For those unable to attend, the graduation ceremony will be streamed live on the Goodridge Facebook Page and Garden Valley Channel 38.

Instead of doing a receiving line, there will be a reverse parade at 3:30pm on Main Street in Goodridge. Please see the picture map for directions for the reverse parade. There will be a supervised card/gift drop off station for the graduates in front of the school during the reverse parade.

The Goodridge School will also be holding a #BeTheLight event for the Class of 2021 on Monday, May 17th, at 8:30pm on the Goodridge School Football Field. We will be turning on the Football Field Lights in honor of the Goodridge Class of 2021. We will also be taking Cap and Gown photos of the graduates this night, as well. The #BeTheLight event is open to the public. Only graduates and their family members will be allowed on the field, members of the public should park around the field.

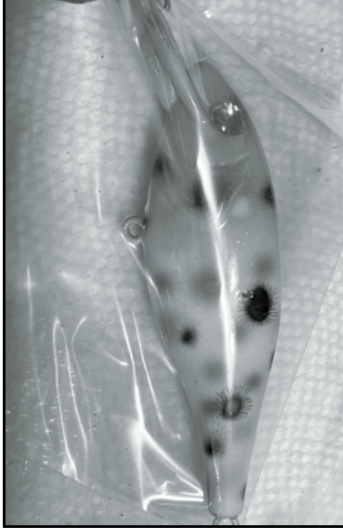
Northern Lights fishing report

On this week's report, we hit the Rainy in high hopes of catching a few sturgeon. My dad and I were joined by 4 of his brothers to try our hand at landing a few sturgeon for the 3 days we were there. The weather man said it was going to be nice the time we were there. Wednesday morning, my dad and I met his brothers at Borderview Lodge; they have nice cabins, by the way. Then we hit the river. Fishing was really slow and not a sturgeon was boated. My dad and uncles caught a few walleye and a couple suckers. Thursday morning, we woke up to a balmy 30 degrees. A brisk north wind made for a long day. We boated 3 sturgeon between the 2 boats. My dad caught his giant of an 18" sturgeon and my uncles in the other boat got a 32" and a 48". Then Friday morning arrived, and we again woke to 28 degrees, but no wind and we headed out to the bay. We boated 4 more sturgeon the biggest being 50". I never had a bite while we were there.

All in all, it was fun to get together. The fishing did pick up a little over the weekend from a few reports I have seen. I am switching tactics and chasing crappie on Wednesday and Thursday.

The weather is starting to look better for more hunting and asparagus soon after. In the coming days I will be placing a suggestion box up at the store by my tackle if you have anything you would like to see or for me to make differently.

Grygla After Prom Party

Only in Minnesota: a weekly feature in the Eagle

Mickey’s Diner is a classic diner in downtown Saint Paul, Minnesota. It has been in continuous operation at the same location since 1939. Designed to resemble a railroad dining car, the prefabricated building was constructed in 1937 by the Jerry O’Mahony Diner Company of Elizabeth, New Jersey, then shipped to Saint Paul by rail.

Its unusual architecture made it a local landmark. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1983. It was also nominated for being “a beloved, longstanding and unique social institution,” an unaltered example of railroad car-style diners, and one of the few surviving examples of its type in the American Midwest.

50 feet long and 10 feet wide, Mickey’s has distinctive red and yellow porcelain-enameled steel panels and Art Deco-style lettering on the exterior. A row of 10 train-style windows graces the front. The interior features floor-mounted round stools along a well-worn counter.

Mickey Crimmons and Bert Mattson opened Mickey’s Diner in 1939. Such diners had gained popularity early in the 20th century as inexpensive, often all-night, eateries. Mickey’s Diner has been operating as a family-owned business since the year it opened.

