Makin' Connections

It's a hot, muggy Monday afternoon. Earlier in the day a violent T-Storm ran through the area, knocking down trees and temporarily flooded the streets. But this being northern Minnesota and all, it cleared up within the hour and the heat was on!

About 30 ATV rigs converged on an area in Beltrami that has been a topic of much debate and a ton of work to open up to riders. It was a major accomplishment for the two local ATV Clubs. The result of the countless, thankless hours of negotiations, YEARS in fact, is that we have ourselves a Pilot Program.

It's called the Moose River Dike Road Pilot Project. Let me explain the reason this is so exciting and the profound effect this is going to have on our sport.

The Fourtown/Grygla Sportsman's Club combined with the Roseau/Lake of the Woods Sportsman Club becomes the Northstar Trail Alliance. From here on out I will refer to the joined clubs as the

NTA. By becoming one voice, we are a force that cannot be ignored.

The DNR has agreed to open the dike to riders on a two year pilot program. They will own it and maintain it. This will not be one of our trails. What's special about this dike opening is that it literally joins up the one Club to the other Club and all the respective trails therein! This is HUGE. Up to now we had to take many miles of forest roads, shared with loggers, trucks and cars. The dust was inhibitive and dangerous. Now our trail system has exploded and the options are endless!

The beauty alone is a real treat and I expect all you riders to check it out as soon as possible.

A small celebration was held to commemorate this historic event on Monday, July 15th. A few words were shared by Jack Nelson who was instrumental in getting us to this point. He blamed his pigheadedness for not giving up or giving in. It's solid leadership like this that inspires the rest of us. (Nelson is the President of the Fourtown/Grygla Sportsman's Club.)

Our Representative Dan Fa-

bian was proud to be on hand to give us a round of applause to congratulate the joint efforts to expand our trail system. He works tirelessly on our behalf at his post. He is hands on and is on board with us every step of the way. No matter what your party affiliation is, always vote this guy back in. He's genuine and energetic and we appreciate everything he does for us and our sport!

Tony Moe let us know what this Pilot Project means. We have two years to prove that opening this dike up to ATV's means there will be no negative environmental impact. There will be no tearing it up. There will be no ditching unless bone dry. There will be no garbage left behind. Signs will be placed at the main arteries leading up to the gates of the dikes to indicate whether they are closed or open because they will be closed if it's too wet. This responsibility falls onto each and every user. And you want to know why we want you to be especially grateful for this opportunity? Because there is MORE.

This is only phase one of what we are coining as the Northstar Interstate. Through

this artery we will be connected to Williams, MN. You want to talk about a superior trail system, we have it right here, folks. Work is in progress to connect all the trails for many, many miles of comprehensive, safe riding. We are setting up the future of the ATV sport like you have never seen before. The economic impact to our rural area will be huge.

This is what your local ATV Clubs do so join one today. Numbers speak volumes. Your membership and your votes is what drives these kinds of changes. You do not have to go to the meetings, unless I put out an "all hands on deck" call to you. But when the powers that be look at our numbers, they take into account how many people we have on our rolls. The power is in the numbers, folks.

And BUY the TICKETS! Go to the Fun Runs! These funds are imperative to the improvements that you see on the trails!

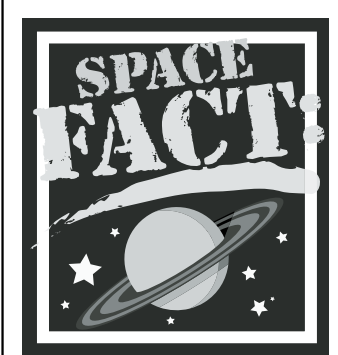

An Early History of Gatzke, Minn.

Note: Over the course of the next few weeks, and as room allows, we are going to be sharing things out of the book titled "An Early History of Gatzke, Minnesota: Second Edition - As told by Walter Lunsetter."

Let's dive into Week 3...

