Free produce given away this Thursday

This Thursday, August 22nd, any and all are invited to swing by Grygla’s Community Garden to pick up some free produce. North Country Food Bank’s truck usually arrives to town about 8:30am or so and will be bringing a bunch of produce to unload and give away to anyone interested. A canopy will be set up by the garden with members of the Grygla Garden Club giving away produce until it’s gone.

The produce will be coming from farmer’s all across Minnesota as part of North Country Food Bank’s Farm to Food Shelf program.

About the program
Farm to Food Shelf is a program to help farmers offset some of their losses on unde-

livered produce or produce that wouldn’t have been able to be sold at market. The farmers are paid per lb. on the produce they “donate” and the food banks get this produce to distribute to local communities and agencies within their service area. Every food bank in the state participates to some degree; nearly 2 million lbs. were distributed last year alone.

The produce will be your typical Minnesota-grown fruit and veggies and will include items like onions, potatoes, corn on the cob, cabbage, cucumbers and cantaloupe, to name a few.

Again, any and all are welcome to swing by the Community Garden this Thursday.

Sheriff Ernie Beitel of Beltrami County announced today the commencement of the Law Enforcement Scholarship Program for 2019. Sheriff Beitel proudly announced that the MSA Board of Directors has established a scholarship fund for the awarding of up to 15-\$600 scholarships for this year. These scholarships are due to the coordinated efforts of the 87 Sheriffs of the State of Minnesota.

The Members of MSA gives special recognition to the financial needs of students attending the peace officer skills course, or one of the two or four year law enforcement degree colleges. "The Board of Directors feel peace officers in our democratic society have complex duties to perform," said Sheriff Beitel. MSA recognizes the importance of pre-entry training for people considering law enforcement as their career choice. MSA recognizes some students need outside help in meeting the costs of such training, even though they excel academically.

The Scholarship Committee, in making its selection of awards, intends on achieving representation from all geographical areas of the state. Scholarship awards will be announced by December 28th of the same year. Application forms and a statement of procedures are available at the Beltrami County Sheriff's office. Scholarships are only available to students currently enrolled in one of the following three categories:

- 1. Mandated POST Skills Program
- 2. In their second year of a two year law enforcement program.
- 3. In their third or fourth year of a four year college criminal justice program.

In order to qualify, students must have completed at least one year of the two year program or two years of a four year program. Students meeting these criteria are invited to obtain a scholarship application form from their local sheriff's office or online at www.mnsheriffs.org

An Early History of Gatzke

Note: Over the course of the next few weeks, and as room allows, we are going to be sharing things out of the book titled "An Early History of Gatzke, Minnesota: Second Edition - As told by Walter Lunsetter."

Let's dive into Week 7...
Feed Grinding Station

Albert Bollie set up a feed grinding station for a while and would grind feed for the neighbors.

Barbershops

Albert Bollie also had a barbershop in the west part of Westin's Restaurant. Later he bought a house from Mrs. Saxvold on the east edge of town and set up a barbershop there. The house had been built by Mrs. Saxvold's first husband, Peder Ostby. When he died in 1917, she married Gust Saxvold.

Adolf Tonder started a barbershop, too, in the bank building. There was quite a bit of competition. Some charged five cents for a shave and ten cents for a haircut. Adolt Tonder charged twenty-five cents for a haircut for a while and the barbers in TRF got after him. Albert Bollie decided it was too much competition and he quit then.

Stockyard

Gatzke's stockyard was built in about 1920. It was made of planks six or more feet high, stood on end to make a

wall maybe 100 feet square. Farmers then had a place to put their cattle before they were sold. The farmers either chased or led the cattle from the farm to the yard in Gatzke. The farmers would bring their stock to the stockyard in Gatzke one day and the next day the cattle would be chased to the Middle River Stockyard and loaded onto the train to be shipped to St. Paul. The cattle lost a lot of weight between the farm and St. Paul. Alton Sparby told about his dad tying a cow to the back of a wagon (when Alton was about 7 or 8 years old) and Alton had to walk behind the cow to prod her along - a distance of about 6-7 miles from where they lived at the time.

Gust Lanz from Montana brought in a carload of horses and put them in the Gatzke stockyard one time. He would sometimes bring a load to Harold McMillin's, too, and neighbors would go there and buy them.

Newspapers

Rollis published a weekly newspaper called the Eastern Marshall County News. I have obtained several of these newspapers dated 1903 and 1904 from the Minnesota Historical Society in St. Paul.

Schools

For a while there was no school in Gatzke. There were

several schools scattered throughout the countryside, usually with two schools in each township. At the 82 North School, or Cloverleaf School, Jessie Leslie (Mrs. Walter Peterson) was the teacher in 1921. Celia Morrissey was next, then Eli Norbeck, then Celia again, then Helge Ose, Marville Morrissey, Margaret Gustaphson, Nels Engen, and Hilda Mosses-tad. Thora Skomedahl was the Superintendent of Schools for many years, followed by John Pearson.

