We are pleased to announce that our Firemen's Supper is back on the calendar! You've been waiting 3 years for this event, and we're going to dust-off our time-tested recipes to make this year's meal the best one yet!

Our annual Firemen's Supper will be held Sunday, April 3, at the Grygla Community Center, from 4:00-7:00 pm. The menu will include roast beef and ham, mashed potatoes and gravy, coleslaw, and corn. We are charging \$12.00 for adults, and \$6.00 for kids under 12. It's "all you can eat", so bring your hearty appetites. We will draw door prizes at 7:00. We will also be offering curbside pick-up for those that would rather eat

in the comfort of their homes. Simply call the Community Center to arrange pick-up. The phone number is 294-6200.

During the past year, the fire department has responded to 56 calls. This included 7 wildland/grass fires, 2 structure fires, 7 auto/ATV accidents, and 26 medical calls. We also had 7 alarm activation/service calls. By the way, have you checked your smoke detectors recently?

New to the force this year are Dacotah Byklum, Dylan Morey, and Dustin Nelson. These three guys have been excellent additions to our department. They are currently enrolled in the Firefighter 1 Program and will complete their training this summer. We're always looking for quali-

fied individuals who might be interested in joining our crew. If it is something you are considering, please reach out to one of our firemen.

We have recently purchased a main engine pumper truck to replace our 23-year-old pumper. This new pumper is a 2006 model and has a five passenger crew cab. It will be parked in front of the Community Center during the supper. We will continue to use our old one as a back-up. We've also acquired a 2006 Chevy pickup to utilize for this spring's grass fire season. Maintaining and replacing older equipment has always been a priority for our department, ensuring everything is in good working order whenever it's needed.

We would like to acknowl-

edge the support of all the individuals, businesses, service clubs, and civic organizations in our area. With your generous donations, we have been able to make improvements to our equipment, attend trainings, and maintain our Fire Hall. The Grygla Fire Department serves 6 townships in Marshall County, 8 townships in Beltrami County, and provides mutual aid to the surrounding departments in Goodridge, Middle River, and Roseau.

New Engine

The Grygla Fire Department recently purchased a new truck from Great Plains Fire Equipment out of Fergus Falls, MN. The truck was in service on a rotational/lease program in a fire district out of Michigan. Grygla's Department received monetary support from Marshall and Beltrami Counties, along with an equipment grant from the MN DNR; they'll also be applying for a grant through the Roseau Electric RoundUp Grant Program. Purchasing this truck was a substantial savings over a brand new one by about \$300,000.

The new truck will be the main engine with the old truck being kept for a second engine and backup, which the department is required to have and has been out of compliance with for many years, so this is a great, necessary addition. It will also allow more flexibility when responding to mutual aid calls outside of the district.

Mental illness is not something that many want to talk about, but we all are exposed to. Mental illness is common, nearly, one in five Americans live with mental illness. Reducing the stigma around mental illness/mental health starts with a simple conversation. It's OK to not be OK! Mental illness can be caused by trauma, chemical or biochemical changes in the brain, genetics, and/or environmental.

40th Annual Goodridge Lion's Consignment Sale & Smelt Fry

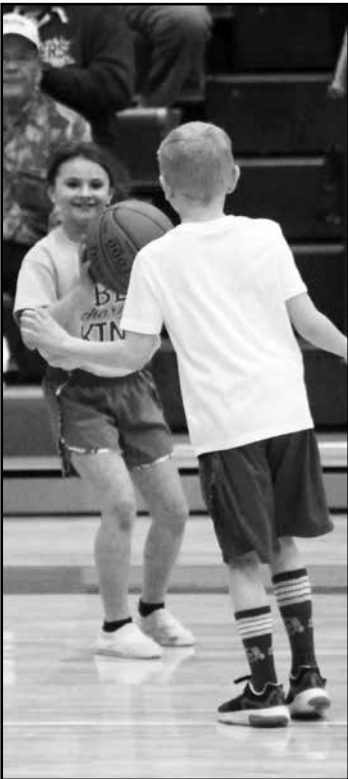
