Only in Minnesota: a weekly feature in the Eagle

The highest natural point in Minnesota is Eagle Mountain at 2,301 feet (701 m). It is in northern Cook County in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and Superior National Forest in the Misquah Hills, northwest of Grand Marais. It is a Minnesota State Historic Site.

Eagle Mountain is only about 15 miles from Minnesota's lowest elevation, Lake Superior, at 600 feet. It is part of the Canadian Shield. Confusingly, there is another, much shorter, peak also named Eagle Mountain in northern Minnesota. The shorter peak is part of the Lutsen Mountains ski resort.

The hike to the summit can be made in about two and a half hours. The distance to the peak is about 3.5 miles with an elevation gain of 550 feet. The trail is rocky and moderately strenuous. Whale Lake is about halfway along the trail and offers two campsites to hikers. The peak of the mountain is marked with a plaque. Permits are required because portions of this hike enter the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. Self-issued permits are available at any Superior National Forest ranger station or at the trailhead. Instructions and the permit can usually be found at the trailhead kiosk.

Among the highest natural points (highpoints) in each U.S. state, Eagle Mountain ranks 37th.



2.5 mile skating path through Warroad was a hit, now there's an effort to keep it

Neighbors who plowed a 2.5-mile ice path on the Warroad River in Warroad are seeking financial help to buy equipment to maintain the viral winter attraction this year and in the years to come.

Back in December, amid COVID school closures and canceled sports, three neighbors in Warroad plowed nearly a mile-long path along the river bend to connect their two river rinks. From there, the popularity of the path grew and they made it longer, totaling 2.5 miles to connect people along the river to nearby businesses. The path is lined with donated Christmas trees, there are multiple lights and fire pits set up along the way, as well as a concession stand and skate rental at "the start" of the path at Doc's Harbor Inn.

The path has brought the community together and has attracted the attention of statewide and national news organizations, including Good Morning America and CNBC. The neighbors, who call themselves the "Riverbender Crew," have been maintaining the path themselves using homemade equipment, as well as a Polaris-donated power broom and an anonymous donor's pump to flood the path.

And now they've teamed up with Warroad Community Partners to launch the Riverbend Skate Path Maintenance Fund via

Go Fund Me with the hope of raising enough money to buy equipment to maintain the path. According to a Go Fund Me spokesperson, supporters, including residents and businesses, have been rallying around this cause, donating nearly \$1,000 a day. This prompted Warroad Community Partners to start an online giving campaign.

While spring is near, the skate path is still open. Updates on conditions are posted daily on the Warroad Community Partners Facebook page.

An update provided via the Facebook page said:

"It was requested that we establish an online donation site for the Riverbend Skate Path Maintenance Fund, so here it is! We are working toward purchasing a couple machines with plow blades and another broom that are exclusively for use on maintaining the path. Currently the #riverbendercrew uses the Toolcat Machine with broom donated by Ironhide Equipment and 3-5 of their personal machines outfitted with one broom we purchased and another broom loaned to us by Polaris, Inc. Purchasing these additional machines would make maintaining the path much more manageable and avoid the considerable wear and tear to the crew's personal equipment.

SIMPLY DELICIOUS

Crockpot Sausage and Peppers

This is an easy slow cooker recipe with simple ingredients. I have sausage and peppers on my shopping list to enjoy it this week. The marinara seems like an interesting addition, but I'm not hating the idea of it. I'll give it a try. Serving suggestions say to scoop some of this on top of pasta or on a hoagie roll, but I think I'm just going to eat it as is and keep it lighter.

- Italian Sausage links (8-10)
- 1 green pepper
- 1 yellow pepper
- 1 red pepper
- 1 onion
- 2 cloves of garlic, minced
- 1 tsp (or more) of Italian seasoning
- 2 cups marinara sauce
- 1 tbsp parsley

Cut up your sausage links, peppers, onions. Add them to the crockpot with all the remaining ingredients except the parsley. Mix until combined. Cover and cook on high for 3 hours or low for 6 hours. Garnish with parsley.

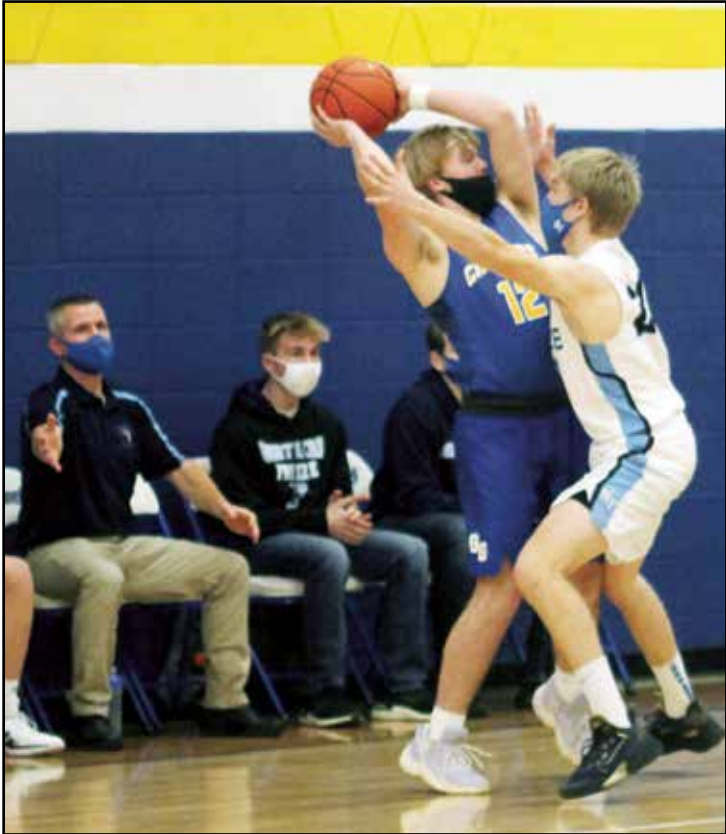

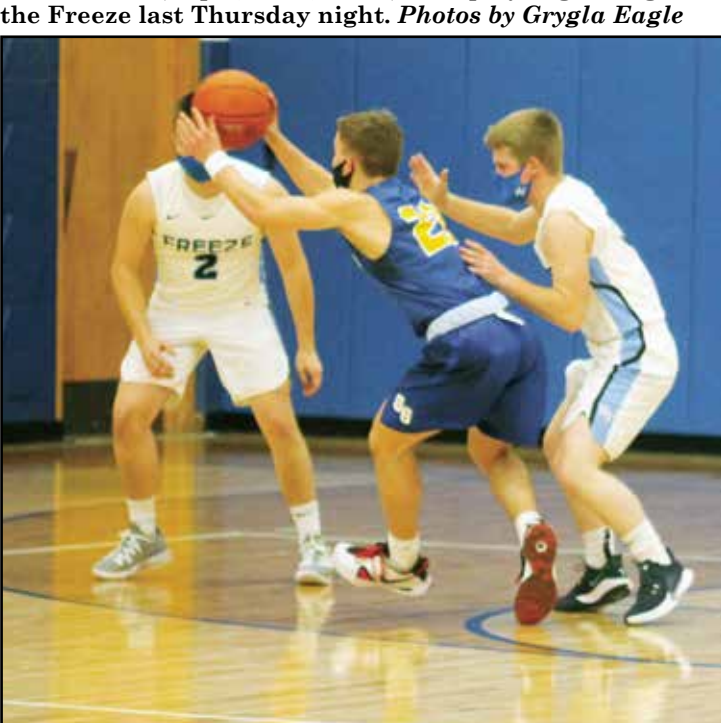
