Grygla football field dedicated as Darwin Hagen Field



Last week, before the Chargers took on the Northern Freeze Tuesday, October 26th, a short ceremony was held dedicating the Grygla Football Field officially as the Darwin

Hagen Field.

Coach Hagen, pictured far right next to his sign, served as Head Coach for the Grygla Eagles in 1976. He also became the Head Coach for the Blue

Devils in 1984. He retired from coaching after the 1997 season, but became an assistant again in 2007-2010.

Coach Hagen led the Blue Devils to 3 conference cham-

pionships, a state semi-final appearance in 1989, and a state runner-up finish in 1991. Coach Hagen also had a direct impact on all of his players, with several of them going into coaching because of the impact that he made on their lives.

Mike Gast says, "I learned so much from Darwin when we worked defense together. I also learned that preparation is so very important! He reinforced in me to work hard and be respectful of others. Darwin is a quiet, humble, and classy man. I learned a lot from him just by watching his actions. Congratulations to Darwin, it's well deserved!"

Darwin's family gathered with him as the field was officially dedicated. Coach Hagen appreciates the honor of the field dedication, thanking all the players, parents and coaches during his coaching career.

100-year remembrance: Marie Wick Memorial

Fall's crispness was in the air as a dozen people gathered around the grave of Marie Wick last Saturday at Valle Cemetery in rural Grygla.

2021 marks the 100-year anniversary of the murder of Marie Wick, an 18-year-old from Grygla, MN, who was murdered in a Fargo hotel in June of 1921.

The Grygla Eagle Newspaper ran a 4-part story in last week's paper titled "Murder in Room 30" which was a story and podcast done last June by Tracy Briggs with The Forum out of Fargo.

A memorial service was recently organized by Joni Anderson, of Grygla, MN, and Dale Neuschwander, of Saint Joseph, MN, formerly of Grygla. The two wanted to honor Marie and recognize her untimely death, sending a message of hope. Anderson shared, "After listening to the podcast, I became interested in this story and felt like something needed to be done to honor her memory. After talking about it with several friends on Facebook, I learned that she was related to people I know from my hometown."

Anderson organized a short memorial service that took place around Wick's grave last Saturday. Distant relatives and community members gathered to send a message of hope. Anderson commented, "It's worth noting that here we are, 100 years after Marie's brutal murder, and not much has changed – women continue to be beaten, injured and killed by sexual predators."

With October being Domestic Violence Awareness month, the memorial service had an open donation as a fundraiser to go towards the Violence Intervention Program in Thief River Falls, MN. When asked about the fundraiser, Anderson explained that she felt raising awareness and doing something to help women who are currently facing violence would honor Marie Wick. "It's a way of paying respect to her by making someone else's life better," she said. As mentioned, honoring Marie with a memo-

rial service to recognize her untimely death sends a message of hope. Anderson concluded, "It's my hope that women who are in difficult situations know that we support them and respect their rights and wish to help them."

As for Dale Neuschwander, who grew up in Grygla, he felt the 100-year anniversary of Marie's death couldn't pass without acknowledging her life back in her hometown. "Most of us did not know her story until we listened to the podcast. It was as fascinating as it was frightening," he described. Neuschwander also shared that growing up, his parents and grandparents never spoke of the gruesome event. "It was never brought up in front of us kids. But my grandmother, Palma (Windsnes) Neuschwander was born in 1900 and was a neighbor to the Wicks. My great-grandparents are buried just a few feet away from the Wicks at Valle Cemetery also. Grandma would have known Marie, who was only three years younger, and would have gone to school with her. I wish I would have known to ask her about Marie Wick when I was older," he noted.

Right across the road from Valle Cemetery, where Wick is buried, along with other members of her family, is the original homestead of the Wick family. Neuschwander said it best, "The Wicks have long since passed or moved away, but Marie is buried alongside her parents and one of her six siblings. Thus, Marie is forever a part of our community, and her story should never be forgotten. So many of our homesteaders and pioneers are now lost to the fog of time and memory, but thanks to the podcast, which is now in The Forum's Vault, a whole new generation has become acquainted with Marie Wick. I believe the lesson we have taken from her story is that although justice is not always served, victims of violence will be cared about and held respectfully in memory and prayer by their community for generations to come. Even in divisive times, there are ties that bind."

