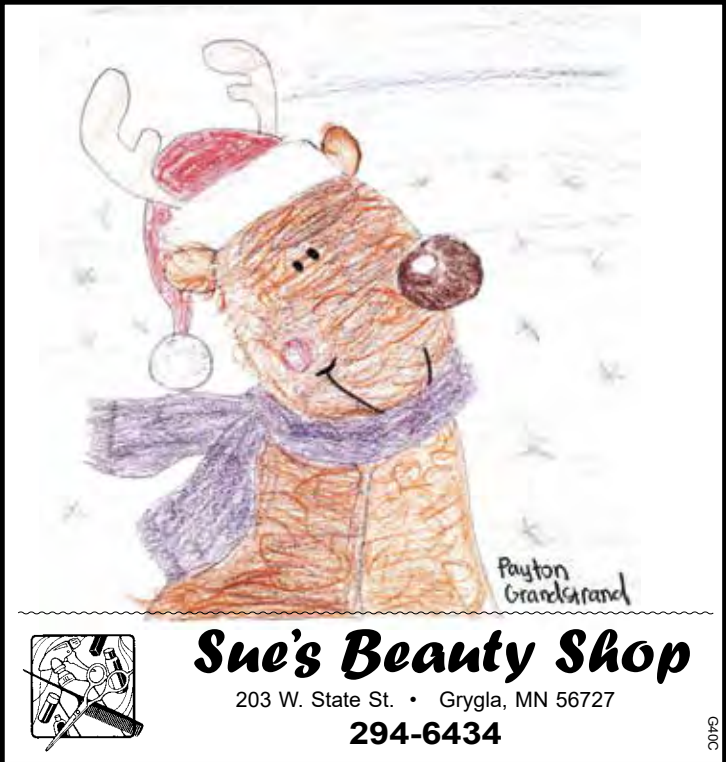

Grygla Lions serve and deliver Christmas Eve dinners

The Grygla Lion's Club held their annual Christmas Eve Dinner on Sunday, December 23rd. Around 30 volunteers, along with some of their family members, cooked, prepared and served a noon meal at the Grygla Community Center. 53 meals were also delivered to homes in Grygla/Gatzke/Goodridge this year by several different Lion members. A handful of early risers started preparing the menu at 4:30am; that menu was made up of mashed potatoes, gravy, dressing, turkey, beans, cranberries, dinner rolls and lefse. This holiday meal is a free-will donation. Lion's member, Wayne Warne, said they are the only club in the region to provide a Christmas Eve dinner. With a budget of \$600 for this annual project, the club always breaks even or ahead – though that isn't the focus. Goodridge School helps give back to one of its own

Last week, the Goodridge School held what they called a 'Week of Giving.' The 'Week of Giving' was a fundraiser meant to raise money for a school in North Carolina that was hit by Hurricane Florence. Teaming up with three other local schools, a friendly competition began between Goodridge, Grygla, Red Lake Falls and Warroad to see which school could raise the most money to help Maysville Elementary buy library books. What came as a surprise to some was that this project was started in order to help former Goodridge High School graduate, Bryce Marquis, who is the principal at Maysville Elementary School in North Carolina. The schools held dress-up days, such as Ugly Sweater Day, Christmas Character Day, Pajama Day, to name a few, in which students and staff had to pay \$1 (or more) to participate. Candy Cane Grams were also delivered, along with some donations from community members. All proceeds went to the 'Week of Giving.'

The fundraiser was initially started by Mr. Chris Bjerklie, Principal of J.A. Hughes Elementary School in Red Lake Falls. Mr. Bjerklie contacted Goodridge, Grygla and Warroad Schools to see if they would like to participate. Bryce Marquis was unaware of the fundraising efforts taking place. Last Friday afternoon, Goodridge, Grygla, Warroad and Red Lake Falls joined in a video chat with Mr. Marquis and his 4th grade students. The Goodridge School also had some special guests to help spread the news to Mr. Marquis – Mr. Mickelson, his high school basketball coach; Mrs. Sargent and Amber Homme, his classmates; Mrs. Rystad and Andrea Marquis, his relatives; and Sydney Langseth, daughter of one of his classmates. The announcement was made that \$1,444.75 was raised for Maysville Elementary!

