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Sapphire's Courage tour includes a stop at the Goodridge School

Sapphire's Courage is a campaign that began 5 years ago after Sapphire Brown experienced bullying from her peers, and the mental health challenges that accompanied. Being very open about her past experiences during her teenage years, and telling the story of this challenging time in her life, including suicidal ideation, Sapphire promotes hope and shares coping skills that were effective for her as she encourages others to seek help for whatever they are dealing with.

Sapphire's Courage will soon go on tour in Northern Minnesota and work its way down to the Minneapolis area and up towards the Grand Forks, ND, area. The tour will kick off on October 3rd at Franklin Middle School in Thief River Falls, and makes a stop at the Goodridge School on October 11th at 9:30am.

Sapphire has shared her story at many area schools, churches, and other venues, and has presented for mental health conferences as a keynote speaker. She is also a Nashville recording artist who has opened for legends Amy Grant, Michael W Smith and Mark Schultz. Already reaching thousands of kids, Sapphire will hit the road in a few weeks to connect and interact with

even more students while using music to deliver her message. The mission of Sapphire's Courage is to educate, inspire, and advocate for anti-bullying, suicide awareness, and mental health.

Two years ago, Sapphire moved to Nashville to pursue her music career. During her time there, she says she learned so much about writing, and the ins and outs of the music industry. She and her fiancé, Blake, performed at some amazing events while there, including the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital, but felt a strong pull to come back to Minnesota to tour. She says, "While there, we met fabulous people who changed our lives, were welcomed into a church that gave us so much to be thankful for, and got to live and breathe the feeling of Nashville. Although it was so much fun, I discovered that my purpose was not only just for Nashville, but for anywhere and everywhere God leads me. After lots of praying of where He wanted us to go next, we felt a strong pull to come back to MN." She adds, "We don't know what state we'll be going to next, but Nashville and Minnesota are always home to both of us."

Sapphire graduated from Northome, MN, while her fiancé, Blake, graduated from Thief River Falls. Sapphire's mom, Stacy (England) Brown,



grew up in Grygla. Her grandparents are Melvin and Polly Englund, so she visits this area occasionally and as time allows.

As far as short term goals, Sapphire wants to continue spreading her story and music in Minnesota and reaching as many people as she can. Looking down the road, she hopes to share her story with all 50 states and also doing some out of country events. "To me, I have already made it. I get to share my story with hundreds of people every year and I get to watch as people pull out of their darkness and find the courage to be who they are. To me that is making it. That's been my purpose all along. And if that's all I do for the rest of my life, it's completely and totally worth it," Sapphire con-

cluded.

Along with Sapphire's Courage tour, she will be singing at the Suicide Prevention Run/Walk/Skate in Bemidji on September 9th, and also has an upcoming concert scheduled at Pioneer Village in Thief River Falls from 7-9pm on September 15th. All proceeds go to fund the village. Tickets are being sold at Hugo's, Border State Bank and the Ralph Engelstad Arena in TRF.

Grygla man loses life in accident on his farm

A Grygla man was found dead Tuesday, Aug. 29, after a farming accident, according to the Beltrami County Sheriff's Office.

Ralph S. Lee, 80, had been cleaning the box of a farm truck used for hauling small grain when he became trapped in the truck's chute and died, according to a news release. Deputies received a 911 call reporting

Lee's death at about 10:11am Tuesday and responded to the scene at the 43000 block of Moose River Road in Northwood Township, in the far northwest portion of Beltrami County.

The Beltrami County Coroner's office completed an autopsy Wednesday and determined that Lee's death was accidental.

Registration begins that Saturday at 9am and activities include free coffee, juice, rolls, live music, silent auction, raffles, face painting and much more. The opening ceremony begins at 11:30am with a balloon release at 12 noon and the walk beginning at 12:1pm.

A free-will donation lunch provided by the Warroad Senior Living Center for registered walkers will follow.

In 2016, grants were given out to area individuals and organizations in the amount of \$30,000! These grants have been given for dementia specific uses such as respite care, support, medical needs, training, education, research and equipment. The Mayo Clinic Alzheimer's Research Center in Rochester, MN, was also the recipient of \$25,000 from Walk to Remember.

100% of these research dollars goes towards research and the Mayo Clinic. What a joy it is to keep our dollars local and give back to communities in the counties of Roseau, Lake of the Woods and Marshall!

Grygla Fire & Rescue Report

From January 1, 2017, to September 2, 2017, the Grygla Fire & Rescue responded to 25 calls total.

7 fire calls: 3 structure, 1 tractor, 3 grass; 1 ATV accident; 1 motorcycle accident; 4 motor vehicle accidents; 6 medical calls; 1 lift assist; 2 alarm activations, which resulted in false alarms; 2 weather alert calls; 1 service call, which was in response to a cat being in a tree.

