2022 MN election process
February 1, 2022, is caucus night in Minnesota. GET INVOLVED!! 2022 is the largest election of the decade on Nov 8, 2022. Every state representative, every state senator, US representative, Sec. of State, State Att. General, and Governor are up for election plus many county commissioners and school board members. If you like the status quo, you're excused. Otherwise, GET INVOLVED and start by attending your caucus. 6 townships in Beltrami County in the Fourtown/Grygla area will meet at Our Savior's Lutheran Church Feb. 1, 2022, at 7pm. Delegates to Beltrami County Convention will be elected. From there, delegates to CD7 convention and State convention will be

elected.
Republicans can write up resolutions for the state platform, discussions about candidates and a straw vote ballot will be taken for Governor, Sec of St, and Att. Gen. Ballots will be turned in at the state headquarters and included with all other precincts for a statewide response. Democrats will have a similar caucus. Plan on CAUCUS NIGHT Feb. 1, 2022, and make your voice heard.
If you're thinking your vote doesn't matter? Rep Matt Bliss for Bemidji lost his election 4 years ago by 8 votes. Low voters' turnout was the issue. He was elected two years later. Votes do count and are needed. Please get involved.

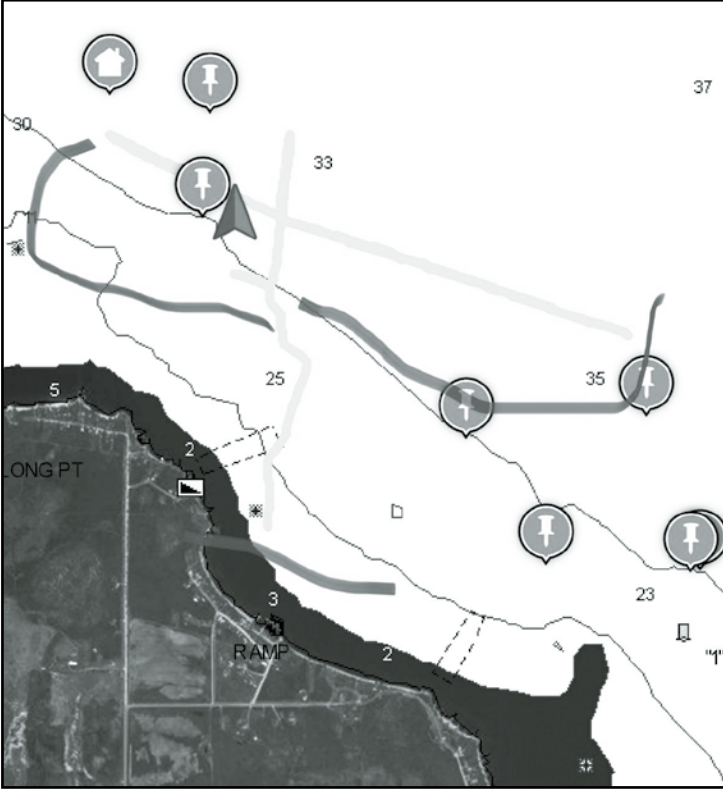

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Strategic Farming: Let's Talk Crops

Pull up a chair and join in or bring the conversation with you as you go about your day. Whatever works best for you, join us this winter to discuss some of the key issues and questions around commodity crop production facing Minnesota farmers today through the “Strategic Farming: Let’s Talk Crops” webinar series. This live, online program will provide up-to-date, research-based information to help optimize your crop management strategies for 2022. Slow Cooker Queso Chicken Tacos

Taco night just got a lot more flavorful with this SUPER EASY, delicious weeknight meal that makes the BEST chicken tacos! Only a few ingredients and minutes to throw together, these Queso Chicken Tacos are loaded with flavor and require little work and effort. Use the chicken for tacos, burritos, wraps and bowls. Perfect for feeding a crowd, parties and game day.

Ingredients
2 lbs boneless, skinless chicken breasts
1 packet taco seasoning
1 can of Rotel
4 oz. can mild diced green chiles
½ cup chicken broth

¾ cup salsa con queso
Taco shells

Favorite toppings: lettuce, tomato, cheese, onions, jalapenos, sour cream, guacamole, lime, cilantro, hot sauce, more queso!

Lightly spray slow cooker with non-stick cooking spray. Place chicken in a single layer and sprinkle taco seasoning evenly on top. In a medium size bowl, add Rotel, green chiles and chicken broth, mix well and pour over chicken. Cook on high for 4 hours. When ready, drain excess liquid leaving just a smidgen behind (I use a soup ladle), then shred chicken using two forks. Last, spoon queso on top and gently mix with chicken, coating chicken evenly. Cook on low for 20 minutes or until heated through. Serve with your favorite toppings.
