Yes. Now Off-Sale! Many remodel projects and new layouts can be seen at the Grygla Co-op, including a new Off-Sale section that is officially up and running. With the beer truck stocking the first half of the area and Saurdiff Trucking delivering the liquor a few days later, the Co-op Off-Sale is open for business.

Owner Randy McMillin says it is their intention to extend the hours of operation, which will hopefully begin this week. “We are working on scheduling shifts for the new hours and hope to start those later hours this week,” he said.

The Grygla Co-op is open every Sunday from 9am-1pm; Monday-Wednesday 6:30am-6pm; and the hours on Thursday-Saturday will now be extended to 6:30am-8pm, which includes both grocery and off-sale.

McMillin says the work in progress includes competitive

pricing with neighboring cities and trying to bring in as full of a selection as possible, which will include an expansion of the wine selection, based on suggestions from consumers.

Sportsman’s Club members celebrate opening of new trail route

The Northstar Trail Alliance, a cooperative between Roseau-Lake of the Woods Sportsman’s Club and Fourtown-Grygla Sportsman’s Club, will be celebrating the Moose River Dike Road ATV Pilot Project on Monday, July 15th, at 6pm.

Everyone is encouraged to attend the recognition event, which will include a grill out and a short ATV ride put on by the Alliance. The group will be meeting at the dike on the east end of Lobo Road (aka Blilie Grade).

About the opening of MRD to ATV travel

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is launching a two-year pilot project to open the Moose River Dike Road (MRD) to all-terrain vehicle (ATV) travel during a limited timeframe.

The Moose River Impoundment is located at the headwaters of the Moose and Mud Rivers in northwestern Beltrami County, about 15 miles northeast of Grygla. DNR manages the Moose River Impoundment in conjunction with the Red Lake Watershed District for both natural resource enhancements and flood damage reduction benefits. The DNR owns and operates the MRD within the Moose River Wildlife Management Area.

After construction of the impoundment, local residents requested access to the dike for recreational use. Consideration of this request led to

the dike being opened shortly after construction to highway-licensed vehicles (HLV) during a limited timeframe of July 15-September 15. The timing was designed to minimize disturbance to wildlife nesting and using the dike. Since opening the road, HLV use has been minimal during the allowed timeframe.

DNR did not open MRD road to ATV traffic previously because of concerns for safety, erosion and additional wildlife disturbance from ATV use. However, ATV users have a long-standing desire for additional riding opportunities in this area and they have identified the MRD road as a safer alternative for north south travel compared to using Dick’s Parkway.

After carefully considering the various perspectives, opportunities and concerns associated with allowing ATV use on the MRD road, DNR will launch a two-year pilot program (summer 2019 and summer 2020) to open to the MRD road from July 15 to September 15 beginning on July 15, 2019.

The pilot will help DNR determine whether ATV use on MRD road can be implemented in a manner that is sustainable and safe. At the close of the 2-year pilot, DNR will review the evaluation to decide if ATV use on this route is consistent with natural resource conservation and public safety objectives.

The Grygla Lion’s Club will hold their July “Picnic in the Park” meeting on Wednesday, July 17th, at the Ralph Klein Park. The annual steak sup-

per will begin at 6pm with the meeting to follow at 7pm. All Lion members are welcome to attend.

Grygla area woman injured in a single vehicle accident

A Grygla area woman was injured in a single vehicle accident on July 4th in Beltrami County. According to the Minnesota State Patrol, Terry Lynn Fischer, 54, was injured when the westbound 1997 Ford Thunderbird she was driving ran off Highway 89, 10 miles

east of Grygla in Hamre Township. According to the State Patrol report, road conditions were listed as dry and Fischer was wearing a seat-belt at the time of the accident, reported just after 7am. Officials say alcohol was not a factor in the accident.

Kiesow is a part of the HOBY Minnesota 2019 seminar

Founded in 1958, HOBY’s mission is to inspire and develop our global community of youth and volunteers to a life dedicated to leadership, service and innovation.

HOBY programs are conducted annually throughout the United States, serving local and international high school students. HOBY programs provide students selected by their schools to participate in unique leadership training, service learning and motivation-building experiences.

Chosen from Grygla was Levi Kiesow, who attended HOBY’s Minnesota 2019 seminar with approximately 85 other students at St. Cloud State University June 7-9.

While at HOBY, Levi was a member of the Royal Blue group, facilitated by Caitlyn Parsons, a speech-language pathologist at South Washington County Schools and long-time HOBY volunteer.

