Northern Lights fishing report

On this week's report, we're getting closer to hitting the big lake. Wigwam Resort is anticipating letting out wheelers and snowmobiles this coming weekend. They are reporting 5"-7" on the bay and around 4" past Pine Island. The Long-point area may start letting out ATVs this next weekend as well.
With the strong winds it did push the ice up so the edges may be a little rough. Overall, it's looking good; hopefully get out some time soon. Red Lake has still been hit and miss on the bite. If you can safely get away from people it's better. A jig, bobber, and minnow have been more productive than jigging.
This coming weekend is the last weekend of the muzzle-loader season, so good luck all! Hunters, stay safe. It should be a decent weekend coming up. Check out the new jigs up at the store in town. I'll be adding to that as winter goes along.
This coming week is a busy one between reffing and an ice show, so we will see if I get out fishing or not. First, I should

get my snowmobile going, wheeler started, and take my fish house down from the rafters.

Minimum guidelines for new, clear ice

4" 5-7" 8-12" 12-15"

Ice is never 100% safe!

- Wear a life jacket or float coat, except in an enclosed vehicle.
- Carry ice picks, rope, a whistle, and an ice chisel.
- Check the ice thickness as you go-conditions can change quickly.
- Warn children of the danger of thin ice.
- Don't drive on the ice at night or in foggy conditions.
- Avoid alcoholic beverages.
- Double the thickness guidelines for white or snow-covered ice.

No fish is worth your life - as lakes across Minnesota freeze, remember that your safety is your responsibility. As you contemplate that first foray onto frozen water, wear a life jacket or float coat, and make sure your ice picks are easily accessible. Wait until there's at least 4 inches of new, clear ice before venturing out. Check the ice thickness for yourself and check it frequently - don't rely on a social media post. Straight out of my kitchen, like most of the weekly recipes I share, comes this delicious take on Mac & Cheese. It's a healthier option using cauliflower instead of pasta, and it's a blend of cream cheese, sharp cheddar and smoked gouda that add a surprising depth of flavor.

I love cooking. I love trying new recipes. I love to EAT those new recipes, but with that can come a little bit of selfishness. Oops. I made a casserole dish of this last week and I just didn't want to share, so I called dibs on it and asked Robert to not eat any. I mean, I did give him a bite, but he isn't trying to slim down like me – so in all fairness – the Keto food is mine first, right? Right. (Though he is eating a lot of it and enjoying my new recipes quite a bit. He also got ONE bite of this dish and really liked it.)

You don't have to be trying to eat healthy or watchin' those carbs in order to make this. You just have to like cauliflower, which a lot of people do. And when you spruce it up all cheesy and stuff, well, it's just simply delicious.

Check it out.

FYI: If you don't have gouda, just substitute for another cheese.

Cauliflower Mac &

Cheese

1 large head cauliflower, cut into small, bite-size florets

1 tsp garlic powder

1 tsp mustard, ground

1/4 tsp black pepper

1/4 tsp cayenne pepper

1/2 tsp salt

1 tbsp olive oil

1 1/2 cups sharp cheddar cheese, shredded

8 oz cream cheese

1 cup smoked gouda cheese, shredded

1 cup heavy cream

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and arrange the cauliflower florets in a single layer. Drizzle with oil and toss. Bake for 18 minutes.

Meanwhile, heat the cream to a simmer in a saucepan over medium heat, whisking often. Stir in cream cheese and cook until the cream cheese melts. Reduce heat to low. Stir in ¾ cup of the sharp cheddar cheese and the gouda cheese.

Sprinkle with the garlic powder, ground mustard, salt, black pepper, and cayenne pepper. Cook until the cheese melts, about 3 or 4 minutes.

Add the cauliflower to the pot and toss to coat. Transfer the mixture to a 9 x 9 casserole dish. Top with the remaining ¾ cup of cheddar cheese.

Bake for 20 minutes. If desired, you can broil for a few minutes to brown the top.
