The Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf is participating in the statewide Minnesota Food Share Campaign to collect non-perishable food items and/or monetary donations. Donations collected locally will stay in the Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf to assist area residents. All donations made during the month of March allow our food shelf to be eligible to receive additional funding from Minnesota Food Share based on the funding raised and the amount of food items donated (number of pounds).

We urge everyone (individuals, civic organizations and businesses) to consider donating to the Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf during the month of March to take advantage of these grant programs. Food donations may be left at participating area churches or at the Co-op Store. Donations can be sent or given to the Treasurer of the Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf, Lori Thompson, 222 Evelyn Avenue, PO Box 105 Grygla, MN, 56727.

Below is a list of suggested items:

Breakfast: Canned fruit juices, hot and dry cereals, dry

powdered or canned milk.

Lunches/Dinners: Hearty soups (chunky type), tuna fish, canned beef or poultry, peanut butter, canned fruit or vegetables, canned or boxed main dishes, rice, macaroni, spaghetti, spaghetti sauces, baked beans, canned chili, stews, potato buds.

Food Staples: Crackers, sugar, flour, coffee, tea, hot chocolate, pancake and biscuit mixes.

Sundry Basics: Toilet paper, facial tissue, bath soap, shampoo, moisturizer, deodorant, feminine sanitary supplies, laundry soap, dish soap, bleach ammonia liquid, toothpaste, tooth brushes.

Baby Items: Diapers, baby shampoo, cereal, infant formula, powdered milk, bath powder, baby oil, baby wipes.

Special Treats: Cake mixes, cookie mixes, muffin mixes, granola bars, pudding mixes, Jell-O mixes, graham crackers, packaged cookies.

It's always great to get donated food items, as it adds to the variety of food items available. Our order form from the North Country Food Bank does not always change a lot from month to month, so getting different items donated is always welcome!

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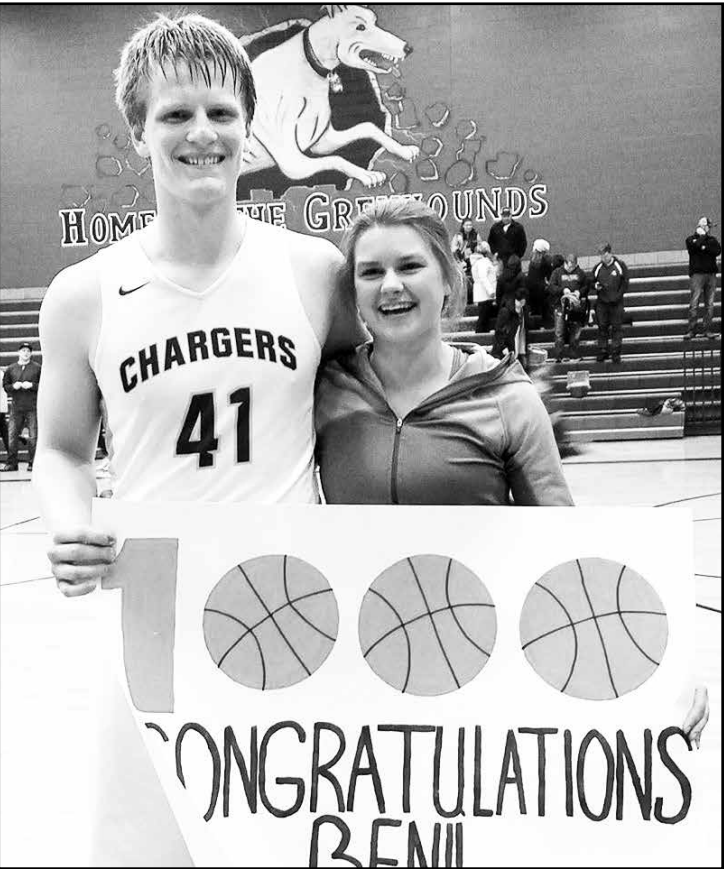

SIMPLY DELICIOUS

Two things to share with you this week. A supper idea and an appetizer idea/party platter/cheeseboard/whatever you want to call it!

First up, Taco Pie. For my family of 4, the entire pie plate was gone in one supper, so plan accordingly. This was good. Like, SO GOOD.



Taco Pie

Ingredients

- 1.5 lbs ground beef
- 1 packet taco seasoning
- 1 can crescent rolls
- 2 cups corn chips
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 cup shredded cheese
- Toppings of your choice

Instructions

Heat oven to 375 degrees. Brown your ground beef, drain and stir in taco seasoning with a little water. Simmer for 5 minutes. Meanwhile, press your crescent dough into an ungreased pie pan, pressing to form a crust. Sprinkle 1 cup of corn chips over bottom of dough.

Spoon taco meat on top of the corn chips and crust. Gently spread sour cream over your taco meat and cover with shredded cheese. Sprinkle remaining cup of corn chips on top.

Bake for 20-25 minutes or until crust is golden brown.

Serve with toppings of your choice! (Lettuce, onions, olives, tomatoes, salsa, etc.) Adding beans or olives to the taco meat would have been my preference, but I know my kids wouldn’t have liked that, so I added my go-to toppings afterwards. This was a hit at my house and I know it will be at yours, too!

Cheeseboards

Next up are cheeseboards. I was on Pinterest and saw this and almost overdosed on pictures - there are SO many ideas to make these pretty boards!

They are impressive, easy to assemble and delicious. I didn’t have a lot of stuff on hand to go ALL OUT like the ones off of Pinterest, but I did have a few things and, to be honest, I just made it for my family to enjoy at home while we were playing cards around the table. Had I invited guests over or brought this to a party, I would have stepped up my presentation game and followed some of these tips below.

Now, there are a lot of cheeseboard tutorials out there. Some have hundreds of dollars worth of ingredients put into them or tons of styling time, but you don’t have to make it so complicated. The basic idea here is to put piles of stuff you like on a board. Done.

Breaking the food up into a few different categories is pretty fun: sweet, salty, cheesy, crackery...you get the idea.

Dried fruits (like apricots) are great for a sweet tooth and also fill in spaces nicely, along with clusters of grapes. You can throw everything on the board or quarantine some of the items in a bowl (think olives and nuts).

What you want to pile on and how you want to display it is up to you. Hard cheese, soft cheese...toss it all on there. In fact, the messier, less organized, more rustic a cheese board is, the more beautiful it is.

I think it’s pretty evident which picture is mine and which one came off of Pinterest, but for my first cheeseboard, I give mine a C-minus. Next party I go to, I’ll shoot for an A-plus board with lots of crunchy, chewy, sweet and salty items piled on.
