Sorenson wins National Composition Award

David Sorenson has been awarded first place in Piano Solo for the Emil and Ruth Beyer Composition Contest, a national contest held by The National Federation of Music Clubs.

The composition, Scherzo, is early 20th Century Style with dissonant harmonies; but also blending in Romantic elements such as those found in Chopin's early Scherzos.

Receiving the call from the award committee was a surreal experience, David notes. This was his first major award received for his work, and having it be a National Award is helping to propel his career as a composer forward.

Did you miss Marshall County's Household Hazardous Waste Fall Collection? Marshall County accepts all of the items collected at the fall HHW collections, from May thru October, each Wednesday from 8am-4:30pm at the Marshall County Demolition Landfill. The Marshall County Demolition Landfill is located approximately 4 miles south of Argyle or 5 miles north of Warren on Highway 75. The landfill is located on the west side of the highway. All demolition debris can be disposed of on-site during these hours. Other items that are collected,

from households, at the facility are: appliances, televisions, computer monitors, fluorescent bulbs, batteries, ballasts, tires, oil paint, latex paint, solvents, acids, caustics, adhesives, and home & garden pesticides. The Marshall County Environmental Services Office can also accommodate accepting small loads of household hazardous waste on days other than Wednesdays at the Marshall County Courthouse if you call ahead to make arrangements. Next up, a few Junior High book suggestions to share with you. My daughter asked me to pick out some books I thought she'd like to read so I just got these 3 on order last week. I've found some pretty reliable websites I like to browse through and, so far, each pick has been a hit. Anna likes to know how many AR points each book is worth, along with a short description of each, so I thought I'd share it below since it was already typed up.

Don't hesitate to shoot me a text or email if you want me to get a couple of books on order for your kid(s)! As mentioned,

I have my resources to turn to that give great book suggestions for any age, boy or girl. Maybe some of these below would interest your kids. Again, these are all at a Junior High reading level.

Dairy Queen - 10 AR Points
A Wisconsin teenager has been picking up the slack around her family's dairy farm ever since her dad got hurt and her brothers left to play college football. She has to wake up at 5am to milk their 32 cows! A little on the husky side, DJ is also a major football fan. When she decides to join the team, there's some major drama with rival team's quarterback. This book is perfect for hardworking, athletic girls who love their families and their sports!

Beyond the Bright Sea - 9 AR Points
A 12-year old girl named Crow sets out on a journey to discover who her parents were and why they abandoned her

when she was a baby. She has lived her entire life on a tiny, isolated island in Massachusetts. She was put on a small boat when she was only hours old and set adrift by her parents. A man named Osh rescued and raised her. Crow has always been curious about the world around her. A mysterious fire appears across the water and the question of her own history forms in her heart. Soon, an unstoppable chain of events is triggered, leading Crow down a path of discovery and danger.

Do you know the Monkey Man? 7 AR Points

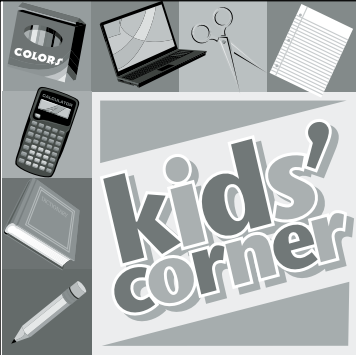

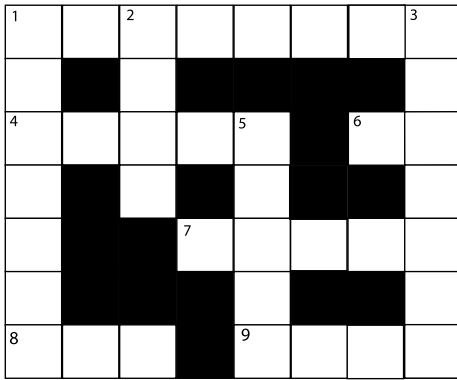

Apple S'more – Mini marshmallows, graham cracker crumbs, chocolate chips and caramel

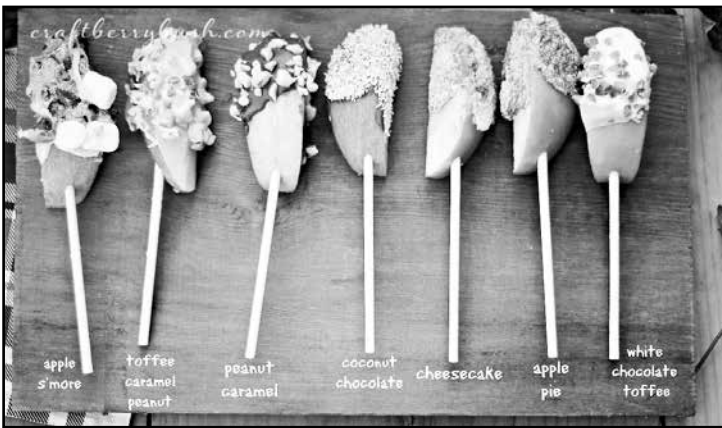
Toffee Caramel Peanut – White chocolate, chopped peanuts, Skor toffee bits and cara-