The Engelstad Store

First owned by Christ Engelstad, the store was located 1.5 miles east and 1 mile north of where Gatzke is now. Christ's wife Emma's brother, Carl Johnson, had a post office just north of there that he named Gatzke. Carl Johnson's wife's maiden name was Rose Gatzke, so that's where Gatzke got its name. (Carl Johnson was originally a Bolлие, but changed his name to Johnson.)

Pernilla Bolлие (Emma Engelstad's and Carl Johnson's mother) had a little log house northwest of the Engelstad Store and lived there for several years. Later, Carl Johnson, the Kings, and Nils Mugaas each lived there for a while. That log house is now in Pelan Park, by Greenbush.

Christ Engelstad moved the store to Gatzke's current location around 1908, because of the creamery being built there. By then, he had taken over the post office from Carl Johnson too, so that the new location kept the old name and became known as Gatzke. Christ and his wife Emma (Bolлие) lived above the store and later added on to it for more living space. There was a hitching rail along the east side of the store and another on the east side of the driveway going along towards Engelstad's barn.

The store sold everything anyone needed: groceries, bins of sugar and flour that had to be weighed up and tied with paper and string, vinegar in a 50 gallon barrel with a spigot on it, yard goods, tables full of overalls, oilcloth on rolls for tablecloths, shoes of all kinds, guns and all kinds of ammunition, nails, bolts, and collars, harnesses and sweat pads for horses. There were probably a dozen different brands of pipe tobacco that they carried at the store, as well as chewing tobacco and snuff. I remember a couple brands of tobacco came in long bars of a foot or more and they had a tobacco cutter that would cut the length of tobacco plug that you wanted.

You could always go to Engelstad's house door if the store was closed and they would open the store so you could get what you needed, even on Sundays. Usually the store would be open until 9pm or later in the evening; lots of people would go up to the store to sit and visit in the evenings.

Sometimes people didn't have money and they traded goods for goods from the store. Nearly everybody had a few chickens and often had eggs to bring to the store to be traded for groceries.

Engelstad would also take whole or half hogs in trade to re-sell to the customers. One time my dad needed a set of harnesses for a young pair of colts so he brought in a butchered pig. The pig brought 35.00 to help pay on the harnesses, which cost 55.00.

The Engelstad store also sold repair parts for mowers and grain binders, binder twine, cylinder oil for motors and machine oil for oiling the bearings on mowers, binders, threshing machines and other equipment. They even sold coffins! The coffins were stored in the Engelstad granary, not in the store.

In those days, if there was a death in the family, the body was always kept at home until the day of the funeral. Then there would be a service in the house. The coffin would then be brought to the church for the final service. I remember that sometimes Engelstads would haul the coffin in their truck from the house to the church.

Clifford Engelstad took over the store after his dad. He and his wife Agnes ran it for many years. Clifford built a house in Gatzke in 1922 or so, and he and Agnes lived there until he sold it to Arnold Engelstad. That house is still standing on the north side of the road.

Later, Glen Evans & his wife Anna Rose, Curtis Thompson, George Severts, Raymond Morrissey, Ingeborg Loven, Rick & Muriel Larson, Don & Laura Dahl, consecutively, became the store's owners.

