Career Coaches, Hall of Fame Members, Longtime Friends

Steve Philion and Vern Johnson have known each other for about 40 years. Now in their 60s, the men are high school boys' basketball coaches who have seen a lot, learned a lot and taught countless numbers of students and athletes.

Philion is the coach at Red Lake County Central and Johnson is at Win-E-Mac. When their teams met on a frigid January evening here at Win-E-Mac, it was part homecoming, part family reunion, part elbow in the ribs.

"I tease Steve every time I see him," said Johnson with a smile. "I tell him, 'You can't quit. I don't want to be the only old guy.'"

While their junior varsity teams were on the court, Johnson and his son/assistant coach Bret saw Philion in a hallway. In a voice loud enough for his longtime coaching counterpart to hear, Vern said to Bret, "Look! There's an old coach over there."

All jokes aside, Johnson and Philion are among the top coaches in Minnesota history. Both are members of the Minnesota High School Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame; Johnson was inducted in 2013 and Philion in 2016.

Their successes, however, extend far beyond the basketball court. Philion is retired from a career teaching high school math and Johnson is a retired elementary teacher who currently is working as a long-term elementary substitute teacher at Red Lake Falls (the Red

Philion, a graduate of Red Lake Falls High School and Bemidji State, began his coaching career in 1975 as coach of the boys and girls basketball teams at Gonvick-Trail (which became Clearbrook-Gonvick). In 1998 he returned to his hometown to coach the Red Lake Falls boys. He also is a longtime official, working football, baseball, softball and volleyball on the high school and college level for more than four decades,

and works as an MSHSL Rules Clinician.

Johnson, a graduate of Erskine High School and the University of North Dakota, began his coaching career as an assistant at Erskine in the 1970s and became the head coach at Grygla-Gatzke in 1980, where he remained for 33 years (also coaching football) until retiring in 2013. A year later, he returned to coaching when he was hired at Win-E-Mac to replace a young coach who moved to Colorado.

"Never in my wildest dreams did I ever think I would coach

again," Vern said. "I was satisfied. I took a year off with the intention to take a lot more years off. But the kids keep you young. It is refreshing."

Memories can be foggy, but Philion and Johnson recollect that they first crossed paths playing softball when they were in their 20s.

"Vern's a pretty passionate guy," Philion said. "He's into the game and he's pretty lively on the sideline. They always play good defense and they al-

ways have good fundamentals; typically he's had pretty decent teams over the years. Small schools usually have ups and downs but he's had more ups than downs."

Johnson said, "Oh, we've battled against each other. We still compete and we're still friends."

The Win-E-Mac Patriots defeated Red Lake County 64-42 in their first meeting earlier this month; they will meet again at Red Lake County in the regular-

season finale on Feb. 27.

Like Johnson, Philion has a son (Kevin) who serves as assistant coach. Kevin also drives the team bus.

"This is his fourth year with me," Steve said. "It's pretty special. It's fun having him there, he's very sharp."

Bret Johnson has been coaching with his father for three years, and Vern calls their relationship "kind of a special bond."

Arctic cat announces agreement to be acquired by Textron in \$247 Million all-cash transaction

Delivers substantial all-cash premium to Arctic Cat shareholders; Textron committed to continued, long-term growth of Arctic Cat; Combined businesses better positioned to be powersports industry leader

MINNEAPOLIS-- (BUSINESS WIRE)--Jan. 25, 2017- Arctic Cat Inc. (NASDAQ: ACAT) today announced that it has signed a definitive merger agreement under which Textron Inc. (NYSE: TXT) will acquire Arctic Cat in a cash transaction valued at approximately \$247 million, plus the

assumption of existing debt. Under the terms of the agreement, which was unanimously approved by the Arctic Cat board of directors, Textron, through a wholly owned subsidiary, will commence a tender offer to purchase all outstanding shares of Arctic Cat at \$18.50 per share in cash, representing a 40.7 percent premium to the closing price of Arctic Cat's common stock on January 20, 2017. Arctic Cat anticipates that tender offer materials will be provided to shareholders no later than February 7, 2017. The completion of the acquisition is subject to customary conditions and regulatory approvals.