Last Saturday, September 2nd, the crew responded to 3 separate calls. The first call came in at approximately 7am when crews were dispatched to a single car accident that contained 5 occupants. Per Fire Chief, Bob Thompson, the driver was Jessica Byklum, of rural Grygla, who had driven off the end of her driveway due to foggy conditions, crossing over Hwy 89, and going straight into the ditch. Her mother, Marilou, a passenger, was life-fighted

to the hospital in Grand Forks with neck and back injuries. All other occupants were taken to Thief River Falls Sanford Hospital by ambulance, with what appeared to be non-life threatening injuries and were later released. Marilou remained in the hospital as of this print date. Other passengers included Edwin Yager and two minor children.

The second call to the Grygla Fire & Rescue came in at approximately 3:30pm last Saturday afternoon regarding a grass fire in Veldt Township, north of Grygla. Crews arrived on the scene and assisted DNR Forestry officials to extinguish the flames.

The third call was for a single car rollover on Hwy 219 near 320th Ave at approximately 6:20pm. Occupant was transported to TRF Sanford with what appeared to be non-life threatening injuries. The name was not released.

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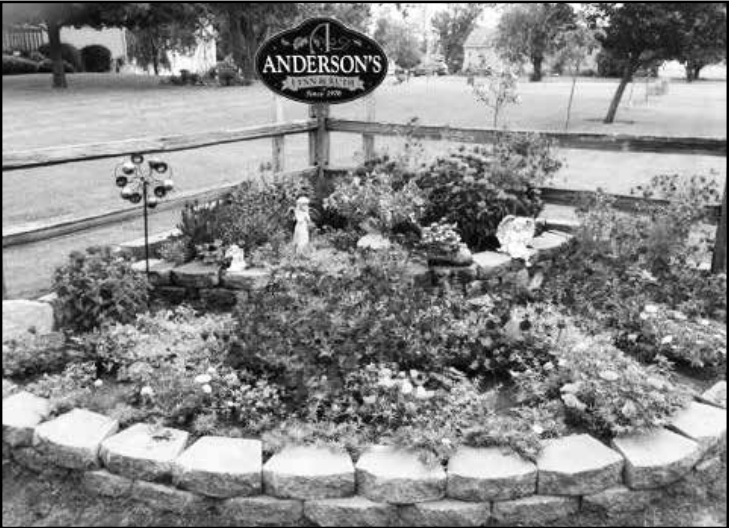
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Yard of the Week wraps up

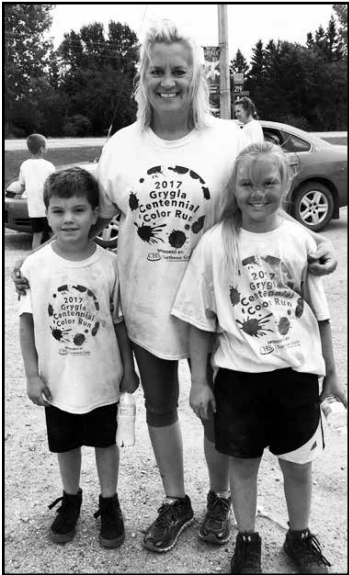
▶ SIMPLY DELICIOUS

Garlic Hummus
This is a simple hummus (without tahini) that takes about 5-10 minutes tops. It uses common ingredients and is so much cheaper than the packaged stuff. Why is a little tub of bean dip so expensive? I mean, come on, it's mostly just beans, which cost next to nothing. So make your own and save some money.
To make this dip, just add all the ingredients below to a food processor and blend until smooth. That's it. Serve it up with your favorite dippers. My go-to dippers are tortilla chips, crackers and veggies; more specifically, green pepper strips. YUM. I also think warm Pita bread is a great one, but that takes another few hours to prepare and make.
If you like the nutty taste of tahini, definitely add it to this recipe. I don't really care for the taste and it's also not an ingredient I just leave it out. It's really not even necessary to make a great batch of hummus, anyway.
Ingredients:
2 (15 oz) cans garbanzo beans (chickpeas) drained
6 tbsp cold water

2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
2 tbsp lemon juice
1-2 garlic cloves, minced
1 tsp ground cumin (or substitute with chili powder)
½ tsp salt
Process all of those ingredients until smooth and creamy. Before serving, drizzle a bit of olive oil on top. Add a few sprinkles of parsley, red pepper flakes and chopped onion. Most recipes say to store in the refrigerator, but anyone who knows hummus, knows it's TECHNICALLY supposed to be served at room temperature. So serve and eat immediately after making. There. Problem solved on the storing issue.
