Congressman Collin Peterson attends annual Fourtown/Grygla Sportsman's Club picnic

The Fourtown/Grygla Sportsman's Club held their annual picnic last Saturday following the youth firearm safety field day. Attending the picnic this year was Congressman Collin Peterson, who has been a big advocate of the club's Northstar Trail Alliance and continued efforts to obtain more trails in the Beltrami Island Forest. "I am happy to say that we are moving ahead with things and have reached an agreement," says Representative Peterson. The local Sportsman's Club and the Roseau/LOW Sportsman's Club joined forces to form the Northstar Trail Alliance and have worked together to put up signage and work on trails, creating friendlier trails that are safe to ride. The projected management plan has received joint DNR and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service approval. "By next spring, those trails will be connected and open," assured Peterson. After some minor road repair and culvert repair, the new routes will provide a connection between northern parts of the forest and areas farther south near Fourtown.

Representative Peterson ex-

plained that the DNR has essentially reached a land-trade agreement with the Fish and Wildlife Services in order to move forward. Members of the Roseau/LOW Sportsman's Club were present for the picnic, in addition to Roseau County Commissioners and Fourtown/Grygla Sportsman's Club members. New members are always welcome to join; the club holds a new membership supper every January with information coming out closer to that time. The club meets every 3rd Tuesday of the month switching between TRF, Grygla and Fourtown for meeting spots. **2017 officers include:** Jack Nelson, President; Donald Haack, Vice President; Tonia Haack, Secretary/Treasurer; Bob Thompson, Snowmobile Trail Admin.; Ryan Petersburg, ATV Trail Admin. **Board members include:** Loren Pittman, Jeremy Haack, Kyle Haack, Robby Anderson, Nick Harris, Jake Sundberg and Robert Sundberg. President Jack Nelson says the Fourtown/Grygla Sportsman's Club gives out approximately \$10,000 each year

towards the benefit of community projects, which include Fall Fest, school scholarships and Post-Prom parties, to name a few. The Sportsman's Club Fall Gun Raffle is currently going on. See the raffle ticket photo on page 3 for this year's prizes. **Youth firearm safety field day** The annual youth firearm safety field day was also held last Saturday at Grande Corner from 9am-1pm. This is the 7th year the range course has been held at the location 11 miles east of Grygla, along Highway 89. Numerous stations were set up for youth hunters to practice and get tested on their skills. Stations included visiting with landowners/gaining permission, safely hunting with a gun in a boat, shooting clay targets, safely climbing and being harnessed in a tree stand, compass work in the woods, and different scenarios on when it's safe to shoot or not. Many Sportsman's Club members and volunteers helped make the range course another successful one.

What interests do you have outside of the classroom? Hunting, fishing, and anything outdoors.

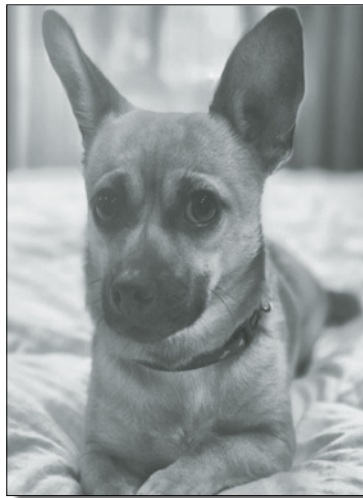
If you could trade places with anybody for a week who would it be? Any professional NBA basketball player, just to see what it would be like to play in the NBA.

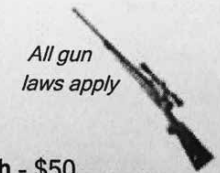

Chairperson of the board Nicolette Leach called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. with Karina Tinnes, Charisa Limesand, James Verbout, Jeremy Rychlock, Andrew Oslund, Principal Lunsetter, and Superintendent Clow present.

Pledge of Allegiance

Motion by Charisa Limesand, second by Jeremy Rychlock, to approve the agenda as amended. Passed 6-0.

Minutes of the 6/27/17 regular school board meeting were approved as amended. Motion by Charisa Limesand, second by Andrew Oslund, to approve payment of the bills check #35285 through check #35329 and wire payments. Passed 6-0.

