Other choral selections included a familiar Beatles hit, some toe-tapping bluesy tunes and an emotional piece called "Inscription of Hope," which invited you to live and breathe the words of hope written by a people of the not-so-distant past. The words

to the song were inscribed on the walls of a cellar in Germany, where Jews were hiding from the Nazis during WWII. Hope was all they had to hold on to; hope was their only bridge to a brighter tomorrow. The Senior High Band ended the night with a concert piece titled "Moscow, 1941." 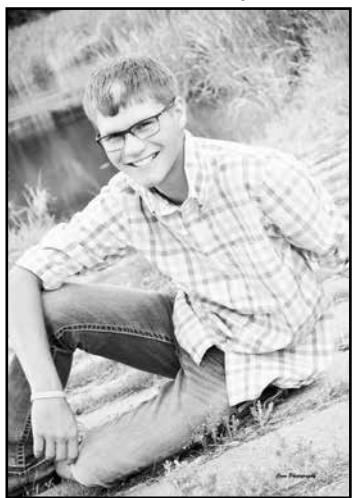

Grygla Community hosted a blood drive with Vitalant, formerly United Blood Services, on April 26 at Grygla Community Center which helped collect a total of 34 units of blood products for patients in need.

A total of 37 individuals volunteered to donate blood and 31 individuals were able to donate at the Vitalant blood drive on April 26. A total of two donors also came forward to donate Power Red Cells (2RBC) which collects two units of red blood cells while returning platelets, plasma and a saline solution back to the donor.

Vitalant expressed their gratitude to Ralph Rundell, who coordinated the drive, and Grygla Lions which sponsored the blood drive, as well as others who assisted the day of the drive: Ralph

Rundell, Sheldon Peterson and Mildred Klamar.

Vitalant strives to keep a 5-day supply of every blood type on the shelf at all times to be able to meet the needs of patients across the region. Donations from O-negative donors, the universal blood type, are especially important this time of year due to increased accidents and trauma cases.

Vitalant is the only blood provider to nearly 70 hospitals across the region. The blood supply is dependent on selfless donations from volunteer donors to ensure the lifesaving needs of the region are met.

About 30 percent of Vitalant's blood supply goes to cancer patients across the region and one in seven people entering the hospital will need

blood. Those relying on blood in the region receive that lifesaving blood from Vitalant.

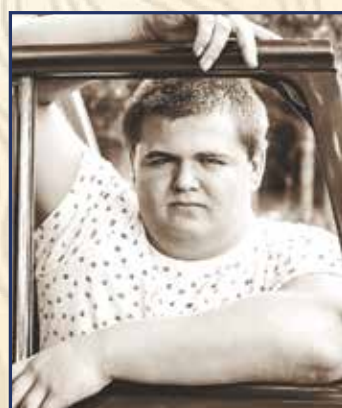
