Food security – is "access by all people to enough food for an active, healthy lifestyle".
Food insecurity – means access to adequate food is inconsistent and limited by a lack of money or other resources throughout the year. Food insecure households report their diets to be of reduced quality, variety or desirability and/or experience disrupted eating patterns and reduced food intake.

Here in Minnesota, we have a few places where Lego fanatics can gather. At the Mall of America, there's an official Lego store where you can buy individual bricks, the newest kits, and much more. The Lego Store is well-known to most Minnesotans. But did you know there's an unofficial Lego store that is just as fun? Read on to learn about Brickmania GHQ, a Minneapolis-based Lego shop with some truly incredible designs:

Brickmania GHQ is a Lego store in the Northeast neighborhood of Minneapolis, Minnesota. It's housed in the historic Thorp Building, and it's a go-to place for Lego lovers.

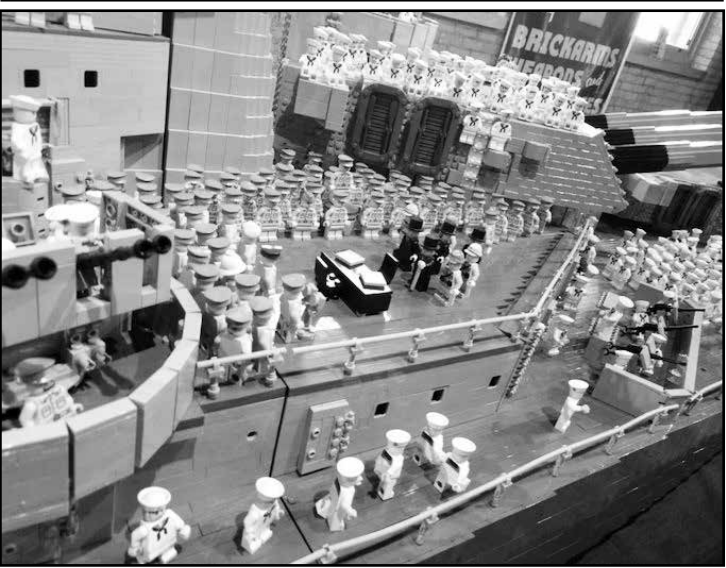
Brickmania is an aftermarket Lego store, meaning you can't find Lego's official kits here. In fact, they are not officially affiliated with Lego. Instead, the company uses Lego to create their own kits.



Most of the kits are centered on the military, with models of ships, planes, and other machines among their designs. They also have custom minifigs so that builders can add life to their displays. They are historically accurate, with the minifigs' faces and bodies painted in military uniforms from various wars.

Beyond the kits you can purchase, the Brickmania GHQ store has a few fantastic displays that are well worth visiting. For example, there are huge models of the USS Missouri battleship and the USS Nicholas destroyer. There are also finished models of completed Brickmania kits as well as some unique models of a Minneapolis landmark. 4149C team didn't have a very good 2 days. They lost all 7 matches and had trouble with their robot, then going up against some of the top teams. They had close matches but just couldn't take a win.

4149G team had some better luck, they won 4 and lost 3 of their matches. They were able to get into the round of 16 being picked as an alliance partner with another team from Hallock. They put up a good fight but came up short.

Both teams leave again March 27th for the US Create Open in Council Bluff, Iowa. Also, our Drone team goes to World's in Dallas, Texas, in May.

What started out as a trial run a couple of years ago has earned us a spot at the 2022 REC Foundation Aerial Drones World Championship Event in Dallas, Texas.

Through a program we were granted 2 drones to compete with in 2019-2020. A team of 3 competed in a tournament in St. Cloud, missing 1st place by mere seconds. Last year we were unable to compete due to Covid-19. This year we were able to compete again.

