I have to say he was one of the best speakers I have ever heard. I last talked to Jon a couple of years ago when the VFW closed and felt it would be a great use of part of the auxiliary funds to have him come to Grygla and speak at a school assembly. At that time he was recovering from complications from rotator cuff surgery, but was still hoping to get back to doing speaking engagements, but it never worked out for us.

So now I suggest his book “Left for Dead” written by Jon Hovde and Maureen Anderson. Jon tells a detailed description of serving in Vietnam. He hit a mine driving an armored personal carrier where he lost an arm and a leg. He was “left for dead” when his pulse was taken in the arm that was severed from his body, but he moved and was helicoptered to an evacuation hospital. Jon tells of his long (painful) road to recovery, although there were many times along the way they said he probably would not survive.

At his worst point, Jon made three promises if he managed to survive. One: he would have the fastest car in Polk County, Minnesota. (Hey, he was twenty years old; that’s what guys think about). Two: he would not be dependent on the government. He would become a productive member of society despite his amputations. Three: he would make a difference. (He eventually became a motivational speaker)

The book is about his life and finding his purpose in life. He tells it with realism and humor. Jon tells about racing his Dodge Charger around before getting his act together. Mostly his positive attitude, despite all he’d been through, makes this book interesting and would be a good read for young readers, as well.

most people, it’s not just about the hunt itself. It’s about the preparations, the anticipation, reliving the stories of past season hunts, and mostly enjoying time with family & friends in the outdoors.

Deer hunting on Agassiz National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) is a long-standing tradition. Agassiz, known as Mud Lake NWR until the name change in 1961, was first open to deer hunting during the fall of 1949.

Due to three years of Lottery and Bucks-only designations, combined with some milder winters, Agassiz deer numbers have increased. This year’s management designation for Deer Permit Area 203 is Hunter Choice. According to the MN DNR 2018 Deer Hunting Information Data, this designation is intended to maintain or slightly increase the deer population.

On another note, during this year’s hunt, we encourage you to use lead free ammunition. Agassiz National Wildlife Refuge is one of several refuges in the Midwest Region encouraging hunters to make the switch.

We encourage you to switch to lead free ammunition and be our partner in this conservation effort. Together it is our goal to protect wildlife health on our national wildlife refuges.

In addition to the opening of the deer firearms season, archery hunters, and grouse hunters are welcome as well. For the hardy, cold weather hunters, the Refuge is also open for the muzzleloader deer season. Most seasons are in accordance with state regulations; some have delayed openers (i.e., archery and grouse). Please consult Agassiz NWR and state regulations for complete details.

Wishing everyone a safe and happy hunting season, and hoping your ‘lucky socks’ come through for you.

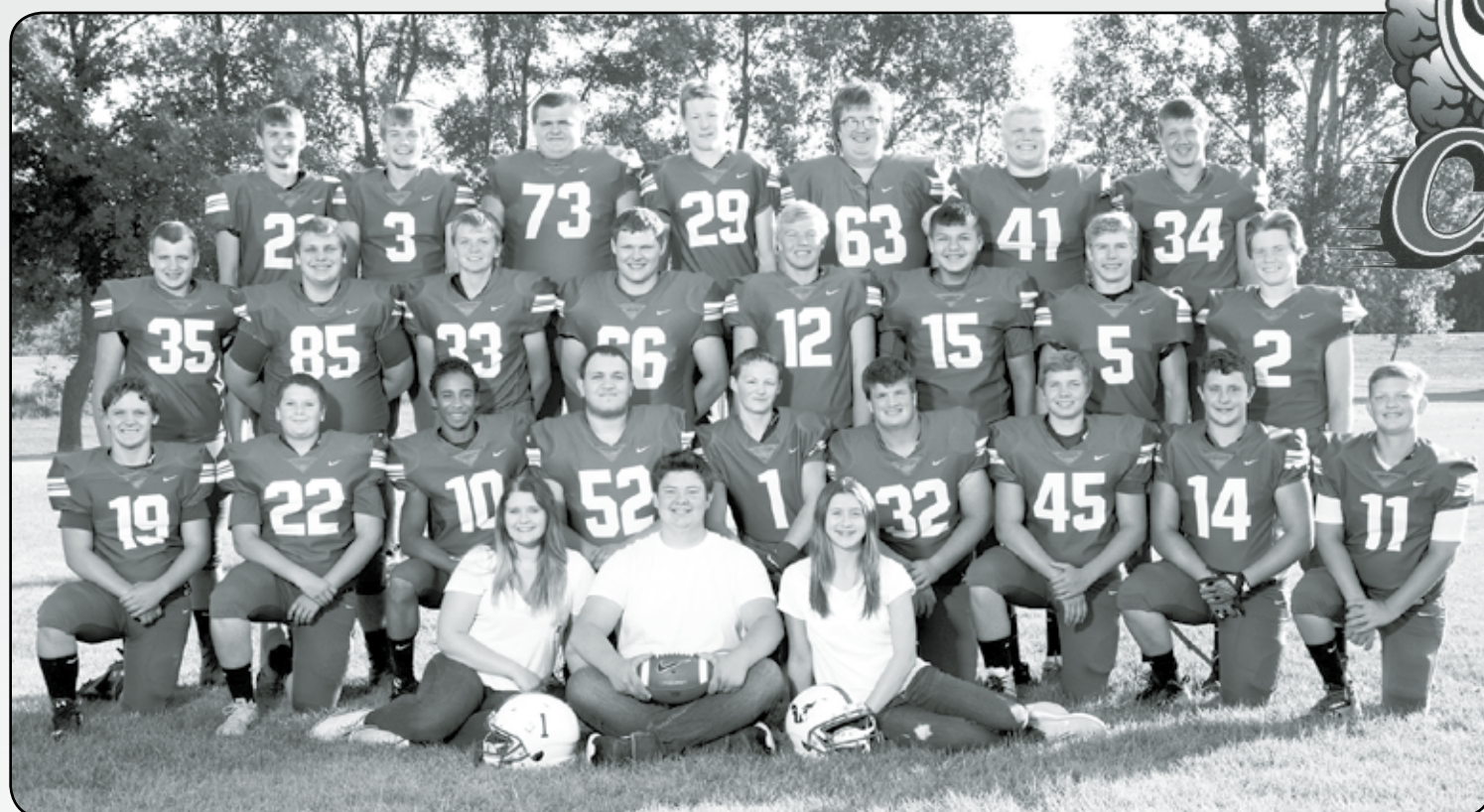