A copy of one of Stella Lunsetter Greenli's old report cards from 1912-1913, provided by Helen Greenli Swenson, is very interesting. On the cover it has Hans Albert Lunsetter's signature as a proud papa reviewing the report. Helen says that another showed that she attended only three months and missed three months during the winter although she wasn't marked absent. "I'm guessing that was the winter when scarlet fever was rampant, so I'll bet they closed the school since so many were sick. I kind of think there may have also been a diphtheria epidemic."

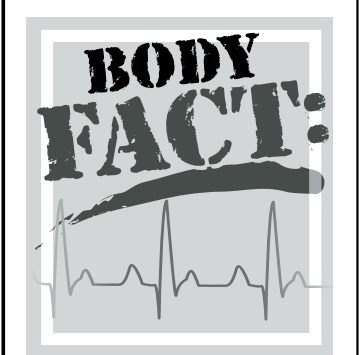

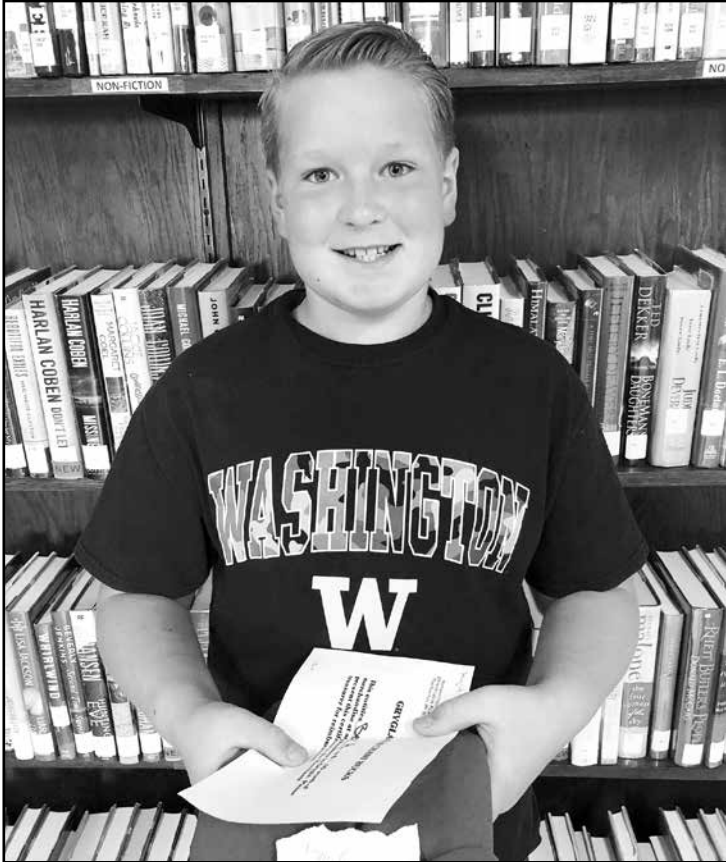
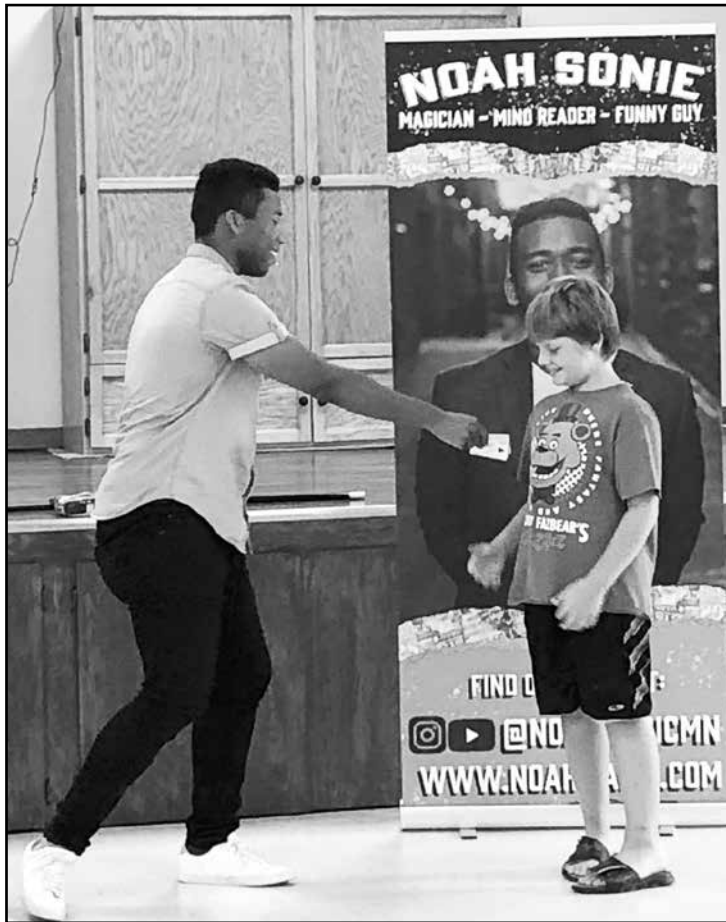
