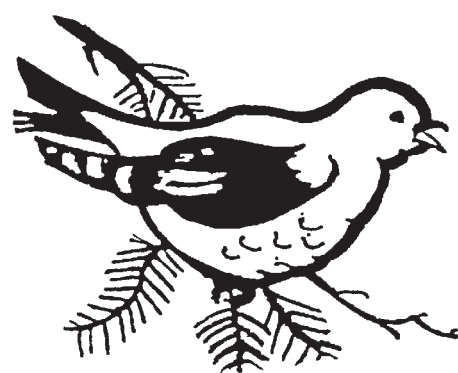

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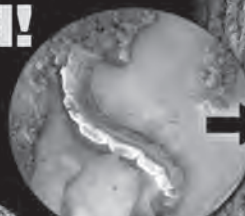

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Essentia Health Takes on Deadly Sepsis

Skyrocketing cases of sepsis in hospitals across the country have prompted Essentia Health to put new protocols in place and employ its electronic medical record to watch for early signs of the potentially deadly condition. "Sepsis is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States. In its early stages, it can be difficult to diagnose and can lead to a patient's rapid deterioration," says Dr. Jeff Lyon, Essentia Health Patient Safety Officer. "By then, our treatments become less successful, and patients may experience multiple-organ dysfunction, such as kidney and respiratory failure."

The electronic health record will look for certain "predictive analytics" or clues to key caregivers to watch out for early signs of sepsis in patients. Body temperature, pulse, blood pressure, respiratory rate, white blood cell count, among other things are monitored and if any combine to meet certain criteria, an alarm will alert staff so they can take prompt action.

"Everyone in our organization plays a vital role in recognizing sepsis and ensuring our patients receive the best care to survive it," says Essentia Health-Fargo Nurse Educator Peggy Ward, part of a system-wide team on sepsis. "Nurses, patient care technicians, respiratory therapists, pharmacists and providers all have a role in early identification, from the time a patient is triaged in the Emergency Department to the care they receive on the medical/surgical floors and in the critical care units."

Sepsis is a potentially life-threatening complication of an infection. It occurs when chemicals released into the bloodstream to fight infection trigger an inflammatory response in the body.

"It's important when patients have signs of sepsis not only to treat it quickly, but to treat it correctly from the outset," Dr. Lyon says.

When treating sepsis, early diagnosis and treatment improves a patient's chances for survival. Early treatment includes three- and six-hour guidelines, including antibiotics, labs for monitoring and larger amounts of intravenous fluids. Symptoms of sepsis include chills, fever or low body

temperature, rapid pulse, rapid breathing, nausea and vomiting.

"As with heart attack and stroke, recognizing the early warning signs of sepsis is critical," Dr. Lyon says. "That can be tough with patients who are already severely ill and in our intensive care units – and it's those patients who often are at highest risk for the illness."

The guidelines are fairly simple, requiring specific lab testing and antibiotic use. They also call for a rapid intravenous infusion of saline solution, which helps caregivers to preserve and rejuvenate the heart and vascular system. The new protocol decreases the chance of dying from sepsis by 20 percent to 30 percent, so it's a significant and meaningful impact.

Some sessions may include guest speakers. The support group will be facilitated by adult suicide loss survivors trained in support group facilitation.

The group is open and appropriate for adult survivors who have lost a loved one to suicide as well as those supporting a survivor. The groups will be held the second Tuesday of each month. The sessions will run from 7-8:30pm. The group will be held at the Evergreen Youth & Family Services Drop In Center at 610 Patriot Dr NW, Bemidji. The next group will be held July 14th. Sanford offering video visits for common health conditions

Service available in ND, SD, Minn., Iowa

SIoux FALLS, S.D. – Video visits, Sanford Health's service connecting patients with providers over a mobile device or computer for non-emergency health care concerns, are now available for patients in North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota and Iowa.

Video visits provide access to a designated team of acute care providers. By using an iPhone, iPad, Android device or any computer with a webcam, patients are able to see the provider on their screen. The provider also has access to the patient's medical record and, if appropriate, medication can be prescribed and sent directly to the patient's pharmacy.

"Sanford Health is committed to not only providing our patients with unmatched expertise for their health but also unmatched conveniences to meet the demands of their busy lives," said Allison Suttle, M.D., chief medical officer at Sanford. "Video visits are one of many ways we are helping patients have more control of their time and health."