The Goodridge School shared news of this project on its Facebook page, saying, "This week was one of the most amazing things our school, students and community have done yet. It was filled with so many smiles, so much laughter, and even some tears; it was definitely a week we will never forget."

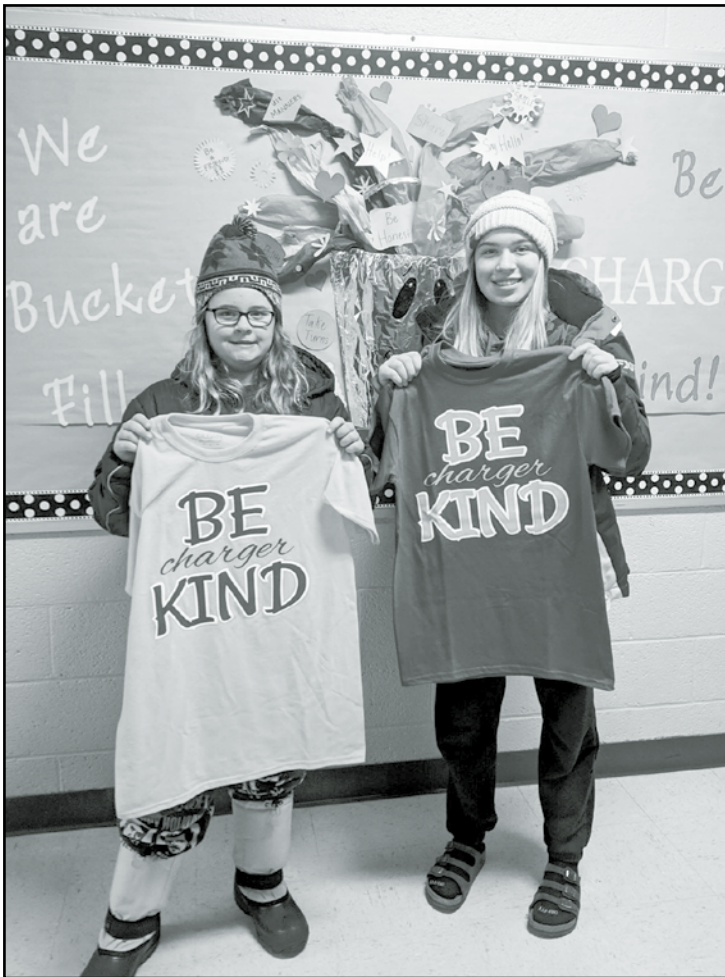

Blueberry Cream Cheese French Toast Bake

We are doing a Christmas "brunch" at my parents' house this year and everyone is pretty excited about the menu change-up. I'm in charge of a French toast bake and found this yummy-looking recipe online. Adding cream cheese just about guarantees that it'll be amazing, too. I like pretty much any type of French toast bake, especially ones that have a crunchy brown sugar topping – such as this.

This particular recipe allows you to get everything prepared the night before if you want. Also, you can serve this the next day with maple syrup OR...a lemon glaze. I'm going with the latter. Just mix some powdered sugar with a couple tablespoons of milk to make a thick icing. Add some lemon juice and zest to it until the consistency becomes thinner.

The night before (if desired): Cube the bread and leave it out overnight uncovered. Mix the egg custard ingredients and keep covered in the refrigerator. You can prewash the blueberries and cut the cream cheese ahead of time. The brown sugar topping can be made and kept covered in the refrigerator.

In the morning turn on the

oven, toss the bread with the egg mixture, layer and cook as directed in the recipe below.

