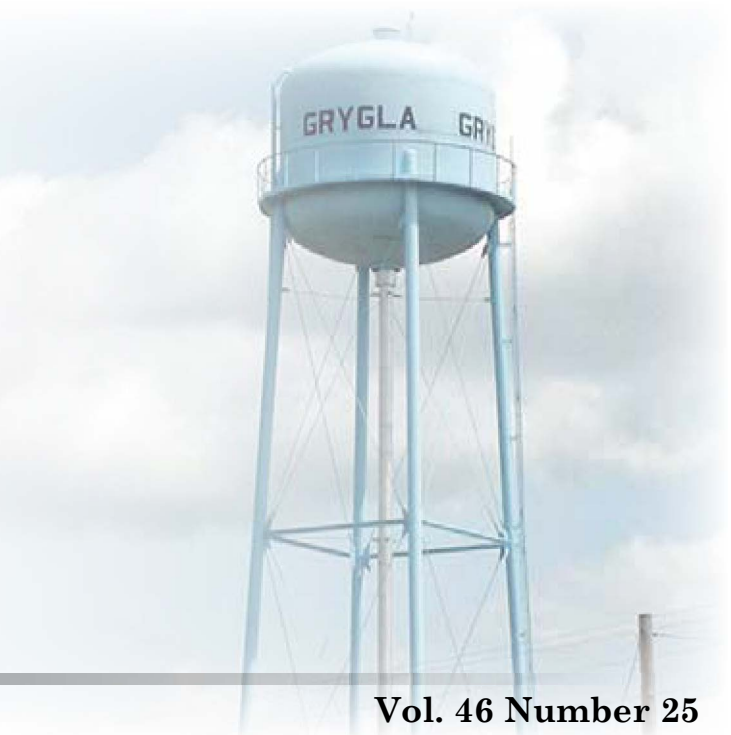

LSS Meals available to anyone this Friday



LSS Meals, a service of Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota, will be handing out meals this Friday, November 18th, at the Grygla Community Center from 11am-12:30pm. These meals are not limited to low-income or in-need individuals or families – they are for anyone to pick up, with each person being allowed to take 5 meals with them. All meals are already home-cooked and prepared.

How are meals produced and distributed?

LSS Meals will produce meals at one of their Minnesota kitchens and transport them with refrigerated trucks. Representatives will hand out meals using proper PPE (masks and gloves) and follow state social distancing guidelines. They have partnered with the City of Grygla; City Clerk, Rose Aune, will be at the Grygla Community Center this Friday helping distribute.

What is required from community partners?

LSS Meals, a service of Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota, is seeking community partners in the area to help them distribute nutritious meals to individuals and families. LSS will work with community partners to identify a pick-up date, time and location. They need access to a parking lot, open entrance spaces or an ideal high traffic area to ensure an efficient distribution of meals. Partners are asked to help get the word out about the meal distributions through communication channels. Tis' the season for counting birds



Agassiz National Wildlife Refuge staff invites you to participate in the Annual Christmas Bird Count (CBC) on Friday, December 18th. The National Audubon Society administers the Christmas Bird Count and this year marks the 121st year. This is the longest running citizen science bird project in the U.S.

Counts are held in designated areas throughout the U.S., Canada and Latin America every year between Dec. 14th and Jan.5th. Information from the count provides important information on winter ranges of birds, population trends, and how changing climate alters winter bird distribution.

The count area covers a 15-mile diameter circle that includes the cities of Newfolden and Viking, and areas in-between. Highlight species from last year's count include bald eagle, northern shrike, rough-legged hawk, numerous sharp-tailed grouse and wild turkeys.

Due to COVID-19, participants will count independently instead of going in groups like in the past. If you are interested in participating, a map of the count circle marked with an area for you to cover, along with a data sheet can be emailed, mailed or dropped off at a designated location for you. Not an avid birder? No worries. This is a perfect event for beginning bird watchers to "spread their wings", become actively involved in wildlife viewing, and help out with an important survey. Completion of the CBC can be tailored to your interests, with as much or as little of the survey being done from a vehicle or on foot. People who live within the Newfolden Count Circle can even participate by reporting bird sightings at feeders from the comfort of their own home.