"Arctic Cat's board believes that Textron's offer delivers compelling and immediate value to our shareholders," said Christopher Metz, Arctic Cat's president and chief executive officer. "This transaction presents increased opportunities for the business to leverage our combined scale, accelerate growth and enhance product innovation in ways that will benefit our customers, dealers and employ-

ees." Textron is a multi-industry company with over \$13 billion in annual revenues and approximately 35,000 employees.

Arctic Cat will become part of Textron's Specialized Vehicles business, maintaining its iconic Arctic Cat brand, as well as its current manufacturing, distribution and operational facilities, with a focus on growing the business. Arctic Cat and Textron Specialized Vehicles have complementary product portfolios of recreational, utility and specialized vehicles. The combined businesses will be well positioned to be a powersports industry leader with a wider product line-up, and allow for more aggressive investment in product development, dealer networks, marketing and customer service.

Metz added: "We are proud of the progress our team has made to lay the foundation for Textron to continue taking this company forward. Textron plans to build on Arctic Cat's strong brand and history of innovation. We expect many Arctic Cat employees to benefit from expanded career opportunities as part of a larger, more diversified company. and outcomes related to quality and finance.

Ryan and Kari Rivard, Argyle are Marshall County's representatives in the Red River Valley Emerging Leadership Program. Ryan is a third generation farmer. He farms with his cousin, Aaron Rivard. They have 6,000 acres of corn, soybeans, wheat, and sugar beets. They have two full-time employees and 15 part-time employees during harvest. Kari is currently student teaching at Stephen Argyle Central School and will be graduating with her education degree in May 2017.

The couples have been taking part in educational sessions since November 2016. They are building skills for leadership and networking with other rural leaders from 15 counties in the region. Extension educators Lisa Hinz, Brian Fredrickson, and Jody Horntvedt are instructors for the sessions which focus on personal leadership styles, communication, community

leadership, rural issues, life balance, dealing with challenges, change, and facilitating effective meetings.

According to Horntvedt, "this program focuses on helping participants gain competence, build connections, and increase confidence to lead in many different ways in their communities." This is the 33rd year the Emerging Leadership Program has brought together individuals from across the region for training workshops. Nearly 1,100 leaders in northwest and west central Minnesota are alumni of the program, which was established in 1985 to enhance the King Agassiz Program of the Red River Valley Winter Shows.

University of Minnesota Extension, with their long history of excellence in designing, delivering and evaluating leadership programs, is the primary sponsor of the Emerging Leadership Program. Additional financial support for the program comes from the Red River Valley

Development Association, and from a variety of other sources including ag producer groups, electric cooperatives, community businesses, financial institutions and individuals in counties throughout northwest and west central Minnesota who contribute each year. The Emerging Leadership Program is supported by the Northwest Minnesota Foundation who manages the program's project and endowment funds.

Kiehle Auditorium Murals Focus of Presentation by Librarian and Public Historian Bill Wittenbreer

CROOKSTON, Minn. – The murals that grace the walls of the Kiehle Auditorium on the University of Minnesota Crookston campus are 75 years old. Their history and impact will be the focus of a special presentation, "The Kiehle Murals: The Art of John Martin Socha," by historian and librarian Bill Wittenbreer on Thursday, February 16, 2017, at noon. The presentation, which will take place in the Kiehle Building's historic auditorium, will include the history of the Works Progress Administration's (WPA) arts program and the artist and muralist John Martin Socha and his work



around Minnesota and the country. The presentation is free, the public is invited, and parking permits will not be required.

Wittenbreer, a librarian and public historian, was the curator of An Artist's Paradise: Minnesota Landscape Painters, 1840-1940

at the Minnesota Museum of American Art, where he also serves on the collections committee. He has written and lectured about Minnesota painters and holds graduate degrees in history and library and information science. He currently works as a librarian at Augsburg College in Minneapolis, Minn.

Polk County Sheriff

On 01/27/2017, at 6:41pm the Polk County Sheriff's Office received a report of an emergency aircraft landing, in rural Polk County, south of Crookston MN. The Polk County Sheriff's Office, Crookston Fire Rescue, Minnesota State Patrol, Crookston Area Ambulance and Fisher Police Department responded to the scene.

