American Legion Post 117 Color Guard will be presenting the colors for the National Anthem. All area veterans, law enforcement, and first responders/fire department volunteers are invited to attend the game and be recognized for their service. These heroes will be provided with free admission into the game as a thank you for their service. Prior to the brief ceremony, the Homecoming Court will be recognized on the field as well.

Grygla School sets public meeting for September 28

In order to answer specific questions from the community regarding the upcoming referendum and bond vote, the Grygla School has set a public meeting for Tuesday, September 28th at 7:00 in the big gym. This meeting will consist of two parts. First, a brief presentation will be given by Superintendent Lunsetter, the school’s engineering firm, Architectural Resources Incorporated and the school’s financial team from Ehler’s Financial. Superintendent Lunsetter will give a brief overview of what the process has been in making this decision. Architectural Resources will highlight the reasons why a new boiler system is necessary, as well as discussing our ten year facilities maintenance plan (LTFM). Finally, Ehler’s will discuss the funding mechanisms available to our schools, what the local taxpayers responsibilities are and how state aid works. Following the presentation, Ehler’s and Architectural Resources conduct “breakout” sessions, where they will be available to answer individual questions. The school board will also be available to answer any questions the public may have. In next week’s article, Superintendent Lunsetter will be discussing the funding that the school has received to fight COVID, and how that is different from an operating referendum and a bond issue. Grygla School looks forward to seeing everybody out on September 28th, and in the meantime, if you have any questions, don’t hesitate to contact your school board members, Jamie Lunsetter or Derek Gieseke. Northern Lights fishing report

On this week's report, goose season is about halfway in, and birds are still hard to come by. This past week I hunted Wednesday for the last day of early teal. It was ok; a lot of holes in the sky but ended with 6 teal and 1 goose.
Thursday I hunted a stock pond and with no wind. The geese did what they wanted to, and I wound up with 2 that ran off into the brush.
Saturday was our redemption day. We got our 10 geese, but in true fashion, it was not pretty with malfunctioning guns and ammo. One flock of 12 came right into the decoys. We both pulled up and not a shot was fired. Both of us had dirt in the safety's and then for most of the day I had a bolt action shot gun. But nonetheless we got our 10. On Sunday we hunted a field that had 2" grass at most to hide and we wound up with 10 geese again for 3 people. So, in all not a bad weekend. Next week I will be targeting geese in the week and switching to cranes next weekend. On the fishing side of things, the bite has been getting more consistent. South tip and whiskey flats have been producing decent fish. In the mornings shallower is better - 8'-15'. With the cooler mornings the blinker and most spots near the south side should start heating up. In the Long-point area they are still going out to LEMs reef and finding fish mainly in the flats off of it. The reefs and Twin islands are starting to pick up as well. Again, in the morning go shallow and then search deeper. On the east side 4 mile bay is producing some fish in the 10'-15' spots and then out past pine island as well in the gap.
This coming weekend grouse, sandhill crane, and deer archery all open on Saturday. Good luck this weekend and be safe. Looking further ahead to ice season - now is the time to get ahold of me if you would like a new ice rod or any custom jigs. I look to put ice jigs in the store around the beginning of November

Individual Artists apply by October 1 for \$5,000

Grant money is available from the Northwest Minnesota Arts Council. Grants are awarded to performing artists, visual artists, media artists, and creative writing artists from our seven county Minnesota service area including Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake and Roseau counties.
To be eligible you must be out of high school and at least 18 years of age. College tuition is not an eligible expense. This is the main category that individuals use to support their artistic business or advance their technical skills. This category is for non-hobby artists who make substantial yearly income from their art. Grants are awarded annually with \$1,500 going to four individuals and \$5,000

going to four individuals. Support for this program comes from The McKnight Foundation. The deadline is October 1 for \$5,000 level applicants and November 15th for \$1,500 level applicants.
You absolutely must reside in our region (for one year prior) and remain living in our region during your entire grant year (2022). In the case of college students, your school or your home mailing address must be in our region. You will have to show proof of residency, usually your driver's license.
Also available on a first come-first served basis are Quick Turn Around Grants for \$500. These grants can be used for artistic training, arts marketing, and equipment purchases related to creating a

body of artistic work, as well as recent loss of income from canceled gigs, due to the pandemic. Use the Quick Turn Around Grant application in the Individual Artist grants.