Taking part in the Christmas Bird Count is a fun and meaningful way to spend a winter day. Hope you can join in.

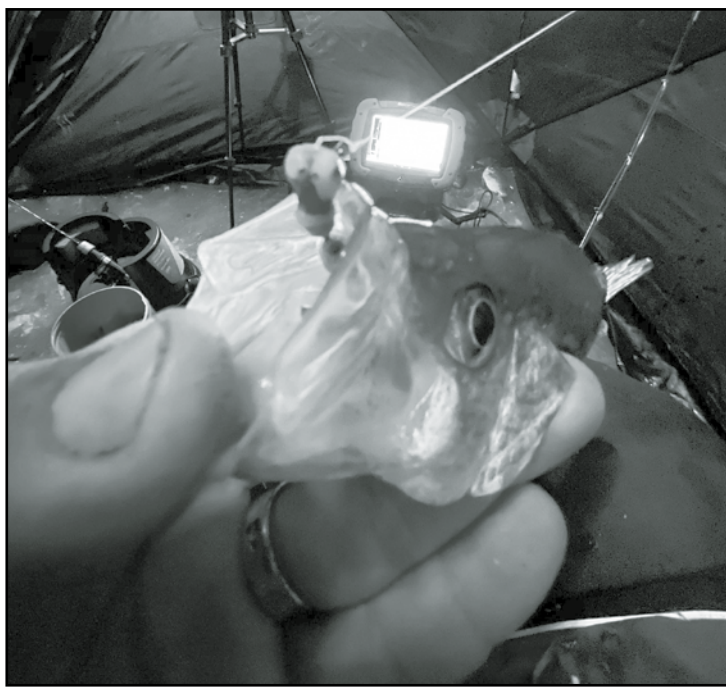

Winter is here to stay. With that, this week is going to put on some good ice.

This past week, I found myself taking my dad out crappie fishing on Union Lake. We arrived at Campground Bay at about 3pm and were fishing by 3:30pm. The first lure down, my dad had a bite and the action was hot and heavy. As soon as we got a waxy down, we had fish all over it. Mainly sunfish until dark and then a few crappie after that, but nothing as good as the sunfish bite. We wound up with 7 crappie and 4 sunfish. We ran out of waxies right as the crappie moved in. If you are looking for something a little different, head out to Campground Bay for some evening crappie.

Lake of the Woods has decent ice - about 6-8" out to about 20'. Morris Point started to let out wheelers on a marked trail. After this week there should be good ice at most resorts and ice

fishing will be in full swing out there. Fishing was decent out there in the 17' of water or so. Red Lake continues to be a zoo with lots of people. Fishing for the most part is good out there in that 11-12'. Talk to the resorts before heading out to either lake to see what they are allowing, and to see if there is a marked trail.

Muzzleloader has come and gone, truly marking the beginning of ice fishing and the holidays to come. If you are heading out fishing this week, good luck and stay safe.

Only in Minnesota: a weekly feature in the Eagle

The Minnesota Governor's Residence serves as the official home of the governor of the U.S. state of Minnesota. The house, located at 1006 Summit Avenue in Saint Paul, is on 1.5 acres (0.61 ha) of land. The building is slightly more than 16,000 square feet (1,500 m2) in size.

The house was designed by Minneapolis architect William Channing Whitney for Saint Paul lumber businessman Horace Hills Irvine and his family. The 20 room English Tudor house has nine bedrooms, eight bathrooms, and nine fireplaces. The Irvine family lived in the home from 1912 until 1965, when the Irvines' youngest daughters, Clotilde Irvine Moles and Olivia Irvine Dodge, donated it to the people of Minnesota to serve as the official residence of the First Family.