Upon investigation the Polk County Sheriff's Office learned, the 2008 Cessna 172S Aircrafts engine failed, flying south of Crookston at approximately 900ft in the air. The two pilots then conducted an emergency landing in a plowed field in Hammond Township near 340th St. SW and 280th Ave SW. They were the only people in the aircraft. The aircraft sustained light damage as result of the emergency landing.

Upon conclusion of the investigation the Polk County Sheriff's Office was in communication with the Federal Aviation Administration of Fargo ND and the aircraft was released to the University of North Dakota Aviation.

No further information is given out at this time.

"The other night I know he wasn't real happy with me, and he thought I should have made a change earlier. Later I said, 'Are you mad at me?' He said, 'Yup. You should have gotten out of that zone earlier.'

"You don't always get to spend a lot of time with your kids. I have a feeling I won't be the best coach in the family. He'll be a lot better than I am."

Both coaches are taking it a year at a time, enjoying the days with their teams and the competition with friends.

"I hate playing his teams," Johnson said of Philion. "They just work hard and they're fundamentally sound. It doesn't matter how much talent they have or don't have. You better be ready or you're going to be taught a lesson."

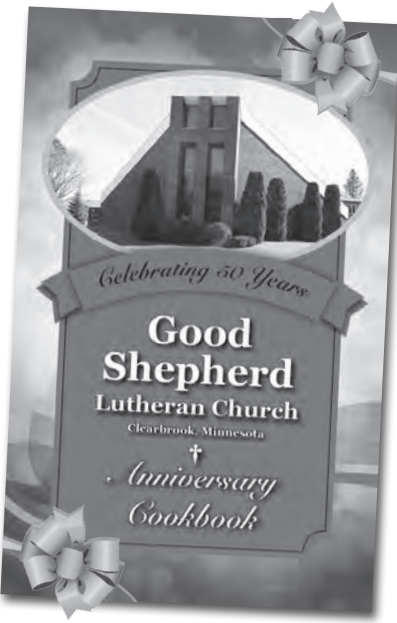

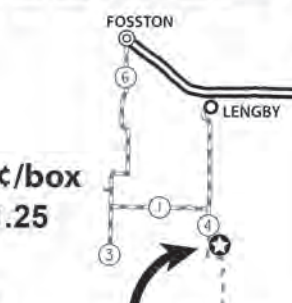

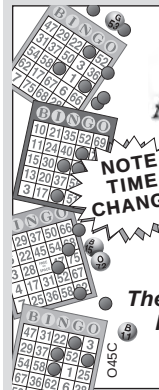

Challenges and Opportunities Of Water Management

When looking at the issue of water management in the Red River Basin and throughout the world there is one common impediment that most can identify, perspective. We all for the most part want to do the right thing when it comes to water management. But perspective challenges the cohesiveness of this desire for the right thing because every one of us has a different idea of what that is. We are all swayed by our own perspective, incentives, interests and desired outcomes. What comes next is anyone's guess? Whether you are an economist, an engineer, a scientist, a hydrologist, a landowner, a water board member, city, county or state employee, we all look at it differently.

These many different perspectives when dealing with water management create challenges when identifying best management practices and solutions related to the varying areas of water management: flood damage reduction, water supply, water quality, recreation, soil health, and aquatic habitat and life. How do you implement solutions that meet all of these areas of need? And then add in individual perspectives and opinions...

The United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development published a paper that outlines the need to evaluating and understanding the multiple perspective approach when learning about water. The article discusses the teaching through a multiple-perspective approach and how it provides a valuable means to guide holistic thinking about complex systems, most specifically about environmental issues. A multiple-perspective approach conveys the dynamic parts-to-whole relationship, which constitutes complex systems such as the Earth's freshwater system. The many processes and events of both natural and human influences on freshwater systems help connect us in a meaningful way to the issues.

The Multiple-Perspective Tool can be used as a pathway to:

- learn about sustainability issues from multiple bodies of knowledge,
- identify and understand personal and others' perspectives, and
- apply decision-making processes to complex issues that affect personal, community, and global well-being.