Besides its architecture, Mickey’s is known for its all-day (and all-night) breakfast menu. The menu features such staples as eggs,

pancakes, and hash browns. It also includes Mickey’s homemade mulligan stew, hamburgers, and ice cream floats, milkshakes, and malts. The diner’s website includes Mickey’s schedule (“Open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year”) and its “House Rules” (“No smoking, no checks, no take out”)

Mickey’s is famous beyond Minnesota. It was named one of America’s Top Ten Diners in Gourmet magazine. It also has been featured on travel and food television series like Unwrapped, Roker on the Road, Rachael Ray’s Tasty Travels, Feasting on Asphalt, and Man v. Food. The unusual diner has been showcased in magazines such as Smithsonian, National Geographic, and Sports Illustrated.[2]

The diner also has appeared in movies that include The Mighty Ducks series of the 1990s and Jingle All the Way (1996). The opening and closing scenes of the 2006 Robert Altman film A Prairie Home Companion were shot at Mickey’s.

The diner is also featured on the front and back cover of the 1985 self-titled debut album of R&B singer Alexander O’Neal, and appears in his 1985 music video for the song “Innocent”. The diner also appears in the 1991 Pet Shop Boys music video for the song “Where the Streets Have No Name (I Can’t Take My Eyes off You).”



Freeze Baseball drops opening two games

Freeze 0 Bearcats 24 (five innings):

The Freeze Baseball team would run into an obstacle before it even began its game schedule. According to Freeze Head Coach Shawn Donarski, the team had “basically” one day to prepare for its opening game versus the Kittson County Central Bearcats after the team had to shut down for a week due to a COVID-confirmed case associated with the team.

“For the limited amount of prep that we had, I thought our boys played really hard and they didn’t give up,” Freeze Head Coach Shawn Donarski said.

The Freeze would fall 24-0

in its opening game to the Bearcats on the road in Kennedy on April 20.

Despite the outcome, Coach Donarski was happy to see his team back on the field.

“It was a great, great feeling to see them out there being able to actually play a game and see what kind of team we’re made of,” Coach Donarski said. “They did really well, considering the elements for the first game against KCC. It was really cold that day.”

The Freeze gave up nine runs in the first, nine in the second, and six in the third to fall by the final margin.

As a team, the Freeze gave up 13 Bearcats hits. Caleb Bray took the loss on the mound for the Freeze. Offensively, the Freeze finished with two hits.

Freeze 12 Rebels 15:

The Freeze scored five second-inning runs to jump out to an early 5-0 lead on the road versus the Red Lake County Rebels. After allowing two nine-run innings in its opening game, the Freeze would again be plagued by another big inning by its opponent.

The Rebels scored 14 runs in the second inning to put the Freeze in a 5-14 deficit. The team battled back, but eventually fell by a 12-15 final in Red Lake Falls on April 22.

After giving up those 14 runs, the Freeze scored one run in fourth, three in the fifth, and three in the sixth to close to within two, at 12-14. The Rebels responded with a run in the bottom of the sixth to provide for the final margin.

After picking up two hits in its opening game of the season, the Freeze racked up 11 hits versus the Rebels.

Jake Knutson took the loss on the mound for the Freeze. As a team, the Freeze gave up 21 Rebel hits.

Speaking of pitching, this is one area Coach Donarski looks for his team to improve on from these two games.

“The biggest thing is just working on the arm strength for the pitchers, seeing if we can get them to possibly go more than two innings,” Coach Donarski said. “Or hopefully they can work on their control a little bit and start pitching up-

wards (of) that 70 to 80 pitches per game, just continually building on that.”

Defensively, he said his team is playing “fairly decent.”

“Sometimes we kind of have a mental error here or there and tend to throw the ball where we don’t necessarily want it to go,” Coach Donarski said. “But other than that, (we need to) just continually ... improve—improve every day and improve every game. And, hopefully our bats will start producing a few more hits and producing runs on the board.”

Next Action: After hitting the road to play the Badger/Greenbush-Middle River Gators, the Freeze hosts the Fertile-Beltrami Falcons in its home opener on Thursday, April 29 in Karlstad. The team then hosts the Win-E-Mac Patriots on Friday, April 30 also in Karlstad. The following week, the Freeze heads to Ulen to play the Norman County East/Ulen-Hitterdal Titans on Monday, May 3.

SIMPLY DELICIOUS

Italian Chopped Salad

I haven’t made this salad yet, but it’s saved on my meal planning list to make with some kind of meat on the grill. I love summery salads and this one looks so good. It’s loaded with fresh goodness, plus salami, provolone, pepperoncini and olives. It’s light, yet hearty, so you could totally eat it on its own without a side dish.

