The show will be held at Yo-Hawn's Bar & Grill, starting at 10am with the ride leaving Grygla at 12pm sharp. It's by Liv Constantine, which is the pen name of sisters Lynne and Valerie Constantine. It was such an easy read; I finished it in two days. It goes like this: Amber Patterson is fed up. She's tired of being a nobody: a plain, invisible woman who blends into the background. She deserves more - a life of money and power like the one blond-haired, blue-eyed goddess Daphne Parrish takes for granted.

U of M Beef Team to host Cow/Calf Days Seminar Tour and Trade Show in January and February

The University of Minnesota Beef Team is proud to host the annual Cow/Calf Days Seminar Tour and Trade Show at 10 locations across the state in January and February. This event has been held for over 40 years and continues to be the leading information, technology, and research outlet for cow/calf producers in the state of Minnesota.

The 2018 event will feature information on marketing calf value, genetic selection for commercial cow-calf operators, and backgrounding the calf crop on the ranch. The program also will feature a panel discussion on genetics and management. Updates from the Minnesota State Cattlemen's Association will also highlight the event. The corresponding tradeshow will feature vendors with new information, technology, and products with a wide-array of practical uses for the operators in the cow-calf sector.

The program is directed at cow/calf producers, allied in-

dustry representatives, and is open to the public. A meal will be served with the program and a registration fee of \$10 will include the meal, proceedings book, and program materials.

ARC/PLC enrollment contract signup has begun

The Marshall County FSA Office would like to inform producers that they may enroll into the 2018 ARC/PLC program by signing a contract CCC-861 or CCC-862. This is a required annual contract to be eligible for any payments earned under the ARC/PLC program. Signup began November 1st, 2017, and will continue to August 1, 2018. We encourage producers to take the time to sign the ARC/PLC contract for 2018 now during the winter and early spring months. By coming in earlier will give us more time to make any changes that you may have

such as landowner changes, new land interest and operating plan changes. Please bring a copy of any new land leases you may have with your landowners.

To better serve producers the contract enrollment process is being conducted by appointment.

Producers with questions about the Enrollment process or who wish to schedule an appointment should contact their local FSA County Office or the Marshall County FSA Office at (218) 745-4251 ext. 2.

Candlelight events begin at Minnesota state parks and trails

Care to see winter soften before your very eyes? Candlelight has that effect. Each year staff at Minnesota state parks and trails place lanterns, candles and other luminaries along short trails and invite the public in for a candle-lit walk.

In some cases, visitors can also snowshoe or cross-country ski over a trail glowing with soft light. The evening wraps up with a steaming cup of cocoa or cider near a crackling bonfire.

More than 30 candlelight events are scheduled at Minnesota state parks and trails this winter, starting on Saturday, Dec. 30, and continuing through the end of February. Events are scattered throughout the state, offering a variety of terrain and scenery. For the complete schedule, including dates, times and other details, visit http://www.dnr.state.mn.us/state_parks/candlelight_events.html

"Candlelight brings out winter's soft side," said Erika Rivers, director of the Department of Natural Resources Parks and Trails Division. "The flickering light against snow creates an unforgettable experience. An evening walk becomes so much more on a candle-lit trail aided by light from stars and a full moon."

Snowshoes and skis can be rented or checked out at some

parks. Call in advance to confirm the availability of equipment and to reserve what you will need.

The candlelight events are free, but a vehicle permit is required to enter a state park (\$7 for a one-day permit or \$35 for a year-round permit). Those who don't already have a vehicle permit can purchase one at the park on the night of the event, but getting one online in advance will save time.

Skiers age 16 and older also need the Great Minnesota Ski Pass to participate in the candle-lit ski events. The ski pass (\$6/one-day pass, \$20/single-season pass, and \$55/three-season pass) allows access to hundreds of miles of trails in state parks, state forests, city parks and other public lands throughout Minnesota.

Note that events may be changed or canceled due to weather.

Events closest to Grygla include an event at Itasca State Park on Saturday, January 27th from 5-7:30. Go on a lantern-lit snowshoe or ski and then warm up by the fireplace and enjoy folk music under the pines! On January 27th, Hayes Lake State Park is also putting on a candlelight Snowshoe from 5:30-8:30pm. See the website for more information and locations.

To continue on with our soup recipes for in honor of January being National Soup month, I have another good one to share with you.

Tortellini Soup with Italian Sausage and Spinach

This is like tomato soup taken up a whole bunch of notches and is perfect for a cold winter night. It's got everything you need – meat, veggies and cheesy pasta. It cooks quickly and in just a few steps. Of course, the longer you let it simmer, the better the flavor. Just be sure to plan to add the tortellini and spinach just before you're ready to eat, so they don't get overcooked.

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1 pound ground Italian Sausage
- 1/2 cup diced onion (about 1/2 medium sized onion)
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic

1-28 oz can crushed tomatoes

1-32. oz. box of vegetable broth (chicken works too)

2 tablespoons fresh chopped basil

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

1 9-ounce package refrigerated tortellini

2 cups packed fresh spinach

Directions
Heat a large pot over medium-high heat. Heat vegetable oil and add diced onion. Saute until onions are soft. Crumble Italian Sausage and the garlic in the pan. Cook until sausage is no longer pink. Stir in crushed tomatoes, vegetable (or chicken) broth, basil, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil, reduce heat to low, and cover. Let soup simmer for 20-30 minutes. Add tortellini and spinach and simmer for about ten minutes, until pasta is tender. Serve with shredded Parmesan.

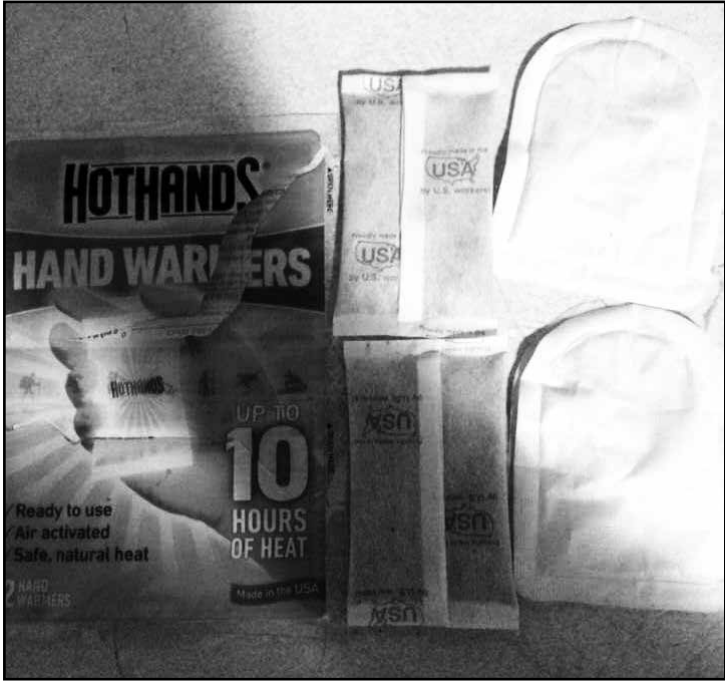

NAP is designed to offer disaster coverage to producers who are growing non-traditional crops that crop insurance does not cover. Please contact your local USDA Service Center for information on exemptions.

NAP fees are non-refundable and must accompany the application for coverage by the applicable application closing dates. The fees are: \$250 per
