Gear up for Snowmobile Safety Training

Twix Cookies

If your favorite candy bar is a Twix then you are going to love these shortbread Twix cookies! They start off with a buttery, flaky shortbread base and are topped with caramel and finished with chocolate. They are a very rich cookie so make sure you have some nice, cold milk on hand. These make a great addition to your holiday baking and also package great for a cookie exchange.

Ingredients

1.5 cups softened butter
1 cup powdered sugar
3 cups flour
1 tsp vanilla
¼ tsp salt
15 oz. caramel
2 cups milk chocolate chips

2 tsp shortening

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cream butter and sugar together. Add your flour, vanilla and salt. Mix well. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough out to ½ inch thick. To cut cookies, use a biscuit cutter or a small glass about 2 inches wide. Place round cookies on a lightly greased cookie sheet and bake for 14-15 minutes. Let cool. Melt caramel and spread over cooled cookies. Let cool completely. Add shortening into the chocolate chips and melt in microwave then spread over the cooled caramel. Let cool before packaging or serving. Do not store in the refrigerator – the chocolate will discolor and not look as appetizing. Happy baking!