The grant application process is conveniently online and NWMAC's Executive Director Mara Hanel can help walk you through the process of using the grants portal. Caramel Apple
Cheesecake Bars

I stumbled upon this recipe on Pinterest and it stopped me in my tracks. THIS. This is the bar I’d choose on a tray of many, many kinds. Hands down. I haven’t made them yet but saved it to my Pinterest board so I can try them out sometime this fall. These creamy Caramel Apple Cheesecake Bars start with a shortbread crust, a thick cheesecake layer, and are topped with diced cinnamon apples and a sweet streusel topping. I don’t know what they taste like yet, but I’d bet big money they’re SIMPLY DELICIOUS.

- Crust:**
2 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
1 cup butter softened
- Cheesecake Filling:**
3 8 ounce packages cream cheese softened
3/4 cup sugar
3 large eggs
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- Apples:**
3 apples peeled, cored and finely chopped (about 3 cups)
2 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- Streusel Topping:**
1 cup firmly packed brown sugar
1 cup all-purpose flour
1/2 cup quick cooking oats
1/2 cup butter softened
- Drizzle:**
1/2 cup caramel topping for drizzling after baked

INSTRUCTIONS
Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. In a medium bowl, combine flour and brown sugar. Cut in butter with a pastry blender or food processor (or 2 forks) until mixture is crumbly. Press evenly into a 9×13 baking pan that is greased or lined with heavy-duty aluminum foil or parchment. Bake 15 minutes

or until lightly browned.

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese with 3/4 cup sugar in an electric mixer at medium speed until smooth. Then add eggs, 1 at a time, and vanilla. Stir to combine. Pour over warm crust.

In a small bowl, stir together chopped apples, 2 tablespoons sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Spoon evenly over cream cheese mixture.

For the streusel topping: In a small bowl, combine all ingredients. I like to really combine it by using my clean hands to thoroughly combine the butter into the mixture. You can’t use a food processor because it will grind up the oats. Sprinkle Streusel topping over apples. Bake 40-45 minutes, or until filling is set. Drizzle with caramel topping and let cool. Serve cold and enjoy.