Non-emergency primary care needs that could be addressed by a video visit include, for example, aches, pains, bladder infections, coughs, colds, diarrhea, pink eye, rashes and sinus infections. More urgent or complex cases may not be appropriate for a video visit, and a patient may be advised to schedule an in-office appointment.

Video visit patients must have a My Sanford Chart account and be at least 18 years old. The digital appointments are available Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Video visits are available to current patients in North Dakota and to current and new patients in South Dakota, Minnesota and Iowa.

The cost for a video visit is \$55, and patients are billed at their home address. Sanford Health Plan may cover some or all of the cost.

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After initial testing, DNR researchers still investigating avian flu in wildlife

After collecting and testing more than 3,300 samples from wild birds, nearly all of the test results are back and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources has found only one positive for highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI), a Cooper's hawk from Yellow Medicine County reported in late April.

The researchers plan to conduct expanded surveillance this summer and fall by testing ducks and geese handled as part of normal banding operations and by sampling hunter-harvested waterfowl throughout the state.

“We know that waterfowl serve as reservoirs for avian influenza because they contract the virus, but normally are not killed by it. However, what we don't know is what role wildlife may have played in recent infections in domestic poultry,” said Lou Cornicelli, DNR wildlife research manager. “We're continuing to take a science-based approach to testing so we can obtain meaningful results.”

To help identify wildlife's role in the disease, DNR researchers conducted an initial three-pronged surveillance effort beginning as soon as the disease was discovered in the state's domestic turkeys in March. Researchers:

1. Collected more than 3,000 fecal samples from wild waterfowl in a statistically designed surveillance effort. Of those, half were collected from around infected facilities and half from control areas where DNR manages specifically for waterfowl but where the disease had not yet

been found in domestic poultry. 2. Tested hunter-harvested wild turkeys in the five counties with the highest number of infected poultry facilities.

3. Collected dead birds reported by the public, with an emphasis on raptors, wild turkeys, and bird die-offs of five or more. No HPAI positives were found in the 3,138 fecal samples collected, but 3 percent of the samples were positive for low pathogenic avian influenza (LPAI).

“The finding of some of low pathogenic avian influenza was not surprising because we know waterfowl are reservoirs for many of the 144 possible strains of the LPAI virus,” said Michelle Carstensen, DNR wildlife health supervisor. “When DNR conducted widespread avian influenza surveillance of more than 12,000 ducks and geese from 2006 to 2010, no HPAI was found but about 3 percent had low path avian influenza.”

For hunter-harvested wild turkeys, 84 were submitted during the season and all were negative.

Of the 81 dead wild birds submitted and tested so far, HPAI has only been found in the Cooper's hawk in Yellow Medicine County. For more information on the test results, visit the DNR avian flu Web page at www.mndnr.gov/ai.

Future testing The DNR plans to conduct more testing this summer during previously scheduled banding of geese and ducks, and in the fall will collect and test samples from hunter-harvested waterfowl throughout the state.

“The samples needed to look for active infection are simple throat and cloacal swabbing of live or hunter-harvested birds,”

Carstensen said.

Also this summer, DNR researchers will collaborate in a serology research project looking for avian influenza antibodies in birds collected at a number of sites across North America. Serology involves drawing blood and looking for antibody responses that would indicate previous exposures to avian influenza, Cornicelli said.

“As yet, serological sampling of avian influenza in wild birds is still in the research stage and can't be used as surveillance tool because a positive antibody result doesn't tell us if the bird was exposed to highly pathogenic avian flu,” Cornicelli said.

Researchers hope the serological work will help to better understand serologic signals to these viruses, to follow incursion and possible establishment of the viruses, and to optimize the most effective approaches to using this technique.

“Our-goal is to use scientifically sound approaches to better understand avian influenza in wildlife and to help inform prevention and management responses,” Cornicelli said. “We will continue to coordinate and collaborate with other cooperating agencies and organizations on state, regional and national efforts to better understand and manage this disease.”

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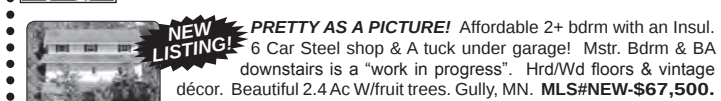

Motorcycle rider deaths reach 25 for the year

Deadly Year for Motorcyclists; Rider Deaths Up 56 Percent Over Last year

Motorcycle rider deaths are significantly higher compared to this time last year. Twenty-five riders have died on Minnesota roads so far in 2015, which is 56 percent more than this time last year when there were 16 motorcycle fatalities.

