Pennington SWCD seeks summer apprentices

Conservation Corps Minnesota & Iowa is currently accepting applications for young adults, ages 18-25, for summer apprentice positions in 31 Soil and Water Conservation Districts throughout Minnesota. Apprentices will spend their summer working alongside natural resource professionals to learn hands-on skills in managing soil and water resources. Responsibilities vary by site and may include communicating with landowners, creating educational materials, surface water monitoring, inspecting

sites, surveying, utilizing GPS and GIS applications, preparing reports and other conservation-related activities. The Pennington SWCD apprentice will be based at the SWCD/USDA Service Center in Thief River Falls. Apprentices will serve as AmeriCorps members and receive a monthly living stipend of \$1,355 as well as an education award of \$1,538 to use towards qualifying education and student loan expenses. Educational credits may be arranged by the apprentice. The service

term runs from May 15 to August 10, 2018. Those interested may get more information at www.conservationcorps.org/apprentice-academy and complete an application online at conservationcorps.org/apply. The application deadline is March 2, 2018. The summer apprentice program is funded through the Minnesota Environment and Natural Resource Trust Fund and LCCMR.

USDA requires applicants to take a homeownership education course that will inform them of the buying process and help safeguard their important investment. USDA's Direct Home Loan Program offers financing to qualified very low and low-in-

come applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of 20,000 people or less. The maximum loan amount for the repair program is \$20,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for up to 20 years. Grants of up to \$7,500 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used

Rep. Dan Fabian attends Rural Prosperity Conference at White House

Rep. Dan Fabian, R-Roseau, attended a White House Conference on Rural Prosperity on Tuesday, January 30, 2018, led by United States Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue, United States Secretary of the Interior Ryan Zinke, and a number of other federal, state and local leaders from across the nation. Vice President Pence also at-

tended and spoke on the importance of rural economies. Discussions focused around trade, infrastructure, technology, and strengthening rural economies.

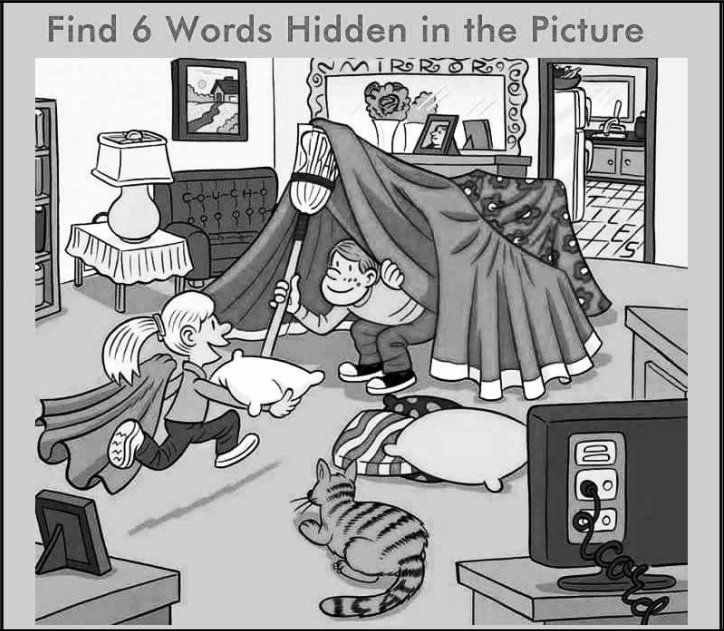

Lemon Cheesecake Mousse

Think Spring! Could there be a better spring dessert? These individual mousse cups would be perfect for Easter and Mother's Day or for any get together.

- Yield: 8 - 10 servings
- Ingredients**
- Crust*
- 3/4 cup crushed graham crackers (6 full crackers)
 - 2 Tbsp sugar
 - 3 Tbsp butter, melted
- Mousse*
- 2 1/2 Tbsp fresh lemon juice
 - 1 1/2 Tbsp water
 - 1 1/2 tsp unflavored gelatin powder
 - 1 1/2 cups heavy cream
 - 1 cup powdered sugar, divided
 - Yellow food coloring (optional)
 - 12 oz cream cheese, softened
 - 1 (10 oz) jar lemon curd
 - Sweetened whipped cream, lemon wedges, blueberries and mint for garnish (optional)

Instructions

In a mixing bowl whisk together graham cracker crumbs and sugar. Pour in butter and stir until evenly moistened. Divide mixture among 8-10 dessert cups and lightly press into an even layer, set aside.

Pour lemon juice and water into a small bowl. Sprinkle gelatin evenly over top, let rest 5 minutes. Meanwhile, whip heavy cream in a medium mixing bowl until soft peaks form. Add in 1/3 cup of the powdered sugar, tint with yellow food coloring if desired and whip until stiff (but not lumpy) peaks form

(shake cream from beaters, no need to clean). In a separate large mixing bowl whip cream cheese until smooth and fluffy. Mix lemon curd and remaining 2/3 cup powdered sugar into cream cheese mixture.

Heat rested gelatin mixture in the microwave on high power for 30 seconds. Whisk for 1 minute to thoroughly dissolve gelatin, then let cool 3 minutes (no longer or it may start to set then you could end up with little lumps in the mousse). While mixing cream cheese mixture with hand mixer, slowly pour in gelatin mixture then blend until thoroughly combined. Gently fold 1/3 of the whipped cream mixture into the cream cheese mixture to lighten, then add remaining whipped cream and gently fold until combined. Spoon or pipe mixture into dessert cups over graham cracker layer. Cover and refrigerate 2 hours (or up to 1 day ahead if desired) to set. Garnish as desired. Serve cold.

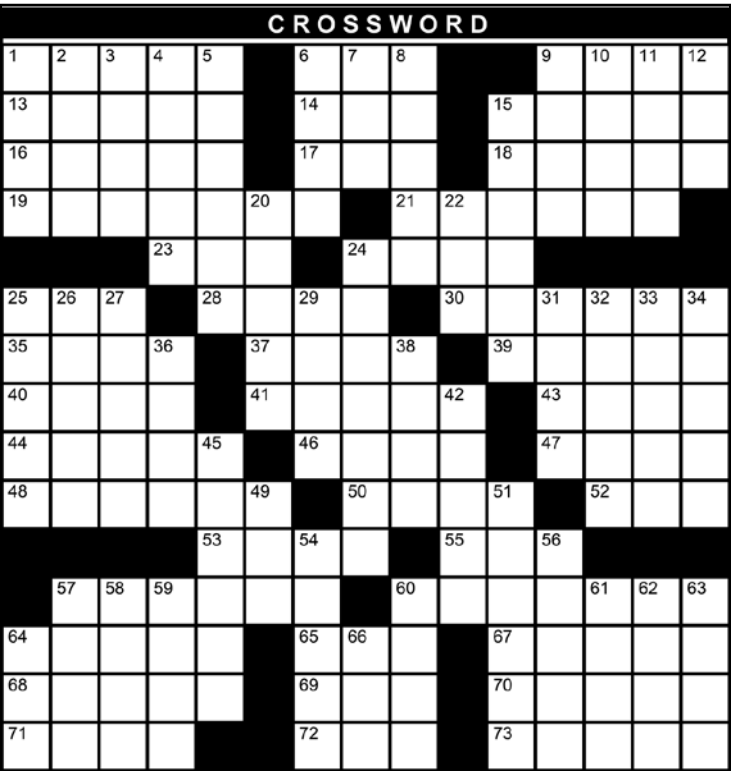
