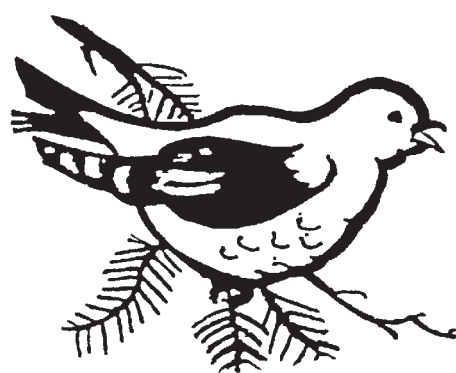

Relay for Life held over the weekend

Last Friday, June 26th in Fosston the 2015 East Polk County Relay for Life celebrated hope. There was a large crowd, hundreds of luminaries and lots of things to do.

The evening began with a survivor registration along with a survivor reception inside the Fosston High School gymnasium. Inside the gym, there was also table full of silent auction items, anything and everything was being auctioned off from a signed Minnesota Wild jersey, an American Girl doll, Oofda Tacos sweatshirts and lots of Tupperware. Along with the auction items, the gym was also the location of a photo booth, where for \$5 you could have your picture taken with or without a variety of props and take your picture home with you. The proceeds for both the photo booth and the auction went directly to East Polk Relay.

There was an opening ceremony where the Master of Ceremonies, Dick Roue, introduced the 2015 Honorary Chair, cancer survivor, Mike Murray. Dick then called upon Neil Bursheim this year's survivor speaker, who gave a speech about his trials and triumphs over cancer.

The Relay team then handed out balloons and flowers, in purple, to the survivors, who released the balloons and walked the track. The sight was amazing as both young and old were represented in the survivor group.

Next came some fun with a frozen t-shirt contest that was hosted by the Essentia Hospital Patient Care team, where a dozen teams tried to be the first to un-thaw a frozen, then cold and wet t-shirt unto a team member. Next was the Grace Lutheran Church team who had Win-E-Mac teacher, Jeremy Morgenroth who promised to shave his head if over \$1,500 was raised. Jeremy raised over \$2,000 and his wife shaved his head. Congratulations to Jeremy for such a great fundraising effort.

The evening brought the Relay's Got Talent show, where

many talented area residents performed and raised an additional \$326 for East Polk County Relay for Life. Carole Tharaldson won, getting the most money collected in her voting bucket.

Next was honoring those who have survived and those who lost their battle to cancer by the lighting of the luminaries. It was a beautiful sight and those in attendance were able to walk through the lighted path.

Teams taking place in the 2015 East Polk County Relay for Life were First Care Living Center, Essentia Hospital Patient Car, Grace Lutheran Church, Kamp Kenneth, Team Robin and Team Shereck.

Marshall County Sheriff

On Saturday June 27, 2015 & Approximately 12:36 P.M., The Marshall County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call of a two vehicle head on collision on Hwy One approximately 10 miles east of Warren, MN. The Warren Fire Department and Ambulance Service was dispatched to the scene.

A 1993 Chevrolet Pickup driven by Cory Ingeman, 25, of Karlstad, was heading west bound when it collided with a 2000 Pontiac Montana, driven by Rachel Houle, 31, of Warren, that was headed east bound. A passenger in the Pontiac, Timothy Bruggeman, 49, was killed in the accident. Neither of the drivers were injured. The body of the deceased has been transported to the Marshall County Medical Examiner's office in Grand Forks for an autopsy.

The incident remains under investigation by the Minnesota State Patrol's Office and the Marshall County Sheriff's Office.

Polk County Sheriff

On 6/26/2015 at approx. 10:00 AM the Polk County Sheriff's Office along with County EMS and the Beltrami Fire Department responded to a one-vehicle rollover ½ of a mile west of Polk County Road 14 on Polk County Road 1. The vehicle, which was an Aggregate Industries ready-mix truck, was east bound on Polk County Road 1, lost control and landed on its side in the middle of County Road 1. The driver and sole occupant, Shane Bruggeman (43) from Moorhead, MN, was taken by Air-Med to the Sanford Hospital in Fargo.