Ingredients

- 1 loaf French bread
- 8 eggs
- 2 cups milk
- ½ cup heavy cream
- ¼ cup sugar
- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1 tbsp vanilla extract
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- ¼ tsp nutmeg
- 8 ounces cream cheese, cut into 16 pieces
- 1 pint blueberries washed and dried

Brown sugar topping

- ½ cup flour
- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ¼ tsp salt
- ½ cup butter, cold and cut into small squares

Instructions

French Toast Bake:

Spray a 9×13 pan with cooking spray and preheat your oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, add the eggs, milk, heavy cream, sugar, 1/2 cup brown sugar, vanilla, cinnamon and nutmeg. Chop the bread into 1-inch cubes and put it in the bowl with the egg mixture and toss well until all the liquid is absorbed.

Pour half of the bread and egg mixture into the pan, top with half of the cream cheese and blueberries. Pour over the remaining bread mixture then top with remaining cream cheese and blueberries.

Brown sugar topping:

In a small bowl or a food processor, add the flour, remaining brown sugar, cinnamon, and salt and mix. Cut in the butter with a fork or pulse in the food processor for 5-10 seconds or until the butter and brown sugar mixture is crumbly. Cover evenly with the brown sugar-butter topping and bake for 45-50 minutes or until the top is crispy and the center is no longer wet.

The RTCC wants to improve transit coordination throughout the region using a mobility manager to coordinate rides and act as a travel trainer teaching people how to ride the buses. The public is asked to come and learn more about the NWRTPCC and provide feedback on their transit experiences.

Grygla City Council approves November minutes

The December meeting of the City Council was held at the Grygla Civic Building on Tuesday, December 11th. Council members approved the November minutes, which are included below. 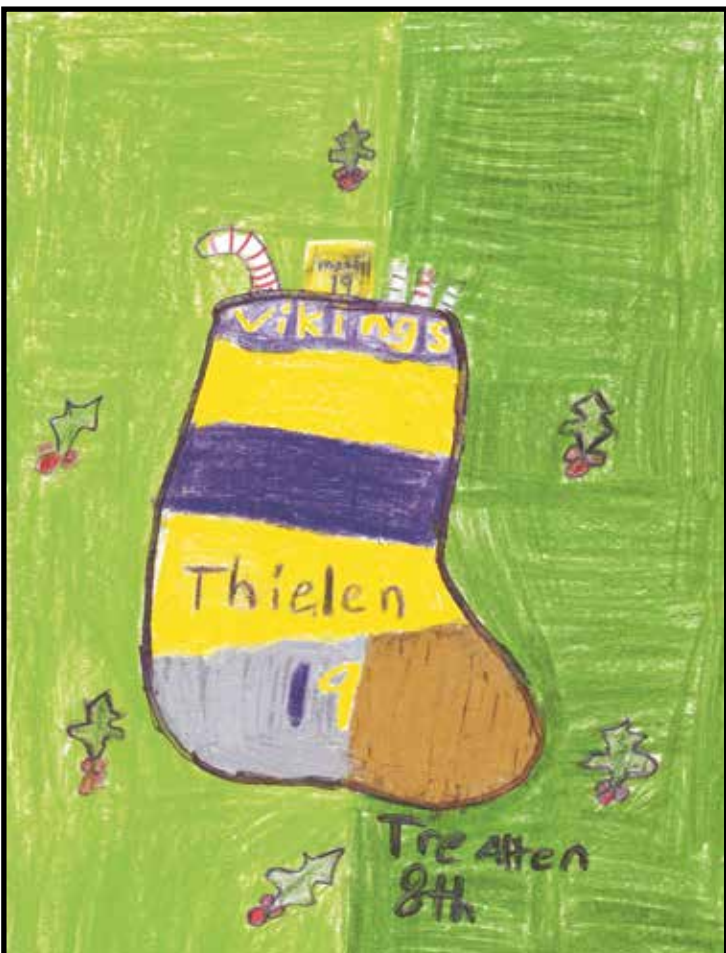
