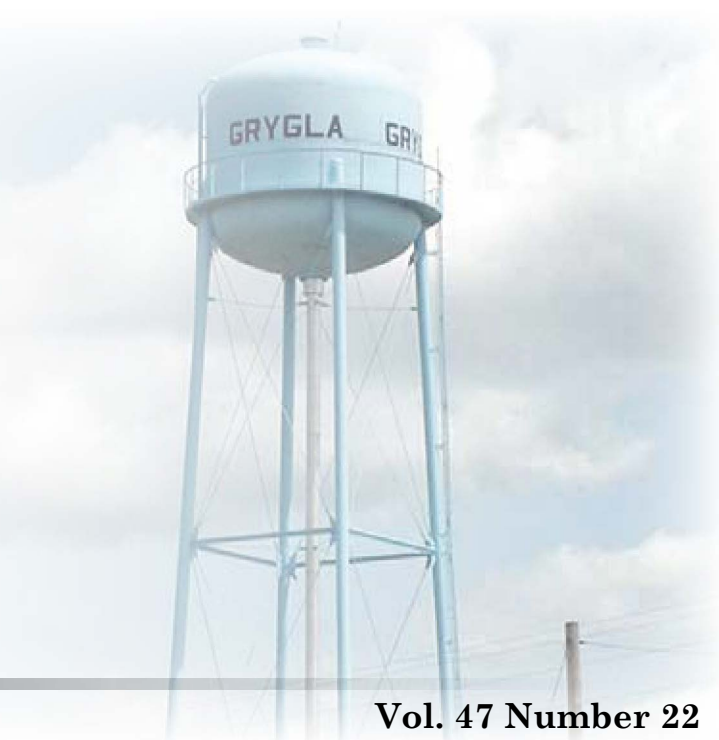

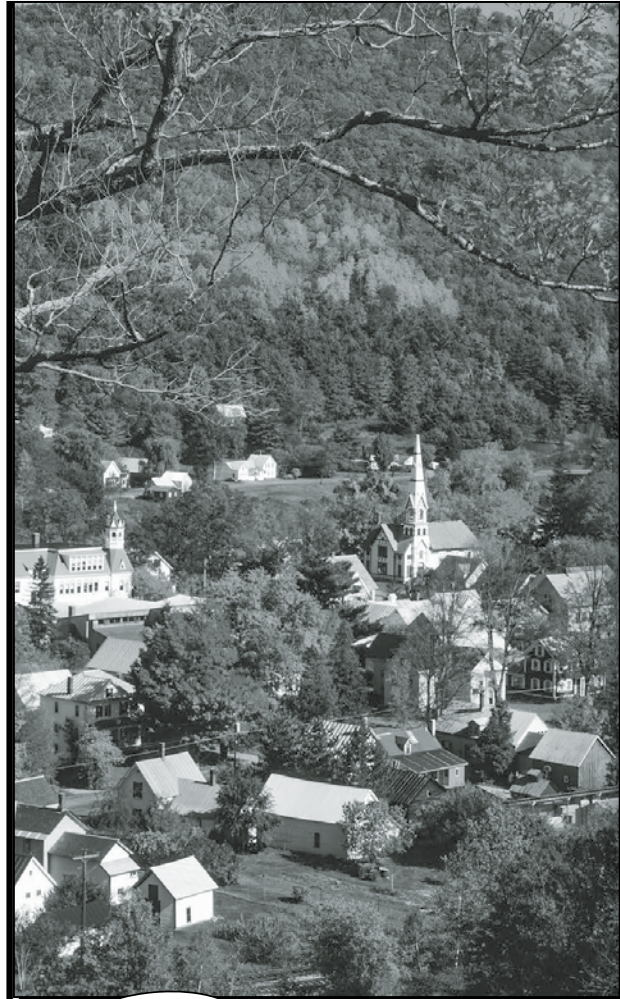

This favorite holiday side dish is a breeze to make in the crockpot. Sweet and crunchy, topped with pecans and marshmallows, it's perfect to serve alongside your roasted turkey AND will free up your oven for the rest of the meal!

Slow Cooker Sweet Potato Casserole

- 1 ½ cups brown sugar, packed
- 6 tbsp. butter, melted
- 2 tbsp. water
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- 4 lbs. sweet potatoes, peeled & cut into 1-inch cubes
- 3 cups mini marshmallows, divided



1 cup chopped pecans, divided

Stir the brown sugar, butter, water, cinnamon, and vanilla together in a crockpot, then add the sweet potatoes, and stir to combine.