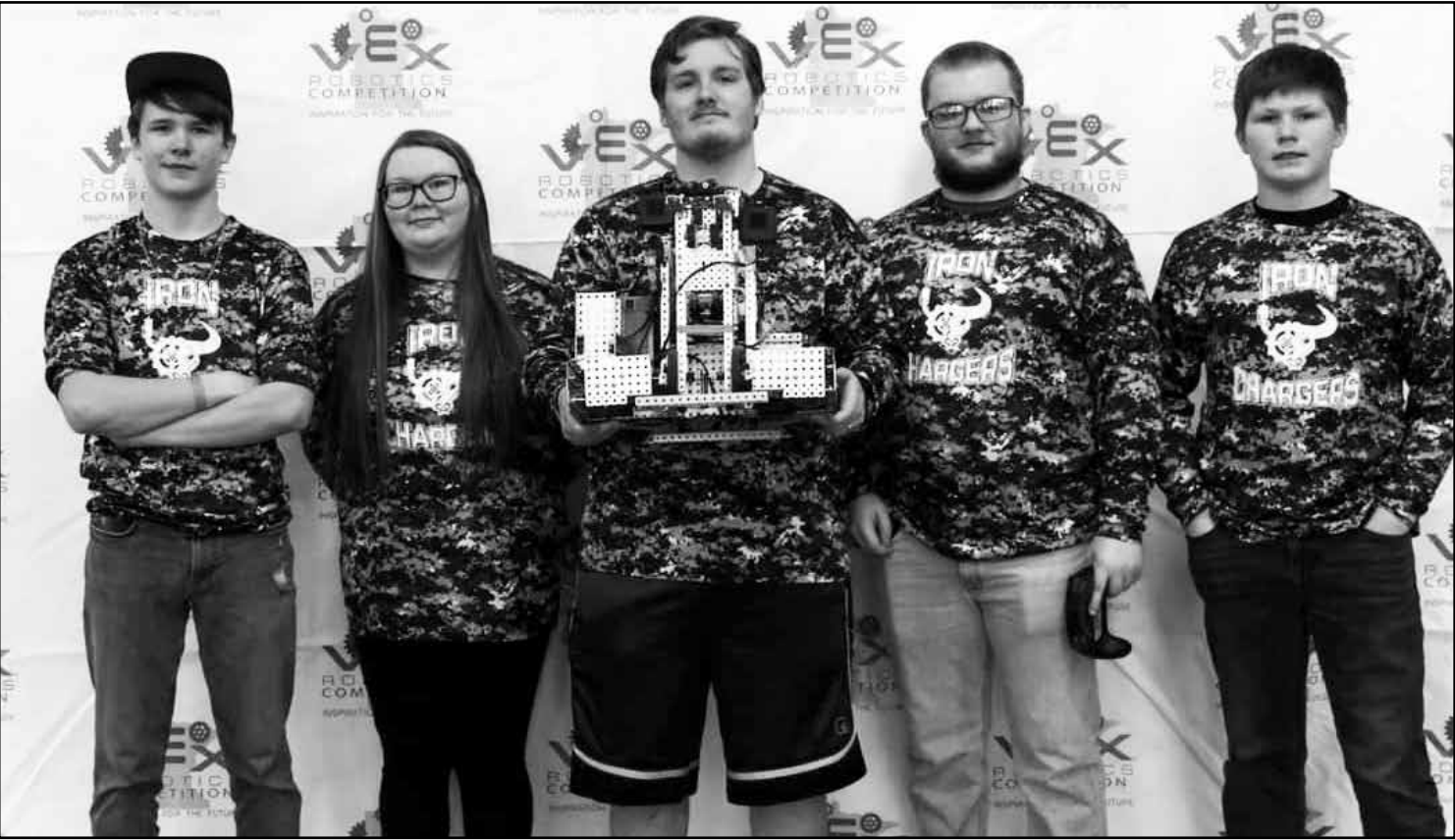
Our team lost out on 1st place by just a few points. Only 1st place qualifies for World's, but there is also a Programming Skills competition, in which our programmer was able to secure 5th place in the world. With that being said 4149D is invited to Dallas, Texas, in May for the World Competition.