- Ingredients
- 2 large heads romaine lettuce
 - 1/2 of a medium red onion, peeled and then sliced into very thin rings
 - 1/2 c. sliced pepperoncini rings
 - 1/2 c. sliced black olives
 - 1/2 lb. provolone, sliced and then cut into ribbons
 - 1/2 lb. salami, sliced and then cut into ribbons
 - 12 oz. cherry tomatoes, sliced in half
 - Salt & Pepper, optional
 - Italian Vinaigrette (ingredients below)
 - 4 medium cloves garlic, minced
 - ¼ cup extra virgin olive oil
 - ¼ c red wine vinegar
 - 2 T flemoj juice
 - 2 T dried oregano
 - 1 T Dijon mustard
 - 1 tsp sugar
 - Salt & Pepper, to taste
- Instructions for Salad

Cut your romaine up. (I like pieces that are manageable bite-wise so do thinner cuts. In a large bowl, gently fold together red onion, pepperoncini, black olives, provolone, and salami. Drizzle about 1/2 cup of the Italian Vinaigrette over these ingredients, and then gently fold again. Add prepared lettuce and tomatoes, gently folding to incorporate. Taste for seasoning and add salt, pepper and/or more of the vinaigrette, if desired. Serve

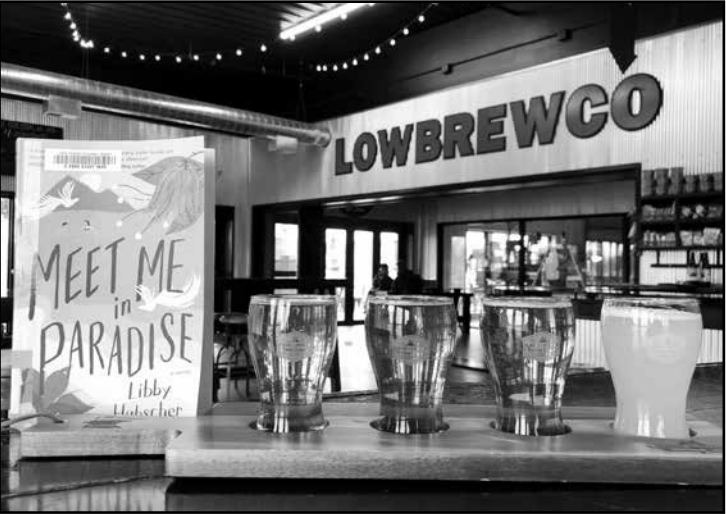
immediately.

Instructions for Italian Vinaigrette

Just combine the minced garlic, dried oregano, olive oil, red wine vinegar, freshly squeezed lemon juice, Dijon mustard, a little sugar, plus some salt and pepper. It’s recommended to use an immersion blender to thoroughly combine and emulsify, but if you don’t have one, just shake it all very vigorously in a tightly sealed jar or container.

Acresage Reporting Maps

Local Farm Service Agency (FSA) County Offices want to remind producers that FSA acresage reporting maps are available at their applicable FSA County Office. Maps can also be mailed to producers at their request.

To better serve producers, FSA asks that producers call in advance, if possible, the day before coming to get their maps so we can have them ready.

Maps can also be sent via e-mail if that is more convenient for producers. If producers want their maps sent via e-mail, they should call the FSA County Office to request their maps and provide their e-mail address or e-mail their FSA County Office to request their maps using the following FSA County Office e-mail addresses:

Pennington County: mnthief-friv-fsa@one.usda.gov
Marshall County: mnwarren-fsa@one.usda.gov

Once producers have finished planting, they should complete their maps, according to the letter provided with their maps.

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, it is not expected that producers will be allowed in the FSA County Office for acresage reporting so acresage reporting will have to be done remotely again this year. Therefore, it is very important that producer's maps are completed accurately by following the directions in the letter with their maps.

Producers with questions about acresage reporting and/or requesting their maps should contact the Marshall County FSA Office at 745-4251 ext. 2, the Pennington County FSA Office at 681-1612 ext. 2, or their local FSA County Office.