This case is still under investigation by the Polk County Sheriff's Office and no further information will be released at this time. Other agencies assisting include the Fertile Fire Department and the Minnesota State Patrol.

The Young Adult Alcohol Survey (YAAS) was conducted by the Polk County Wellness Coalition (PCWC) and Wilder Research (St. Paul, MN) from January- March of 2015. As an incentive to complete the Young Adult Alcohol Survey, the 183 respondents could select 1 of 3 Polk County non-profit organizations to receive a monetary donation on their behalf. The PCWC is pleased to announce

that donations from the YAAS were given to The Polk County Humane Society, The East Grand Forks Food Shelf and the United Way of Crookston.

Polk County, MN: The Young Adult Alcohol Survey is designed to collect information about alcohol-related behaviors, attitudes and perceptions of young adults ages 18-25. The YAAS is designed to collect information about alcohol-related behaviors, attitudes and perceptions of young adults ages 18-25. The PCWC will use this data to

identify strategies and make decisions regarding young adult alcohol prevention in Polk County. Funding for this project was provided by the MN Department of Human Services – Strategic Prevention Framework State Incentive Grant.

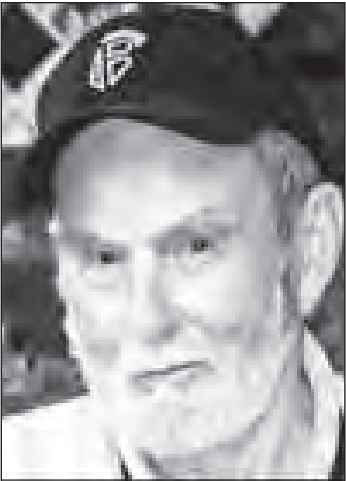

Max (Reuben Stanley) Krogstad**

Max (Reuben Stanley) Krogstad, 91, died on May 13, 2015 at his home in Seattle, WA.

Max was born in Sletten Township, to Jens and Julia Krogstad. He attended rural school, District 177, and graduated from McIntosh High School in 1941. He worked as a radio station engineer at WTAQ in Green Bay before WWII took him to the China-Burma-India Theater (1943-1945) with the US Army Air Corp, first as radio operator flying the Hump on over 40 missions, then as tower chief at Allied airfields such as Dimapur, Chabua, Dibrugarh, Jorhat, and the glider assaults "Log Landing" in Burma. Before radar came into common use, the human ear was relied on at night to distinguish between returning Allied aircraft, and raiding Japanese planes; Max was legendary for his ability to identify each by its sound and to see at great distance. After the war, Max earned a PhD in physics at WSC, worked for GE at Hanford, for Lockheed Missile Systems Division, Boeing Scientific Research Labs, and finished his career teaching physics and pre-engineering at South Seattle Community College. He recently moved to the Ballymena at The Kenney, in West Seattle. In recent years he has kept in touch with his family via SKYPE and HAM radio as KC7WOF.

With family at his side, Max peacefully slept into the night. He is survived by Elise, his wife of 62 years; children Heidi, Eirik, Roald, Marta, Finn, Christian; grandchildren, Tia, Alina and Konrad; and great-grandson Beckett.

qualifying
homeowners to
claim the homestead
benefit for veterans
with disabilities**

The Minnesota Department of Revenue is reminding homeowners that applications for the Market Value Exclusion for veterans with disabilities are due by July 1, 2015.

"We encourage every eligible veteran to file for the Market Value Exclusion. The exclusion is a significant benefit for veterans with disabilities, saving some of them from paying any property taxes," said Revenue Commissioner Cynthia Bauerly. "This benefit is just one of the things that Minnesota does to honor our veterans who have served our state and country."

Last year, more than 13,000 taxpayers claimed the exclusion, resulting in \$1.8 billion in market value exclusions. The number of veterans taking advantage of the benefit has doubled since the program began in 2008.

To qualify, veterans must:

- Be honorably discharged from the United States armed forces
- Have a service-connected disability rating of 70 percent or more
- Homestead a property in Minnesota

"I want to say what a fantastic job all our RLNC team did for this fundraiser," said Red Lake Nation College President Dan King. "An extra special Miigwech to Bugger (McArthur) and Shieleen (Omen) who led the efforts for a great first year tourney! There were excellent