COVID-19 Clinic in Grygla

There will be a COVID-19 Booster Clinic at the Grygla Community Center on Wednesday, November 3rd, from 9-11am.

Federal health officials have now authorized Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 booster shots. Those that are eligible and received Moderna or Pfizer as their primary series can receive a booster dose 6 months after the completion of their primary series. Those that received Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) as their primary series are eligible for a booster 2 months after receiving their initial vaccine.

Who can get a booster?
 Anyone age 65+; people age 18+ with underlying health conditions; people age 18+ living in long-term care settings; people age 18+ working or living in high-risk settings such as healthcare, schools, correctional settings, etc.
 Check with your primary care physicians to see if you

qualify.
 All Minnesotans 18+ who got Johnson & Johnson as their primary series are recommended to get a booster shot at least 2 months after the initial series.

Officials have also authorized "mixing & matching" COVID-19 boosters, meaning anybody who is eligible to get a booster can get any of the three currently authorized or approved vaccines regardless of what product they received for their primary series.

North Valley Public Health will be offering primary doses, secondary doses, and boosters at the upcoming area clinics. To schedule an appointment, please contact 218-745-5154.

Ingredients for 2 people
1 spaghetti squash
2 chicken breasts
2 cups of broccoli florets
1 stick of butter
4 oz. cream cheese
1 cup heavy whipping cream
1 cup parmesan cheese, shredded

Italian seasoning, to taste (couple shakes)
Minced Garlic, to taste (maybe a tsp or so)
Bacon

Instructions
Don’t panic. That’s your first instruction. All of your ingredients are healthy-ish fats. You can eat them in moderation. Ok? Ok. Also, this is super low carb so feel good about THAT.

Next, cut your spaghetti squash in half the long way and clean out the seeds. Brush with olive oil and sprinkle with some salt and pepper. Bake that face down on a cookie sheet at 400 degrees for about 50 minutes. In the meantime, cut, cube and cook your chicken breasts. I also boiled my broccoli during this time and made my alfredo sauce AND fried my bacon. This will be a busy 50 minutes. HA! But so worth it.

To make the sauce: add the butter, cream cheese, heavy whipping cream, parmesan cheese, Italian seasoning and garlic to a pot. Melt all together over medium. Should create the perfect thickness.

After the 50 minutes is up, take the squash out and “rake” your noodles loose in each half. Add your chicken and broccoli to each “boat” and bake for about 10-15 more minutes.

Take out, then pour over your hot alfredo sauce and bacon to garnish and serve.

Call for student digital art for exhibit in TRF

The Northwest Minnesota Arts Council (NWMAC) is pleased to announce a call for student digital art for a student art exhibit at Northland Community and Technical College in Thief River Falls in January and February 2022. The medium for this exhibit is digital art and the theme is celebrations.

The deadline for submissions is Wednesday, December 22, 2021.

The pandemic has shown us the importance of celebrating special occasions with family and friends. We may see more value in observing rites of passage such as births, birthday parties, weddings, and even funerals. This digital art exhibit (in conjunction with regional potter Betsy Saurdiff) celebrates the idea that we can once again get together and celebrate!

Student digital art will be around the theme of celebrations, gatherings, and rituals. All work will be original digital artwork that will be submitted to fit an 8.5 x 11 frame. Frames will be provided.

Betsy’s pottery is created to help us commemorate life’s celebrations. A punch bowl is taken out of storage only when there is a celebration. We elevate the celebration by using a ladle to carefully serve the special drink out of the beautiful open vessel. This exhibit includes punch bowl sets made

of porcelain clay. Other items are plaques, crosses, angel wall hangings, mugs, personalized serving bowls, nesting bowls, serving platters and funerary urns. The pottery represents celebrations such as new births, baptisms, first communion and confirmation, graduation, weddings, anniversaries, traditional holidays and funerals. The creative process includes wheel-thrown, altered and hand-built porcelain with a variety of surface treatments. The purpose of each piece is to help celebrate life events.