Throughout the weekend, youth participated in numerous activities created to develop the youth’s leadership

skills. They went through four “phases” based on different types of leadership. The ambassadors also listened to numerous speakers whom each had a leadership role in society that corresponded to the different phases.

Speakers included: the Mayor of St. Cloud, HOBY Minnesota Chair, Founder of “Like A Girl”, Founder of College Possible, and many others.

Throughout the weekend, ambassadors were challenged to go outside their comfort zones, create goals, and grow in their leadership abilities.

Ambassadors were also challenged mentally and emotionally through activities such as “The Ice Cream Game.” In this activity, each ambassador was assigned to a group based on ice cream flavors, the flavors all corresponded to societal groups that had strong stereotypes (white, black, LG-BTQ+, females, Latina, and the disabled community). The students were not aware of this hidden meaning during the activity. They were then

tasked to create a community. Each group was given a different amount of supplies/money and were treated based on stereotypes of that group. i.e. Females were asked where their husbands were when they wanted to go somewhere, or LGBTQ+ only being allowed to build clubs or things that support the arts. The students began catching on after a while and then went through a debrief on the topic where the hidden meanings were revealed. With students from all different backgrounds attending seminar, there were many different viewpoints on the topic, which everyone discussed. It always is a big eye opener for the students when they “go through” the societal injustices that happen today.

This information was all provided by Kristin Farris, an alumna of Goodridge High School, who attended HOBY as an ambassador in 2015 and started volunteering as the photographer in 2018.

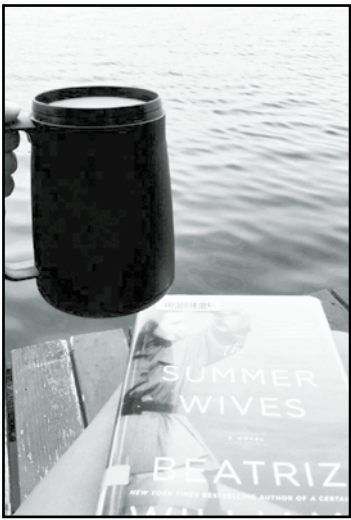
July WIC Schedule

I haven't gotten any book reviews or suggestions from anyone, so I'll share one of my own with you. Last week, I was hesitant to share the title with you in case it was a flop, but it was NOT; it was a perfect summer read. The book is The Summer Wives by Beatriz Williams.

Summary:
New York Times bestselling author Beatriz Williams brings us the blockbuster novel of the season—an electrifying post-war fable of love, class, power, and redemption set among the inhabitants of an island off the New England coast . . .

In the summer of 1951, Miranda Schuyler arrives on elite, secretive Winthrop Island as a schoolgirl from the margins of high society, still reeling from the loss of her father in the Second World War. When her beautiful mother marries Hugh Fisher, whose summer house on Winthrop overlooks the famous lighthouse, Miranda's catapulted into a heady new world of pedigrees and cocktails, status and swimming pools. Isobel Fisher, Miranda's new stepsister—all long legs and world-weary

bravado, engaged to a wealthy Island scion—is eager to draw Miranda into the arcane customs of Winthrop society.

But beneath the island's patrician surface, there are really two clans: the summer families with their steadfast ways and quiet obsessions, and the working class of Portuguese fishermen and domestic workers who earn their living on the water and in the laundries of the summer houses. Uneasy among Isobel's privileged friends, Miranda finds herself drawn to Joseph Vargas, whose father keeps the lighthouse with his mysterious wife. In summer, Joseph helps his father in the lobster boats, but in the autumn he returns to Brown University, where he's determined to make something of himself. Since childhood, Joseph's enjoyed an intense, complex friendship with Isobel Fisher, and as the summer winds to its end, Miranda's caught in a catastrophe that will shatter Winthrop's hard-won tranquility and banish Miranda from the island for nearly two decades.

Now, in the landmark summer of 1969, Miranda returns at last, as a renowned Shakespearean actress hiding a terrible heartbreak. On its surface, the Island remains the same—determined to keep the outside world from its shores, fiercely loyal to those who belong. But the formerly powerful Fisher family is a shadow of itself, and Joseph Vargas has recently escaped the prison where he was incarcerated for the murder of Miranda's stepfather eighteen years earlier. What's more, Miranda herself is no longer a naive teenager, and she begins a fierce, inexorable quest for justice for the man she once loved . . . even if it means uncovering every last one of the secrets that bind together the families of Winthrop Island.