Motion by Andrew Oslund, second by Karina Tinnes, to set board wages at \$50 in-district meetings, \$75 out-of-district meetings, annual compensation at \$500 chairperson, \$400 clerk, \$400 treasurer; meetings to be held the third Thursday of the month when possible, meeting time and place to be 8:00 p.m. in the Grygla School Library. Passed 6-0.

Student Report: No student report.

Teacher Report: Given by Gene Lunsetter. Travis Smith spent a week at a history workshop at the Minnesota Historical Society, where they explored ways to use

primary sources in the classroom. Thanks to Owen, Wayne, Chris, and Carol for getting teachers' rooms ready before the Centennial; teachers will have the opportunity to exchange a work day preparing their rooms prior to the celebration for a workshop day during the school year. Brady Olson's accel program came to a close today, and he had 18 consistent participants throughout the summer. Jesse Westbrook reported that the lock-in was a success, and the student council members were very prepared to plan for Fall Fest activities, Homecoming, and the Return Retreat.

Principal Report: Given by Principal Lunsetter. The athletic update: fall sports meeting will take place on Monday, 8/7/17, in Grygla, with the paired sports meeting at 5:00, registration beginning at 6:00, general meeting at 6:45, and individual sport meetings to follow. The construction projects are wrapping up, and the classrooms are close to completion. Staff will be getting their rooms ready prior to the Centennial and will exchange a workshop day during the year for their time spent preparing. The Gatzke School Reunion was a huge success with nearly 500 people attending. Finally, Principal Lunsetter reported that the student council lock-in was very productive and was mostly student-led. He was very happy with the leadership shown by all of the students.

DIY Piggy Bank Materials
Empty plastic beverage bottle (the wider the better)
Craft knife
Scissors
Colored paper (1 sheet orange, 1 sheet blue)
Pencil
Craft glue
Transparent tape
Hole punch
Paintbrush
Ear templates (download at allyou.com/piggybank)
4 wood beads (3/4" diameter)
Orange acrylic paint
Instructions

Peel label off clean, empty bottle. Use craft knife to cut a 1 1/2" x 1/8" wide slot (for inserting coins) in bottle, about midway between top and bottom. Use scissors to cut a strip of orange paper long enough to wrap around bottle and same width as bottle label. Wrap paper around bottle and use a pencil to trace over slot in bottle. Unwrap paper and cut slot with craft knife.

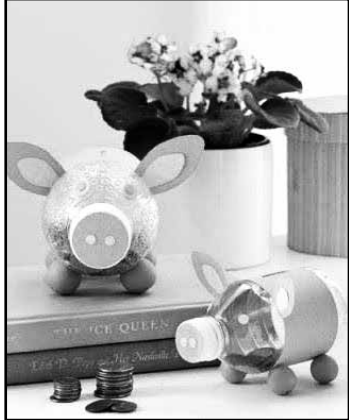
Use scissors to cut out ear and inner-ear templates. Place ear template on orange paper and trace around. Repeat for other ear. Cut out. Place inner-ear template on blue paper and trace around.

Repeat. Cut out. Fold ears at tab. Position ears along edge of paper band, about 1" to each side of slot. Tape tabs to back of paper band. Wrap band with ears around bottle, aligning slots on bottle and paper. Overlap ends of band and tape seam.

Trace around bottle cap on orange paper. Cut out and glue to cap. Use hole punch to make 2 blue circles. Glue to bottle cap.

For eyes, use hole punch to make 2 circles of either color. Glue them to bottle. Or, cut 2 dime-size circles out of contrasting paper and glue hole-punch circles to them; glue larger circles to bottle.

For legs, paint beads and let dry. Glue to "belly" side of bottle.

Join in the fun & band ducks at Agassiz National Wildlife Refuge



Mark your calendars for an evening of duck banding this Saturday, September 16, 5:30 pm at Agassiz National Wildlife Refuge. All ages are welcome to join in the fun and 'ruffle some feathers'. Meet at the Refuge headquarters at 5:30 pm. No pre-registration is required and the event is free to the public.

Banding ducks is a "hands on" experience, and can be a little messy so you'll want to dress sensibly. Old clothing or rain gear is recommended if you plan on handling the ducks. Those of you who would rather watch, bring your cameras to capture the experience.

This annual event brings many 'repeat' banders and Refuge staff look forward to seeing you each year. Newcomers will have an opportunity to learn about the life history of several duck species, baiting, capture, and handling techniques, as well as sexing and aging techniques. We band predominantly mallards, with a few wood ducks, blue-winged teal, and northern pintails mixed in. Agassiz bands an average of 1,500 ducks per year.

