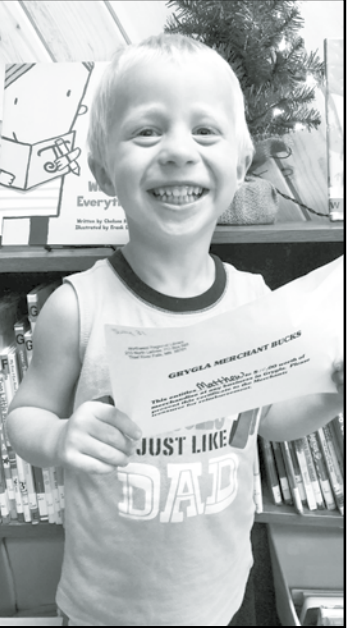

General Pesticide Notice for Parents or Guardians

Dear Parent or Guardian:

A Minnesota state law went into effect in year 2000 that requires schools to inform parents and guardians if they apply certain pesticides on school property.

Specifically, this law requires schools that apply these pesticides to maintain an estimated schedule of pesticide applications and to make the schedule available to parents and guardians for review or copying at each school office.

State law also requires that you be told that the long-term health effects on children from the application of such pesticides or the class of chemicals to which they belong may not be fully understood.

If you would like to be notified prior to pesticide applications made on days other than those specified in the estimated schedule please contact Superintendent Jamie Lunsetter at Grygla Public School.

2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR NOTIFICATION

As a result of recent federal legislation (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act - AHERA), each primary and secondary school in the nation is required to complete a stringent inspection for asbestos and to develop a plan of management for all asbestos-containing building materials. The Grygla Public School has a goal to be in full compliance with this law and is following the spirit, as well as, the letter of the law. As a matter of policy, the district shall continue to maintain a safe and healthful environment for our community's youth and employees.

In keeping with this legislation, all buildings (including portables and support buildings) owned or leased by the Grygla Public School were inspected by EPA accredited inspectors and samples were analyzed by an independent laboratory. Based on the inspection, the school prepared and the state approved a comprehensive management plan for handling the asbestos located within its buildings safely and responsibly.

Furthermore, the Grygla Public School has completed their 3-Year Re-inspection required by AHERA. Our district buildings, where asbestos-containing materials were found, are under repair, removal and Operations and Maintenance.

This past year Grygla Public School conducted the following with respect to its asbestos containing building materials:

*Implemented our Operations and Maintenance Program

Federal law requires a periodic walk-through (called "surveillance") every six months of each area containing asbestos. In addition, the law requires all buildings to be re-inspected three years after a management plan is in effect. MacNeil Environmental, Inc will accomplish this under contract.

Short-term workers (outside contractors - i.e., telephone repair workers, electricians and exterminators) must be provided information regarding the location of asbestos in which they may come into contact. All short-term workers shall contact the lead maintenance person before commencing work to be given this information.

The Grygla Public School has a list of the location(s), type(s) of asbestos containing materials found in that school building and a description and time-table for their proper management. A copy of the Asbestos Management Plan is available for review in the school office. Copies are available at 25 cents per page. Questions related to the plan should be directed to MacNeil Environmental, Inc., Burnsville, Minnesota, at 800/232-5209 or by contacting the Grygla Public School.

An Early History of Gatzke, Minn.

Note: Over the course of the next few weeks, and as room allows, we are going to be sharing things out of the book titled *"An Early History of Gatzke, Minnesota: Second Edition - As told by Walter Lunsetter."*

Let's dive into Week 6... Restaurants

After the bank closed, the building was used for a restaurant by Adolph Tonder, who had a cream station and a barbershop in the back. Olaf Newton was the first in town to have a cream station, to help gather the cream from neighboring farms for shipment to the creamery Adolf Tonder and his family lived upstairs until they bought the land on the corner right west of Gatzke.

Aksel Gormsen took over Tonder's restaurant next and sold lunches and ice cream. Bill and Tillie Bernstein also ran it for several years. Bernstein's son, Royden, was run over by a county truck outside the cafe when he was only a few years old; he survived.

After Ray Mulholland got out of prison, he came back to Gatzke and ran a restaurant for a while, too. He had two friends with him when he returned, but they broke into some boxcars in TRF and stole some cases of cigarettes and

were sent back to jail. Mulholland was running the restaurant when a fire started and it burned to the ground.

