Northern Lights fishing report

On this week's report, muzzleloader season ends with a few remaining days to bow hunt. My ice season started this past week ramping up production for the show in Fargo and also getting a few jigs up to the store. The Fargo Ice Show was awesome to say the least. Lots of people and lots of fishing conversations.
Then on Sunday I took my dad up to the big lake to see what the ice was like and get in some fishing. We went out of Longpoint Resort on four-wheeler and it is rough. This is the worst I have seen it ever with ice shards and breakers everywhere. There is a solid 6" of good ice and 4" or so of cloudy ice as well. There are also some water pockets in the ice that make for uneven holes and hard on the auger. But the fishing was great.
We started in 18' and had 2 bites so we elected to try out in 26' and the bite was on fire; in a matter of 2 hours, we had our fish and were throwing 15"-16" fish back. We caught around 50 fish. Glow green with blue seemed to work best on the dead stick and a glow rattle spoon or orange spoon for jigging. Frozen shiners on the spoon worked the best as well.
The east end of the lake is just as rough and messed up, but the fish are biting there, as well as a lot of little ones. A jigging spoon and shiner have been productive, along with pink and white. Red Lake has been getting pretty good lately with the best fishing out in 12'. They are allowing ice houses up to 18' pulled by a wheeler or side by side. I would call ahead to the resort to double check if they are still going out with this warm weather. Last I heard the ice is around 12". Dead sticking them still has been best with a glow red jig

and emerald shiner.
In true fashion my fishing trip had an "adventure" - about 7 miles north of Grygla my drive shaft snapped off. I was able to take it the rest of the way off and tried to limp it into Grygla. Well, the side in the transmission shot out about 2 miles down the road and drained the transmission fluid. Looks like fishing will be put on hold for a while. Maybe I'll have to work in the shop.
With that being said, if you would like a new rod, I can still take a couple orders as well. I will also be making a few more jigs and spoons for the store when I get time.
Be careful on the lake if you are heading out. There are active cracks still moving and lots of ice chunks. Be safe and have fun.

Northwest Partnership now accepting proposals for community projects

Northwest Minnesota residents with an idea to strengthen their community can now apply for partnership support from the University of Minnesota Extension Northwest Regional Sustainable Development Partnership (Northwest RSDP). Northwest RSDP supports local innovation by connecting community ideas to University of Minnesota resources in four focus areas: natural resources, clean energy, agriculture and food systems, and resilient communities. Community members work on diverse project teams that research, design and plan local sustainability projects with University students, faculty and staff. Northwest RSDP seeks ideas from community members, especially those who have not previously partnered with the University. In 2022, Northwest RSDP will prioritize projects in RSDP's focus areas that advance sustainable community development; engage historically underrepresented communities; further resilience in food and energy systems; promote climate change mitigation and adaptation strategies; and create a positive narrative for rural communities. "Community members know best how to make changes toward stronger social connections, valuing nature and fostering a home-grown economy. We're excited to hear what comes next for your community, and share with you how the RSDP can help," said Northwest RSDP Executive Director Linda Kingery. "I encourage people to get in touch with me to talk about their ideas for making our communities more sustainable places." Project ideas are being accepted through February 14 and can be submitted online at z.umn.edu/RSDPIdeaBrief. Community members are encouraged to contact Kingery at kinge002@umn.edu or 218-281-8697 to discuss their ideas and ask any questions. Successful projects are selected by the Northwest RSDP community-University governing board through a competitive process. Examples of projects recently supported by the Northwest RSDP include working with the nonprofit 100 Rural Women to build women's leadership networks across the region, a study of the feasibility of a regional electric vehicle car-sharing program, partnering with White Earth Tribal Community College and the Rural Renewable Energy Alliance (RREAL) to add pollinators to a community solar project, and research on affordable housing needs and opportunities in the region. For more examples of projects supported by the Northwest RSDP, visit z.umn.edu/RSDPProjectExamples. The Northwest RSDP serves Kittson, Roseau, Lake of the Woods, Marshall, Pennington, Red Lake, Clearwater, Beltrami, Polk, Norman, Mahanomen, Clay and Wilkin counties and the Red Lake Nation and White Earth Nation. Northwest RSDP is one of five regions of the University of Minnesota Extension Regional Sustainable Development Partnerships (RSDP). For more information on RSDP, visit RSDP.umn.edu.
