Northern Lights fishing report

On this week's report, I went fishing on Maple and Balm Lake targeting panfish. Wednesday afternoon I took Maria after school and we hit the road to Maple Lake to chase crappie. We arrived and got the boat in the water and flooded the motor; we had to fish off the boat tied to the dock for about an hour. We caught a bunch of sunfish and kept about 6. Then fired up the boat and went over to Campground Bay. We caught a lot of sunfish and a few jumbo perch. No crappie, but as we were there, the water temp dropped 2.5 degrees.

Thursday, my dad and I took his boat to Balm Lake to do the same thing, chase crappie. All we caught was one bass and a small perch. Up in the shallows, I saw one small sunfish. The water temp there was only 49 degrees. So a little early for the panfish spawn yet.

This coming weekend I will be hitting the water - not sure where, yet. When we had the Rainy last week, the Warroad River looked like it was at about normal levels. So you should be able to get out of that access. The biggest thing is going to be if anymore sediment

got pushed up at the mouth of the river.

Good luck, everyone, on opener and if you need a new jig check out the store and give them a try.

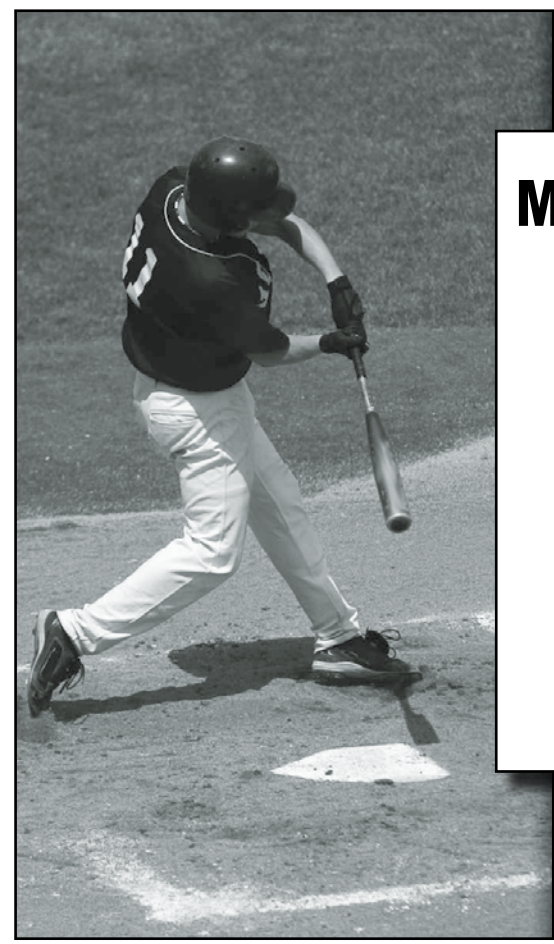

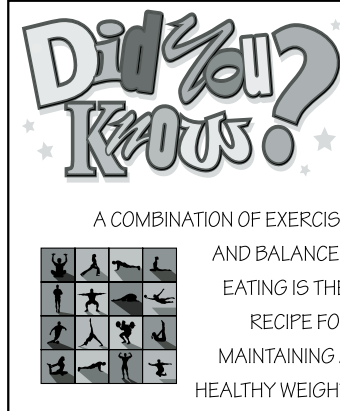

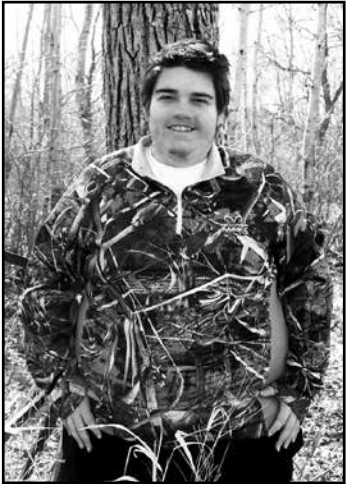

Freeze Baseball finishes week 0-3

Freeze 5, Gators 12

Trailing 6-1 going into the bottom of the third inning, the Freeze allowed the Badger/Greenbush-Middle River Gators to bat around in this inning, thanks to both some Gator hits and Freeze errors.

By inning's end, the Freeze was looking up at a 12-1 deficit. The Freeze scored four unanswered runs over the next four innings, but eventually fell by a 12-5 final on the road in Greenbush on April 27.

For the game, the Freeze committed six errors, leading to eight unearned runs for the Gators. Trailing 12-3 going into the bottom of the fifth, the Freeze pitching and defense did allow the Gators to load the bases with two outs— one run away from ending the game via ten-run rule. Instead, Freeze relief pitcher Dawson Walz forced a pop out to the catcher to extend the game.

Offensively, the Freeze scored one in the second, two in the fourth, and one in each the sixth and seventh innings. Caleb Bray finished two for four at the plate with two runs scored and Riley Duray finished two for five with an RBI to lead the Freeze offensively.

Parker Nelson picked up the pitching loss for the Freeze, surrendering 12 runs, four earned, on seven hits, seven walks, and two hit batters, and striking out three in three innings of work.

Freeze 3, Falcons 15 (nine innings)

Trailing the Fertile-Beltrami Falcons 3-0 going into the bottom of the sixth inning, the Freeze rallied back, scoring one in the sixth and two in the seventh to force extra innings.

After a scoreless eighth inning, the game would be broken open in the ninth. Behind a 12-run ninth inning, the Freeze fell to the Falcons 15-3 at home in Karlstad on April 29.

Coach Donarski appreciated the effort from his team, including from his starting pitcher Caleb Bray.

"They did a fantastic job battling the whole entire game," Coach Donarski said.

After pitching seven and two-thirds innings, Bray "fell victim," Coach Donarski said, to the pitch count limit. Before that, Bray had given up three runs, one earned, on seven hits and one hit batter, and struck out nine.

The Freeze then turned the ball over to relief pitcher Braxton Swenson. He recorded an out without a run scoring, but couldn't record an out in the ninth to earn the pitching loss for the Freeze.

Swenson and the next Freeze relief pitcher Cade Knutson, combined to give up the 12 runs, eight earned, on six hits and six walks.

Easton Olson and Logan Kostrzewski recorded the two Freeze hits in the game. The Freeze made eight errors in the field.

Freeze 6, Patriots 20

Trailing 8-2 going into the top of the third, the Freeze allowed the visiting Win-E-Mac Patriots to break the game open with eight runs in the third inning, pushing the Freeze deficit to 16-2. The Freeze could never fully recover.

After committing eight errors in its previous loss, the Freeze would limit the errors to three in this game, but gave up 15 walks and hit three other batters. It all added up to a 20-6 loss in five innings to the Patriots at home in Karlstad on April 30.