Every year there is increased attention on the issue of water education. A general understanding of the perspectives in water management is critical in educating all levels of water management. The key perspectives outlined in the Multiple-Perspectives Tool are:

1. Scientific Perspective: The scientific perspective maintains that scientific knowledge is "true" and useful in any setting and independent of the other perspectives
2. Historic Perspective: Understanding where we have been is important when addressing the future of water
3. Geographic Perspective: Learning about water through a geographic perspective helps learners understand how natural or human-created water issues appear. The Red River Basin is what remains of Glacial Lake Agassiz.
4. Human Rights Perspective: A human rights perspective stresses the relationship between access to sufficient supplies of safe water and opportunities to access other universal rights, notably education, health, and active participation in governance.

5. Values Perspective: Learners understand how particular needs or perspectives that an individual or group holds can dominate their ideas on water sustainability.

6. Sustainability Perspective: Learners consider the interactions between the environment, economics, and society to ensure an adequate supply of safe water for ecosystems and people today and for future generations.

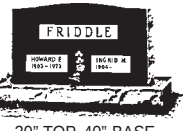

Public can view road conditions from MnDOT snowplow cameras

ST. PAUL, Minn. – The public can now view winter road conditions from the Minnesota Department of Transportation's new "plow cams" available through the 511mn.org website. MnDOT announced today that some of the agency's 838 snowplows are equipped with cameras that show real-time road conditions along plow routes.

"The plow cams are another way for travelers to make good decisions about their travel plans during the snow and ice season," said Kelly Braunig, 511 program manager. "If they go on the 511 site and see that travel is not advised, they can actually see an image of the road the cameras take as the plow is traveling. Seeing is believing."

Travelers can already see road conditions on major highways from the Road Weather Information System, which is also part of 511. These are fixed cameras at 97 locations across the state that show live rotating photos. While the RWIS cameras show a small area of the road, the plow cams show real-time road conditions as snowplows plow their routes.

"The RWIS and plow cameras are both used for maintenance purposes, and the public also benefits," said Steve Lund, state maintenance engineer. "They give maintenance managers and supervisors a quick snapshot of what's going on in the field but the plow cams will show the road conditions from the driver's seat along a route."

The plow cams are available on the 511 website's full-featured and streamlined pages and the 511 app. They are also available on the "Personalize

Your 511" feature, which is on the full-featured and truckers' pages.

To access the plow cams, go to www.511mn.org and click on "Plow Cameras" on the left menu. A window will open to show photos and a map where the plow is. Underneath the current photo and map is a "film strip," showing images every five minutes. The camera will activate when the plow is going at least 10 miles per hour or based on other filtering criteria.

Photos have captions that give the plow number, the date, time and location of the plow. Images will be displayed for two hours. If a new image is not taken for 15 minutes because, for example, a snowplow has stopped to refuel, the snowplow icon will be removed from the map until the plow is active again.

The active trucks displayed on 511 only represent a portion of MnDOT's fleet for snow and ice and other maintenance activities. Not all of the cameras are fully implemented in the trucks, but 200 cameras were purchased for this winter season. MnDOT is in the testing stage this season, which will allow the agency to make decisions on whether to install additional cameras.

"All the new features we're putting on 511 come down to intelligent transportation," said Braunig. "We want to be on the cutting edge of that. If motorists can just pick one or two features to use, they can make better travel decisions."

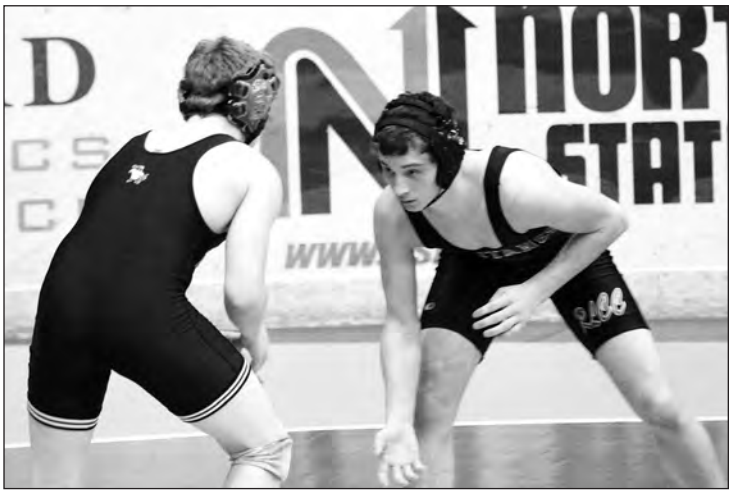
Thief River Falls Tournament