Skating Rink

There was a skating rink east of Ray Mulholland's restaurant for a while and all the young folks would go there and skate. Ray had music piped outside his restaurant for them to skate by. Engeviks, Aunes, Ruuds, Lunsetters, Ingvald Andersons and all the young people had a good time skating there.

Tavern

"The Spot" was a tavern started in the 1930's and was run by Matt Wick. It was located right west of the blacksmith shop. Vernon Williams ran it for a few years, too.

Veterans Home

In about 1925 or 1926, a fellow came up to Gatzke who said he was a doctor. He set up a home for shell-shocked veterans of World War I in the old Rollis store. He had several veterans who lived there and had two nurses who worked for him. He had a Model T Coupe and spent his time out chasing wolves while the nurses did all the work and took care of the patients.

The Young People's Hall

Sometime in the early 1900's

neighbors got together and decided to build a hall 2.5 miles southeast of Gatzke. They cut logs and had them sawed for lumber and donated all the labor for the building. They had a few books to loan out. Mostly it was used for dances; several wedding receptions were held there. Around 1940, the hall was moved into the town of Gatzke and stood near today's Senior Citizen Center until it came down recently.

The Senior Center

The Senior Center is now in the old schoolhouse that was moved into Gatzke. There's not much left of Gatzke these days, but those of us who are senior citizens continue to share our memories of these wonderful times at the Senior Center there.

Blacksmith Shops

Barney Peterson had the blacksmith shop south of the road in Gatzke. Later, his son Walter took over. Others who had the blacksmith shop were: Ratkovick, Allan Tonder and Henry Hammerback. The community bought a CCC building and moved it into Gatzke so Hammerback had more room to work. The CCC was the "Civilian Conservation Corps" which was begun by FDR during the depression to put young, un-

employed fellows to work. For example, after the North Dakota State Capitol burned to the ground in 1930, the CCC supplied much of the labor in building the present capitol in 1933. Therefore, it cost way less than it would have otherwise. The boys were paid, but not much, apparently. They may have been given food and lodging as part of their pay, however, as they were mostly young, single and unemployed, most of the pay was withheld and sent to their parents.

Garage

August Peterson's sons, Art and George Peterson, built the garage in Gatzke in 1922 or 1923. They did mechanic work and sold cars. In 1928-29, they really sold a lot of new cars - Whippets and Durants.

Melroy Aaase was the next garage owner, then Lawrence Gram and his brother Alfred, Bernsteins, Kings, Laverne Aune, Swede Olson, Albert Peterson, Carlyle Mugaas, Cheslie Ruud, Floyd Jesme, Donovan Ruud, Myron Olufson and Gene Engen.

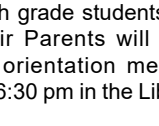

GENERAL INFORMATION

Telephone calls to the school for students should be made only when most necessary. Students will not be called to the telephone except in an emergency. A phone is available for student use in the main entrance doorway. A pay phone is also available in the gym lobby.

Our school day will consist of 7 periods per day and a 35 minute home room at the end of the day. School begins at 8:30 am and ends at 3:32 pm. A student must be present for 4 periods during the day to get credit for a ½ day, and present in all 7 periods for a full day.

This mailing contains: Lunch Information, Yearly Meal Plan & Menu, Bus Routes (if applicable), Kindergarten Information (if applicable) Asbestos Notification, General Pesticide Notice, Quality Air Release, Internet Use Agreement, Data Privacy, and other school info that may apply. Students in grades K-12 will receive an assignment book with a student handbook printed in it the 1st day of school. Please take the time to read this and familiarize yourself with it. Please note that there is a 2019-2020 calendar in the Student Handbook for your convenience. This will help you to plan dr./dental appt., trips/vacation planning, etc.

The handbook will be reviewed the first day of school.

In order to keep our gym floors in good condition students are encouraged to have a pair of tennis shoes to use when PE classes and recesses are held in the gyms.

SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION

Bus routes will be included in the family packets. For increased safety of our students, in-town stops are included for students who wish to ride the bus before and after school. In-town stops will be approximately between 8:00 - 8:15. Please have your children ready early, these times may vary.

These stops are at:

1. The corner by the Machinewell welding building.
3. The corner of Sixth Avenue and Park Drive by the trailer court.

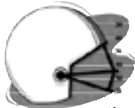
