Beat" campaign would promote bystander action and increase awareness of AED locations and the use of AEDs, along with early CPR.

Registered Nurse Colette Larson works at Essentia Health-Brainerd and says she's seen great success in sudden cardiac arrest rates in Minnesota through teamwork and awareness.

"Over the past 6 years, I have had the privilege of working with colleagues at the MN Resuscitation Consortium, to raise public awareness about the problem of sudden cardiac arrest. Through the Take Heart Program, here at Essentia Health in Brainerd, we have been able to train almost 20,000 community members in hands-only CPR and have donate more than 100 AEDs," Larson says.

## Northwest Minnesota Women's Fund Requests Proposals for Women's History Month Programs

The Northwest Minnesota Women's Fund is seeking proposals for up to \$1,500 that will support programs in celebration of Women's History Month. Preference will be given to projects that reflect the National Women's History Month theme: "Honoring Trailblazing Women in Labor and Business." Programs must take place within the timeframe of the month-long celebration in March 2017.

The Women's Fund will consider grant applications from school districts, universities and colleges, nonprofit organizations, historical societies, and community service groups. Counties served by the Women's Fund are Beltrami, Clearwater, Hubbard, Kittson, Lake of the Woods, Mahanomen, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, and Roseau.

Funds may be used for speakers, educational materials, and program delivery expenses for seminars, conferences and workshops that are being held in the 12-county service area. Funds are not available for scholarships

(higher education). The number of awards and dollar amounts will be determined by how many qualified applications are received.

To qualify for consideration, events must be open to the public, non-discriminatory, and appeal to all women, regardless of age, race, and educational attainment. There will be a number of grants up to \$1500 available to qualified applicants. Requirements include clear goals and action steps for completing the project:

- Description of working relationship(s) with other partner(s) and/or funding sources
- Potential success of the program
- Evidence of an evaluation plan

The deadline for submission of proposals is December 1, 2016. Funds will be awarded by January 1, 2017. 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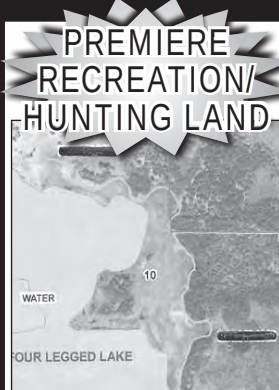
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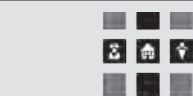

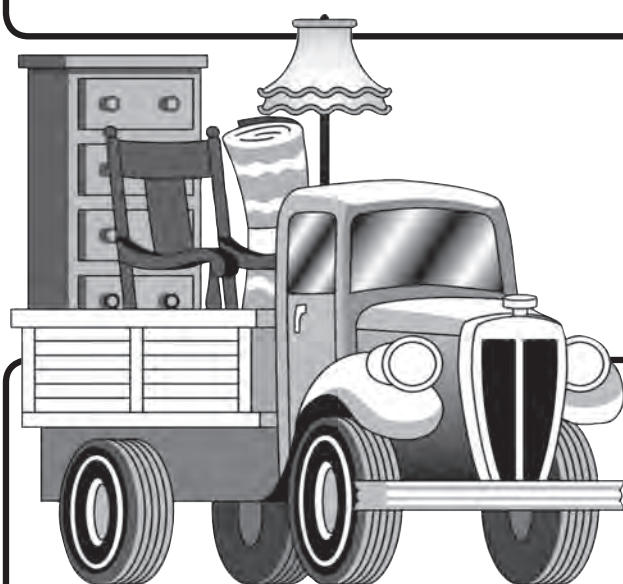

As farms got larger tractor companies began building larger tractors to meet the need!! The John Deere model R was John Deere's first diesel tractor. It was successful and was definitely a workhorse on the farm. Other options were being sought after like power steering and Live PTO.

The models 50, 60, and 70 were already on the market but the 80 was slow to be released. John Deere was actually working on the 20 series and even had began experimenting on the new generation tractors. They decided to release the 80 in 1955.

For starting the 80 used the same V-4 gas starting (pony) motor. The 80 replaced the R, but if you placed them side by side there is little difference. There are really two main distinguishing features. The flywheel cover on the R is round and the cover on the 80 is tear drop shaped. The front axle on the 80 is also arched upward giving it a slightly higher appearance. The 80 had the option of power steering, although few were built without power steering. The 80 was just a stepping stone to the 20 and 30 series. It had a short production run, making it a collectible tractor today.

I can remember driving



by our neighbor, Charlie Bishop's place when I was a kid and seeing his son Greg out driving that 80. Man was I jealous!! I never have gotten to drive an 80, but maybe one

day I can hear that V-4 pony motor rev, hit the starter and decompression lever and hear that powerful pop-pop of the a John Deere two cylinder diesel.....sounds like fun!!

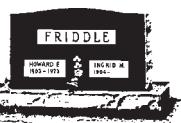

Michael Mandt, age 24 from Maple Grove, MN died on Wednesday, November 2nd at his home in Maple Grove. 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## Mille Lacs Lake to be open for winter fishing season

Winter fishing limits  
1 walleye, 5 northern  
pike per angler

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources today announced that the winter walleye regulation will allow anglers to keep one walleye between 19 and 21 inches or one longer than 28 inches.

The 2016-17 winter regulation continues last winter's one fish limit but moves the harvest slot up slightly from last year's 18 to 20 inches.

The winter walleye season begins Thursday, Dec. 1, and extends through Sunday, Feb. 26, 2017.

Tribal and DNR biologists met Nov. 1 to evaluate the status of the walleye population following the completion of the 2015-2016 fishing season. The key conservation goal of conserving the abundant 2013 year class was achieved, with minimal fishing mortality occurring during the past year and key population benchmarks successfully met. Those factors combined to support a modest winter harvest for Mille Lacs Lake walleye.

"The winter season regulation enables Mille Lacs anglers to catch and keep walleye while providing necessary fish conservation and support to the Mille Lacs area economy," said Don Pereira, DNR fisheries chief.

"This regulation allows continued protection of walleye in Mille Lacs' abundant 2013 year class, which are the lake's future spawners," Pereira said.

Northern pike will provide anglers and darkhouse spearmen with additional opportunity to harvest fish on Mille Lacs this winter. Like last winter, ice anglers and spearmen can keep

up to five fish with one longer than 30 inches. However, in order to keep the one northern pike longer than 30 inches, anglers and spearmen must have caught or speared two northern pike shorter than 30 inches and have both smaller fish in immediate possession.

The pike regulation goes into effect on Dec. 1. It continues through Sunday, March 26, 2017, for angling and Sunday, Feb. 26, 2017 for spearing.

For now, bass regulations will remain the same. But on the heels of a very successful Toyota Angler of the Year tournament and the increased attention it has focused on Mille Lacs' world-class smallmouth, discussions with the Mille Lacs advisory committee will be ongoing to determine if changes may be warranted for the open water bass season.
