attending by August 7th as the money needs to be sent in ahead of time. She can be reached at 294-6386.

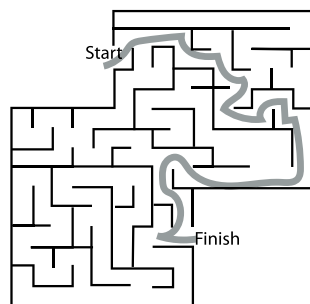
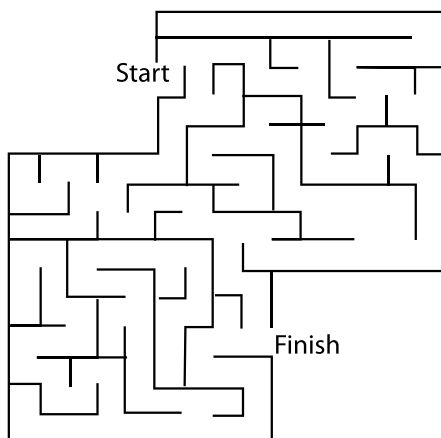

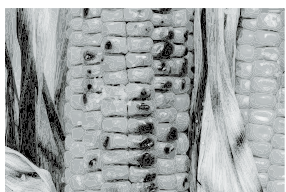

An Early History of Gatzke, Minn.

Note: Over the course of the next few weeks, and as room allows, we are going to be sharing things out of the book titled *“An Early History of Gatzke, Minnesota: Second Edition - As told by Walter Lunsetter.”*

Let’s dive into Week 4...

The A.P. Nelson Store was run by Richard Nelson, who was also the postmaster at one point. The post office was in the west part of the Nelson store, so Richard could take care of both the store and the post office. Richard’s sister, Ruth, helped clerk at the store. (Ruth later married Ralph Greslie from Middle River.) There was a board sidewalk between the store and where the current cafe building is. Richard and his wife lived upstairs in the store building until they moved across the street to the banker’s house when the bank closed. (There was a hitching rail east of this store.) After Richard Nelson left Gatzke, Arvid Carlson rented the Nelson’s store. Arvid also had a store in Middle River at the time. After Arvid Carlson, A.P. Nelson moved in from the farm and took over the store himself for a few years. Later, Art Stordahl ran the store for awhile. He brought in used furniture from Minneapolis and sold it at the store. Finally, Glen Bernstein

took over. He brought in used machinery from ND and sold it there.

Lawrence “Case” Gram and his wife lived upstairs of the Nelson store when it burned down - it was caught up in a grass fire. They then moved into what had been Albert Bolle’s barbershop, a very tiny building about ten feet by ten feet.

The Hartz Store was built by L.B. Hartz and run by Einar Loven and Melroy Aase. They ran it for a short time and then it was sold and moved to Grygla.

The first Post Office at Gatzke was up north, 1.5 miles east and 1 mile north, right across from the first store. Carl Johnson was the first postmaster. Later, Christ Engelstad had the post office in his store. After Christ, Richard Nelson had the post office in the northwest corner of this store. When Carl Olson moved to Gatzke, he took over as postmaster and he moved into the banker’s house where he had the post office. Ray Mulholland was the next postmaster, and unbeknown to the community, he was stealing money from the post office. He was arrested by federal officers and sent to jail in Leavenworth. When Ray was sent to prison, his assistant at the post

office, Louella Stordahl, took over as the next postmaster in a small building where the post office is now. Later postmasters were Polly Haraldson, Edwin Lund, Marville Morrissey and Petra Larson.

There was a Star Mail Route from Middle River. The route was let out for bids - during the Depression, the bids for the Star Route got so low that they went for almost nothing.

An excerpt from the Rollis Eastern Marshall County News, December 2, 1903:

“Mr. H.C. Naeseth has secured the Contract for carrying the mail from Gatzke to Breese, a distance of about 26 miles one day, and the return trip the following day. Mail will be delivered to 4 post offices along the way: Ware, Jonstad, Fram and Rollis.”

And on December 9, 1903:

“A blizzard has been raging every day since Naeseth started hauling mail, but he has to go regardless.”

The first mail carrier that I remember was Selmer Severts. (He and his sister Bertha lived in a little house in Gatzke owned by Nils Mugaas.) Minnik Ruud also had the mail route for many years. In the winter he used horses and a sleigh. He would keep a team in Middle River so he could drive 1 team

into town in the forenoon and drive another back to Gatzke in the afternoon. The mail would get to Gatzke late in the afternoon and it would go out on the route the next day.

There were 3 mail routes out of Gatzke. One route went to the Mud Lake area and one went east to Ilag. These two routes went 3 days a week. Amos Aase had the third, more local route, and that went every day. He had a long route and had to keep a team of horses with someone along the route so he could change teams part way.

People ordered a lot of things from mail order catalogues in the area then, too. Also, whenever a person needed a ride out of Middle River to Gatzke, they could always get a ride with the mailman.

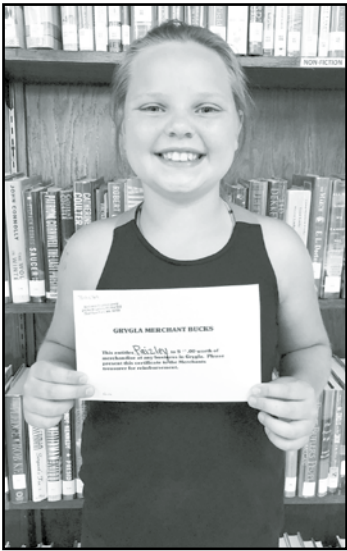
I believe that Axel Johnson had the mail route after Minnik Ruud, but by then he was able to use the car all year. Art Stordahl had the route for a few years. Adolf Tonder had it next, then Severt Engevik and then Mylan Abrahamson.