More than one million birds are banded in North America every year. Banding provides valuable information on migration routes and breeding and

wintering areas of different bird species, as well as helping support hunting regulations development and detecting changes in bird populations. Secondly, the strong waterfowl contingent in northwestern Minnesota also recognizes harvested ducks sporting "jewelry" in the form of metal leg bands as special trophies.

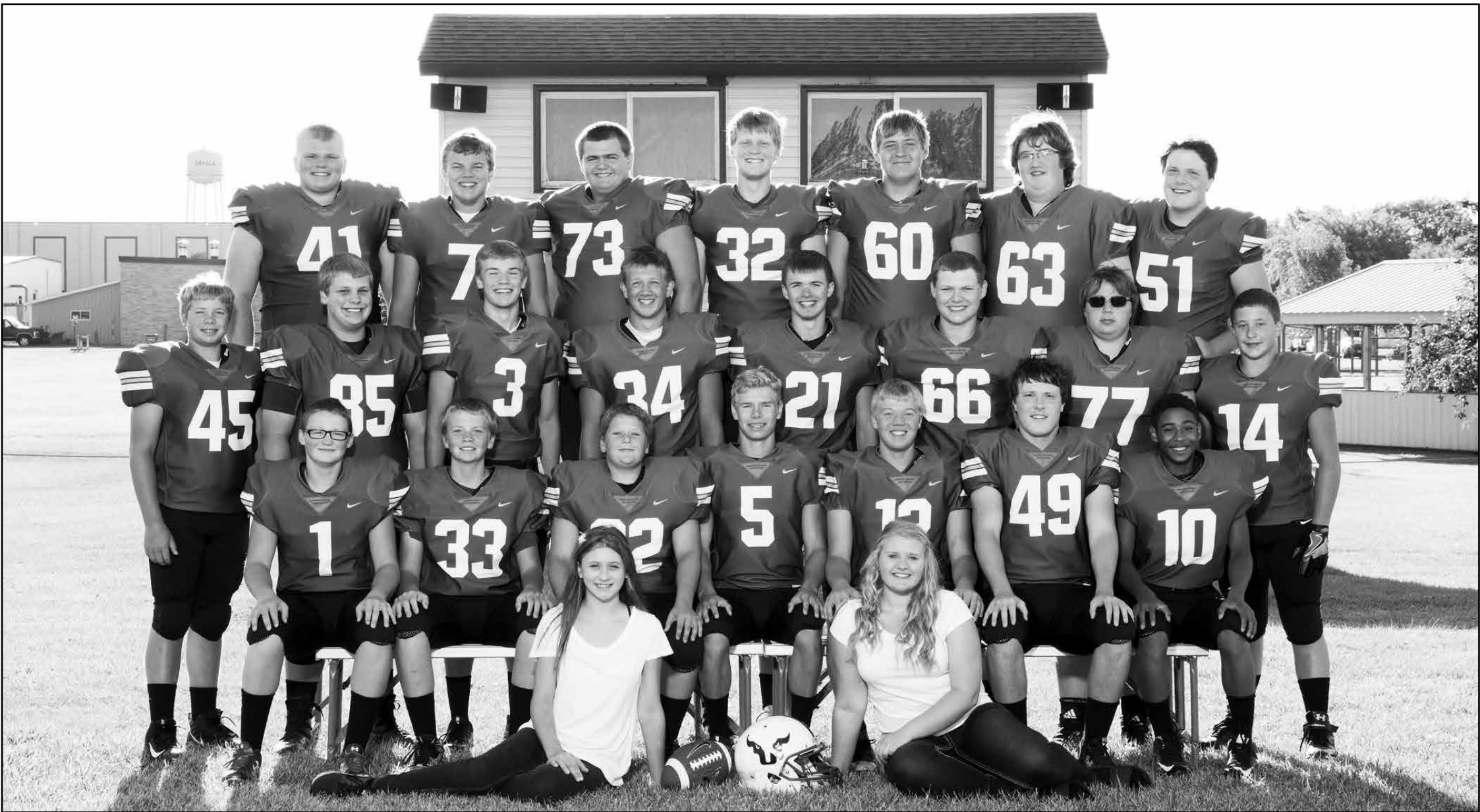
