Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf to participate in March Campaign

March is almost here and that means it time for the Annual Minnesota Food Share March Campaign for Hunger Awareness. The Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf is participating by requesting non-perishable food items and monetary donations during the month of March. The campaign runs from February 28th through April 10th. We are eligible to receive funding from Minnesota Food Share based on the funding raised and the amount of food items donated (number of pounds).

This is our big fundraiser for the year and the ability to generate some matching funds makes it all the more worthwhile.

Statistics show that in 2021 the projected food insecurity rate was 8.6% in Minnesota, up from 7.7% in 2019. 9% of all Minnesotans had income below the poverty line (\$25,926 for a family of four) in 2020.

This included 11% of Minnesota Children. 3.7 million visits were made to food shelves during 2021 in Minnesota. That is why we exist – to help alleviate those worries. This is especially important as people are still struggling because of the impacts of Covid-19.

The Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf is run on individual donations and any grants that we may receive. We are able to buy food items through the North Country Food Bank at a greatly reduced rate, but we do buy additional food items locally and therefore support the local economy.

Only in Minnesota: a weekly feature in the Eagle

The underappreciated museum that shows you a side of Minnesota you've never seen before

The Land of 10,000 Lakes might as well be called the Land of 10,000 Museums. There probably aren't quite that many, but there are dozens – even hundreds – of large and small museums across the entire state. Whether you like fine art or local history, there's something of interest to just about everyone. In the small town of Scandia, Minnesota, an



underappreciated museum celebrates Minnesota's Swedish heritage. Take a look:

Gammalgarden Museum is a little-known - but very interesting - spot in eastern Minnesota. Address: 20880 Olinda Trail North, Scandia, MN, 55073.

The museum preserves the history of Minnesota's Swedish heritage. Its grounds and buildings will bring a new appreciation for the immigrants who settled here centuries ago, as well as for new immigrants today.

The buildings stand as relics of the past. They give information about what life was like more than a century ago in the 1850s. Inside, artifacts from more than a century ago offer details on how people lived way back then. Each room features cookware, clothes, and more.

Back outside, the grounds are incredibly beautiful. When you've had your fill of history, you can spend hours exploring the lush natural surroundings. A small body of water runs through the museum grounds.

Reorganization of the Board: Guidelines for officer selection-Acting chairperson calls for nominations for chair (3 times) or until all nominations are made. Acting chairperson states nominations are closed and declares the new chair if there is only one nomination or calls for a vote if there are two or more nominations and declares the chair when a nominee receives a majority vote. If no majority, revote until there is a majority. Same procedure is used for selection of vice chair, clerk, treasurer. Motions and seconds are not needed in this process.

Teacher Report: Given by Alissa Hruby. The seniors are working on their FAFSA in Mr. Grandstrand's class. Elementary Art with Alyssa Auna has been going great! The teachers and students are loving the projects. Thank you to Mrs. Aune for organizing this and the grant that funds it. The 4th grade students are working on their Southeast United States presentations. Mr. Olson has been busy with and doing a great job of organizing elementary basketball program.

Principal Report: Given by Mr. Gieseke. Mr. Gieseke recently attended a presentation with the NW MN Drug Task Force. They gave a thorough look at what we should be keeping our eyes and ears open for in our schools and communities. So far this year we have seen some COVID cases, but there is still little transmission happening at school. The school's intention is to remain open and continue using sanitation mitigation strategies. Work based learning has gone very well, with 9 students utilizing this through local businesses.

Superintendent Report: Athletic Update-Going very well. Bus Log-No issues. Other-Discussion was held on potentially separating the Business Manager and Payroll positions, as this is what most local schools are doing as the requirements and state reporting continue to increase the workload. We are currently lining up presentations for our students with Anton Treuer, Professor of Ojibwe Studies at Bemidji State University, and Keith Hawkins, motivational speaker.

Crockpot Sausage and Peppers

This is an easy slow cooker recipe with super simple ingredients. I have sausage and peppers on my shopping list to

make it this week. The marinara sauce seems like a weird addition to me, but I'll give it a try. Serving suggestions say to scoop some of this on top of pasta or on a hoagie roll, but I think I'm just going to eat it as is and keep the meal a bit on the lighter side.

Italian Sausage links (8-10)

1 green pepper

1 yellow pepper

1 red pepper

1 onion

2 cloves of garlic, minced

1 tsp (or more) of Italian seasoning

2 cups marinara sauce

1 tbsp parsley

Cut up your sausage links, peppers, onions. Add them to the crockpot with all the remaining ingredients except the parsley. Mix until combined. Cover and cook on high for 3 hours or low for 6 hours. Garnish with parsley.
