Anyway, this LOOKS good and I'm betting it TASTES even better. This would definitely earn a spot on my plate.

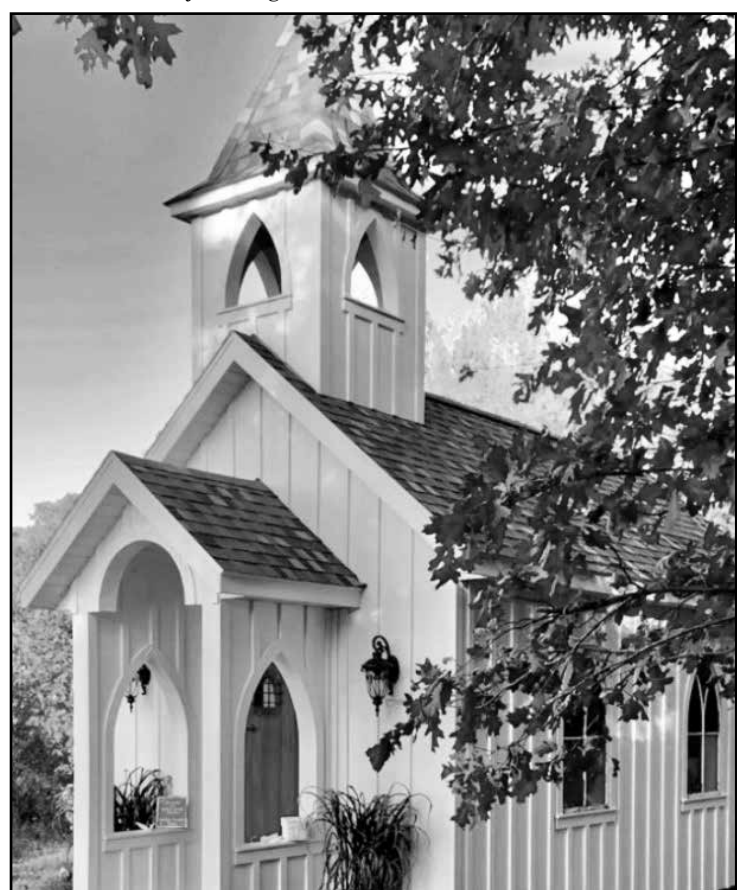
Instructions
Preheat oven to 400 F. Trim the asparagus ends. Wash. Pat dry with a paper towel. Place the asparagus on a baking sheet, drizzle with 2 tablespoons of olive oil, season with salt and pepper, mix everything well. Roast, uncovered, at 400 F for 10 minutes. Remove from the oven. Sprinkle the Mozzarella cheese all over asparagus, then add thinly sliced and chopped ham evenly over the asparagus, then top with the Parmesan cheese. Roast for 10 more minutes, uncovered at 400 F. If desired, you can broil for the last 5 minutes.

Note: It says thinly sliced and chopped ham. Definitely do that if you're using leftovers from a big ham that you've already made. For me, I'm going to just buy a package of diced ham at the store. Done. Simple and delish.

Thanksgiving is coming up and the main attraction to me isn't the turkey; it's all the side dishes. I'm not talking about the bowl of corn or the green bean casserole that seems to make an appearance every year, but I do think veggies are an essential part of the Thanksgiving Day spread. I just don't like the ones that are expected, ya know? I like fun, new foods and I'm just not finding a lot of joy in that bowl of corn.

What I **WOULD** find joy in when it comes to a side dish of veggies, is this ham and cheese asparagus...what a simple, different, and delicious-looking recipe perfect for the holidays. Take your asparagus and dress it up with some Mozzarella and Parmesan cheese, add your ham and then roast it all in

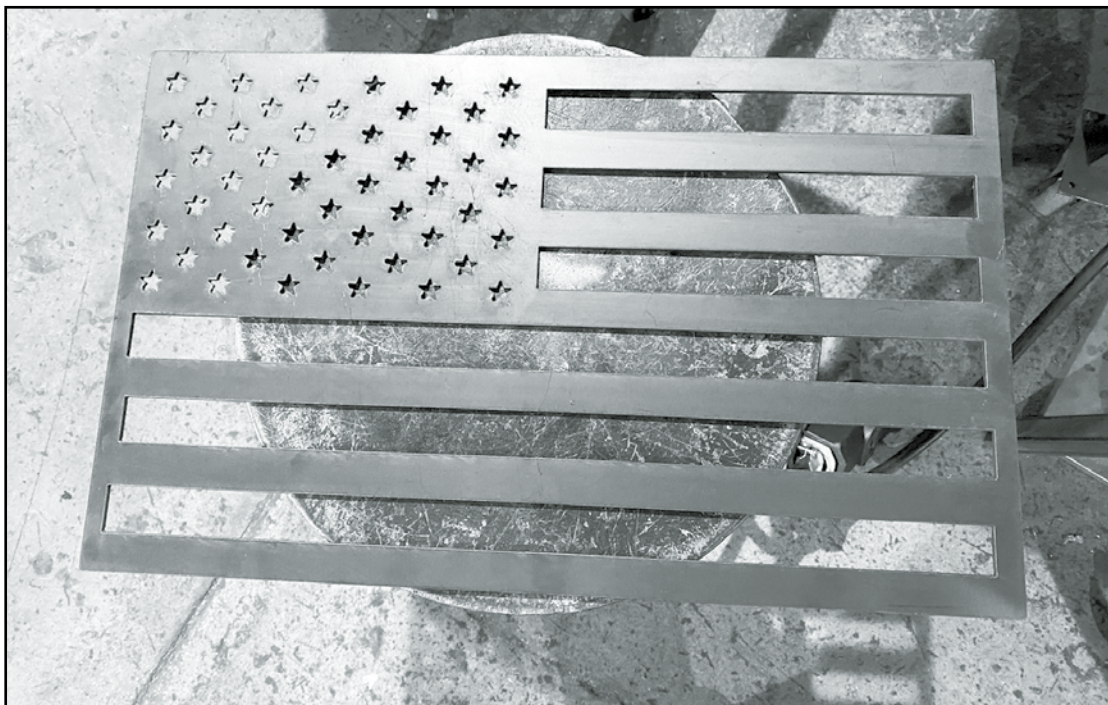