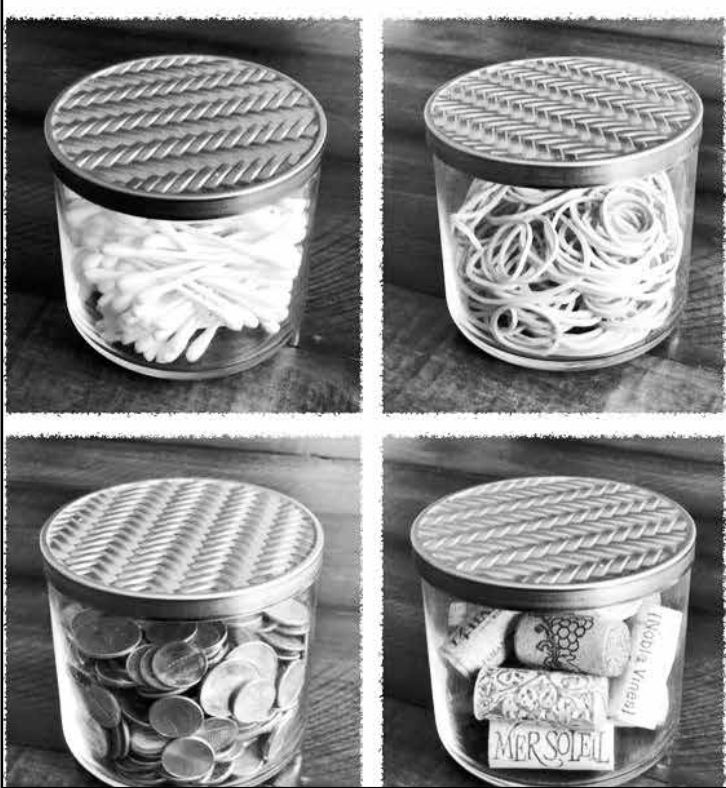

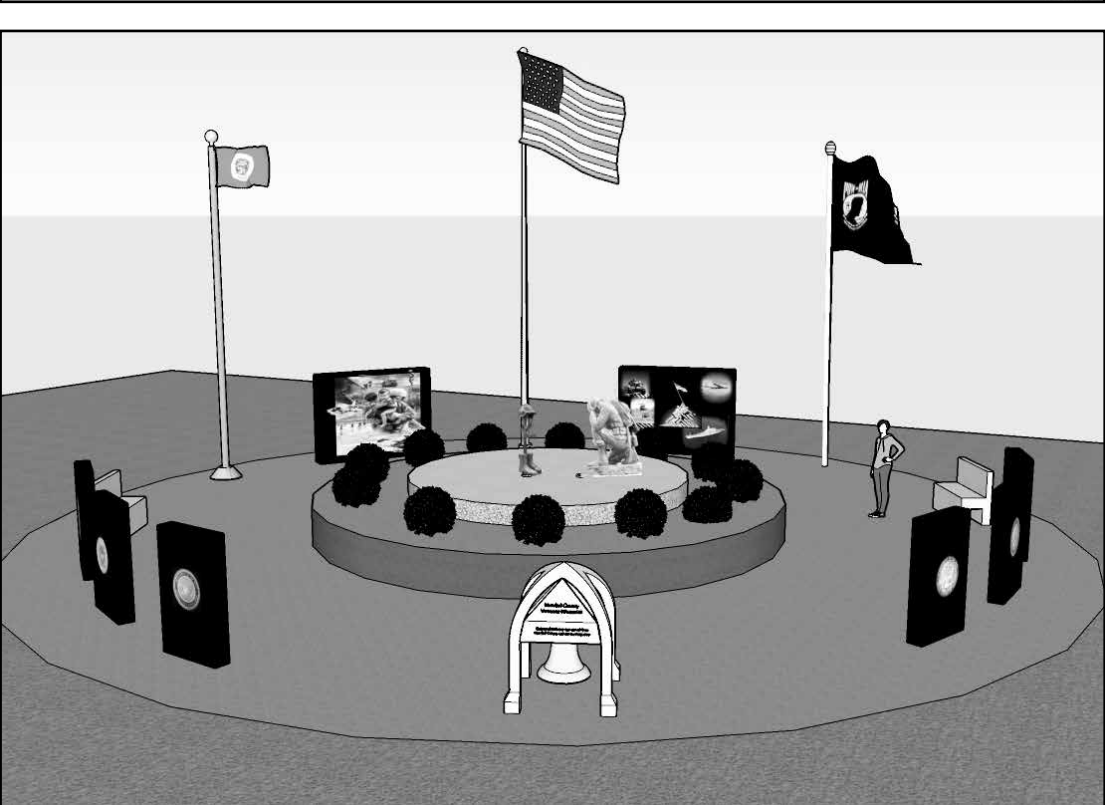