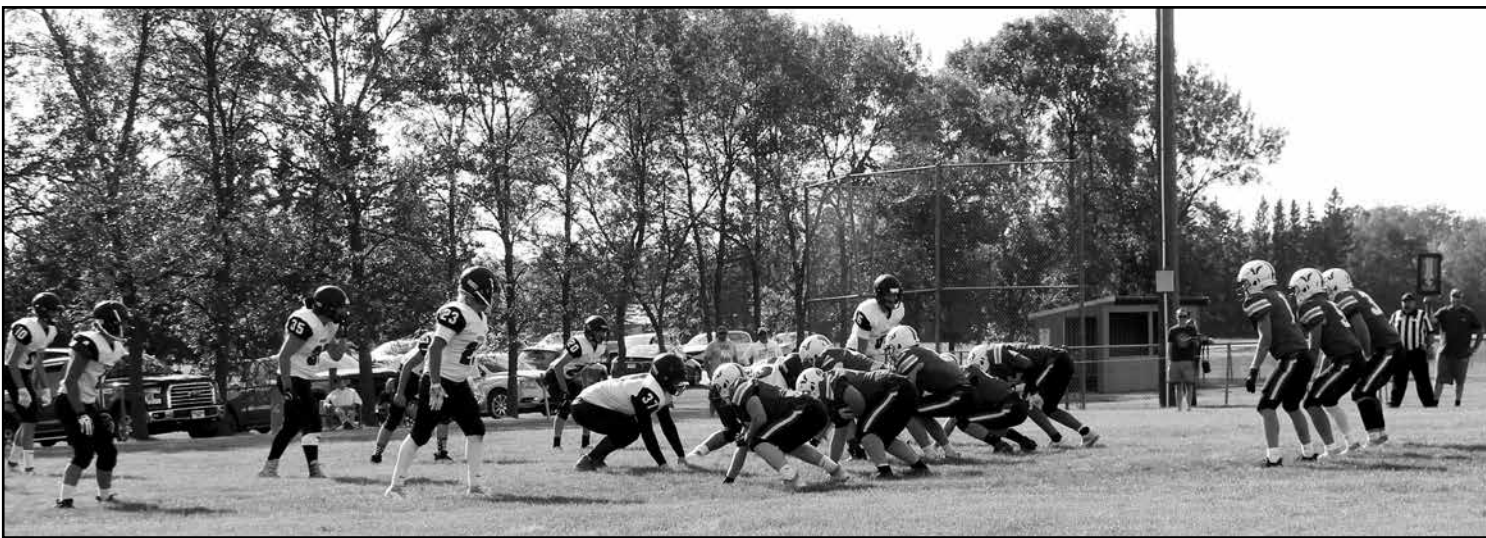

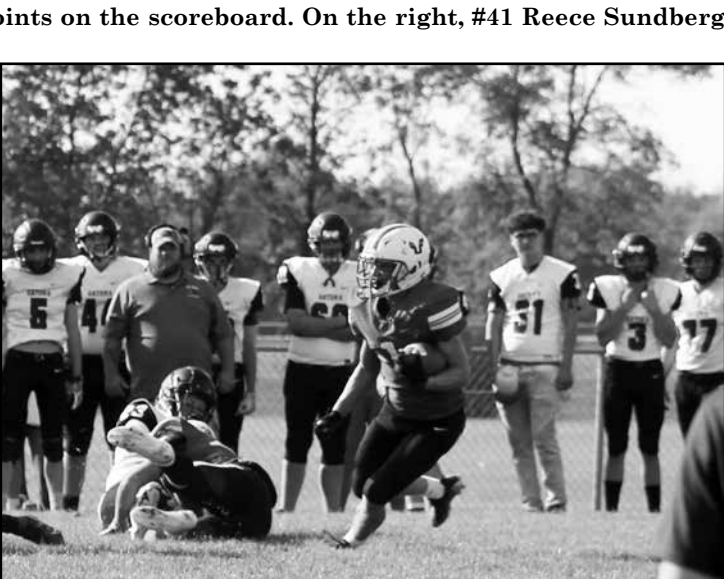

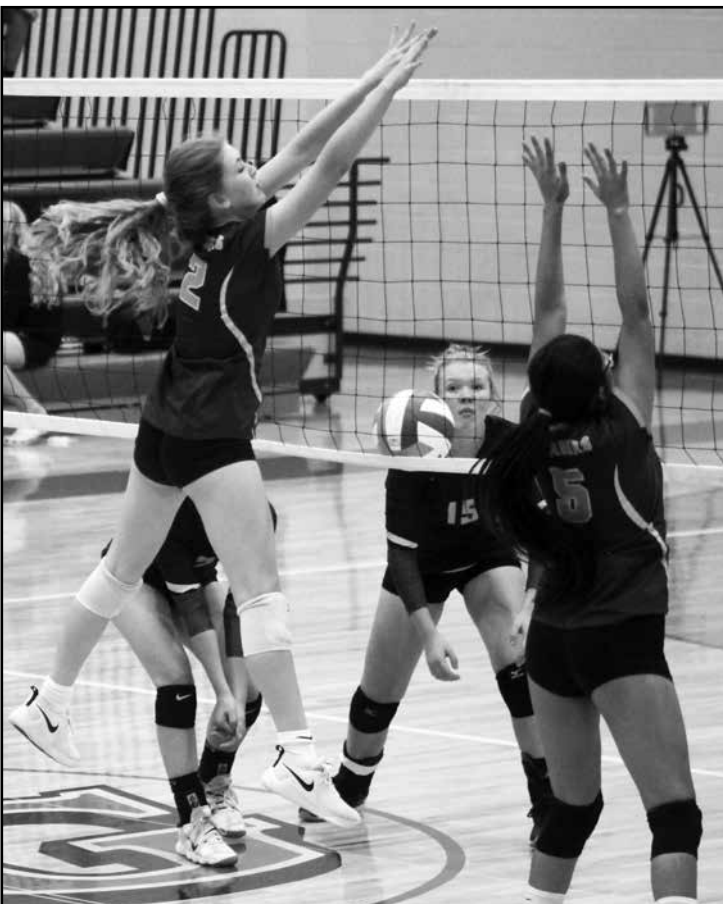