The latest motorcycle death happened Thursday, June 18, around 9:30 p.m. during a pursuit on County Road 75 near County Road 7 in Stearns County. The driver was thrown from the motorcycle and pronounced dead at the scene. The Minnesota State Patrol is investigating.

So far this year, there have been 158 traffic fatalities in Minnesota; nearly 16 percent of those are motorcycle riders. In 2014, 46 motorcyclists were killed in crashes, according to preliminary reports.

Public safety officials are asking motorcyclists to take safety into their own hands and motorists to look twice for motorcycles.

"Motorcyclists and motorists need to work together to share the road to prevent more motorcycle fatalities," says Lt. Bob Zak, Minnesota State Patrol. "It's really unfortunate that there are nine more motorcycle deaths than this time last year, and we need the public's help to keep this number from increasing."

2015 Fatal Motorcycle Crash Facts (these do not include the latest crash)

Age: Eleven of the riders killed this season were older than 50. Nine riders were between the ages of 30-49. Four riders were in their 20s. It's important for new riders, riders returning from a break and experienced riders to take a training course and sharpen and hone skills.

Passengers: Three passengers were killed in the 22 crashes.

Helmet Use: Helmet use is known for 22 of the 25 riders killed. Of those 22 riders, 14 were not wearing a helmet and seven were wearing a helmet.

Location: Seventeen of the crashes happened in rural areas. Four of the crashes occurred in urban areas. Location was not reported for one of the crashes.

Contributing Factors: Contributing factors point to rider error in many of the crashes. Riders were negotiating a curve when 11 of those crashes happened. A second vehicle failing to yield was cited in three of the crashes.

Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Center (MMSC) Program Coordinator Bill Shaffer encourages riders to get trained.

"Training can save a rider's life," says Shaffer. "It teaches riders crash-avoidance techniques to stay safe on the road. Any experience level is welcome. You can never get too much training as a new rider, returning rider or experienced rider."

Ask a Trooper

Question: I read your last article on rear license plate lamps and the display of license plates and this got me wondering as I went to renew my registration the other day. They gave me new license plates and said they do this every seven years. Why is that?

Answer: Good question. Under Minnesota State Statute 168.12 states, "Plates issued for passenger automobiles must be issued for a seven-year period. All plates issued under this paragraph must be replaced if they are seven years old or older at the time of registration renewal or will become so during the registration period."

The replacement is in part due to the safety reflectorization required for the plate. It's required that Minnesota license plates be readable from 110 feet and be visible from a



vehicle equipped with normal headlights at 1,500 feet. The reflective materials in the plate sheeting degrade over time and are warranted for five years, but seven year replacements are less interruptive. Minnesota's challenging environment

stresses the plate's sheeting and reflectorization, and those in rural areas are subjected to additional strains. The replacement also helps reduce registration tax avoidance.

DNR approves new deer population goals

New deer population goals have been approved by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources for large portions of northeastern, north-central and east-central Minnesota, covering 40 of 128 deer permit areas in the state.

“These new goals will result in management to increase deer numbers in relation to last year’s levels in most of the 40 permit areas,” said Steve Merchant, wildlife populations manager. “The new goals largely reflect the desires shared by stakeholders who participated in the deer goal setting process and generally reflect the public feedback we’ve heard during the past few years.”

As a result of this process, 85 percent of the 40 areas will be managed for populations higher than those experienced in 2014; the remaining will see no change.

Comparison to former goals

Of the 40 deer permit areas with new goals, 26 will be managed for deer densities higher than those established by the previous goals; eight will be managed at similar densities to former goals; and six will be managed for densities below former goals. More information about the goals for each deer permit area can be found at www.mndnr.gov/deer.

With respect to the four advisory team recommendations not accepted by the DNR, the agency chose more moderate population increases to better reflect the preferences suggested by hunter and landowner survey data and public input; allow more deer to be harvested; and minimize anticipated deer damage to agricultural lands and forest habitat.

Goals are intended to be in place for three to five years. The DNR shortened the goal timeframe to allow more frequent opportunities to revisit and adjust goals with input from stakeholders.

Goal-setting process

This is the third year the DNR has worked with citizens and stakeholders to re-assess and re-establish deer population goals in portions of the state. Goals for southwestern and portions of northern Minnesota were set in 2012. Goals for southeastern Minnesota were set last year.

DNR will postpone goal setting in the remaining 54 deer permit areas scheduled for consideration in 2016 until the current legislative audit of Minnesota’s deer population management program is complete.