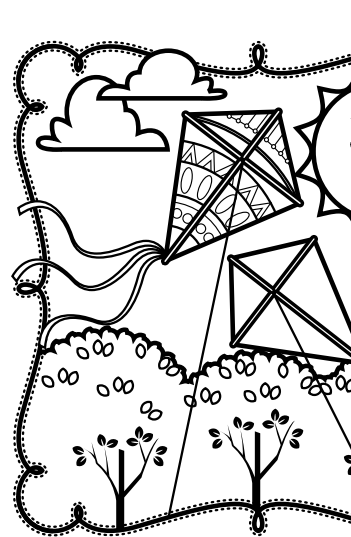

An Early History of Gatzke, Minnesota

Over the course of the next few weeks, we are going to be sharing things out of the book titled "An Early History of Gatzke, Minnesota: Second Edition - As told by Walter Lunsetter."

Walter Lunsetter's family were amongst the pioneers that settled Gatzke, and when the first edition of his book was published in October of 2013, at 98, he and a few scattered second cousins were the only ones left who remembered the glory days of the thriving little town it used to be. The second edition of his book includes additional material about events during Walter's life that Walter had mentioned and seemed germane to the spirit of the book. While they are not in his voice, it is the hope that you will find interest in the stories, pictures and articles.

Walter died at home on November 19, 2013, but he was



able to see his book published and enjoyed its enthusiastic reception in the community. Gatzke lives on in the hearts of all who live there and those

who heads the stories of wonderful times there.

The Grygla Eagle will be making its way through the pages of Walter's book and

looks forward to bringing you the pictures and stories over the course of the next few weeks.

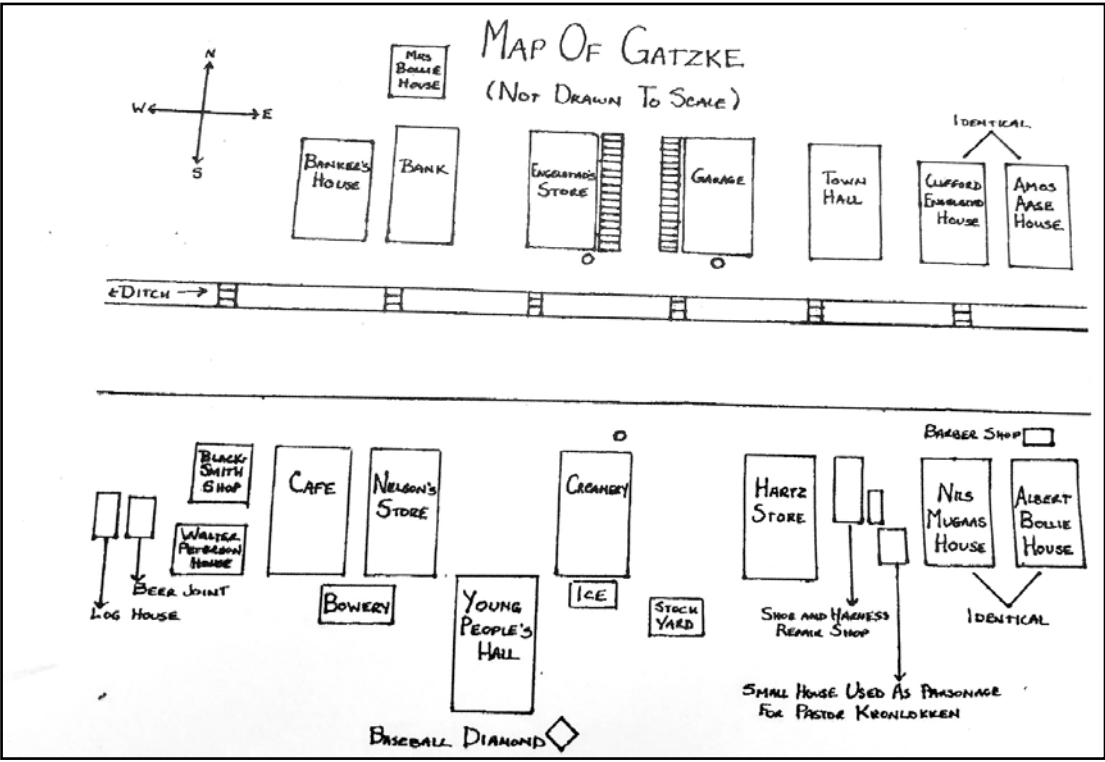
Gatzke, Minnesota, was settled in 1897 by a few Norwegian families who moved to Minnesota from South Dakota to take up homesteads. The Red Lake Indian Reservation was opened to homesteaders in 1896. It was in the early summer of 1887, that some of the family from Brookings went up to the Gatzke area to check out the land. Owning land was of utmost importance to them, and there was no land left to homestead around Brookings. I'm quite sure that the "land men" or even the government advertised it as being a wonderful opportunity to own cheap or free land. Dad and the others thought it must be wonderful land with rich soil as the grass was so tall. What they didn't realize was that much of it was a bog and would require a great deal of hard labour to take it for farming.