The Minnesota Legislature in 1965 passed a law accepting the donation and designating the house as the State Ceremonial Building for official public use for state ceremonial functions and as a governor's residence. The law placed the house and its management under the jurisdiction of the Minnesota Department of Administration. From 1965 until 1980, governors were permitted to propose changes to the house. The Legislature provided renovation funds and the Department of Administration supervised the improvements. From 1965 to 1967, a committee assisted with furnishing the house, but the governor retained the authority to make changes.

In 1974, the house was listed on the National Register of Historic Places. With this designation, any renovation to the exterior of the residence must be reviewed and approved by the State Historic Preservation Office of the Minnesota Historical Society. It is also a contributing property to the Historic Hill District.

Every year, a forester from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources selects a giant Christmas tree, harvested from one of Minnesota's 59 state forests, often from near Pine City, to adorn the front lawn during the holiday season.

Editor's note: Would you believe I've found nothing about the 2020 Christmas tree for outside of the Governor's Residence? I searched almost every website I could think of that normally has this information, including the DNR website, which always advertises it, and the official page of the Governor. It makes me wonder if they decided not to even put a tree outside this year due to all of the COVID-19 restrictions that are in place. Which would be weird, but stranger things have happened, I guess. I don't know.

So instead of sharing any 2020 tree info, let's go back to the 2019 stats. The tree was a balsam fir that came from General CC Andrews State Forest in Pine County. It was roughly 40 years old and 25 feet tall.

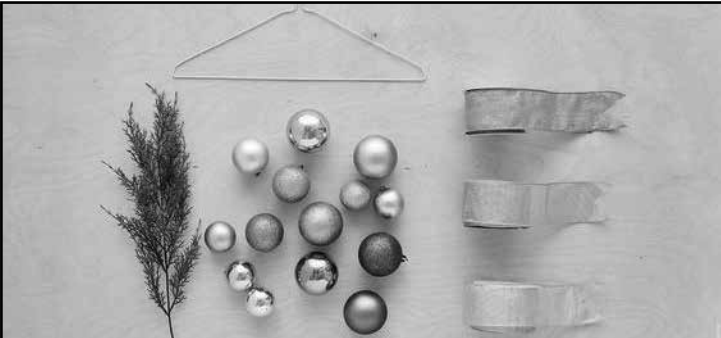
Half a million Christmas trees are harvested from private tree farms in Minnesota each holiday season, contributing about \$30 million to the state's economy. For each tree harvested, one to three trees are planted.

Real Christmas trees provide an environmentally friendly decorating option during the holidays because they store carbon during their lifespan and can be chipped for mulch when the season is over.

SIMPLY DELICIOUS

This recipe is straight up making me feel happy, and I'm willing to pass the happiness along. These are No-Bake Salted Caramel Coconut Macaroons and they'd look simply delicious on your Christmas cookie tray. The sweet coconut gets stirred into gooey caramel then everything gets dipped and drizzled in chocolate. That's a lot of happiness right there.

INGREDIENTS

5 tablespoons butter
2 tablespoons heavy cream
3 teaspoons brown sugar
11 ounce bag wrapped caramels, unwrapped
5-6 cups sweetened shredded coconut
4 ounces chocolate almond bark
1-2 teaspoons sea salt

DIRECTIONS

In a medium-sized heavy-bottomed saucepan melt butter, heavy cream, brown sugar, and caramels over medium heat. Keep stirring until smooth and sugar crystals are dissolved. (Can also use a double boiler to prevent scorching.)

Remove pot from heat source and stir in coconut until fully combined with caramel. If mixture seems too wet, add a bit more coconut.

Allow to cool for 10 minutes. Scoop 1-2 tablespoons of coconut mixture onto parchment paper and allow to cool and set up completely.

In a small bowl, melt chocolate bark. Dip bottoms of each macaroon and place on a sheet of wax paper or silicone baking mat. Drizzle remaining chocolate over tops of cookies. Sprinkle sea salt on top of cookies before chocolate dries.

Allow to cool completely and for chocolate to fully harden. Store airtight at room temperature. Do not refrigerate.