Cover with the lid and cook on high for 3.5-4 hours or on low for 6 hours. Stir every hour to prevent burning. Stir in 2 cups of the marshmallows and ½ cup of the pecans, then sprinkle the top with the remaining pecans and marshmallows.

Cover once again and let the marshmallows melt for another 10-15 minutes. Uncover and let the sweet potatoes cool for about 20 minutes before serving.

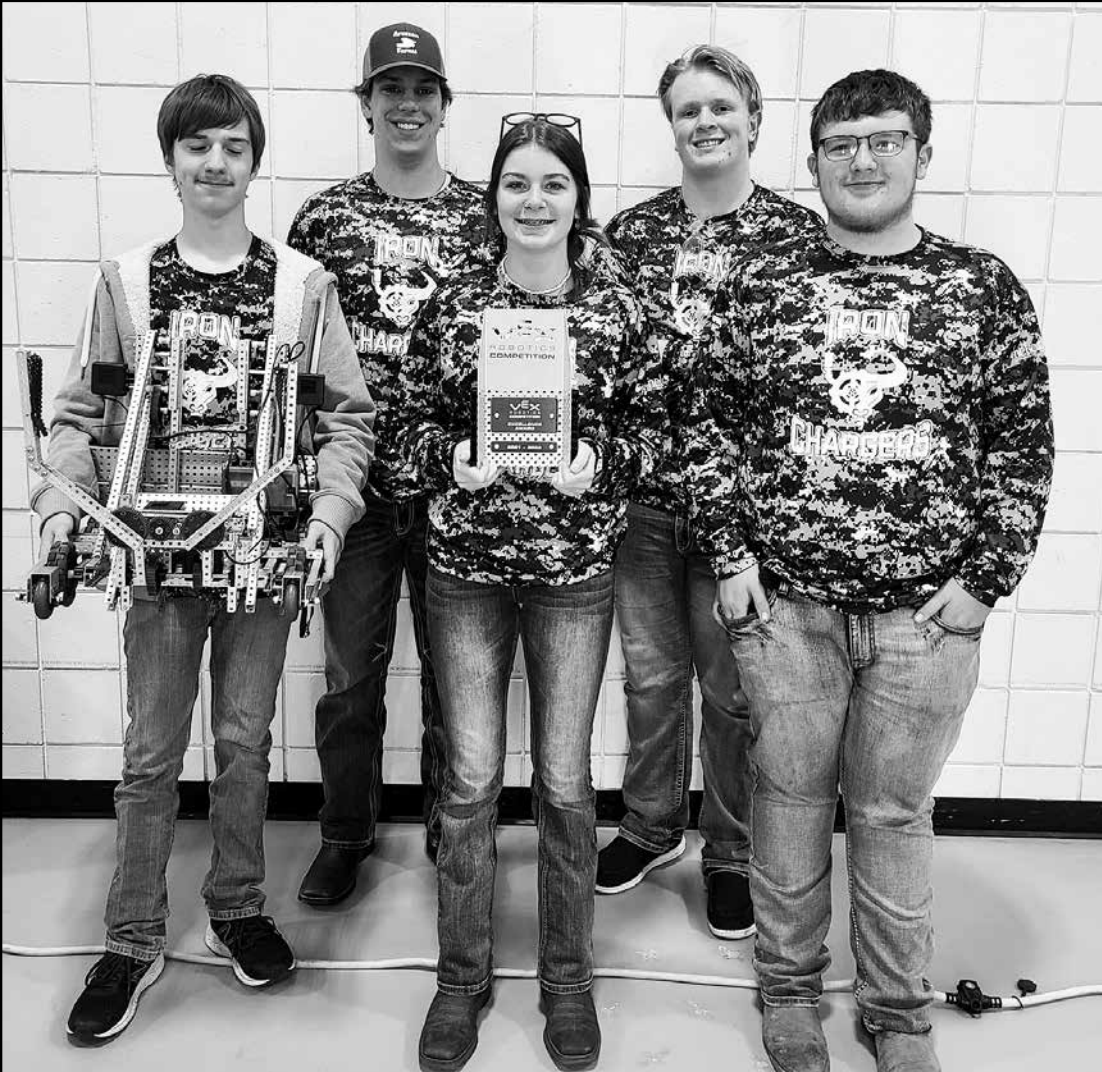

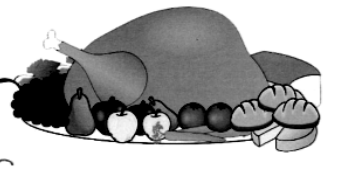

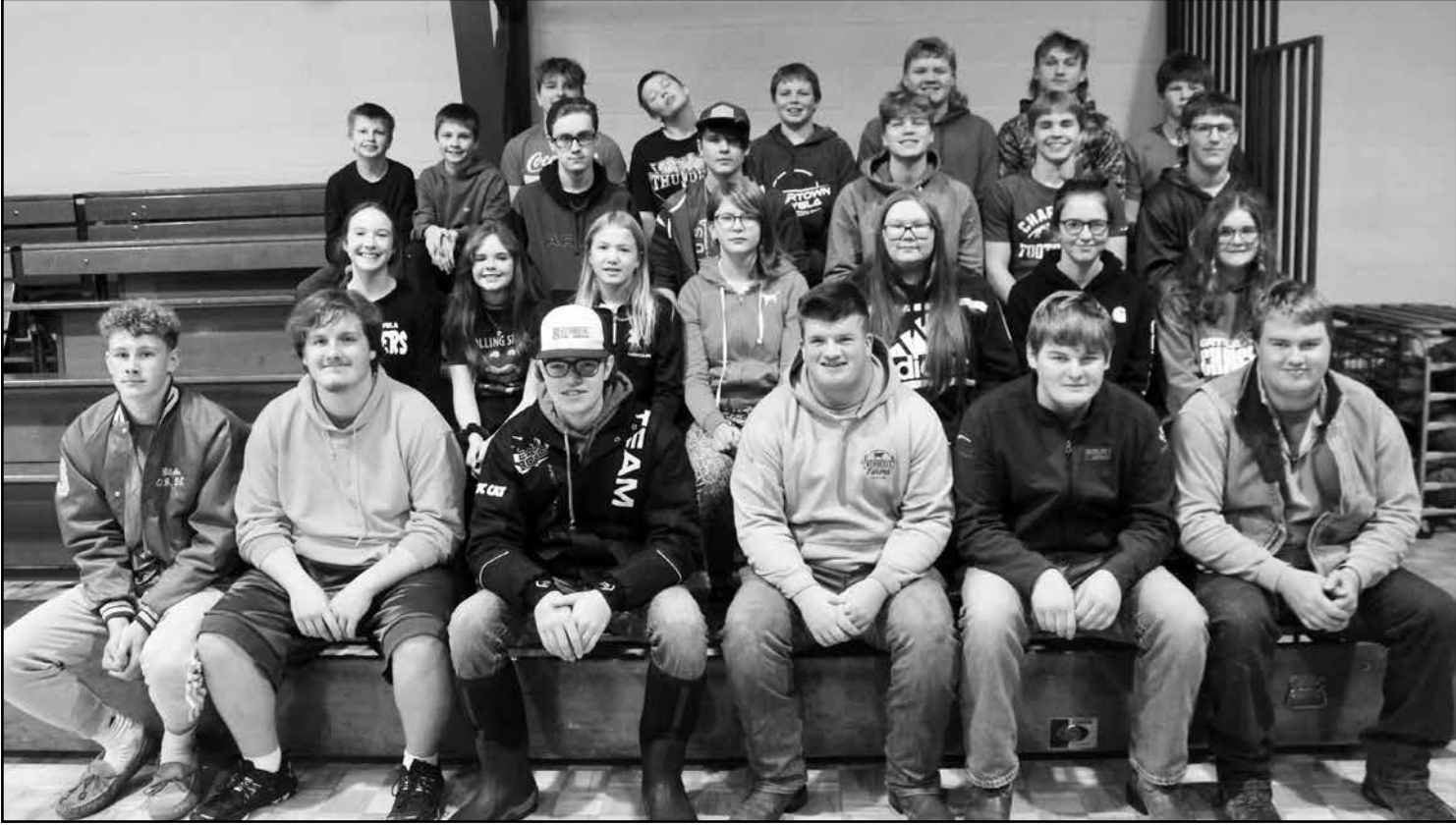