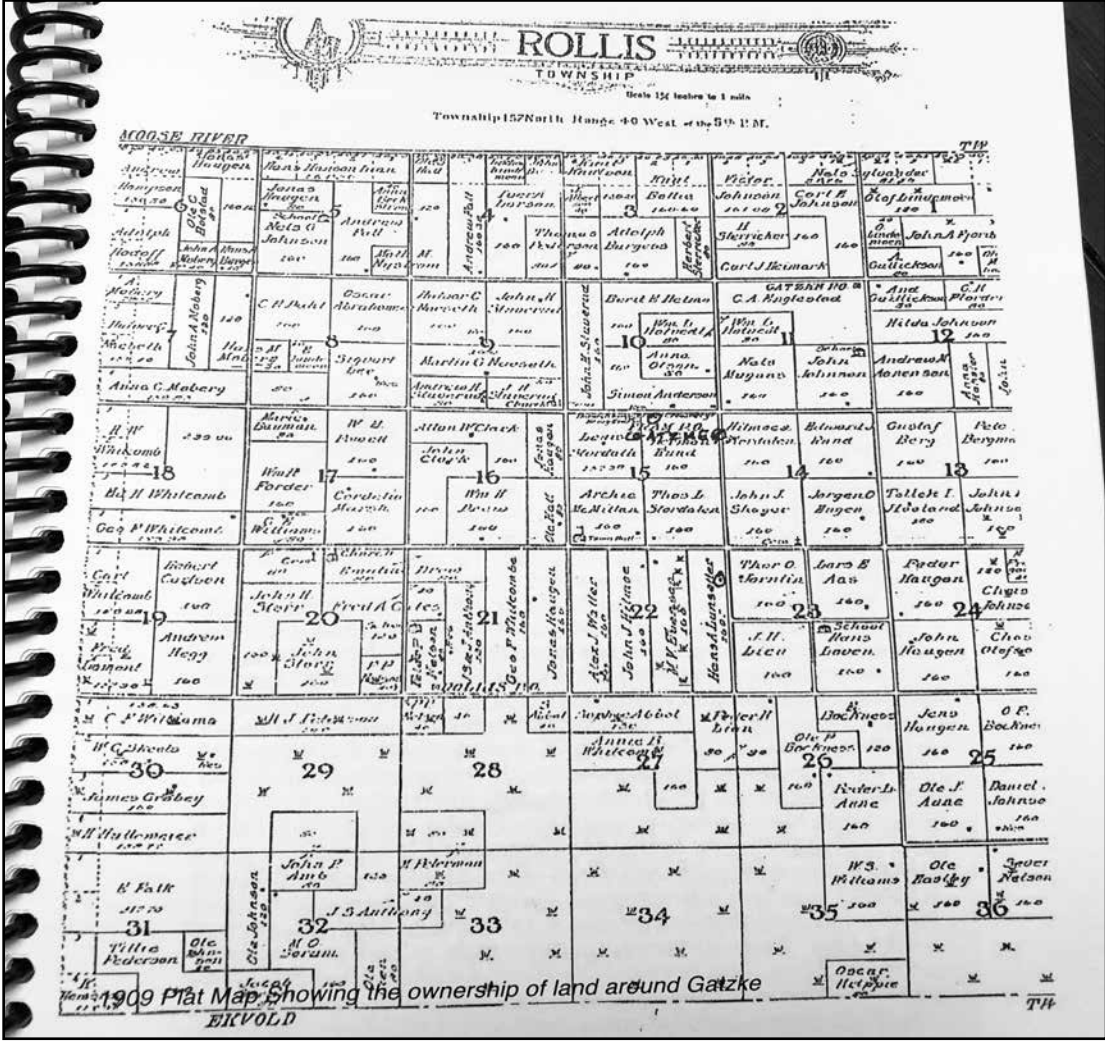
Pictured above: The Lunsetter Farm in 2011.



This is the oldest building on the Lunsetter Farm. The bottom part, where the logs go crossways is the original shelter for two horses built in 1897 when they arrived in Gatzke. This horse shelter plus a small cabin and a well were all built in about a month, in time to move family in on Christmas Eve. The horse shelter was later converted to a granary.

Settling Rollis Township

-Mrs. Esther Nelson (written as a tribute to her father H.A. Lunsetter in 1951)

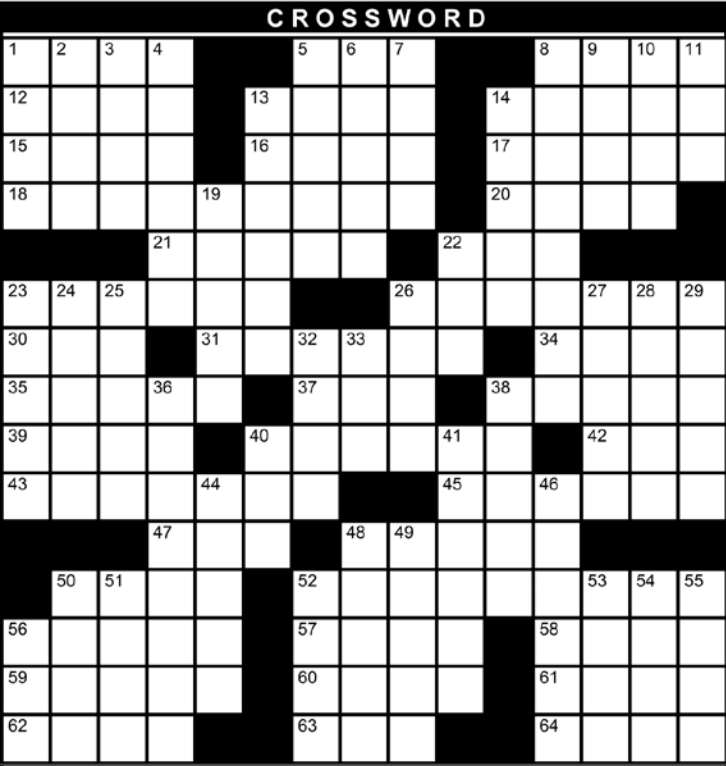
With the passing of years, time has taken its toll among the early settlers in our state, until now there remain only a few who can truly reminisce and say, "I remember the winter of 1897 when we first came to Eastern Marshall County in a covered wagon."

In 1894, the Red Lake Reservation had been opened for settlers and during the winter and spring of 1896 Ole and Louis Stordahl and their sister Martine filed on their land. They were the first ones to file right around what is now known as the Gatzke territory. They have all since died but others still tell how Louis, who was always a great sportsman, used to tell about running down deer on his skis that winter as the snow was so deep that the deer were not able to travel fast. A cousin, Knud Hegne, came with them and filed on the land where Theodore Johnson now lives. Louis was a progressive farmer at Gatzke and at one time was known as the King of Alfalfa for his interest in developing diversified farming and new crops.

In October 1897, another group of adventurers set out from Brookings, SD, where they had all experienced the rigors of South Dakota winters with little fuel to provide warmth for their humble homes. The group included Mr. and Mrs. Hans Albert Lunsetter and children Melvin, Alma and Norman; Thorwald Jorlin, wife and children, Willean, Mable and Clarence; Olaf Ruud and his wife and three children; John Shager, wife and one son, Julius; Johannes Ruud with a family of three boys, Edward, Herman and Otinuu; also Gust Svenson and two other young men.

The caravan arrived at Thief River Falls November 2, 1897. There it was decided that the women and children should remain to receive badly needed medical care and give the men an opportunity to erect some meager shelter against the oncoming rigors of winter. The men proceeded to Gatzke, where each had filed on a quarter section of land the summer before. First a shelter must be provided for the cows and horses, a well must be dug by hand using spades, and finally a small log house plastered with clay was erected. On Christmas Eve, Mrs. Lunsetter and Mrs. Jorlin with their children arrived at their new home. How often on Christmas Eve years later as we were gathered about more beautiful boards did we hear of that first Christmas in Gatzke. The meal consisted of pancakes and strawberry sauce. In January, Mrs. Shager and Mrs. Oluf Ruud with children were able to join their families and establish their homes. The Ruud family had increased by the addition of a little daughter.
